TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners conclude a 10-day, 9-game homestand with the final (0-2) of 3 games vs. Colorado...began the homestand by sweeping a 3-game series from Kansas City and taking 2-of-3 from Los Angeles-AL...following an off day tomorrow, Seattle will embark on a 7-day, 6-game, 2-city road trip to Los Angeles-AL (3 G) and Colorado (3 G)...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won 9 of their last 12 games, including a season-high 8-game winning streak (6/25-7/3)...the Mariners are 10-9 over their last 19 contests...they have also won 16 of their last 26 games, 23 of their last 35, 27 of their last 41, 32 of their last 47 and 34 of their last 51...Seattle is 42-23 in its last 65 games, 47-26 over its last 73 games and 52-30 in its last 82 games...Seattle is 16-16 during the day and 40-18 at night...Seattle is 30-17 at Safeco Field, 26-17 on the road.

- **Homer Happy** - dating back to May 26, **Nelson Cruz** is batting .312 (43x138) with 25 runs scored, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 15 RBI, 34 RBI and 18 walks in 38 games...during this stretch he is tied for the Major League lead in home runs (also: Max Muncy-LAD), while ranking 3rd in slugging (.681) and T6th in RBI.
- **Milestone** - **Kyle Seager** recorded his 1,076 and 1,077 career hits yesterday vs. the Rockies...Seager is currently tied with Raúl Ibañez (1,077) for 6th-most hits in Mariners franchise history.
- **Corner of Edgar & Dave** - the Mariners are 30-17 (.638) at Safeco Field this season, 6th-best home winning percentage in the Majors...they trail New York-AL (.717/33-13), Boston (.700/28-12), Cleveland (.667/28-14), Philadelphia (.652/30-16) and Chicago-NL (.643/27-15)...the Mariners have won 14 of their last 19 home games (5/31-c) and are 21-7 (.750) at home since May 18.
- **First Things First** - **Dee Gordon** is batting .324 (24x74) when leading off a game this season.
- **Herrmann's Hits** - **Chris Herrmann** has reached base safely via hit or walk in 5 of his 7 starts this season...he has reached base twice via hit or walk in 3 of those 7 starts...the Mariners are 5-2 in Herrmann's 7 starts.
- **Four Score** - The Mariners are 41-11 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 15-23 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Series Stuff** - the Mariners have won or tied 24 of their first 30 series, posting a series record of 18-6-6.

JEAN, JEAN THE HIT COLLECTOR...**Jean Segura** has 37 multi-hit game this season, tied for the most in the Majors (also: Nick Markakis-ATL)...Segura leads the Majors with 15 games of at least 3 hits...Segura has more multi-hit games (37) than games without a hit this season (21)...among Major League leaders, Segura ranks 2nd in hits with 115, trailing only Houston's Jose Altuve-HOU (121)...he also ranks 3rd in the Majors with a .333 (115x345) batting average, behind Mookie Betts-BOS (.343/93x271) and Altuve (.339/121x357).

AMONG THE BEST...since May 8, the Mariners have a .649 (37-20) winning percentage, 2nd-best in the Majors over that span...they trail Houston (.704/38-16), while ranking ahead of Boston (.643/36-20), New York-AL (.635/33-19), Chicago-NL (.611/33-21) and Los Angeles-NL (.611/33-21)...the Mariners 37 wins trail only Houston (38-16) for the most in the Majors since May 8.

MILE HIGH...**Jean Segura** has reached base safely in 39 of 42 career games he has appeared vs. the Rockies, including recording at least 1 hit in 33 games...he has recorded 17 multi-hit games, including 6 3-hit games, 1 4-hit game and 1 5-hit game...overall he is batting .374 (61x163) with 32 runs scored, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 9 home runs, 21 RBI, 4 HBP, 13 walks and 10 stolen bases in 42 games...among all active players (min. 150 PA), Segura's .374 average vs. Colorado is the 3rd-highest in the Majors...he trails only Miguel Cabrera (.406/65x160) and Matt Holiday (.378/56x148).

SEAGER BELIEVER...dating back to June 26, **Kyle Seager** has hit safely in 7 of his last 11 games, including recording 6 multi-hit contests...during this 11-game stretch, he is batting .368 (14x38) with 5 runs scored, 3 doubles, 3 home runs, 9 RBI and 4 walks...Seager is also batting .381(8x21) with 2 runs scored, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 4 RBI and 2 walks in 6 games in July...he has a career .303 (190x629) with 87 runs scored, 42 doubles, 1 triple, 24 home runs, 79 RBI and 61 walks in 165 games in July...his .303 average is his highest monthly average in his career (.276/205x744 in 194 games in May).

ALL HE DOES IS WIN...as a Mariner, **Wade LeBlanc** is 7-0 with a 3.84 ERA (53 ER, 129.0 IP) in 28 games, including going 7-0 with a 3.52 ERA (43 ER, 110.0 IP) in 20 starts...LeBlanc's streak of 20 consecutive starts without a loss by a pitcher to start his tenure with a team is currently the 3rd-longest in Major League history dating back to 1920...he trails only Whitey Ford with the New York Yankees (22, 7/6/50-6/12/53) and Kirk Rueter with the Montreal Expos (22, 7/7/93-6/15/94), while ranking ahead of Brooks Lawrence with the Cincinnati Reds (18, 4/22/56-7/17/56).

ELECTRIC EDDIE...**Edwin Díaz** leads the Majors with 34 saves, while ranking 2nd among all relievers with 75 strikeouts (Josh Hader-MIL, 83)...**Díaz is the 2nd pitcher in Major League history with at least 30 saves and 70 strikeouts prior to the All-Star Break**, joining Eric Gagne-LAD in 2003 (31 SV, 76 K)...Díaz's 34 saves rank T2nd-most all-time prior to the All-Star Break (also: John Smoltz-ATL, 2003), behind Francisco Rodriguez in 2008 with the Angels (38)...of Díaz's 34 saves, 20 have come in 1-run games, most in the Majors this season (Craig Kimbrel-BOS, 11)...his 20 1-run saves are only 3 shy of equaling the Major League single-season record, set by Rodriguez in 2008 (23)...the Mariners are 42-0 when Díaz enters with a lead this season, including 22-0 when he enters with a 1-run lead...Díaz is 20-for-22 in 1-run save opportunities (90.9%) with a 0.81 ERA (2 ER, 22.1 IP) with 40 strikeouts and 5 walks.

GOING NATIONAL...today is the 5th of 20 Interleague match-ups for the Mariners this season...Seattle opened Interleague play by going 1-1 at San Francisco on April 3-4 and is 0-2 in this series vs. Colorado...the Mariners are 204-184 all-time in Interleague play, including 108-89 at home...the Mariners have gone .500 or better vs. the National League in 14 of the last 18 seasons since 2000...6 of the Mariners next 12 games will be vs. National League opponents, as they continue a 3-game series vs. Colorado...Seattle will also travel to Colorado, July 13-15 and host San Francisco for a 2-game series at Safeco Field, July 24-25.

AS YOU KNOW...**Jean Segura** has recorded 47 RBI in 83 games this season, the most RBI in a single season prior to the All-Star break in his career (36 RBI in 2013 and 2016)...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that among all players with fewer than 10 home runs this season, **Segura's** 47 RBI (7 HR) lead the Majors?...he ranks ahead of Yuli Gurriel-HOU (6 HR/46 RBI), Jurickson Profar-TEX (6 HR/46 RBI), Brian Anderson-MIA (6 HR/44 RBI), Daniel Descalso-ARI (9 HR/44 RBI) and Joey Votto-CIN (8 HR/44 RBI).

ABOUT LEBLANC...

- 33-year-old left-hander is making his 18th appearance and 13th start of the season, his 194th career appearance, 92nd career start and 8th start (10th appearance) vs. the Rockies tonight.
- Signed with Seattle on March 25 after being released by New York-AL at his request.
- Previously played with Seattle in 2016...acquired on June 22, 2016 from Toronto in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations...was traded to Pittsburgh on Sept. 13, 2016 in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations.
- Selected by San Diego in the 2nd round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft.
- Native of Lake Charles, LA...attended Alfred M. Barbe High School.
- Made his Major League debut with the Padres on Sept. 3, 2008 at Los Angeles-NL (L,4,0,8,5,5,3,1,HR-2).
- Pitched for the University of Alabama, 2004-06...was 24-9 with a 2.81 ERA (100 ER, 320.1 IP) and 334 strikeouts in 46 career G/45 GS...holds Alabama's all-time record for strikeouts with 334...National Freshman of the Year (*Baseball America*) and SEC Freshman of the Year in 2004 after going 8-4 with a 2.08 ERA (26 ER, 112.2 IP) with 98 strikeouts in 16 G/15 GS while posting 8 complete games, including 2 shutouts.
- Went 2-5 with a 4.23 ERA (21 ER, 44.2 IP) in 8 starts with the Seibu Lions in the Japan Pacific League in 2015.
- Is 5-4-1 with a 3.92 ERA (37 ER, 87.1 IP) in 30 career games/10 starts in July.

LAST OUTING...W#4 in his last start, a 4-1 Mariners win vs. Los Angeles-AL on July 3...allowed 1 run on 3 hits and 1 walk while striking out 4 across 7.0 innings pitched...sole run came on a solo home run by Andreilton Simmons in the 4th inning...marked his 4th quality start of the season.

FOR STARTERS...since moving into the Mariners rotation on May 3, is 4-0 with a 2.89 ERA (21 ER, 65.1 IP) with 48 strikeouts and 13 walks in 12 starts...the Mariners are 9-3 in those 12 starts...among American League leaders during that span, ranks 4th in BB/9.0 IP (1.79/13 BB, 65.1 IP), 8th in ERA (2.89) and 12th in K/BB (3.69/48 K, 13 BB).

START IT UP...in 19 career starts with the Mariners, is 7-0 with a 3.52 ERA (43 ER, 110.0 IP) with 82 strikeouts and 22 walks...the Mariners are 16-4 in his 20 starts with the club...made 8 starts with Seattle in 2016, going 3-0 with a 4.43 ERA (22 ER, 44.2 IP) with 34 strikeouts and 9 walks.

HE'S A WINNER...has made 20 career starts with the Mariners without suffering a loss...only 1 American League pitcher in the live-ball era has had a longer such streak to begin a tenure with a single club (Whitey Ford-NYY, 22, 7/6/50-6/12/53)...among all pitchers in the live-ball era, LeBlanc's streak trails only Ford and Kirk Rueter-MON (22, 7/7/93-6/15/94)(STATS).

AS A RELIEVER...is 0-0 with a 4.61 ERA (7 ER, 13.2 IP) in 5 relief appearances this season...tossed a season-high 4.2 innings of relief in a 4-10 Mariners loss on April 23 at Chicago-AL...limited the White Sox to 2 runs on 6 hits while striking out 6 after entering the game with the Mariners trailing 0-8 in the 4th inning.

WELCOME (BACK) TO SEATTLE...signed with Seattle on March 25 after being released by New York-AL at his request...became the 43rd player in club history to have spent at least two different stints with the Mariners...Mike Blowers (1992-95, 1997, 1999), Raúl Ibañez (1996-2000, 2004-2008, 2013), Norm Charlton (1993, 1995-97, 2001) and Jeff Nelson (1992-95, 2001-03, 2005) are the only players who spent three separate stints with the Mariners.

2017 SEASON...went 5-2 with 1 save and 4 holds in 50 appearances (0 starts) with a 4.50 ERA (34 ER, 68.0 IP), 54 strikeouts and 17 walks with Pittsburgh...held right-handed batters to a .217 (38x175) batting average against with a .270 on-base percentage and a .389 slugging percentage (.658 OPS against).

LAST TIME AROUND...appeared in 11 games (8 starts) with the Mariners in 2016, going 3-0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (25 ER, 50.0 IP)...was 3-0 with a 4.43 ERA (22 ER, 44.2 IP), 34 strikeouts and 5 quality starts in 8 starts with the Mariners...held opponents scoreless in 2 of his 3 relief appearances...went 0-0-1 with a 5.06 ERA (3 ER, 5.1 IP) with 7 strikeouts in 3 relief appearances.

IT HAD BEEN A WHILE...in his Mariners debut on June 24, 2016, LeBlanc made his first Major League appearance since Sept. 28, 2014 at Seattle with Los Angeles-AL, a span of 634 days between appearances...LeBlanc made his first ML start since Sept. 23, 2014 at Oakland with Los Angeles-AL, a span of 639 days between starts.

FIRST SEATTLE WIN...earned his first win with Seattle on July 1, 2016, vs. Baltimore (6.0,3,2,2,1,5,HR-1), his first Major League win since Sept. 23, 2014, with the Angels at the A's, a span of 646 days between Major League wins.

IN JAPAN...spent the 2015 season with the Seibu Lions in the Japan Pacific League...went 2-5 with a 4.23 ERA (21 ER, 44.2 IP) in 8 starts...tossed his second career complete game on April 2, 2015 at Rakuten Golden Eagles, allowing 2 earned runs on 2 hits 9.0 innings (also: 4/25/14 at Reno w/Salt Lake).

CAREER...10-year MLB veteran with 7 clubs (San Diego, Miami, Houston, Los Angeles-AL, New York-AL, Pittsburgh & Seattle)...overall, is 34-35-3 with a 4.26 ERA (310 ER, 655.2 IP) in 193 career appearances/91 starts...in 91 career starts, is 26-31 with a 4.33 ERA (238 ER, 494.1 IP) with 342 strikeouts and 160 walks...in 102 career relief appearances, is 8-4-3 with a 4.02 ERA (72 ER, 161.1 IP) with 125 strikeouts and 43 walks...appeared in 11 games (8 starts) with the Mariners in 2016, going 3-0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (25 ER, 50.0 IP).
