**RAY MATTER**—The Rays are 11-3 over their last 14 games, their best 14-game stretch since July 13–Aug 2, 2014 (11-3)...this includes an 8-game winning streak—tied for 3rd-longest in franchise history—from April 18-28...over this 14-game stretch, the Rays have a plus-33 run differential (83-50) and have out-hit opponents, 147-111...they have improved from 4-13 (.235)—worst record in the AL East and 3rd-worst winning pct. in the majors—to 15-16 (.484) over this stretch...with last night's win vs. TOR, the Rays improved to 5-1-0 in their last 6 series, compared to 1-4-0 before it.

- ✦ The Rays have scored 5 runs or more in 8 games over this 14-game stretch, and are 8-0 when doing so...they have scored 6 runs or more in 7 games and 8 runs or more in 6 games...they have reached double-digit hits in 9 games over this 14-game stretch.
- ✦ The Rays have come from behind in 7 of these 11 wins.
- ✦ The Rays have won the opening game of their last 6 series.
- ✦ The Rays have won six consecutive home games, dating back to April 18 vs. TEX...they have outscored opponents, 41-21, over these 6 games...the 6-game home winning streak matches their longest under fourth-year Manager **Kevin Cash** (also April 7-20, 2017 and April 22–May 1, 2015)...today the Rays will go for their first 7-game home winning streak since June 29–July 11, 2013 (9).
- ✦ The Rays rank 2nd in the AL with a .262 avg. to the Red Sox (.269) and rank 2nd in the AL with a .333 OBP to the Yankees (.335).

**SEEKING SWEEP**—Today the Rays are attempting to finish their third sweep of the season (3 games from April 20-22 vs. MIN and 2 games from April 25-26 at BAL)...with a win today, the Rays would match their total number of sweeps from last season: 3 games from April 18-20 vs. DET, 2 games from May 1-2 at MIA and 3 games from Sep 29–Oct 1 vs. BAL.

- ✦ Twice previously the Rays have had a chance to sweep and failed to do so: April 11 at CWS (2-1 loss) and April 29 at BOS (4-3 loss).
- ✦ A win today would also clinch a second consecutive winning homestand, as they went 5-4 from April 13-22 vs. PHI/TEX/MIN.

**CONSIDER THIS**—Today the Rays have a chance to return to .500 for the first time since they were 1-1...they have lost previous attempts to return to .500 when they were 1-2, 12-13 (April 29 at BOS) and 13-14 (Tues at DET)...the Rays are 1 game under .500 despite a wide range of obstacles:

- ✦ Their 8-game losing streak tied for the 4th-longest of the "Rays" era and remains tied for the 2nd-longest in the majors this season.
- ✦ They opened the season with three regular members of the starting rotation following the injury to **Nathan Eovaldi**, and used a "bullpen day" as needed as the fourth and fifth starters...they have used seven different starting pitchers, tied for 4th-most in the majors, and just one shy of their total from all of last season.
- ✦ They placed two-time Gold Glove winner and 2015 AL Platinum Glove winner **Kevin Kiermaier** on the disabled list in mid-April, the third consecutive season he has missed significant time.
- ✦ They have totaled 12 games against the Red Sox (3-7) and Yankees (0-2), who own the two best records in the majors this season.
- ✦ They have played more games on the road (16) than at home (15).

**RAYS vs. BLUE JAYS**—Today the Rays have a chance to sweep the Blue Jays for the first time since May 16-18, 2016 at TOR...they are attempting to sweep them at Tropicana Field for the first time since April 24-26, 2015...today is the third of 19 meetings between the two clubs this season (9 at Tropicana Field, 10 at Rogers Centre)...the two teams meet only six times before the All-Star break, compared to 13 times in the second half (and 10 times in September)...the Rays went 9-10 last season (6-4 at

home, 3-6 on the road), just the second time they've lost a season series to the Blue Jays in the Rays era (8-11 in 2014)...the Rays are 187-167 (.528) all-time against Toronto, their most wins against any opponent.

**SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN**—This is the second of six consecutive series against teams that finished last season below .500...the Rays don't face another postseason team from last year until May 22-24 vs. BOS...so far this season, the Rays are 6-9 (.400) against teams that made last year's playoffs and 9-7 (.563) against teams that missed the postseason.

- ✦ Tomorrow is the Rays second of three off-days in a stretch of 8 days...following the May 10 off-day, the Rays play 40 games in 41 days (two off-days plus a doubleheader on May 12 at BAL).

**ROAMING BUFFALO**—Last night vs. TOR, **Wilson Ramos** singled in the 3rd inning to extend his hitting streak to 13 games...his hitting streak is:

- ✦ the longest active streak in the major leagues
- ✦ the 3rd-longest of his career behind April 24–May 19, 2015 (19, with WAS) and June 9–July 11, 2014 (14, with WAS)
- ✦ the longest by a Ray since **Kevin Kiermaier** (13) in 2016...no Ray has had a longer streak since **James Loney** (16) from June 19–July 5, 2013, and the club record is 19 by **Jason Barlett** in 2009
- ✦ tied with **John Flaherty** from Aug 7-27, 1999 for the 2nd-longest in franchise history among catchers...it is one shy of tying the club record for a catcher, held by **Toby Hall** (14) from Aug 7-28, 2001

**THE HORSE**—**Alex Colomé** has pitched to a 1.17 ERA (7.2-IP, 1-ER) with 11 SO over his last 7 apps...last night vs. TOR, he went 1.2 IP for his longest app of the season...he recorded his fifth career save of 5 outs or more, first since June 17, 2017 at DET (1.2 IP)...since the start of 2016, he has 13 saves of 4 outs or more, most in the AL and 3rd-most in the majors.

**COMMUNITY CORNER**—Before every Tuesday home game, the Rays host a youngster from the Make-A-Wish Foundation or Children's Dream Fund as a part of the "Tuesday's Champion" program...for this Tuesday's game vs. ATL, the Rays will welcome 11-year-old **Christopher Shoup Jr.** from the Children's Dream Fund...as part of his special day, Christopher will meet Rays players and coaches and throw a ceremonial first pitch.

- ✦ On Tuesday morning, **Chris Archer**, Rays front office staff and Good Sports staff will join athletes, coaches and staff from Middleton High School in Tampa, and donate brand-new baseball and softball equipment...the donation, valued at more than \$35,000, will include cleats, baseball and softball bats, fielding gloves, batting gloves, helmets and more...this is the fifth year that the Rays, Good Sports and Archer have partnered to support local youth.

**MINOR MATTERS**—In yesterday's game at Burlington (Angels), Class-A Bowling Green 1B/LH **Brendan McKay** hit his first homer of the season and fifth of his professional career (last Aug 8, 2017 with Short-A Hudson Valley)...McKay, 22, was the Rays first round selection (fourth overall) in the 2017 June Draft out of the University of Louisville...this season, he is batting .278/.473/.370 (15-for-54) with 2 2B, 1 HR, 15 RBI and 20 BB in 17 games and the plate, and is 1-0 with a 1.45 ERA (18.2-IP, 3-ER) and 33 SO in 5 starts on the mound, including 4.2 no-hit innings on Fri at Burlington.

**THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY**—On May 6, 2000, **Steve Trachsel** throws a 3-hit shutout with 11 SO and outduels BOS **Pedro Martínez** in a 1-0 Devil Rays victory at Fenway Park...**Greg Vaughn** drives in the game's only run with a two-out single in the 8th inning...Pedro's 17 SO remain tied for the most ever by an opposing pitcher against the Rays, and the only other pitcher to do that was TOR **Brandon Morrow** on Aug 8, 2010.

**LAST START**—On Tues at DET, allowed a 3rd-inning RBI double to **Nicholas Castellanos** and 5th-inning RBI double to **Leonys Martin**...three of his 6 hits allowed came in the 5th inning, but stranded two runners after consecutive strikeouts ended the inning...allowed 2 runs, matching his season low (also April 20 vs. MIN), and did not allow a homer for the first time in his 7 starts this season...replaced after 6 IP and 90 pitches in a 2-1 loss: his line: L, 6 IP, 6 H, 2 R, 1 BB, 6 SO, 90 pit, 57 str.

+ Became the third pitcher to reach 1,000 IP for the Rays, following **James Shields** (1,454.2 IP) and **David Price** (1,143.2 IP).

**SEEKING LENGTH**—Has totaled 38.2 IP in his 7 starts this season, averaging just over 5.1 IP per start...hasn't completed 6 IP in nine of his last 12 starts dating back to last Sep 2, after doing so in 18 of his previous 19 starts...doesn't have a start of at least 7 IP since Aug 27, 2017 at STL (7 IP) and hasn't gone 8 IP since May 10, 2017 vs. KC (8 IP).

**vs. TORONTO**—Will be making his 25th start against the Blue Jays, his most frequent opponent (Red Sox, 20)...has gone 7-4 with a 3.09 ERA (148.1-IP, 51-ER) in 24 starts against them and 4-2 with a 3.11 ERA (81-IP, 28-ER) in 13 starts at Tropicana Field...has yielded 3 runs or fewer in 21 of 24 starts against the Blue Jays, including 10 straight dating back to Oct 3, 2015...has yielded 2 runs or fewer in 17 starts and 1 run or fewer in 9 starts...hasn't lost to them since Opening Day 2016.

**INFLATED ERA**—His 6.05 ERA is the 6th-highest among qualifying pitchers in the majors and 4th-highest among AL qualifiers...has gone 3-7 with a 6.56 ERA (60.1-IP, 44-ER) in 13 starts dating back to Sep 2, 2017 at CWS...min. 50 IP, his ERA since the start of last September is highest in the majors, ahead of **TEX Martin Pérez**.

**UPCOMING MILESTONES**—Is 2 wins shy of tying **Scott Kazmir** (55) for 3rd in franchise history, and 3 starts shy of tying **Price** (170) for 2nd in club history...his 1,086 SO are 2nd in club history behind **James Shields** (1,250).

**FRANCHISE FIRST**—With his start on Opening Day vs. BOS, he became the second pitcher in franchise history to make four Opening Day starts (**James Shields**; 2008-10, 2012), and the first to do it in four consecutive seasons...is one of five pitchers to start on Opening Day in each of the last four seasons, along with **SEA Félix Hernández**, **LAD Clayton Kershaw**, **CLE Corey Kluber** and **ATL Julio Teheran**.

**MR. DURABLE**—Since June 1, 2013—the date he was recalled to the majors for good—he leads the majors with 163 starts...DET/WAS **Max Scherzer** ranks 2nd with 159 starts...made 34 starts last season, tying **BAL Kevin Gausman** for the major league lead and tying the club record (Archer in 2015, **David Price** in 2011, **Scott Kazmir** in 2007)...has made at least 30 starts in four straight seasons, one of two Rays pitchers all-time to do that (also **James Shields**, six, 2007-12)...is the third Rays pitcher with three straight years of 200 IP, joining **Shields** (six, 2007-12) and **Price** (three, 2010-12)...is one of five pitchers to throw at least 200 IP in each of the last three seasons, along with **Max Scherzer**, **Jeff Samardzija**, **Chris Sale** and **Corey Kluber**.

**KING OF THE K**—His 249 SO last season ranked 4th in the majors behind **BOS Chris Sale** (308), **WAS Max Scherzer** (268) and **CLE Corey Kluber** (268), and ranked 2nd in club history, behind his own record of 252 (2015)...led the majors for a third straight year in strikeouts on the slider (179), after recording 152 in 2016 and 179 in 2015...last season he made 9 starts with at least 10 SO, tying the club record...he has done that 27 times in his career, most in franchise history, ahead of **David Price** (23)...has not allowed a walk in 8 of those 27 career starts, tying **Price** for most in club history and as many as **Hall of Famer Nolan Ryan** compiled in his 27-year career.

**K'S FOR KIDS**—Every strikeout he records will benefit the local nonprofit Starting Right, Now...its mission is to combat youth homelessness through a variety of personal development programs...for every strikeout, Archer, the Rays Baseball Foundation and Crown Automotive Group will each donate \$25...this is the fourth consecutive year Archer has conducted the strikeout campaign...any Rays fan or local business can join the strikeout challenge by making a pledge at [raysbaseball.com/archer](http://raysbaseball.com/archer).

## TUESDAY'S STARTER: LH BLAKE SNELL (4-1, 2.55 ERA)

**LAST START**—On Wed at DET, failed to hold a 2-0 lead, allowing an RBI groundout in the 5th inning and game-tying solo homer to **James McCann**, his last batter faced, in the 7th inning...only allowed 1 hit through 4 IP, then allowed 4 hits over his last 2.2 IP...yielded 1 BB or fewer for a fourth straight start, longest such streak of his career...his 86 pitches were his fewest since his first start of the season on March 30 vs. BOS (84), and his pitch count by inning was 17-17-13-7-11-13 plus 8 pitches to 3 BF in the 7th inn. ...his line: ND, 6.2 IP, 5 H, 2 R, 1 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 86 pit, 57 str.

**THE WIN COLUMN**—Has won four consecutive decisions spanning 5 starts, matching the longest winning streak of his career...he previously did it spanning 7 starts from Aug 15-Sep 20, 2017 (4-0, 3 no-decisions)...

over this 5-start unbeaten streak, he is 4-0 with a 1.89 ERA (33.1-IP, 7-ER) and 38/7 SO/BB ratio...prior to his no-decision in his last start, was the first Ray to win four consecutive starts since **Erasmus Ramirez** from May 30-June 15, 2015 at BAL/SEA, vs. LAA/WAS.

**HARD TO HIT**—Has allowed 5 hits or fewer in a club-record 11 consecutive starts since Sep 12, 2017...passed **Drew Smyly** (9) from Aug 11, 2014-May 5, 2015 and **Matt Moore** (9) from Sep 11, 2012-April 27, 2013.

**vs. ATLANTA**—Has never faced the Braves...is 3-1 with a 2.48 ERA (40-IP, 11-ER) in 7 career interleague starts, including 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA (17-IP, 3-ER) in 3 IL starts at home...his last IL start was Sep 20, 2017 vs. CHC.

## #16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

+ Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than **SD Andy Green**.  
 + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.  
 + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

+ Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.  
 + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
