**RAY MATTER**—The Rays are 4-1 in their last 5 games and 13-3 in their last 16 games since Aug 19 at BOS, and they have outscored opponents, 79-47, over that stretch...at 11 games over .500, they are one win shy of matching their high-water mark of the season...the Rays went 5-3 on their 8-game road trip to Atlanta (1-1), Cleveland (2-1) and Toronto (2-1), and starting tonight 16 of the club's final 23 games of the season are at home.

- + On Wed at TOR, the Rays lost to snap a 4-game winning streak... they allowed double-digit runs for the 11th time this season, first since July 29 at BAL (15), and their 16 hits allowed tied April 26 at BAL for their 2nd-most this season to May 13 at BAL (19).
- + The Rays are 26-17 (.605) since the All-Star break, tied for the 5th-best winning pct. in the majors since then, and 4th in the AL.

**DOME SWEET DOME**—The Rays have won eight consecutive home games, matching June 11-26 for their longest such streak of the season... from Aug 20-26, the Rays swept a multi-series homestand for the first time in franchise history, going 7-0 against the Royals (4-0) and Red Sox (3-0)...since June 11, the Rays are 29-8 (.784) at home, best home winning pct. in the majors over that span ahead of the Red Sox (25-7, .781) and Rockies (26-11, .703)...they were 12-16 (.429) at home before this stretch.

- + The Rays have won in walk-off fashion eight times this season, tied with the A's for most in the AL and their most since 2013 (13)... they have hit four walk-off home runs, tied for most in the AL.
- + Since May 26, the Rays have played 43 games at home: 32 wins, 10 1-run losses, and 1 loss by 2 runs or more (July 24 vs. NYY, 4-0).

**WHERE WE STAND**—Both the Rays and Athletics were idle yesterday, but the Rays lost ground with Wednesday's results and they are 8 GB of the A's with 23 games remaining...the Rays have a 1.3 pct. chance of making the postseason according to Baseball Prospectus, a 0.2 pct. chance of doing so according to FanGraphs and 0.1 pct. chance per ESPN.com.

- + The Rays are on pace for 87 wins, and since the second Wild Card was introduced in 2012 the only teams to win that many and miss the postseason are the 2014 Mariners (87), 2013 Rangers (91, lost tiebreaker game vs. TB), 2012 Angels (89) and 2012 Rays (90).
- + It's worth noting that with 23 games remaining in 2011, the Rays were 76-63 and 8.0 GB of the Red Sox for the AL's lone Wild Card... that season, the Rays passed the Red Sox on the final day.
- + A team with the same record as the Rays would be 1.5 GB in the NL East, 2.0 GB in the NL West and 4.5 GB in the AL Central.

**CAN'T PREDICT BALL**—In the 10-3 loss on Wed at TOR, the Rays yielded 7 runs in the 1st inning, one shy of their season high for a single frame (July 27 at BAL, 8-run 7th inning)...the 7 runs allowed in the 1st inning were only one shy of matching their total from the previous 4 games combined, and it was more than the total from their previous 7 games against the Blue Jays combined (5)...they allowed 6 hits in the frame, after allowing 5 hits or fewer in each of their previous 7 games against them.

**RAYS vs. ORIOLES**—This weekend wraps up the season series between the Rays and Orioles, and the Rays are 8-8 so far (4-2 at home, 4-6 on the road)...the Rays have allowed 102 runs and 32 HR in the season series, averages of 6.38 runs and 2.00 HR per game...their highest marks against a single opponent in a season are 136 runs in 2002 against the Blue Jays and 33 HR (see chart)...the Rays were outscored, 84-51, and outhomered, 25-10, in the 10 games in Baltimore, and the 84 runs and 25 HR allowed were both their most all-time for a single season at a visiting venue.

- + The Rays have lost by 9+ runs three times against the O's, and their margin of defeat has been 9+ runs once in their other 123 games.
- + Four times this season the Rays have allowed back-to-back homers to the Orioles, and they've done it twice against all other teams.

**ABOUT THE OFFENSE**—The Rays rank 3rd in the AL with a .257 avg. and 4th in the AL with a .329 OBP...in the last 14 games, the Rays are averaging 5.43 runs, including 4 runs or more 12 times and 5 runs or more nine times...they have recorded double-digit hits in 10 of their last 14 games.

- + **Malle Smith** ranks 8th in the AL with a .302 avg. and is attempting to become the first qualifying Ray to hit .300 or better since **Casey Kotchman** (.306) in 2011...**Joey Wendle** ranks 2nd among major league rookies with a .297 avg., pct. points behind NYY **Miguel Andujar** and is attempting to finish with the best avg. for a rookie in club history, currently held by **Rocco Baldelli** (.289) in 2003.
- + The Rays have totaled 124 HR this season, 4th-fewest in the majors, and are on pace for 145 HR, which would be 83 HR fewer than their club-record 228 HR last season...they have won 25 games this season without the benefit of a home run, most in the majors, and they are 26-6 (.813) when hitting multiple homers in a game.
- + The Rays rank 4th in the majors with 99 SB and 1st with a club-record 85 HBP...they are on pace for 99 HBP, which would rank 2nd in AL history behind the 2008 Indians (103).

**CHANGE IN APPROACH**—The Rays have reduced their strikeout rate (SO/PA) from 25.0 pct. in 2017 to 22.6 pct. in 2018, the largest drop in the majors ahead of Oakland (24.3 to 22.0)...with Major League Baseball on pace to break its own strikeout record for an 11th consecutive season, the Rays are one of only eight major league teams that have reduced their SO/PA ratio from 2017...from 2017 to 2018, the Rays have raised their season batting avg. from .245 to .257 and their avg. with RISP from .227 to .248.

**THE OUTLAW**—On Wed at TOR, **Kevin Kiermaier** recorded the third multi-HR game of his career, following Aug 23, 2017 vs. TOR and Sep 8, 2016 at NYY...his first homer was his first since July 28 at BAL, snapping his homerless drought at 114 AB, and was his first to the opposite field since Sep 7, 2014 vs. BAL, according to Baseball Reference.

**SNELL-ZILLA**—Tonight's starter **Blake Snell** has a 2.02 ERA this season, 3rd in the majors behind NYM **Jacob deGrom** (1.68) and BOS **Chris Sale** (1.97)...he is on pace to set a single-season club record, currently held by **David Price** in 2012 (2.56)—the year he won the AL Cy Young Award...his 17 wins are tied with NYY **Luis Severino** for 2nd in the majors behind CLE **Corey Kluber**, and are tied for 3rd for a single season in club history.

- + Snell was named the AL Pitcher of the Month for August, the fifth Rays pitcher to receive the monthly honor and first since rookie **Chris Archer** did so in July 2013...since Aug 4, Snell has yielded 1 ER or fewer in six consecutive starts, matching the longest such streak in franchise history, excluding openers.

**MINOR MATTERS**—Triple-A Durham, Double-A Montgomery, Class-A Bowling Green and Short-A Hudson Valley all won postseason games last night, with the Hot Rods advancing to the Midwest League semifinals and the Renegades moving on to the New York-Penn League Championship Series...the Bulls and Biscuits are both tied, 1-1, in the best-of-5 International League semis and Southern League semis, respectively.

- + LH **Matthew Liberatore** has been named the organization's Pitcher of the Month for August, after going 2-1 with a 0.79 ERA (22.2-IP, 2-ER) in 5 starts between two levels...INF **Vidal Brujan** hit .390/.487/.690 (39-for-100) with 9 2B, 3 3B, 5 HR, 14 RBI and 13 SB between two levels as the organization's Player of the Month.
- + Double-A INF **Nick Solak** was named the Southern League Player of the Month for August, batting .305 (25-for-82) with a league-leading .404 OBP, .537 SLG and .941 OPS.

**LAST START**—On Sat at CLE, yielded 8 hits, his most since May 8, 2017 vs. KC (10), but yielded only 2 R/1 ER in 6.2 IP, both in the 2nd inning, on RBI doubles by **Melky Cabrera** (unearned) and **Yan Gomes**...was replaced after a 7th-inning, 2-out single, snapping a streak of 10 straight batters retired...yielded 7 hits and 1 BB through 4 IP but 1 hit in his final 2.2 IP...his line: W, 6.2 IP, 8 H, 2 R/1 ER, 1 BB, 9 SO, 101 pit, 62 str.

**THE WIN COLUMN**—Has won five straight decisions, longest streak of his career and tied with **Ryan Yarbrough's** current streak for the longest by a Ray since **Drew Smyly** (5) from July 30–Sep 13, 2016...is attempting to become the first Ray to win six straight decisions since **Jake Odorizzi** (6) from July 17–Aug 25, 2016...is also attempting to tie the club record by winning a sixth straight start (without a no-decision in between); would join **David Price** from June 25–July 25, 2014, **Matt Moore** (June 20–July 22, 2013, Sep 29, 2012–April 27, 2013) and **Scott Kazmir** (May 10–June 6, 2008).

+ His 17 wins this season are tied with NYY **Luis Severino** for 2nd in the majors behind CLE **Corey Kluber** (18)...is tied with **Matt Moore** in 2013 for 3rd in a single season in club history, trailing **David Price** in 2012 (20) and 2010 (19).

**HE LIKES IT HERE**—Has allowed 1 ER or fewer in 14 consecutive home starts since Sep 12, 2017 vs. NYY, the longest such streak in the majors since 1913—when earned runs were officially kept in both leagues—according to the Elias Sports Bureau...has pitched to a 1.06 ERA at home—min. 50 IP, no pitcher has finished a season with a home ERA that low since MIL **Cal Eldred** (0.76) in 1992...min. 50 IP, in club history the lowest ERA at home over an entire season is held by **David Price** (1.81) in 2012.

**SIXTH SENSE**—Has yielded 1 ER or fewer in six consecutive starts, matching **Erasmus Ramirez** from June 15–July 18, 2015 for the longest streak in franchise history, excluding openers...is 5-0 with a 1.10 ERA (32.2-IP, 4-ER) in these 6 starts, best in the AL and 3rd in the majors over that span.

+ In 11 starts since June 19, is 9-1 with a 1.26 ERA (64.1-IP, 9-ER)...despite a stint on the disabled list, leads the majors in wins since then.  
 + In 17 starts since May 18, is 13-2 with a 1.44 ERA (99.2-IP, 16-ER), leading the majors in wins and ERA (min. 75 IP) during that stretch.

**LEADERBOARDS**—His 2.02 ERA ranks 3rd in the majors behind NYM **Jacob deGrom** (1.68) and BOS **Chris Sale** (1.97)...led the AL in ERA through July 9, joining **David Price** in 2012 as the only pitchers in club history to hold the AL lead in ERA in July or later, according to Stats LLC...his 2.02 ERA would set a club record among qualifiers, ahead of Price (2.56) in 2012...also ranks among AL leaders in opp avg. (.186, 2nd), WHIP (1.01, 4th) SO/9 IP ratio (10.50, 7th), HR/9 IP ratio (0.83, 5th) and wild pitches (13, tied for 3rd)...min. 100 IP, leads the majors with a .092 opp avg. with RISP and a .063 opp avg. with RISP/2 outs...according to FanGraphs, is averaging 95.7 mph on his fastball, 4th in the AL, and 14.4 pct. of his total pitches are swings and misses, 3rd in the AL.

+ Has a chance to pass Sale and reclaim the AL ERA lead tonight...would do so with 4+ IP (scoreless) or 8.1+ IP allowing 1 ER or fewer.

**PITCHER OF THE MONTH**—Named the American League Pitcher of the Month for August...he became the fifth Rays pitcher to receive the monthly honor, joining **Chris Archer** in July 2013, **Jeremy Hellickson** in May 2011, **David Price** in Sep 2010 and **Scott Kazmir** in May 2008...went 4-0 with a 1.04 ERA (26-IP, 3-ER) in 5 starts in August; his 4 wins tied the club record for August and tied four others for the AL lead...min. 25 IP, his ERA led the AL and his 11.77 SO/9 IP ratio ranked 4th in the AL...his ERA was the best in club history for August and 4th-best in club history for any calendar month.

**WHEN HE'S ON**—Has yielded 1 run or fewer in 17 starts, 2nd in the majors behind TB **Ryne Stanek** (18)—who has made 24 starts this season but none longer than 2 IP...excluding openers, they are the most by an AL pitcher since SEA **Félix Hernández** (17) in 2012...has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 22 starts, tied with WAS **Max Scherzer** (22) and PHI **Aaron Nola** (22) for 2nd in the majors to Stanek (23)...has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 15 of his last 17 starts.

+ Excluding openers, his 17 starts of 1 run or fewer are a single-season club record, passing **James Shields** (16) in 2011, and his 22 starts of 2 runs or fewer are tied with **David Price** in 2012 for the single-season club record.

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

- to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
