**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers lost to the Yankees, 2-1, on Saturday afternoon at Yankee Stadium. Jim Adduci, Nicholas Castellanos and JaCoby Jones each had two hits in the game, while Victor Martinez drove in Detroit's only run of the game with a first inning sacrifice fly. Daniel Norris started for the Tigers and took the loss, allowing two runs on one hit with one walk and seven strikeouts. Norris carried a perfect game into the fifth inning, until allowing a leadoff walk to Miguel Andújar. The Tigers and Yankees conclude their four-game series this afternoon. Following today's game, the road trip continues with three games at Chicago (AL) (September 3-5).

**CASTELLANOS, VERHAGEN EARN AUGUST HONORS:** Nicholas Castellanos and Drew VerHagen have been selected as the Tigers Player and Pitcher of the Month, respectively, for August. Castellanos played in 26 games during the month, hitting .283/.339/.443 with 16 runs scored, five doubles, four home runs and 15 RBI. VerHagen made 11 relief appearances in August, compiling a 1-0 record with a 2.70 ERA (16.2IP/5ER), a 1.14 WHIP and 17 strikeouts.

**NICK THE STICK:** Nicholas Castellanos went 2x3 with a walk in yesterday's game to notch his team-leading 45th multi-hit game of the season, which ranks seventh in the American League. Castellanos has hit safely in seven of his last 10 games, batting .325/.386/.450 with five runs scored, two doubles, one home run and three RBI during that stretch.

**THE DEUCE IS LOOSE:** Jim Adduci had a pair of hits in yesterday's game to record his 11th multi-hit game of the season and his third in the last five games. In 23 games since August 1, Adduci is batting .338/.363/.494 with six runs scored, five doubles, two triples, one home run and nine RBI.

**EARLY NO-NO'S:** Daniel Norris retired the first 12 batters he faced in yesterday's game, and threw 4.1 no-hit innings, until allowing a two-run home run to Gleyber Torres. Norris' performance followed Jordan Zimmermann's outing on Friday, in which he threw 5.1 no-hit innings. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, it marked the first time since June 1-2, 2016 that Detroit starters have thrown at least 4.0 no-hit innings in consecutive games. In that instance, Michael Fulmer took a no-hitter into the seventh at Los Angeles (AL) on June 1 and Matthew Boyd carried a no-no into the sixth on June 2 vs. New York (AL).

**TIGERS TIDBITS:** Daniel Stumpf struck out one in a scoreless two thirds of an inning yesterday. In six appearances since being recalled from Triple A Toledo on August 19, Stumpf has thrown 6.1 shutout innings with one hit allowed, one walk and eight strikeouts... Victor Martinez had one RBI in yesterday's game and now has 1,172 RBI in his Major League career. He is one RBI away from tying Bobby Bonilla (1,173) for 172nd in MLB history. Martinez has driven in seven runs in six games vs. the Yankees this season.

**CLOSE ENCOUNTERS:** The Tigers played their 42nd one-run game of the season yesterday, falling to 19-23 in those contests with a 2-1 win. Detroit's 42 one-run games are the third-most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 52 and Seattle, 51). In addition to the 42 one-run games, the Tigers have also played 26 games that have been decided by two runs.

**WALKING ON SUNSHINE:** The Tigers today will play their American League leading 63rd day game of the season (out of 137 games, 46.0%). Detroit has posted a 28-34 (.452) record in the day time this season, as opposed to 26-48 (.351) at night.

**ON THE ROAD:** The Tigers are 1-4 on their current nine-game road trip, which includes two games at Kansas City (0-2), four games at New York (AL) (1-2) and three games at Chicago (AL) (September 3-5).

Detroit is 20-48 (.294) on the road this season and has lost 28 of its last 35 games away from home. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .230 (535x2330) on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 5.02 ERA (575.1IP/321ER).

**NEW YORK STATE OF MIND:** New York (AL) has a 4-2 edge in the season series against Detroit. With yesterday's win, the Yankees clinched the season series. The Tigers have not won a season series against New York (AL) since 2011.

**ON DECK:** The Tigers continue their three-city, nine-game road trip tomorrow afternoon as they begin a three-game series at Chicago (AL). Detroit is 10-6 against the White Sox this season, clinching the season series for the eighth time in the last nine seasons. The Tigers are 6-0 at Guaranteed Rate Field this season, and their six-game winning streak in Chicago is the longest for the club since July 15, 1979-August 26, 1980, when they also won six in a row.

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

\*Enters today's game with a 54-82 (.397) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,122-1,121 (.500) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 53rd in baseball history.

\*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

\*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

\*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

\*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

\*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

**ABOUT MATTHEW:** Boyd will make his 27th start of the season this afternoon in the series finale at New York (AL).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Boyd suffered the loss in his start on Tuesday at Kansas City, allowing five runs on seven hits with three walks and four strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

**SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** Boyd has been one of the best pitchers in the American League since the All-Star break, posting a 4-4 record with a 3.14 ERA (48.2IP/17ER) and 44 strikeouts in eight starts. Among all AL pitchers in that span, Boyd ranks third in opponents batting average (.217, 39x180), while he is fourth in WHIP (0.99), tied for seventh in wins and 10th in ERA.

**VS. NEW YORK (AL):** Boyd has made two career starts against the Yankees, posting an 0-2 record with a 9.35 ERA (8.2IP/9ER) and five strikeouts. He last faced New York (AL) on August 22, 2017 and took the loss, giving up seven runs, five earned, on six hits with three walks and two strikeouts in 2.1 innings.

**ON THE ROAD:** Boyd has pitched in 43 games, including 41 as a starter, on the road in his career, compiling an 8-21 record with a 6.03 ERA (212.0IP/142ER) and 192 strikeouts. In 14 road starts this season, Boyd is 2-9 with a 5.75 ERA (76.2IP/49ER) and 74 strikeouts.

**AT YANKEE STADIUM:** Boyd is making his first career appearance at Yankee Stadium today.

**AGAINST THE AL EAST:** Boyd has made 17 career starts against teams from the American League East, posting a 2-6 record with a 5.70 ERA (85.1IP/54ER) and 79 strikeouts. In six starts vs. AL East teams this season, Boyd is 2-2 with a 3.59 ERA (42.2IP/17ER) and 43 strikeouts.

**RECORD IN SEPTEMBER:** Boyd has made 15 starts in his career in the month of September, compiling a 2-7 record with a 5.33 ERA (76.0IP/45ER) and 62 strikeouts. In six September starts last season, Boyd went 1-3 with a 2.95 ERA (36.2IP/12ER) and 30 strikeouts.

**LOOKING BACK AT BOYD'S AUGUST:** Boyd started five games in August, posting a 2-3 record with a 4.25 ERA (29.2IP/14ER) and 24 strikeouts.

**AMONG THE AL LEADERS:** Boyd currently ranks ninth in the American League with a .224 (122x545) opponents batting average.

**LEFT VS. RIGHT:** Lefthanded hitters have posted a .256 (88x344) career batting average vs. Boyd, while righties are hitting him at a .267 (359x1344) clip. In 26 starts this season, lefties are hitting .220 (28x127) against Boyd, while righthanded hitters are batting .225 (94x418).

**TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR MAY:** Boyd was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for May after posting a 3-2 record with a 3.18 ERA (34.0IP/12ER) and 31 strikeouts. He allowed three runs-or-less in five of his six starts in May.

**IMPRESSIVE START TO 2018:** Boyd threw 6.0-or-more innings and allowed one run-or-less in each of his first three starts this season. He became the first Tigers lefthanded pitcher since at least 1908 to work at least 6.0 innings and give up one run-or-less in each of his first three starts of the season.

**NEAR NO-NO:** Boyd came just one out shy of his first career no-hitter on September 17, 2017 vs. Chicago (AL). Boyd threw 8.2 no-hit innings before allowing a double to Tim Anderson. He completed the shutout, allowing just one hit and striking out five.

**STRONG FINISH TO 2017:** Boyd was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for September, 2017 after compiling a 1-3 record with a 2.95 ERA (36.2IP/12ER), 30 hits allowed, 11 walks and 30 strikeouts. Boyd ranked fourth in the American League with 36.2 innings pitched during the month, while he was 10th with a .216 (30x139) opponents batting average.

**NAMED A MINOR LEAGUE ALL-STAR:** Boyd was selected as a 2015 Minor League All-Star by *Baseball America*. In 19 starts in the minors in 2015, Boyd had a 9-2 record with a 1.65 ERA (114.2IP/21ER) and 108 strikeouts. He led all qualified starters in the Minor Leagues in WHIP (0.85) and opponent average (.176), while he was second in ERA.

**EARNING HIS FIRST BIG LEAGUE WIN:** Boyd picked up the first win of his Major League career in his Tigers debut on August 5, 2015 vs. Kansas City. Boyd allowed just one run on seven hits with two strikeouts in 7.0 innings vs. the Royals.

**MAKING HIS MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT:** Boyd made his Major League debut with the Toronto Blue Jays on June 27, 2015 against Texas. Boyd took the loss in the game, allowing four runs on nine hits with seven strikeouts in 6.2 innings. Boyd's seven strikeouts tied the Toronto record for most strikeouts by a pitcher making their debut as a starter (also, Mark Rzepczynski, July 7, 2009 at Tampa Bay). Also, his 6.2 innings pitched without issuing a walk were the most by a Toronto starter making their debut.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Boyd was acquired by the Tigers along with lefthanded pitchers Daniel Norris and Jairo Labourt from the Blue Jays on July 30, 2015 in exchange for lefthanded pitcher David Price. Boyd was selected by the Blue Jays in the sixth round of the 2013 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Boyd attended Oregon State University and helped the Beavers to the 2013 College World Series. He earned All-Pac-12 First Team honors and was named a third-team All-American by *Baseball America* as a senior.
