### TRIBE HEADLINES

» The Indians' 33-29 record through 62 games sits two wins ahead of the 102-win 2017 club (31-31)...Cleveland is the only divisional leader in MLB with a lead larger than 1.5 games, as they enter play today with a 4.0-game lead over second-place Detroit.

» **COREY KLUBER** is set to face the Tigers for the second time and an A.L. Central division opponent for the fifth time this season... is 4-0 with a 0.33 ERA (1ER/27.2IP) against the Central so far... enters today's game leading the A.L. in walks-per-9.0IP (1.0) and wins (9, T1st), while ranking 2nd in ERA (1.96), innings pitched (91.2) and opponent on-base percentage (.228).

» **MICHAEL BRANTLEY** went 2-for-3 last night and is batting .330 (31-94) with three doubles, six home runs, 18 runs scored and 20 RBI in 23 games vs. the A.L. Central this season.

» Cleveland owns a 15-4 record in its last 19 games vs. Detroit, posting a 1.99 team ERA (38ER/171.2IP) in that span.

### YESTERDAY'S RECAP

» The Tribe used a pair of solo homers to tie the game twice yesterday, before falling 4-2 to the Tigers in 12 innings.

» **YAN GOMES** got the Indians on the board, knotting the score at 1-1 with a solo homer in the top of the 3rd...after the Tigers regained the lead in the 7th, **RAJAI DAVIS** led off the 8th with a game-tying solo shot, his first longball of the year.

» **MICHAEL BRANTLEY** went 2-for-3 and recorded his 20th multi-hit game of the year...**LONNIE CHISENHALL** hit his second double of the season, finishing the game 1-for-5.

» **MIKE CLEVINGER** did not factor into hte decision but recorded his eighth quality start of the season, tossing 6.2 innings and allowing two runs on four hits, with three walks and five strikeouts...Clevinger also retired 17 batters in a row from the 1st to 7th innings...**OLIVER PÉREZ** (0.1IP), **NEIL RAMÍREZ** (2.0IP, 1H), **DAN OTERO** (1.0IP, 2H, 1BB) and **ZACH McALLISTER** (1.0IP, 1H, 2K) each recorded a scoreless outing in relief.

### MOTOWN MATCHUP

» The Indians and Tigers are squaring off this weekend in the third of six scheduled series between the clubs, including their second set here at Comerica Park.

» The Tribe owns a 6-3 record against the Tigers through nine matchups...the teams first met from April 9-12 at Progressive Field, where Cleveland recorded a four-game sweep, outscoring Detroit 18-5...the Tigers took two of three contests in Detroit from May 14-16, snapping an 11-game losing streak vs. the Indians.

» Cleveland has gone 15-4 vs. Detroit since July 7, 2017, allowing three-or-fewer runs in all 15 of their wins...over that span, Tribe pitching has posted a 1.99 ERA (38ER/171.2IP).

» The Indians own an overall franchise record of 1090-1121 (.493) against the Tigers in a 118-year-old rivalry (1901)...the two clubs have combined for six of the last seven A.L. Central division titles.

### CENTRAL FOCUS

» This afternoon's contest marks the third of 16 consecutive scheduled games against A.L. Central opponents, Cleveland's longest divisional stretch of the season...with the exception of the team's recent two-game set vs. Milwaukee, 23 of the Tribe's 25 contests from May 28 - June 20 are set to come against divisional opponents.

» Cleveland has gone 15-9 thus far against the A.L. Central, going 4-2-1 across seven completed series...the club's .625 intra-divisional winning percentage is currently tied for the 4th-best in the American League (77th in MLB)...the Tribe is 4-7 in divisional road games, compared to 11-2 at Progressive Field.

### RUBBER REDUX

» The Indians are 3-3 in rubber games this season, including 3-0 at home and 0-3 on the road...Tribe seeks its first rubber game victory on the road this afternoon.

» **COREY KLUBER** has started three of the Indians' six rubber games, posting a 2-0 record and 2.14 ERA (5ER/21.0IP) across those three outings...Tribe won two of the three contests, May 2 vs. Texas and May 13 vs. Kansas City, and fell in a 13th-inning walk-off on April 4 at Los Angeles-AL.

### KLUBER DAY

» **COREY KLUBER** is due on the mound in today's series finale in Detroit, making his 14th start of the season.

» Kluber will face the Tigers for the second time this season, after tossing 8.0 shutout innings against them on April 9 at Progressive Field (2H, 1BB), while striking out a season-high 13 batters...has compiled a career 9-7 mark and 3.75 ERA (59ER/141.2IP) in 23 appearances (22 starts) vs. Detroit.

» He has dominated the A.L. Central this season, posting a **4-0 record and 0.33 ERA (1ER/27.2IP) in his four divisional starts.** » Has not walked a batter since his start on May 8 at Milwaukee, a career-long span of 35.1 innings and the longest such streak by a Tribe pitcher since **Paul Byrd's** 48.0 inning run in 2007.

» **Kluber has also allowed three-or-fewer runs in each of his last 25 starts, the longest such streak by an Indians pitcher in the Baseball Reference Play Index era (1908-)...streak is tied with Chicago-NL's King Cole (25G in 1910) for the 3rd-longest such streak in MLB.**

» Kluber enters today's game ranking among the American League pitching leaders in walks-per-9.0IP (1.0, 1st), wins (9, 1st), ERA (1.96, 2nd), innings pitched (91.2, 2nd), opponent on-base percentage (.228, 2nd), opponent batting average (.203, 7th) and (95, 8th).

### HIT MAN OF THE CENTRAL

» **MICHAEL BRANTLEY** went 2-for-3 with a walk last night, marking his 20th multi-hit game of the season (T14th in the A.L.).

» In 23 intradivisional games this season, **Brantley is batting .330 (31-94) with three doubles, six home runs, 18 runs scored and 20 RBI**...so far this season, his RBI total vs. the Central is T2nd among all hitters, behind Minnesota's **Eddie Rosario** (23).

» Among A.L. Central hitters with at least 45 plate appearances vs. the division, **Brantley's .330 batting average ranks 2nd behind Rosario (.363).**

### STARTING STRONG

» The Indians' starting pitching has been an asset throughout the season, and Tribe starters enter play today with a 3.47 ERA (2nd in A.L., 5th in MLB).

» Cleveland has posted 27 starts of 7.0-or-more innings this season, the most in MLB...**MIKE CLEVINGER's** quality start yesterday afternoon gave the Tribe 40 such starts on the season, 2nd-most in MLB behind Houston (49).

» Including **TREVOR BAUER's** 12-strikeout performance on Friday, Indians starters have recorded 12 starts this season with double-digit strikeouts, T2nd in MLB...Bauer's five starts with double-digit strikeouts are T2nd in MLB, while **COREY KLUBER** is T4th with four such starts.

### SCORE TACTICS

» The Indians enter play today with 303 runs scored, 4th-most in the American League (7th in MLB)...their 201 runs since May 1 are the most in the Major Leagues.

» Cleveland also ranks 3rd in MLB this season with 92 longballs, trailing only New York-AL (103) and Boston (95)...**yesterday's game marked the Tribe's 27th contest with two-or-more home runs,** which is tied with Milwaukee for 3rd in MLB, behind Boston (32) and New York-AL (29).

» The Indians and Yankees are the only MLB teams boasting five players with 10-or-more home runs...**Cleveland is the only MLB team boasting five batters with 35-or-more RBI,** as no other club has more than three such hitters.

» The Tribe also places among MLB leaders with a .438 team slugging percentage (3rd), 217 extra-base hits (4th), a .757 team OPS (5th) and 120 doubles (8th).

### LOOKING AHEAD: FOUR IN THE WINDY CITY

» After the conclusion of this series, the Indians will continue their current stretch of intradivisional contests, heading to Chicago for a four-game series against the White Sox

» Cleveland swept Chicago-AL a few weeks ago in a three-game series from May 28-30 at Progressive Field...Tribe posted a 13-6 mark against the White Sox in 2017, including an 8-2 mark at Guaranteed Rate Field...since **Terry Francona** became skipper in 2013, the Indians have gone 63-35 (.643) against Chicago-AL.

### THIS DAY IN INDIANS HISTORY

**1959: Rocky Colavito** ties the Major League record by slugging four home runs in the Tribe's 11-8 victory over the Orioles in Baltimore...Colavito hit two-run homers in the 3rd & 6th, and solo shots in the 5th & 9th, finishing the game 4-for-4 with five runs scored, six RBI and a walk...he went on to lead the American League with 42 longballs in 1959, and hit 190 homers in his eight years with the Indians, good for 10th on the Tribe's all-time leaderboard.

**TODAY'S START VS. DETROIT**

» Kluber is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season in today's series finale at Detroit...will mark his 182nd career appearance and 177th start.  
 » Will be pitching today on regular four days' rest after his last outing on June 5 vs. Milwaukee...earned the win, surrendering one run on seven hits, with zero walks and seven strikeouts over 7.0 innings.  
 » He will face the Tigers for the second time this season, after tossing 8.0 shutout innings (2H, 1BB, 13K) against them in the Tribe's 2-0 win on April 9 at Progressive Field...owns a career 9-7 mark and 3.75 ERA (59ER/141.2IP) in 23 appearances (22 starts) vs. Detroit.  
 » Enters this afternoon ranked among the American League pitching leaders in walks-per-9.0IP (1.0, 1st), wins (9, 1st), ERA (1.96, 2nd), innings pitched (91.2, 2nd), opponent on-base percentage (.228, 2nd), opponent batting average (.203, 7th) and strikeouts (95, 8th).

**LAST TIME OUT | 2018 RECAP**

» Kluber won his fourth consecutive decision in his last start on June 5 vs. Milwaukee...fanned seven batters and allowed one run on seven hits over 7.0 innings...**did not walk a batter, extending his walkless innings streak to 35.1 innings**, which is the longest active such streak in MLB and the longest such run by a Tribe pitcher since Paul Byrd's stretch of 48.0 innings from April 26-June 6, 2007.  
 » Marked his 13th quality start in as many outings this season, which is the longest such streak by a Tribe starting pitcher since Hall-of-Famer Stan Coveleski began the 1918 campaign with a string of 16 quality starts.  
 » Kluber has allowed three-or-fewer runs in each of his last 25 starts dating back to August 3, 2017, which is the longest streak by an Indians starter in the Baseball-Reference Play Index era (1908-)...his streak is also tied with King Cole (25G in 1910) for the 3rd-longest such streak in the Play Index era, trailing Chris Short (26G from 1967-68) and Jake Arrieta (29G from 2015-16).

**VS. DETROIT | DIVISION RECORD**

» Kluber makes his second start of the season against the Tigers this afternoon...faced them on April 9 at Progressive Field, tossing 8.0 shutout innings and allowing just two hits and one walk, fanning a season-high 13 batters.  
 » Owns a 9-7 record and 3.75 ERA (59ER/141.2IP) in 23 appearances (22 starts) in his career vs. Detroit...this includes a 4-3 mark and 4.93 ERA (27ER/49.1IP) at Comerica Park...started twice here in 2017, compiling a 1-1 record and 4.91 ERA (6ER/11.0IP).  
 » Over the past four seasons (2015-2018), Kluber is holding the Tigers to a .223 batting average, the lowest mark by any pitcher with at least eight starts against Detroit in that time span...his 2.75 ERA (24ER/78.2IP) is the 2nd-lowest within those same parameters.  
 » This afternoon marks his fifth start of the season against an A.L. Central division rival...has compiled a 4-0 record and 0.33 ERA (1ER/27.2IP) in his four prior starts.  
 » Has won each of his last 10 decisions against a divisional opponent, dating back to June 9, 2017...owns a 1.24 ERA (14ER/101.1IP) in that span.

**ON THE ROAD**

» Kluber will make his seventh road start this afternoon and has compiled a 3-2 record with a 2.81 ERA (13ER/41.2IP) in his prior outings on the road this season...in 2017, went 8-2 with a 2.83 ERA (28ER/89.0IP) in 13 road starts.  
 » His last three starts have all come at Progressive Field...today marks his second road start against an A.L. Central division opponent, after he led the Tribe to a 6-1 win over Minnesota on April 17 in Puerto Rico (6.2IP, 5H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 6K).  
 » Earned the win in his last road start on May 19 at Houston...fanned 10 batters across 7.0 strong innings, allowing two runs on six hits (one home run) and walking none.  
 » Since the beginning of 2016, Kluber is 19-8 with a 2.91 ERA (76ER/234.2IP) in 35 road starts...among MLB pitchers with at least 25 road starts in that timeframe, his 19 wins are 16th in MLB, while his ERA is 4th in the American League and 9th in MLB...also ranks 4th in the A.L. and 6th in MLB with 256 strikeouts.

**COMPLETE COREY**

» Kluber tossed his 16th career complete game in his first start of the year on March 29 at Seattle...marked the first Opening Day complete-game by a Cleveland pitcher since Jake Westbrook on April 4, 2005 at Chicago-AL (1-0 loss), and the first such complete game in MLB since Clayton Kershaw threw a complete-game shutout on April 1, 2013 vs. San Francisco.  
 » Struck out eight batters, the 2nd-most by a Tribe starter on Opening Day over the last 14 seasons (2005-18), behind Justin Masterson (10K on April 5, 2012 vs. Toronto).  
 » Kluber threw just 91 pitches in the game, marking the second-lowest complete-game pitch count of his career...needed just 85 pitches to shut out the Mariners on July 30, 2014 (9.0IP, 3H, 8K) in Cleveland.

**2017 HIGHLIGHTS**

» Won his second career American League Cy Young Award in 2017, becoming the first pitcher in club history to win the award multiple times, and the 19th multiple winner in MLB since 1956.  
 » Became the first Indians pitcher since Mike Garcia in 1949 to lead MLB in ERA (2.25), and ranked near the top of the A.L. leaderboard in virtually every other pitching category (see chart), including wins (18, T1st), pitcher bWAR (8.2), strikeouts (265, 2nd) and opponent batting average (.193, 141-732).  
 » Won the A.L. Pitcher of the Month award three times, June (4-0, 1.26ERA), August (5-1, 1.96 ERA) and September (5-0, 0.84 ERA), becoming the first triple winner since Houston's Dallas Keuchel in 2015.

**CAREER SNAPSHOT**

» Kluber is in his ninth season with the Cleveland organization after being acquired from the San Diego Padres on July 31, 2010 in a three-team trade that sent RHP Jake Westbrook (from Cleveland) & LHP Nicholas Greenwood (from San Diego) to the St. Louis Cardinals and moved OF Ryan Ludwick from St. Louis to San Diego.  
 » Signed a five-year contract extension with the Indians through 2019 on April 5, 2015...the deal includes club options for 2020 & 2021.  
 » Made his MLB debut on September 1, 2011 in relief against the Oakland Athletics...made three relief appearances as a September call-up with Cleveland in 2011...has five career relief appearances, last on April 20, 2013 at Houston.  
 » Kluber was originally selected by San Diego in the 4th round of the 2007 June draft out of Stetson (FL) University, where he played three seasons...the Birmingham, Alabama native attended Coppell (TX) High School, located in the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex.
