### MARINERS NOTES:

- The Mariners snapped their 5-game losing streak and picked up their first win in August.
- The Mariners took the lead in the 3<sup>rd</sup> inning to snap a streak of 28 innings after which they either trailed or tied... Seattle had not held a lead this series since the 1<sup>st</sup> inning of Thursday's game when they led 2-0.
- Nelson Cruz** and **Kyle Seager** hit back-to-back home runs in the 7<sup>th</sup> inning, marks the 2<sup>nd</sup> time this season the Mariners have hit back-to-back home runs (also: Kyle Seager and Ryon Healy, 7/4 vs. LAA)
- Nelson Cruz** (2x4, R, HR, 4 RBI) recorded 4+ RBI for the 2<sup>nd</sup> time this season, 36<sup>th</sup> time in his career.
  - Hit a 2-run home run to give the Mariners a 5-3 lead in the 7<sup>th</sup> inning, marks his 7<sup>th</sup> game-winning RBI of the season, ranks 3<sup>rd</sup> on the team behind Mitch Haniger (13) and Kyle Seager (9).
  - Leads the Majors with a 11.9 home run ratio (340 AB/29 HR).
  - Is batting .308 (12x39) with 8 runs scored, 1 double, 7 home runs, and 14 RBI over his last 10 games...his 7 home runs lead the Majors over that span.
  - His 4 RBI in today's game bring his total to 71 this year, ranks T5th in the American League (also: Alex Bregman).
- Kyle Seager** (2x4, 2 R, 2 HR, 2 RBI) hit his 17<sup>th</sup> home run of the season to give the Mariners a 3-1 lead in the 6<sup>th</sup> inning... marks his 1<sup>st</sup> home run since July 4 vs. LAA (21 games)... the 21 game stretch without a home run was his longest of the season, T4th longest of his career (most: 43 games, 9/4/13 – 4-22-14).
  - Recorded his 8<sup>th</sup> career multi-home run game, 2<sup>nd</sup> of the season (also: May 10 at TOR)... his 8 career multi-homer games are tied with Adrian Beltre and Richie Sexson for 10<sup>th</sup>-most in club history.
  - Tallied his 31<sup>st</sup> multi-hit game of the year.
- Jean Segura** (2x4, R, SB) recorded 2 hits to give him 133 total hits this season, ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in the American League, trailing only Jose Altuve (134).
  - Recorded his 16<sup>th</sup> stolen base of the season.
  - Ranks T4th in the American League with 39 multi-hit games this year (most: J.D. Martinez, 43).
- Ryon Healy** (2x4, 2B) doubled for the first time since July 8<sup>th</sup> in the 2<sup>nd</sup> inning... he joins Nelson Cruz as the only other Mariners player to record 10+ doubles and 20+ home runs so far this season... the Mariners are 1 of 11 teams in the Majors with at least 2 players to tally 10+ doubles and 20+ home runs so far (best: 3 players, CLE, COL, and NYY).
  - Recorded his 20<sup>th</sup> multi-hit game of the season.
- Mike Leake** recorded his 4<sup>th</sup> consecutive quality start, his 11<sup>th</sup> in his last 14 outings... during his current streak of 4 straight quality starts, he holds a 3.24 ERA (9 ER, 25.0 IP) with 10 strikeouts and 2 walks.
- Alex Colomé** extended his season-high scoreless innings streak to 13.2 innings, marks the 3<sup>rd</sup> longest of his career, trailing only a 21.2 innings streak (16 G, 8/4-9/5/15) and a 21.0 innings streak (19 G, 5/4-6/15/16).
- Edwin Diaz** recorded his 41<sup>st</sup> save of the season.
  - Struck out 2 batters to tie his single-season career-high with 89 strikeouts... he joins Dick Radatz as the only other primary reliever in Major League history to record 88 strikeouts in each of his first 3 seasons.
- Zach Duke** picked up his 1<sup>st</sup> win with the Mariners.

### BLUE JAYS NOTES:

- The Blue Jays finish the road trip with a record of 5-5.
- The Blue Jays recorded 1 double in today's game and have now doubled in 20 consecutive games, extending their longest such streak of the season.
- Justin Smoak** (1x3, BB) has hit safely in a season-high 10 consecutive games... marks the 4<sup>th</sup> time in his career that he has carried a hitting streak for 10+ games (best: 14 games, 9/13/10 – 4/4/11)... during the current streak he is batting .302 (13x43) with 2 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 home run, 3 RBI, and 3 walks.

- **Devon Travis** (1x4) is batting .304 (28x92) with 6 doubles, 1 home run and 11 RBI in 17 career games against the Mariners... he has had 7 multi-hit games against Seattle.
- **Aledmys Dias** (3x4, 2 R, 2B, HR, 2 RBI) has recorded multiple hits in back-to-back games... today marks his 5<sup>th</sup> 3-hit game of the season, 16<sup>th</sup> of his career.
  - Batted .357 (10x28) with 3 doubles, 5 home runs, 7 RBI, and 1 walk on the current road trip.
  - Hit a 2-run home run to tie the score at 3-3 in the 7<sup>th</sup> inning, his 5<sup>th</sup> home run of the road trip, 3<sup>rd</sup> of the series.
  - Fell only a triple short of hitting for the cycle.
  - Has hit safely in 4 consecutive games.
- **Sam Gaviglio** tossed 5+ innings and allowed 3 runs or less for the 6th time this season (last: July 25 vs. MIN, 3 ER/5.0 IP)
  - Has not recorded a win since 5/25 at PHI (13 starts).
  - Tossed 5+ innings for the 1<sup>st</sup> time in his last 6 road starts... holds a 8.61 ERA (30 ER, 33.1 IP) on the road this season.

## BLUE JAYS MANAGER JOHN GIBBONS:

### On what the difference was between Sam Gaviglio pitching well today and poorly in Oakland:

"His location. He hung in there. We didn't get enough runs early for him, but we got some at-them balls. Same thing for us. The key at bat was with no outs, Devon hit that screamer to third. If that ball gets down to the corner, you never know what happens, but we played a great series out here and the guys really played well."

### On Kyle Seager getting to them today and what he did well as a hitter:

"Well he's good. You know he's always in the middle of that lineup, and he can burn you. We held him in check pretty good. He got that, I think it was last night or a couple nights ago, through the shift, but yeah he's dangerous. Then Cruz, you know Cruz is still one of the best hitters in the game, best run producers. You know those guys are valuable. We came back and tied it up. Diaz had a heck of a series. He's been on a nice little role to tie it up. Joe, he threw some pitches that were thigh-high right in the middle of the plate, it looked like, so you're going to get burned that way."
