MARINERS NOTES:

- The Mariners have won or tied 25 of their first 33 series this season, posting a series record of 19-8-6.
- The Mariners improve to 7-4 in rubber games this season (games to decide the outcome of a 3-game series).
- The Mariners scored 5 runs in the 1st inning, tying their season-high for runs scored in an inning (7x, last: 5/18 vs. DET).
- Nelson Cruz** leads the club with 22 home runs, followed by **Ryon Healy** (20)...the Mariners are 5th team in the Majors with at least 2 players with 20+ home runs apiece (also: Boston, Cleveland, Colorado and New York-AL).
- Ryon Healy** (3x4, 2 R, 2 HR, 6 RBI) hit 2 home runs and picked up a career-high 6 RBI...he is the 2nd Mariners player this season to record 2 HR and 6+ RBI in a game (also: Nelson Cruz, 2 HR, 7 RBI on June 22 vs. BOS).
 - Becomes the 5th Mariners player in club history with a pair of 3-run home runs in a game, including the second this season. He joins Edgar Martinez (5/26/97 at MIN), Bret Boone (6/4/01 vs. TEX), Justin Smoak (5/30/12 at TEX) and Nelson Cruz (6/22/18 at BOS)
 - Marked his 7th career multi-homer game, including his 3rd this season (also: 4/29 at CLE and 6/12 vs. LAA).
 - His 6 RBI surpassed his previous career-high of 5 RBI, done twice (last: 7/8/18 vs. COL).
 - Becomes the 4th American League player with 2 games of 5+ RBI this season (also: Edwin Encarnacion-CLE, Evan Gattis-HOU and Josh Reddick-HOU).
 - His home run in the 1st inning marked the first home run hit by the Mariners since 7/11 vs. LAA... the 6 game stretch without a home run was tied for the longest by any team this season (also: CWS, 6/6-11 & CIN 4/16-22).
 - Picked up his 13th multi-RBI game of the season... has homered in 10 of those 13 games.
 - Recorded his 18th multi-hit game of the season.
- Marco Gonzales** is 4-0 with a 1.27 ERA (4 ER, 28.1 IP) with 24 strikeouts and 3 walks over his last 4 starts...in each of his last 4 starts, has worked at least 6.0 innings, allowed 2 or fewer runs and surrendered 6 or fewer hits.
 - Has recorded a quality start in 8 of his last 11 outings.
 - Has walked only 3 batters over his last 5 starts...came into today's game ranked T4th in the AL with a 1.7 BB/9 ratio.
 - Is 5-1 with a 2.94 ERA (19 ER, 58.0 IP) with 59 strikeouts and 15 walks in 10 starts at Safeco Field this season.
 - Faced 26 consecutive batters without allowing a hit or a walk, spanning his previous start on July 11 at Los Angeles-AL through today vs. the White Sox...retired the last 11 Angels batters on July 11 before retiring 14 of the first 15 batters he faced today (reached on error) until issuing a walk to Kevan Smith leading off the 6th inning.
 - Retired 25 of 26 batters faced during this span (reached on error).
- Mitch Haniger** (0x1, 2 R, 3 BB) has walked 2+ times in back-to-back games for the first time in his career...he has tallied at least 2 walks 9 times this season...his 9 games with 2+ walks are tied for 8th-most in the American League (also: Jose Altuve-HOU, Alex Bregman-HOU, Justin Smoak-TOR and Justin Upton-LAA)...entered play today ranked T11th in the AL (also: George Springer-HOU) with 46 walks.
 - Has recorded 5 walks in his last 8 plate appearances.
- Jean Segura** (1x4, R) has hit safely in 6 straight games, batting .250 (6x24) with 5 runs scored, 1 double and 1 walk over that span.
 - Picked up his 15th stolen base of the season...ranks T10th in the AL.
- Dee Gordon** (1x4, 3B) recorded his team-leading 4th triple of the season.
 - Leads the Majors with 40 triples since 2013.
 - The Mariners are 43-24 (.642) when he records a hit this season.

WHITE SOX NOTES:

- The White Sox fall to 1-4-1 over their last 6 series.
- Reynaldo López** has suffered a loss in each of his last 3 starts.
 - Walked 4 batters in today's game to bring his season total to 51 walks, 4th-most in the AL.
 - Is 2-6, 4.95 (35 ER, 63.2 IP) on the road this season, compared to 2-2, 3.17 (19 ER, 54.0 IP) at home.

- **Tim Anderson** (2x4, R, HR, 2 RBI) hit a 2-run home run in the 6th inning...was his first home run since June 23 vs. Oakland, snapping a streak of 20 consecutive games without a home run.
 - Recorded his 22nd multi-hit game of the season.

WHITE SOX MANAGER RICK RENTERIA:

On López having a rough 1st inning, but keeping the team in the game:

"Yes, he did. Yeah he kept us in the game. Again, had some trouble with some base on balls today. Tried to find his zone, you could see he was leaving pitched out over the plate a little bit and he got roughed around. Settled down, ended up benefiting from some first-pitch outs that gave him some more pitches to work with. He got us through five, and I thought it really wasn't his day today. He got us through five and did enough to keep us in the ballgame."

On what Marco Gonzales did to keep the White Sox off balance:

"Exactly, keeping us off balance. I thought he used a nice mix of pitches. He was commanding the zone. He was elevating when he wanted to, fading it soft, running it in. He was doing everything he wanted to do, it seemed like. It kept us off balance. I think the guys tried to put themselves in a better position, but he did a nice job of just doing what he does, which is pitch."
