## HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 7-3 in their last 10 games.
- ♦ The D-backs have won 6 straight @ Rockies since June 21, 2017.
- ♦ The D-backs are 5-1 in their last 6 games vs. Rockies, 10-3 in their last 13 games (since July 1, 2017) and 12-4 in their last 16 games (since June 21, 2017).
- ♦ Among NL teams since May 28, the D-backs rank in home runs (2nd, 19), slugging pct. (2nd, .515), OPS (3rd, .853), runs (3rd, 61), walks (5th, 38) and on-base pct. (6th, .338).
- ♦ **Matt Koch** ("cook") has won back-to-back starts for the first time in his career...last time out, tossed 7.0 scoreless frames (3 H, 6 K) in 6-1 win vs. Marlins...in 2 road starts, is 1-1 with a 2.38 ERA (3 ER in 11.1 IP)...in his lone game vs. Rockies, tossed 4.0 shutout innings in relief (2 H, 1 BB, 4 K) on Sept. 13, 2016 at Chase Field.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has hit safely in 11 of his last 13 games at a .385 clip (20-for-52)/.448 OBP/.827 SLG/1.275 OPS with 6 doubles, 1 triple, 5 homers, 12 RBI, 1 hit by pitch and 5 walks.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte**, in his last 10 games, is batting .344 (11-for-32)/1.226 OPS with 6 doubles, 2 triples, 2 homers, 8 RBI, 2 walks.
- ♦ **Chris Owings'** .383 average at Coors Field is second-highest among active players (min. 100 AB), behind Adrian Beltre (.400) and ahead of Buster Posey (.379).

## YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs had 9 extra-base hits in a 9-4 win @ Rockies.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** went 3-for-5 with a double, 2 home runs (9, 10) and 3 RBI...it was his first multi-home run game this season, 13th of his career (last: 3 HR on August 3, 2017 @ Cubs).
- ♦ **David Peralta** had 2 doubles and a homer (11), his fourth in 7 games.
- ♦ **Jake Lamb** hit a solo homer (3), the second of 3 D-back homer in the third inning (Goldschmidt, Peralta), the club's 26th time with 3-or-more homers in an inning in franchise history.
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** (5-4) earned the win (4 R-3 ER in 5.2 IP).
- ♦ **Andrew Chafin** (1.1 IP) **Yoshihisa Hirano** (1.0) and **T.J. McFarland** (1.0) combined to toss 3.1 shutout frames.

## D-BACKS ACQUIRE JON JAY FROM THE ROYALS

- ♦ On Wednesday, the D-backs acquired OF **Jon Jay** (No. 9) from the Royals for LHP Gabe Speier and RHP Elvis Luciano.
- ♦ Has hit over .290 in 6 of his 8 full seasons (2010-12, '14, '16-17)...his .996 career fielding pct. (8 E in 1,913 TC) leads active outfielders...his 67 postseason games are fifth most among active players...has appeared in 2 World Series (2011 and '13).
- ♦ In 59 games for the Royals, hit .307 (73-for-238) with 9 doubles, 2 triples, 1 homer, 18 RBI and 28 runs scored...made 27 starts in left field, 15 in center and 9 in right.

## GOLDY HEATING UP

- ♦ Among NL players since May 23 (min. 50 PA), **Paul Goldschmidt** is first with an .827 slugging pct. and 1.275 OPS, tied for first with 12 extra-base hits, tied for second with 5 homers, tied for sixth with a .385 average, seventh with a .448 on-base pct. and 14th with a .417 batting average on balls in play.
- ♦ In his last 8 road games, is hitting .469 (15-for-32) with 6 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers, 8 RBI and 3 walks...ranks among NL leaders on the road in slugging pct. (2nd, .636), extra-base hits (2nd, 20) and average (13th, .314).
- ♦ Goldschmidt's 1,576 total bases since 2013 are second among current NL players behind Nolan Arenado/COL (1,598) and ahead of Anthony Rizzo/CHI (1,524), Evan Longoria/TB-SF (1,516) and Andrew McCutchen/PIT-SF (1,501) [source: STATS].

## EXTRA EXTRA EXTRA EXTRA EXTRA EXTRA EXTRA

- ♦ **Ketel Marte's** last 9 hits have gone for extra bases...starting with May 29, he's had a double, homer, homer, triple, double, triple, double, double, double.
- ♦ Marte's streak is 1 shy of the franchise-record 10 extra-base hits in a row: Chris Iannetta (May 12-June 8, 2017), Paul Goldschmidt (May 7-21, 2014), Luis Gonzalez (April 7-20, 2006) and Steve Finley (September 4-9, 1999) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

## DESCALSO DISHING IT UP

- ♦ **Daniel Descalso**, in last 8 games, is hitting .360 (9-for-25)/1.212 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 2 homers, 9 RBI and 5 walks.
- ♦ In last 9 games vs. NL West, is hitting .435 (10-for-23)/1.345 OPS with 4 doubles, 1 triple, 1 homer, 9 RBI, 1 hit by pitch, 3 walks.
- ♦ In last 14 games vs. righties, is hitting .306 (11-for-36)/1.057 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers, 10 RBI and 5 walks.

- ◆ Koch is in his third full season in the D-backs' organization after being acquired from the Mets on Aug. 29, 2015 with RHP Miller Diaz for RHP Addison Reed.
- ◆ Entered 2017 rated by *Baseball America* as possessing the Best Control in the D-backs' system...also rated by MLB.com as Arizona's No. 17 prospect.
- ◆ Selected by the Mets in the third round of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft from the University of Louisville.

**WHAT TO KNOW**

- ◆ Is 2-0 with a 3.75 ERA (5 ER in 12.0 IP) in his last 2 starts.
- ◆ First career start vs. Rockies (second appearance).
- ◆ Is 1-1 with a 2.76 ERA (5 ER in 16.1 IP) in 3 road starts this season.

**LAST START**

- ◆ Tossed 7.0 scoreless innings with a career-high 6 strikeouts on June 3 vs. Marlins.
- ◆ Earned consecutive wins for the first time in his career.

**VS. ROCKIES**

- ◆ Has 1 career appearance vs. Rockies, earning the save on Sept. 13, 2016 @ Chase Field, tossing 4.0 scoreless innings with 4 strikeouts.

**VS. NL WEST**

- ◆ Is 1-0 with a 1.57 ERA (4 ER in 23.0 IP) in 6 career games (3 starts) vs. NL West opponents.
- ◆ Has allowed 2 runs or fewer in each appearance, limiting the opposition to a .163 average.

**ROAD RULES**

- ◆ Is 1-1 with a 2.76 ERA (5 ER in 16.1 IP) in 3 road starts this season.
- ◆ Has allowed 2 runs or fewer in each appearance, limiting the opposition to a .175 average

- ◆ Attended the University of Louisville...named to the 2010 All-NCAA Regional Team.
- ◆ Pitched for Chatham in the Cape Cod League and was named to the 2011 All-Star Team.
- ◆ Is a 2009 graduate of Washington (Iowa) High School in Cherokee, Iowa...was a 2-time All-State selection in baseball and track...holds the school record in the high jump...also played basketball and football.
- ◆ Was the student council president, class president and member of the National Honor Society in high school.
- ◆ Selected by Boston in the 37th round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign.

**ALL ABOUT THAT (RUNNERS ON) BASE**

- ◆ Is tied for ninth in the NL with a .176 opponent average with runners on base (also: Tanner Roark/WSH).

**DUDE THROWS STRIKES**

- ◆ Has posted a 64.7 strike percentage (1,064 pitches/688 strikes) and issued just 18 walks in 73.0 IP in his career.
- ◆ Averages just 3.68 pitches per plate appearance, lowest among D-backs starters and tied for eighth lowest in the NL.

**FIRST TIME THROUGH THE LINEUP**

- ◆ In 18 career games, has limited the opposition to a .193 AVG (23-for-119)/.256 OBP/.387 SLG the first time through the order.
- ◆ This season, has limited the opponents to a .210 AVG (17-for-81)/.256 OBP/.420 SLG the first time through the order.

**CY WHAT?!**

- ◆ Matched up against 3 different former Cy Young Award winning pitcher in 3 straight outings from May 1-11 (Clayton Kershaw on May 1; Justin Verlander on May 6; Max Scherzer on May 11), the first pitcher in team history to go through such a stretch...Scherzer (2009) and Brandon Webb (2008) each also had stretches of facing 3 straight Cy Young Award winners, but with repeats included [source: STATS LLC].
- ◆ Was the sixth NL pitcher since 2010 to have 3 straight starts against 3 different Cy Young Award winners, joining Luis Perdomo in 2017, Jimmy Nelson in 2014 (4 straight), Travis Wood in 2012, Tim Hudson in 2011 and Tim Stauffer from 2010-11.
