PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (31-24) vs SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (27-30)

Saturday, June 2, 2018 – AT&T Park – 10:05 EDT – Game 56; Road 28

RHP Vince Velasquez (4-5, 4.08) vs LHP Andrew Suarez (1-4, 5.65)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies fell to the San Francisco Giants, 4-0, at AT&T Park ... Starter Nick Pivetta (L, 4-4) went 4.0 innings and allowed 3 runs on 5 hits with 3 walks and 3 strikeouts ... Philadelphia's offense was shut out for just the second time this season as their six-game winning streak against the Giants was snapped.
- YES SER!** Since making his major league debut on May 7, **Seranthony Dominguez** has tossed 13.2 scoreless innings over 11 appearances and has allowed only two singles and a hit by pitch ... **In other words, he has faced 43 batters this season and has retired 40 of them, 15 by strikeout (34.9% SO rate)** ... The Phillies are 10-1 in games which Dominguez has pitched ... His 13.2-inning scoreless streak to begin his career is the longest by a Phillies reliever since Todd Frohwirth began his career with 14.2 scoreless innings (1987-88), per *Ellas*.
- ENTER STRANDMAN:** The Phillies bullpen has successfully stranded 55 of their last 62 inherited runners (4/9-current) and their 88.7% strand rate is easily tops in the majors over that stretch (next: SD, 48-58, 82.8%) ... Overall this season, the Phils pen has stranded 62 of the 77 runners they have inherited and their 80.1% strand rate ranks 3rd among all major league bullpens (best: SD, 83.6 %) ... Individually, **Seranthony Dominguez** has stranded each of his first seven inherited runners and **Luis Garcia** has stranded all 16 of 17.
- HOMECOMING KINGS:** Several Phillies have connections to the Bay Area and Northern California ... **Rhys Hoskins** grew up in Sacramento and attended Sacramento State ... **Mitch Walding** was born in Lodi, about 80 miles from AT&T Park ... **Andrew Knapp** was born in Roseville and attended the University of California, Berkeley ... All three players were signed by Phillies scout, **Joey Davis**.
- A LOOK BACK AT MAY:** As the calendar turns to June, the Phillies close the books on the month of May that saw them go 15-11 ... It marked Philadelphia's first winning record during the month since 2012 when they went 16-13 ... Additionally, Philadelphia reached the 30-win mark this season on May 29, 49 days earlier than last year when they reached 30 wins on July 16, as they won their fourth game back after the All-Star break to move to 30-60 ... Lastly, Phillies pitching posted a 3.00 combined ERA during the month which was the lowest team ERA in a single month since September of 2011 (2.92).
- EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Phillies have collected at least one extra-base hit in 51 consecutive games (since 4/4) and are one of just three teams in 2018 to have a streak of 50 or more straight games with an extra-base hit: Chicago Cubs – 54 straight games (3/29-current) & Texas Rangers – 50 straight games (4/3-5/27) ... This current stretch marks Philadelphia's longest extra-base hit streak since 2015-16, when they did so in 54 straight games (9/22/15-5/20/16).
- A TALE OF TWO MONTHS:** Over 24 games and 65 plate appearances since May 1st, **Nick Williams** is slashing .290/.362/.565 with 5 HR and 5 walks ... His 5 homers in that span are tied for 2nd-most on the team with Cesar Hernandez (5) trailing only Carlos Santana (7) ... Williams started the year with a .532 OPS through 59 plate appearances from 3/29-4/30 but from May 1 on, he has posted a .927 OPS in 69 plate appearances.
- PHILLIE SPECIAL:** After getting off to a 1-4 start to 2018, the Phillies have gone 30-20 over their last 50 games (4/5-current) ... Their .600 win percentage in this span ranks 2nd among all NL teams (best: MIL, .615) and 5th in the majors (best: NYY, .681) ... Philadelphia's +33 run differential is fourth-best in the NL and seventh-best in MLB this season.
- BACK IN THE BAY:** The Phillies face off against the Giants for the second and final time this season and for the first time since they completed a four-game sweep, May 7-10, their first four-game sweep against the Giants since 1982 ... In that series, Phillies pitchers struck out 55 of the 140 hitters they faced, a 39.3 % strikeout rate that set a new franchise record in a four-game series (previous: 34.8 %, April 2016 vs SD) ... The 55 punchouts were the club's most ever in a four-game series and the second-most in any series in franchise history, shy of only a 59 strikeout performance in a five-game series against the New York Mets, May 29-June 2, 2014 ... The Phillies have won six of their last seven games against the Giants (8/19/17-current) and eight of their last 11 (6/3/17-current) ... Philadelphia is looking for their first series win at AT&T Park since 2013, having gone 0-3-1 in series here since 2014.
- GO WEST, YOUNG MAN:** Tonight marks the sixth game of a 10-game, 11-day road trip that began at Dodger Stadium for four games (2-2, 5/28-31), continued now with a three-game set against the Giants in San Francisco (0-1, 6/1-3) before concluding with three games against the Cubs at Wrigley (6/5-7) ... Following this trip, the Phillies will head home where they will play 15 of their final 21 games of the month of June at Citizens Bank Park.
- DRAFT INFO:** The Phillies have the third overall selection in the 2018 First Year Player Draft which will begin live on MLB Network and MLB.com on Monday, June 4th at 7:00 p.m. (ET) ... Representing the Phillies live at the Draft will be Larry Bowa and Mickey Morandini.

LAST START: 5/28 at LAD: ND, 5.2 IP, 3 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 2 BB, 6 SO ... Velasquez vs Stewart ... Velasquez carried a no-hitter into the 6th inning before Yasiel Puig broke up the no-hit bid ... Cesar Hernandez cranked a 3-run home run, Carlos Santana and Jorge Alfaro had two hits and Seranthony Dominguez tossed 1.1 scoreless innings with 3 strikeouts.

TONIGHT'S START:

- May 1?: Went 3-1 with a 2.30 ERA (7 ER, 27.1 IP), allowed only 20 hits and struck out 36 batters (11.85 SO/9.0 IP) in his 5 May starts ...** It was his lowest ERA of any month in his career during which he has made at least 5 starts
- A Giant Start:** In his last start against the Giants on 5/10, struck 12 (2nd-most of his career) of the 24 batters he faced, and recorded a multi-hit game at the plate (second of season)
- Right On:** Has held RHH to a .159 (11-69) mark with 29 SO in his last 8 starts, and a .192 (19-99) AVG overall this season ... **He has not allowed a home run to a RHH all season (113 batters faced)**
- Put Him Away:** When ahead in the count 0-2, Velasquez has held opponents to a 0.80 AVG (2-25) with 16 SO ... Last season, had trouble putting batters away 0-2, as they hit .222 (8-36), the 11th-highest AVG among all NL pitchers (min. 30 BF)
- Help Me Help You:** Has received an average of 6.44 runs of support per start ... However, 19 runs of support came on on 4/7 vs MIA, and he has 22 runs of support in his other 10 starts combined
- vs NL West:** 4-3, 4.46 ERA (35 ER, 70.2 IP) in 15 games (12 starts)

- 2018:** 2-2, 3.06 ERA (11 ER, 32.1 IP) in 6 starts
- Career:** 7-8, 4.28 ERA (73 ER, 153.1 IP) in 35 games (28 starts)

2018 SEASON:

- Tied a career-high three-game win streak, 5/5-17
- On 5/10 vs SF Became the first Phillies pitcher with 12 or more strikeouts and multiple hits at the plate since 9/16/13 (Cliff Lee, 14 SO, 3 H), per *Elías* ... His 12 strikeouts were his 2nd-most ever in a start
- On 5/5 at WSH made the first start of his career of at least 5.0 IP and 1 or 0 hits
- Made a career-best 7 straight starts (8/10/17-4/29/18) issuing 2 or fewer walks
- Had 282 SO through his first 50 career starts, which when achieved was the 7th-most by any ML starter through his first 50 career starts since 2015
- Did not allow a home run in his first 16.2 IP this season
- Made his 3rd consecutive Opening Day roster

2017 SEASON:

- Made his 2nd consecutive Opening Day roster
- Was on the 10-day DL, 5/31-7/17, with a right flexor strain; included rehab assignments to Lehigh Valley (AAA), Reading (AA) and Clearwater (A)
- Had a 2.96 ERA (9 ER, 27.1 IP) in 6 starts from 5/25-8/4
- Stranded 74.4% of the runners he allowed on base
- Placed on the 10-day DL on 8/11 with a right middle finger injury ... Had surgery on right middle finger on 9/6 and missed the remainder of season
