PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (7-5) vs TAMPA BAY RAYS (3-10)

Saturday, April 14, 2018 – Tropicana Field – 6:10 EDT – Game 13; Road 7

RHP Jake Arrieta (0-0, 4.50) vs RHP Chris Archer (1-0, 5.94)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies won their fourth straight ballgame, a close 2-1 match against the Rays at Tropicana Field ... Starter Vince Velasquez strung together his second straight quality start, tossing 6.2 innings and allowing 1 run on 4 hits with 1 walk and 7 strikeouts ... Philadelphia's lone runs came on a Carlos Santana base hit in the sixth to tie the game, and a game-winning knock from Jorge Alfaro (2-4) in the ninth ... The bullpen fired 2.1 scoreless, hitless innings to lock down the victory.
- ARMS RACE:** Over their last nine games (since 4/3), Phillies starters have combined to post a 2.68 ERA (16 ER, 53.2 IP) with 56 strikeouts, just three home runs allowed and a .213 opponents' batting average (42-197) ... **In that span, Philadelphia has the lowest starter's ERA in the National League, and 2nd-lowest in baseball behind only KC (2.04)** ... In those nine games, the rotation has allowed two earned runs or fewer eight times and four hits or fewer six times ... Among all NL teams this season, Phillies starters have the most starts (4) of four or fewer hits allowed and one or zero walks (T-most in MLB with DET and TB) ... Overall this season Philadelphia's starters rank 2nd in the NL in lowest OPP OPS (.626), 3rd in ERA (3.29) and 4th in fewest hits allowed (59) ... Only one team in baseball (SF, 2) has allowed fewer home runs by its starters than the Phillies (3), and they also rank T-5th among ML clubs in fewest walks issued by starters (19).
- HAIL CÉSAR:** César Hernández walked two more times yesterday, and is now T-4th in all of baseball with 12 walks this season, trailing only ATL's Freddie Freeman (16), WSH's Bryce Harper (16) and STL's Matt Carpenter (14) ... He is 5th in MLB in pitches/PA (4.63) and has raised his season OBP to .444, 10th among all ML players ... He already has four multi-walk games, and has reached base safely in each of his last nine contests and 11 of 12 overall ... Since the start of 2017, Hernandez ranks second among all second basemen in walks (73), trailing MIN's Brian Dozier (85), and is 5th in OBP (.376).
- KINGS AND ROOKS:** Scott Kingery has had himself quite a week, earning the walk-off winner with a sacrifice fly on Wednesday night for the Phillies, hitting his first career grand slam on Tuesday and his first major league homer on Monday ... Per *Elías*, Kingery is the only major league player in the modern era (since 1900) to record his first career home run, grand slam, and walk-off RBI in three consecutive games (in no particular order for those achievements) ... **Among all ML rookies thus far, he is T-1st in extra-base hits (6) and doubles (4), 2nd in stolen bases (2), 3rd in runs (6), T-3rd in homers (2) and 4th in hits (10).**
- 'PEN PALS:** The Phillies bullpen did not allow a hit in 2.1 scoreless innings yesterday, and has now yielded just one run in its last 12.2 innings pitched (0.71 ERA) dating back to the ninth inning on 4/8 vs MIA ... **Since 4/3, Philadelphia's relievers have posted a 1.91 ERA (6th in MLB), allowed 27 baserunners (2nd-fewest), surrendered no home runs (joining ARI as only relief corps with 0 HR in that span) and posted the lowest OPP AVG (.160).**
- THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** Philadelphia's 4.25 pitches/PA are the most among all ML clubs thus far (next: STL, 4.111)... They are 2nd in PA/BB (8.61), trailing only WSH (8.37) and 5th in walks overall (54) despite having at least 44 PAs fewer than all teams ahead of them.
- #WINNING:** The Phillies have won four straight games for the first time since 7/26-31/2017 (5 straight) ... They have posted a 2.31 ERA (10 ER, 39.0 IP) and struck out 40 during the streak.
- TAMPA BAY RAY-UNION:** Just 16.2 miles south of their spring training home in Clearwater, the Phillies play three games in St. Petersburg this weekend against the Tampa Bay Rays ... It is the first time they have squared off against Tampa Bay since 7/20-22/2015 in Philadelphia, and the first time at Tropicana Field since 6/23-25/2009 ... In that series, current Phillies manager Gabe Kapler started two games in right field for the Rays, going 2-for-4, with two doubles, two walks and a run, and Phillies Wall of Famer Pat Burrell was the Tampa Bay DH for all three games ... This marks just the fourth regular season series the two teams have ever played at Tropicana Field, as they also played three-game sets in 2001 and 1999 in addition to the 2009 series ... Philadelphia played two games in Tampa Bay during the 2008 World Series (1-1), before returning home to take the championship in Philadelphia.
- FIRST DIBS:** With Scott Kingery and J.P. Crawford already hitting their first career home runs this season, the Phillies have now had nine different players hit their first major league homer since the beginning of the 2017 season: Crawford (4/11), Kingery (4/9), Cameron Perkins (9/14/17), Jorge Alfaro (8/15/17), Rhys Hoskins (8/14/17), Nick Williams (7/9/17), Ben Lively (6/24/17), Andrew Knapp (4/29/17) and Brock Stassi (4/10/17) ... In that span, only one other team (SD) has even had seven players do so.
- INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE:** This series marks the first Interleague series for the Phillies in 2018 ... They finished the 2017 campaign with just a 5-15 against American League ballclubs, but went 5-7 in their final 12 contests ... Philadelphia has not played an American League team on the road this early in the season since they opened 2014 with a three-game series in Texas.

LAST START: 4/8 vs MIA: ND, 4.0 IP, 3 H, 3 R, 2 ER, 2 BB, 5 SO, HR ... Arrieta vs Richards ... Arrieta retired 10 of the final 11 batters he faced, including 5 via strikeout ... Offensively the Phillies were paced by Rhys Hoskins (1-2, 2B, RBI, 2 BB), Odubel Herrera (2-4, 2 R, 2B) and Cesar Hernandez (1-3, R, 2B, BB).

TONIGHT'S START:

- A Dominant Stretch:** Has allowed 3 ER or fewer in each of his last 15 starts dating back to 7/2/17, posting a 2.37 ERA (22 ER, 83.2 IP) and holding opponents to a .206 AVG ... **His 2.26 ERA ranks 3rd in the National League in that span (min. 75.0 IP), and 5th in the majors (best: Stephen Strasburg, 1.35)** ... His streak of 15 straight starts allowing 3 ER or fewer is tied for the longest active streak in baseball with CLE's Corey Kluber
- Rough for Righties:** Since the 2017 All-Star Break, RHH are slashing just .148/.214/.279 against him with 3 HR in 156 plate appearances
- 5-Year Plan:** Among all qualifying pitchers over the last 5 seasons (2014-18), Arrieta ranks 2nd in ERA (2.68, best: Kershaw, 1.99), OPP AVG (.203) and OPP OPS (.583), 3rd in HR/9.0 IP (0.66) and 5th in WHIP (1.03)
- vs AL East:** 13-10, 4.52 ERA (92 ER, 183.0 IP) in 34 games (30 starts)

- 2017:** 9-8, 3.87 ERA (47 ER, 109.1 IP) in 20 starts
- Career:** 48-30, 3.71 ERA (245 ER, 595.1 IP) in 99 starts
- Has made 20 of his 31 starts since the start of 2017 on the road ... He is T-4th in road starts among all ML pitchers in that span ... Tonight is his 100th career road start

2017 SEASON:

- Led the team in wins (14) and totaled at least 30 starts for the third consecutive season
- In 12 starts following the All-Star break, posted a 2.28 ERA (17 ER, 67.0 IP), which ranked 6th among qualifying NL pitchers (3rd among starters) in that span
- Named NL Pitcher of the Month for August (4-1, 1.21 ERA), when he led all NL starters in ERA and T-1st in wins
- Made 20 road starts, the most by a CHI pitcher since 1980 (Rick Reuschel, 21)
- Walked 3 or fewer batters in 29 of 30 starts, averaging 2.94 BB/9.0 IP (55 BB, 168.1 IP)
- Had a stretch of 72 consecutive starts (9/2/14-4/22/17) of at least 5.0 innings snapped, 4/28 at BOS (4.1 IP); that was the longest stretch by a CHI pitcher since 1908
- Belted his 5th career HR, 6/17 at PIT (Ivan Nova)
- Collected his 1,000th career SO (Trea Turner) on 6/27 at WSH
- Went 1-1 with a 0.84 ERA (1 ER, 10.2 IP) in two postseason starts: Game 4 of the NLDS, 10/11 vs WSH and Game 4 of the NLCS, 10/18 vs LAD

CAREER:

- Was the 2015 National League Cy Young Award Winner (5th in CHI history), and in 2016 earned his first career All-Star selection and Silver Slugger Award
- Has tossed two career no-hitters: 8/30/15 at LAD and 4/21/16 at CIN
 - Became the 8th pitcher in MLB history to throw a no-hitter in consecutive seasons ... His second came in his 10th start after tossing his first, the third-shortest time between no-hitters in MLB history
- Recorded a career and CHI franchise-best 20 consecutive wins from 8/4/15-5/25/16, which tied for the third-longest streak in MLB history (since 1913)
- In 9 career postseason starts, is 5-3, 3.08 ERA (18 ER, 52.2 IP), 66 SO (most in CHI postseason history), .189 OPP AVG and hit a HR as a batter ... Allowed just 3 ER in 11.1 IP (2.38 ERA) in two starts during the 2016 World Series
- Signed by PHI as a free agent on 3/12/18 ... Originally selected by BAL in the 5th round of the June 2007 draft
