PLANNING YOUR DAY—Former Rays INF **Dan Johnson** will be available for media interviews on the field today at 5:10...tomorrow, in lieu of the season-ending press conference, Senior VP, Baseball Operations/General Manager **Erik Neander** and Senior VP, Baseball Operations **Chaim Bloom** will be available to media on the field at 11:30 a.m.

RAY MATTER—The Rays have lost consecutive games and are 3-6 in their last 9 games following a 23-5 stretch from Aug 19-Sep 19...tonight they are attempting to avoid matching their longest losing streak since the All-Star break (July 27-29 at BAL, Aug 3-5 vs. CWS)...they are also attempting to avoid losing consecutive series for the first time since July 12-22 at MIN, vs. MIA, a combined 2-5 stretch surrounding the All-Star break...they are 8-1-2 in their last 11 series and 11-2-2 in their last 15 series.

- + The Rays are 17-9 (.654) in September, 4th in the majors, and 39-25 (.609) since the All-Star break, tied for 5th in the majors.
- + Monday's loss officially eliminated the Rays from postseason contention—they were the last AL team to be eliminated...since being eliminated, they are 1-3 and have been outscored, 35-17.
- + Including tonight and tomorrow's games, since becoming the Rays in 2008 the club will have played only 54 games in which they were mathematically eliminated from postseason contention.

NOT THE RAYS WAY—The Rays have allowed at least 7 runs in four consecutive games for the first time since June 25-28, 2016 at BAL, vs. BOS (4), and for the first time in four straight, all at home, since April 1-4, 2003 vs. BOS/NYY...they have yielded 10 HR over this 4-game span, and 19 HR in their last 9 games since Sep 20...for the record, the Rays haven't allowed 7 runs or more in five straight games since June 7-11, 2005 at CIN/PIT, and they have never done that in five straight within the same homestand.

WHAT TO PLAY FOR—The Rays would need to win tonight and tomorrow for their sixth 90-win campaign in 11 seasons as the Rays...they would join the Red Sox (7), Dodgers (6, 89-71 this season) and Yankees (6) as the only teams with six 90-win seasons since 2008...the Rays are 943-838 (.529) since 2008, 6th in the majors behind the Yankees (.567), Dodgers (.556), Cardinals (.553), Red Sox (.549) and Angels (.531)...if they reach 90 wins, it will be only the third time since the second Wild Card was introduced in 2012 that a team won 90 games and missed the postseason.

DOMESTIC SWEET DOME—The Rays are 49-30 (.620) at home this season, tied for 4th-best in the majors behind the Red Sox (56-23), Yankees (53-28) and Cubs (50-29)...they are, however, 4-6 in their last 10 games here following a club-record 12-game home winning streak...they are one win shy of reaching 50 home wins for only the fourth time in franchise history, after going 51-30 in 2013, 52-29 in 2009 and 57-24 in 2008...they are 37-14 in their last 51 games here following a 12-16 start this season.

RAYS vs. BLUE JAYS—The Rays are 11-6 against the Blue Jays this season (5-2 at home, 6-4 on the road) and 196-173 (.531) all-time against them, their most wins against any opponent...this is the ninth time in the last 11 years the Rays have won the season series...the Rays are 2-4 in their last 6 games against the Blue Jays following a 9-2 start...they are 4-0-1 in series play this season, most recently a split last weekend in Toronto.

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays are 27-31 (.466) in 1-run games...the 58 1-run games are most in the majors, ahead of the Mariners (57), and a single-season club record...the 31 1-run losses are most in the majors and also a single-season club record, passing 2015 (30)...the Rays are 17-12 (.586) in 1-run games since June 19 compared to 10-19 (.345) before that.

SNELL-ZILLA—Blake Snell is the third starting pitcher to win the Don Zimmer Award, given to the club's Most Valuable Player, following **James Shields** in 2011 and **Tanyon Sturtze** in 2001...he enters his final start of the season with a 1.90 ERA, 3rd-lowest in the AL since the designated hitter was adopted in 1973 behind BOS **Pedro Martínez** (1.74) in 2000 and NYY **Ron Guidry** (1.74) in 1978...he leads the majors with 21 wins, and is the majors' youngest 21-game winner since LAD **Clayton Kershaw** (21) in 2011 and the AL's youngest since OAK **Barry Zito** (23) in 2002.

- + The last 10 pitchers to lead the AL in both ERA and victories (out-right or tied) have won the Cy Young Award...since it was awarded to both leagues in 1967, 13 of the 14 pitchers to lead the AL in both wins and ERA won the Cy Young, with the exception of BAL **Mike Boddicker** in 1984, when DET **Willie Hernández** won it.

- + Snell enters tonight's start on a scoreless streak of 11.2 IP, as his last 2 starts have been scoreless (Sep 18-23 at TEX/TOR).

HE LIKES IT HERE—Snell is 10-1 with a 1.24 ERA (80-IP, 12-R/11-ER) in 13 starts at home, and he has allowed 1 ER or fewer in 12 of 13 starts here and 1 run or fewer in 11 of 13 starts...he hasn't yielded more than 2 runs in a home start since Sep 6, 2017 vs. MIN...according to Stats LLC, the last pitcher with a lower home ERA was MIA **José Fernández** (1.19) in 2013, and the last AL pitchers were before the introduction of the DH: CAL **Nolan Ryan** (1.07) in 1972 and OAK **Vida Blue** (1.19) in 1971.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—The Rays rank 3rd in the AL with a .258 avg. and 2nd with a .332 OBP, while they were 12th in avg. and 10th in on-base pct. last season...they haven't finished a season in the top five in avg. since 2005 (.274, 3rd), nor in the top five in on-base pct. since 2013 (.329, 3rd).

- + The Rays have only four players with double-digit homers, tied with the Tigers for fewest in the majors and tied with 2001 for their fewest in a single season in franchise history...the Rays are the only team in the majors with only one player with 15 HR—**C.J. Cron** is 1 HR shy of becoming the ninth player in club history with 30 HR in a season...in comparison, the Blue Jays have 11 players with double-digit homers and seven players with at least 15 HR.
- + The Rays have totaled 148 HR, 4th-fewest in the majors and 80 HR fewer than their club-record 228 HR last year...they have won an AL-most 27 games this season without the benefit of a home run.
- + **Tommy Pham's** 30-game on-base streak is the longest active in the majors and the longest by a Ray since **Evan Longoria** (34) spanning 2012-13...it is the longest single-season on-base streak by a Ray since **Johnny Damon's** club-record 39-game stretch in 2011.

MOORE COWBELL—Last night **Adam Moore** recorded his first multi-hit game since June 1, 2013 at TEX (with KC) and fourth career multi-RBI game, first since Sep 24, 2010 at TB (with SEA)...his go-ahead RBI bunt single in the 6th inning marked his first RBI since Sep 30, 2015 vs. MIN (G2, with CLE), and his solo homer in the 8th inning was the seventh of his career and first since Sep 23, 2012 vs. CLE (with KC)...according to Stats LLC, Moore went 2,196 days between home runs, the longest drought for a position player since NYM **Val Pascucci** (2,548) from 2004-11.

STAY THIRSTY, MY FRIENDS—The Rays have not thrown a complete game since **Matt Andriese** on May 14, 2016 vs. OAK...they have played 450 games since then, the longest drought in AL history and 2nd-longest in major league history, according to the Elias Sports Bureau, behind the Marlins (480) from June 4, 2014–June 2, 2017...since then:

- + the longest outing for a Rays starting pitcher is 8 IP (eight times)
- + a Rays starter has pitched into the 9th inning only once: **Alex Cobb** on July 21, 2017 vs. TEX (double, homer and was replaced)
- + the Rays have had 10 CG thrown against them
- + the Indians have recorded a majors-most 16 CG, while six pitchers have thrown at least 5 CG, led by CLE **Corey Kluber** (9)

SHIRTS OFF OUR BACKS—During this homestand, the Rays Baseball Foundation is hosting the annual "Shirts Off Our Backs" fundraiser, with proceeds benefiting the Foundation's efforts to support youth and education programs in the Tampa Bay region...over 200 volunteers are on hand this week offering scratch-off cards in return for donations...the wide variety of prizes are highlighted by game-worn jerseys which players and coaches will present to winners on the field following tomorrow's game.

LAST START—On Sun at TOR, did not allow a run in 6.2 IP, his second consecutive scoreless start and ninth scoreless start of the season...was the second time in his career he went at least 6.2 IP and did not allow a run in a road game, following July 7 at NYM (7.1 IP)...recorded 11 SO, his most since Aug 21 vs. KC (11) and most on the road since June 3 at SEA (12), and it was his sixth start this season with double-digit strikeouts...got out of a 2-on, 2-out jam in the 5th inning, and his last 6 outs came via the strikeout...his line: W, 6.2 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 11 SO, 100 pit, 60 str.

CY ZILLA—Leads the majors with a club-record 21 wins, and leads the AL and ranks 2nd in the majors with a 1.90 ERA behind NYM **Jacob deGrom** (1.70)...the last two AL pitchers to record 21 wins and a sub-2.00 ERA are BOS **Roger Clemens** (21, 1.93) in 1990—two years before Snell was born—and NYY **Ron Guidry** (25, 1.74) in 1978...he has a chance to do something only three other pitchers have done in the live ball era (since 1920): finish a season with 21 wins and a 1.90 ERA (or lower) at age 25 or younger...he is attempting to join NYM **Dwight Gooden** (24, 1.53) in 1985, OAK **Vida Blue** (24, 1.82) in 1971 and DET **Hal Newhouser** (25, 1.81) in 1945.

THE WIN COLUMN—Is the majors' youngest 21-game winner since LAD **Clayton Kershaw** (21) in 2011 and the AL's youngest since OAK **Barry Zito** (23) in 2002...with a win tonight, will be the majors' youngest 22-game winner since FLA **Dontrelle Willis** (22) in 2005...has won nine consecutive decisions, matching **Matt Moore** (9) from Sep 29, 2012–May 19, 2013 for the longest streak in franchise history...has won a club-record nine straight starts (without a no-decision in between), going 9-0 with a 1.03 ERA (52.2-IP, 6-ER) and 74 SO over that span...according to Stats LLC, the only other pitchers in major league history to match or exceed those numbers over a 9-start span are MIN **Johan Santana** in 2004 and STL **Bob Gibson** in 1968.

- + Is attempting to become the first pitcher in the majors to win 10 consecutive starts since CWS **Chris Sale** (10) from Oct 2, 2015–May 19, 2016, and the first to do it within a single season since DET **Justin Verlander** (12) in 2011.

PITCHER OF THE MONTH?—Enters tonight's start on a scoreless streak of 11.2 IP, with scoreless starts on Sep 18 at TEX and Sun at TOR...in 5 starts this month, he is 5-0 with a 1.17 ERA (30.2-IP, 5-R/4-ER)—is tied with COL **Kyle Freeland** and MIA **José Ureña** for the major league lead in wins, and ranks 3rd in the majors and 2nd in the AL in ERA (min. 25 IP)...a win tonight would make him the first pitcher with 6 wins in a single calendar month.

- + Was named the American League Pitcher of the Month for August, going 4-0 with a 1.04 ERA in 5 starts...became the fifth Rays pitcher to receive the monthly honor, joining **Chris Archer** in July 2013, **Jeremy Hellickson** in May 2011, **David Price** in Sep 2010 and **Scott Kazmir** in May 2008.
- + In 10 starts since Aug 4, is 9-0 with a 1.11 ERA (56.2-IP, 7-ER), including 9 starts of 1 ER or fewer.

LEADERBOARDS—In addition to leading the AL in wins and ERA, ranks among AL leaders in opp avg. (.178, 1st), WHIP (0.96, 2nd) SO/9 IP ratio (10.81, 6th), HR/9 IP ratio (0.82, 3rd) and wild pitches (13, tied for 3rd)...min. 100 IP, leads the majors with a .090 opp avg. with RISP and a .060 opp avg. with RISP/2 outs...according to FanGraphs, is averaging 95.8 mph on his fastball, 3rd in the AL, and 15.0 pct. of his total pitches are swings and misses, 2nd in the AL.

WHEN HE'S ON—Has yielded 1 run or fewer in 20 starts this season, 2nd-most in the majors behind teammate **Ryne Stanek** (22)—who has made 28 starts this season but none longer than 2 IP...excluding openers, they are the most by an AL pitcher since TOR **Roger Clemens** (20) in 1997...has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 26 starts, tied with Stanek for most in the majors and most in the AL, excluding openers, since NYY **Ron Guidry** (26) in 1978.

vs. TORONTO—Will be making his first start against the Blue Jays at home since April 6, 2017...has faced them twice this season, both at Rogers Centre, and hasn't allowed a run in 11.2 IP...they are hitting .081 (3-for-37), all singles, against him this season, with 2 BB and 17 SO.

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + On Sep 11 vs. CLE, was ejected by home plate umpire **Mark Carlson**, his eighth ejection as Rays manager, first since July 18, 2017 at OAK.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

- to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
