PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (31-23) vs SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (26-30)

Friday, June 1, 2018 – AT&T Park – 10:15 EDT – Game 55; Road 27

RHP Nick Pivetta (4-3, 3.26) vs RHP Chris Stratton (6-3, 4.97)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies defeated the Los Angeles Dodgers, 2-1, in a showdown between Aaron Nola and Clayton Kershaw ... Nola (W, 7-2) went 7.0 innings and allowed 1 run on 2 hits with 2 walks and 7 strikeouts ... Seranthony Dominguez was summoned in relief of Nola and retired all 6 Dodgers he faced as he recorded a two-inning save as the Phillies split the four-game series.
- STAFF NOTES:** The Phillies starting rotation has combined to post a 3.31 ERA (111 ER, 301.2 IP) this season which is fifth-best in the majors (best: HOU, 2.55) ... The staff also posted a 2.43 ERA in May which was the lowest ERA in a month by a Phillies staff since August, 2011 (2.34 ERA) ... After getting 7.0 marvelous innings from Aaron Nola last night in Los Angeles, the Phillies improved to 23-6 (.793) this season when the starting pitcher goes at least 6.0 innings ... Additionally, when the starter records at least one out in the 7th inning, the Phillies are now 19-1 with their only loss coming on May 11 against the Mets.
- YES SER!** Since making his major league debut on May 7, **Seranthony Dominguez** has tossed 13.2 scoreless innings over 11 appearances and has allowed only two singles and a hit by pitch ... **In other words, he has faced 43 batters this season and has retired 40 of them, 15 by strikeout (34.9% SO rate)** ... The Phillies are 10-1 in games which Dominguez has pitched ... His 13.2-inning scoreless streak to begin his career is the longest by a Phillies reliever since Todd Frohwirth began his career with 14.2 scoreless innings (1987-88), per *Elias*.
- NICK AT NITE:** Tonight's starter **Nick Pivetta** has posted a 3.26 ERA this season, which includes his start on May 4 at Washington (6 ER, 1.0 IP) ... Taken out of the equation, Pivetta has a 2.37 ERA (15 ER, 57.0 IP) in 10 of his 11 starts this year.
- HOMECOMING KINGS:** Several Phillies have connections to the Bay Area and Northern California ... **Rhys Hoskins** grew up in Sacramento and attended Sacramento State ... **Mitch Walding** was born in Lodi, about 80 miles from AT&T Park ... **Andrew Knapp** was born in Roseville and attended the University of California, Berkley ... All three players were signed by Phillies scout, **Joey Davis**.
- A LOOK BACK AT MAY:** As the calendar turns to June, the Phillies close the books on the month of May that saw them go 15-11 ... It marked Philadelphia's first winning record during the month since 2012 when they went 16-13 ... Additionally, Philadelphia reached the 30-win mark this season on May 29, 49 days earlier than last year when they reached 30 wins on July 16, as they won their fourth game back after the All-Star break to move to 30-60 ... Lastly, Phillies pitching posted a 3.00 combined ERA during the month which was the lowest team ERA in a single month since September of 2011 (2.92).
- A TALE OF TWO MONTHS:** Over 24 games and 65 plate appearances during the month of May, **Nick Williams** slashed .293/.369/.586 with 5 HR and 5 walks ... His 5 homers during the month were tied for 2nd-most on the team with Cesar Hernandez (5) trailing only Carlos Santana (7) ... Williams started the year with a .532 OPS through 59 plate appearances from 3/29-4/30 but from May 1 on, he has posted a .955 OPS in 65 plate appearances.
- PHILLIE SPECIAL:** After getting off to a 1-4 start to 2018, the Phillies have gone 30-19 over their last 49 games (4/5-current) ... Their .612 win percentage in this span ranks 2nd among all NL teams (best: MIL, .627) and 4th in the majors (best: NYY, .674) ... Philadelphia's +37 run differential is fourth-best in the NL and seventh-best in MLB this season.
- BACK IN THE BAY:** The Phillies face off against the Giants for the second and final time this season and for the first time since they completed a four-game sweep, May 7-10, their first four-game sweep against the Giants since 1982 ... In that series, Phillies pitchers struck out 55 of the 140 hitters they faced, a 39.3 % strikeout rate that set a new franchise record in a four-game series (previous: 34.8 %, April 2016 vs SD) ... The 55 punchouts were the club's most ever in a four-game series and the second-most in any series in franchise history, shy of only a 59 strikeout performance in a five-game series against the New York Mets, May 29-June 2, 2014 ... The Phillies have won each of their last six games against the Giants, their longest streak since May 13-August 16, 1990 (also 6) ... A win tonight would mark Philadelphia's first seven-game winning streak against the Giants since May 14, 1981-May 16, 1982.
- GO WEST, YOUNG MAN:** Tonight marks the fifth game of a 10-game, 11-day road trip that began at Dodger Stadium for four games (2-2, 5/28-31), followed by a three-game set against the Giants in San Francisco (6/1-3) before concluding with three games against the Cubs at Wrigley (6/5-7) ... Following this trip, the Phillies will head home where they will play 15 of their final 21 games of the month of June at Citizens Bank Park.
- DRAFT INFO:** The Phillies have the third overall selection in the 2018 First Year Player Draft which will begin live on MLB Network and MLB.com on Monday, June 4th at 7:00 p.m. (ET) ... Representing the Phillies live at the Draft will be Larry Bowa and Mickey Morandini.

LAST START: 5/27 vs TOR: L, 5.0 IP, 4 H, 2 R, 2 ER 2 BB, 7 SO ... Pivetta vs Happ ... Down 4-0 in the home half of the 6th inning, the Phillies rallied for 3 runs as Aaron Altherr (2 RBI) and Nick Williams (RBI) led the charge ... Toronto would hold the Phils scoreless over the final 3.0 innings to take the game and the series.

TONIGHT'S START:

- Saint Nick: Pivetta is 3-1 with a 1.13 ERA (3 ER, 24.0 IP), 0.75 WHIP (4 BB, 14 H) and 32 SO in his last 4 starts ...** In each of those starts he has allowed 2 or fewer runs, 2 or fewer walks, 4 or fewer hits and at least 7 strikeouts ... **Since at least 1908, no Phillies starter has ever had 4 straight such starts, and the only others to even have 3 are Aaron Nola, Paul Byrd, Steve Carlton, Chris Short and Robin Roberts**
- Reverse, Reverse: The Phillies went just 5-14 in Pivetta's first 19 career starts (6.73 ERA), and have gone 14-4 in his 18 starts since (3.66 ERA)**
- Last 14: Is 7-3, 2.76 ERA (23 ER, 75.0 IP) with 86 SO in his last 14 starts since 9/18/17 ...** Has allowed 5 hits or fewer in 13 of those 14 starts
- Going Off-Base:** Pivetta's 1.09 WHIP (14 BB, 49 H) is almost 50 % lower than his WHIP in 2017 (1.51) ... He has allowed 5 or fewer hits in 10 of his 11 starts and 2 or fewer walks in 9 of 11, whereas in 2017 allowed 5 or fewer hits just 14 times all season (26 starts) and 2 or fewer walks 15 times
- vs NL West:** 2-4, 6.48 ERA (24 ER, 33.1 IP) in 7 starts

- 2018:** 1-1, 5.82 ERA (11 ER, 17.0 IP) in 4 starts
- Career:** 5-8, 6.49 ERA (62 ER, 86.0 IP) in 18 starts
- Has a 6.49 ERA with 81 strikeouts and 43 walks in 86.0 IP in 18 career road starts and a 4.11 ERA with 126 strikeouts and 28 walks in 105.0 IP in 19 home starts

2018 SEASON:

- Allowed just 1 run in 19.0 IP (0.47 ERA) over 3 starts, 5/16-27, including a 14.0-inning scoreless streak
- Tied a career-high with 11 SO on 5/16 at BAL ... Became 3rd PHI pitcher since 2010 with 7.0 + IP, 2 or fewer hits and 11+ strikeouts in a game (others: Halladay's perfect game, 5/29/10 at FLA and Hamels' no-hitter, 7/25/15 at CHI)
- Matched up against the Braves and RHP Mike Foltynewicz 4 times in PHI's first 46 games, first time two ML starters have squared off 4 times in first 46 team games since 1959 (PHI's Robin Roberts & MIL's Lew Burdette) - Elias
- Had a career-best 4-game win streak come to an end on 4/28 vs ATL ... It was also the end of a string of 9 team wins in 9 straight Pivetta starts since 9/12/17, the longest such streak since PHI won 9 straight Cole Hamels starts in 2012
- His string of 8 straight starts allowing 5 hits or fewer from 9/18/17-4/22/18 was the longest by a Phillies starter since 1994 (David West, 10)
- Did not allow a home run in 41.2 consecutive IP over parts of 8 starts, 9/18/17 vs LAD to 4/22/18 vs PIT
- Struck out 9 batters and did not walk any on 4/11 vs CIN, becoming the first Phillie to do so since Mark Leiter Jr. accomplished the feat in relief, 8/5/17 vs COL and the first Phillies starter to do so since Vince Velasquez, 4/14/16 vs SD
- Had a career-best 18.0-inning scoreless streak (since 9/18/17) come to an end in the 3rd inning of his season debut, 3/31 at ATL

2017 SEASON:

- Among ML rookies, was 1st in SO/9.0 IP (9.47, min. 125.0 IP), 3rd in SO (140), 4th in starts (26) and 7th in innings (133.0)
- Was tied for the 9th-most SO in a season ever by a Phillies rookie and had the highest SO/9.0 IP and SO rate (24.0%) of any Phillies rookie ever to make at least 25 starts
- Had the most starts (26) in a single season by a Phillies rookie since 1990, when Pat Combs started 31
- Among all NL pitchers (min. 125.0 IP), ranked 4th in lowest % of pitches put in play (15.7), trailing ARI's Robbie Ray (13.7), WSH's Max Scherzer (14.3) and LAD's Rich Hill (14.7)

CAREER:

- Acquired by Philadelphia from WSH for RHP Jonathan Papelbon and cash, 7/28/15 ... Originally selected by WSH in the 4th round of the June 2013 draft ... Attended New Mexico Junior College
- Pitched for Canada in 2017 World Baseball Classic ... Was a member of the Canadian Junior National Team from 2009-12 ... Was the first Canadian-born starting pitcher to debut for the Phillies since 6/17/06 (Scott Mathieson vs TB)
