> SOMETHING MINOR: Baseball America's Top 100 Prospects were posted this week with the Angels featuring four players: OF Jo Adell (11), RHP Griffin Canning (48), OF Brandon Marsh (89) and LHP Jose Suarez (90).

LEADING OFF: Happy 27th Birthday to Mike Trout!...PLEASE NOTE TOMORROW'S 1:05 PM START...Halos play the second game of a sixme home stand (1-0) vs. **Detroit** (Aug. 6-8; 1-0) & **Oakland** (Aug. 10-12)...Angels are off Thursday...Halos are 5-1 in last six home games but have dropped six of last eight overall contests...LAA is 17-12 vs. A.L. Central foes... Halos are 2-4 this month. 7-10 since the break and 13-17 since July 1st...Angels are in fourth place, -16.0 in A.L. West (-11.5 for 2nd wild card)...<u>Halos have spent last 40 days in fourth place</u>...LAA is 11-21 when lefty starts (45-37 vs. RHS)... Following the home stand, LAA sets out on a nine-game trip to San Diego (8/13-15), Texas (8/16-19) and Arizona (8/21-22).

IT STARTS AT HOME: Andrew Heaney is 6-1 with a 1.60 ERA (62 IP -11 ER) across his last nine *home* starts...The 1.60 home ERA since April 27 leads the A.L. (2nd in MLB to J. deGrom – 1.52)...Has limited opponents to a .186 clip (41/220) during the stretch (14 BB/50 K).

TAMING TIGERS: Albert Pujols is 4-for-4 with three home runs & six RBI in career against Jacob Turner...Andrelton Simmons is batting .333 (22/66) in career against **Detroit**...<u>Halos are 22-7 at home vs.</u> Tigers since 2010 (haven't lost a home series since Aug. 24-26, 2009).

#27 TURNS 27: Mike Trout turns 27 today...He has a 61.9 career WAR, second-highest all time by a position player through age-26 season behind only Ty Cobb...He and Willie Mays are only players with three 30 HR/20 SB seasons by age-26 campaign-or-younger (first in A.L. history)...Trout joined Mickey Mantle, Jimmie Foxx & Eddie Mathews as only players with 600 BB & 225 HR prior to 27th birthday...Of the 15 other players with 200+ HR at 26-or-younger, none had more stolen bases (186) and only three had a higher OBP (.415) at that point in their career (ELIAS).

BIRTHDAY BASH: Trout is the only player in MLB history to hit four birthday home runs prior to turning 27 (ESPN STATS).

TROUT OUT: Trout has missed the last five games with a right wrist contusion (day-to-day)...He suffered the injury on a head-first slide into third base last Wednesday at Tampa Bay... Yesterday he received a cortisone injection and remains day-to-day.

DID YOU KNOW? Albert Pujols is three hits shy of becoming one of nine players all-time with 1,000 hits in each league (2,073 hits with St. Louis: 997 with LAA)...Four former Angels are on the list - Dave Winfield, Frank Robinson, Vladimir Guerrero & Orlando Cabrera

SAY WHAT? Ohtani is the first player in MLB history to hit 10+ HR & tally 50+ pitching strikeouts in the same season (STATS)...He is just the second player since 1900 with 10+ HR & 4+ wins in a season – Babe Ruth is the other (1918-19).

THE NEW ME: Kole Calhoun has nine HRs his last 22 affairs and his 13 HRs since June 18th lead the A.L....In those 22 games, hitting .310 (26/84) with 19 runs, six doubles, one triple, nine HR & 22 RBI...<u>In 41</u> games since returning from D.L., batting .277 (41/148) with 29 runs, nine doubles, a triple, 13 HR & 31 RBI to raise season average from .145 to .207 (1 HR & 11 RBI over previous 50 G).

LOOKING AHEAD: 36 of 47 remaining games are with divisional foes: 13 vs. Texas (6 at home, 7 on road), 10 against Houston (3 at home, 7 on road), nine against **Oakland** (6 at home, 3 on road) & four vs. Seattle (all at home)...17 of 28 games this month are on road...LAA plays seven interleague games in August (8/13-15 at SD, 8/21-22 at ARI and 8/27-28 vs. COL).

MVP x 3? Two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout ranks in Top 5 in MLB in several offensive categories, including **HR** (4th; 30), **runs** (T3rd; 82), runs created (1^{st} ; 119), times on base (1^{st} ; 221), walks (1^{st} ; 99), IBB (1^{st} ; 20), OBP (1^{st} ; 459), SLG (4^{th} ; .624), OPS (1^{st} ; 1.083), OPS+ (1^{st} ; 196.0) and offensive WAR (7.3; 1st).

SHELVED: Angels have 13 players currently on the D.L...Average D.L. stint for LAA this season is 41 games...On June 15th, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in Club history... 52 players this season are most in MLB (team record is 55 in 2017)...29 pitchers are (12 starters), most in team history thru 114 games (LAA record 31 pitchers in '17)...22 players placed on D.L. in first half (most in MLB).

WALK TALK: Trout's 99 walks are most in club history through 114 games (club record is 116 walks in 2016 by Trout)...4^t history with 20+ SB & 20+ IBB, joining Ichiro (2002; 2005), Rafael Palmeiro (1993) & Reggie Jackson (1974)...With his next walk, he will reach 100 BB, 25+ HR & 20 SB for third time in career (2013 & 2016)... No other American Leaguer has ever accomplished the feat more than once: Toby Harrah (1977) & Carl Yastrzemski (1970)...If Trout reaches 25 HR/30 SB/100 BB, it will be his third campaign doing so (Barry Bonds in 1991 is only other in MLB to accomplish).

GLOVE STORY: Club ranks tied for fourth in A.L. with .986 fielding pct...<u>Halos lead MLB turning 124 double plays</u>...Catchers own a 42.0 caught stealing pct. (22 of 53), tops in A.L. (2nd in MLB)...**A. Simmons** leads MLB shortstops with 164 putouts and is T3rd for fewest errors (8; min. 90 GS)... Trout is only CF in MLB with a 1.000 fielding pct.

PITCHING POINTS: Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 20.4 % to score (40 of 196)...LAA pitchers have 46 games this season with 10+ Ks. a franchise record through 114 affairs (5th in A.L. with 988 K)...Bullpen has logged 427 IP, second in A.L. to **Tampa Bay**...Halos have allowed 148 HRs, fourth-most in A.L...Since 2017, Jose Alvarez and Blake Parker have each pitched in 121 games, each tied for most in A.L. in span.

THIS N' THAT: After toiling for 12 years in the minors, Catcher Francisco Arcia posted 10 RBI thru his first two career games (4 RBI in MLB debut, 6 RBI in 2nd game) **to set an MLB record**, passing **Joe Cunningham** (9 in 1954 with **St. Louis**)...Also tied MLB record (6th player) with four XBH thru first two games...**A. Simmons** leads MLB in PA per SO at 19.23 (423 PA/22 K)...He also leads MLB batting .313 (41/131) with two strikes...Angels' 153 HRs hit rank T3rd in A.L. Trout's 7.8 WAR leads MLB...Justin Upton is only MLB left fielder with at least 20 HR every year since 2013...Mike Scioscia (1,626 wins) is in sole possession of 18th on all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th with 1,769)...**Ohtani** is first Angel with first nine career HRs came at home (all against RHP)...Just second rookie in A.L. history with each of first nine HR at home (Bill Akers, 1930 w/ Det.)...Since 2012, Trout hasn't gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base.

HOT HALOS: Eric Young Jr. has hit in four straight (417; 5/12, 2 2B, HR, 4 RBI)...Albert Pujols is batting .304 (21/69) his last 16 games (9 R, 5 2B, 5 HR, 9 RBI)...**Trout** has four HR his last seven games & five HR his last 10 affairs...**Cam Bedrosian** has a 2.00 ERA (27 IP - 6 ER) since June 1...Last Friday, Shohei Ohtani had best offensive performance of his career (4/5; 3 R, 2 HR, 3 RBI)... Marked first career four-hit game, multi-HR game and first two career HR on the road.

ALBERT ALERT: Albert Pujols ranks 24th all-time with 3,070 hits (Ichiro is 23rd with 3,089)...Pujols ranks sixth all-time with 631 HR (Willie Mays is 5th w/660 HR)...He is one of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (Aaron, Mays & Rodriguez)...AP is seventh all-time with 1,973 RBI (BBREF)...Lou Gehrig is sixth with 1,995 RBI...Albert's 1.285 career extra-base hits rank sixth all-time (Mavs is 5th w/ 1.323 XBH)...Only two players have logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI (H. Aaron & A. Rodriguez; Pujols is 27 RBI shy).

Vs. TIGERS: Detroit leads 2018 season series 3-2 (clubs met May 28-31 at Comerica Park)...Angels are 20-5 in last 25 home games vs. Tigers (27-9 in last 36 overall meetings at Big A)...Albert Pujols owns a .325 (68/209) career clip against the Tigers with 13 home runs & 38 RBI in 57 games...His .325 average is second highest (Toronto, .337) against any A.L. opponent...Justin Upton hit .260 (268/1029) with 59 HR & 181 RBI in 278 games as a Tiger (2016-17).

OAKLAND ON DECK: When these teams last met on June 17th, Angels were 38-34 and A's were 36-36...Since then, Halos have gone 18-24 while Oakland is 32-10... Angels are 11-5 in last 16 games vs. A's... Halos lead 2018 series 6-4 and are 18-11 vs. A's since 2017...March 29th marked the sixth Opening Day meeting between these clubs... LAA has won four consecutive season series vs. A's (2014-17)...<u>Since</u> 2013, Mike Trout is batting .331 (121/366) with 25 HR & 62 RBI in 96

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

August 7

(1973) Nolan Ryan struck out eight consecutive batters to equal his own club record in a 6-5 win at Milwaukee (10 innings); (2015) Mike Trout hit his third career birthday home run, becoming the first player in Major League history to homer on three different birthdays before turning 25.

August 8

(1975) Angels tied a club record by turning six double plays in a 4-3 loss to New York; (1982) For the second time in five days (Aug. 3), Doug **DeCinces** homered three times to tie the club mark in a 9-5 win at Seattle...He remains the only player in A.L. history to hit three HR in the game twice in the same week.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER - LHP ANDREW HEANEY

6-7, 3.75 ERA

Leads the American League with a 1.60 ERA (62 IP - 11 ER) at home since April 27

- BACK ON THE MOUND: Making 21st start of the season and 11th at home...Second start of 2018 vs. Detroit...Opened the year on the disabled list with left elbow inflammation (missed Angels first 14 games).
- HOT AT HOME: In last nine starts at Angel Stadium, is 6-1 with a 1.60 ERA (62 IP 11 ER) and 55 strikeouts...His home ERA leads the American League in that span (since April 27).
- <u>CAREER HIGHS:</u> Has already set new career highs in starts, strikeouts and innings pitched this season...With a win today, would also set new single-season career high (also had six wins win 2015).
- <u>LEFT OUT:</u> Has not allowed a home run to a left-handed batter since April 5, 2016 (**Anthony Rizzo**)...Since start of 2017, his 128 left-handed batters faced without allowing a home run are sixth most in Majors.
- RECENT QUALITY: Has registered quality starts in seven of last nine outings, including five straight from July 3-27...Has been charged with two-or-fewer earned runs in 11 of last 18 starts, while pitching to a 3.27 ERA (113 IP 41 ER) in that span...During eight game stretch from April 27 June 5, pitched to a 1.93 ERA (51.1 IP 11 ER).
- LAST TIME OUT: Charged with loss in last start on Thursday at Tampa Bay after tossing six innings and allowing four
 earned runs on six hits with no walks and five strikeouts.
- GOING DEEP: Is first Angels pitcher to have four starts of 8+ IP in a season since C.J. Wilson in 2015.
- FIRST PITCH SWINGING: Opponents have swung at the first pitch 31.3% of the time vs. Heaney, which is the 10th highest rate in the American League.
- INSIDE THE PARK: Allowed just one home run during an eight start span from April 27 June 5 (51.1 IP), but has allowed 11 home runs across 10 starts since.
- ROCKY ROAD: In 10 road starts this season, is 0-5 with a 5.30 ERA (56 IP 33 ER)...Last road victory was Sept. 2, 2015 at Oakland.
- <u>VS. DETROIT:</u> Charged with loss in first start of the year (and only previous outing in career) against the Tigers on May 31 at Comerica Park (5 IP, 8 H, 5 ER, 1 BB, 3 SO)
- AT ANGEL STADIUM: In 23 career starts at Angel Stadium, is 10-5 with a 3.40 ERA (140.1 IP 53 ER)...This season, is 6-2 with a 2.44 ERA (66.1 IP 18 ER)...Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in 15 of the 23 starts...Angels won each of his first six starts at The Big A, but are 9-8 since.
- MONTH OF JULY: Finished July with a 2-1 record and 2.88 ERA (34.1 IP 11 ER) in five starts...In 10 career starts in the month of July, is 6-1 with a 3.03 ERA (65.1 IP 22 ER)...In last nine July starts, is pitching to a 2.48 ERA (61.2 IP 17 ER).
- BACK-TO-BACK 10K: Recorded career-high 10 strikeouts in consecutive starts on July 3 at Seattle and July 8 vs.
 Dodgers...He is the first Angels pitcher with consecutive 10+ strikeout games since Matt Shoemaker (May 21 & 27, 2016).
- FIRST HALF RECAP: Finished the first half with a 5-6 record and 3.78 ERA (102.1 IP 43 ER) in 17 starts for the Angels...Led Angels pitching staff in inning pitched and ranked second on the club with 102 strikeouts before the Break.
- HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Tossed a one-hit shutout on June 5 (his 27th birthday) vs. Kansas City...Marked first complete game and shutout of career...First shutout by an Angel since Ricky Nolasco on July 1, 2017 vs. Seattle...It was the first CG one-hitter for Angels since Ervin Santana on June 16, 2012 vs. Arizona...First Angels lefty with a one-hit shutout since Chuck Finley on May 26, 1989 at Boston...Became first Major Leaguer to throw a one-hit shutout on his birthday since Cardinals' Vicente Palacios on July 19, 1994 at Houston...First Angel to throw a shutout on his birthday since Andy Messersmith on August 6, 1971 vs. Minnesota.
- 9 K's IN 5 IP: On April 27 vs. New York (A.L), became first Angels pitcher with 9+ strikeouts in five-or-fewer innings since Hector Santiago on July 20, 2015 (Game 1) vs. Boston.
- <u>STARTING NINE</u>: With first start of year on April 13, became ninth different starting pitcher used by Angels this
 season...Nine different starting pitchers through the first 15 games of a season set a new Angels record and were the
 most by any team since the 1960 Orioles. (STATS LLC)
- <u>REHAB ASSIGNMENT:</u> Made one start for Adv.-A Inland Empire on April 6 vs. San Jose and earned the win after working 6.1 innings and allowing one earned run on two hits with one walk and six strikeouts.
- <u>OFFSEASON TRIPS</u>: Participates in offseason humanitarian mission trip to Honduras each offseason along with several other Major League and Minor League players to help build a new learning center, distribute new backpacks and shoes and teach kids the basics of baseball.
- <u>CAREER NOTES:</u> Originally selected by Miami in first round (ninth overall) of 2012 First-Year Player Draft...On Dec. 10, 2014, was traded twice in one day; Was first sent by Miami to Dodgers along with C/INF **Austin Barnes**, RHP **Chris Hatcher** and OF **Enrique Hernandez** in exchange for INF **Dee Gordon**, RHP **Dan Haren**, INF **Miguel Rojas** and cash considerations...Later that day was dealt by Dodgers to Angels for INF **Howie Kendrick**.
