#### WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost five of their last seven games and 22 of 32 as they open a seven-game, six-day trip this afternoon with a straight doubleheader in Minnesota.
- RHPs Reynaldo López (1-4, 3.80) and Lucas Giolito (3-6, 7.53) are the scheduled starters for the White Sox, who have lost 13 of their last 15 road games.
- The Sox won two of three games from Milwaukee last weekend, including a 6-1 victory on Sunday.
- Following this three-game series, the White Sox conclude the trip with three games at Boston (6/8-10) before returning home for seven games vs. Cleveland (6/11-14) and Detroit (6/15-17).
- The Sox went 1-5 on their last trip to Detroit (1-2) and Cleveland (0-3) from 5/25-30.

#### TODAY'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox begin a stretch where they play 21 games in 20 days from 6/5-24 ... they also are in the middle of a stretch from 5/25-6/10 where they play 13 of 16 games on the road.
- The Sox have lost seven of their last eight games vs. Minnesota and six of their last seven at Target Field.
- The White Sox bullpen has allowed two runs on four hits in 11.2 IP over the last three games (1.54 ERA) and owns a 2.47 ERA (13 ER/47.1 IP) over the last 15.
- Daniel Palka is hitting .346 (9-26) with three home runs and six RBI over his last eight games.
- José Abreu has 30 RBI in 37 career games at Target Field.

#### ROSTER MOVES

- The White Sox have recalled C Kevan Smith from Class AAA Charlotte and have added RHP Juan Minaya from Charlotte to serve as the 26th man for today's doubleheader.
- The Sox yesterday reinstated INF Matt Davidson (back spasms) from the 10-day disabled list and optioned C Alfredo González and INF Matt Skole to Class AAA Charlotte.

#### SUNDAY'S RECAP

- Pinch-hitter Daniel Palka broke a 1-1 tie with a go-ahead, two-run home run off Matt Albers, and Adam Engel followed with a solo shot off Albers as the White Sox won the deciding game of the series, 6-1, vs. Milwaukee.
- Dylan Covey, a former first-round draft pick of the Brewers, posted a no decision, allowing one unearned run on four hits with seven strikeouts over 5.0 IP to lower his ERA to 2.82.
- Luis Avilán (0.2 IP), Chris Volstad (0.1), Joakim Soria, Jace Fry and Chris Beck (1.0 apiece) combined for 4.0 scoreless IP in relief, with Volstad earning his first win of the season.
- Alfredo González recorded his first major-league hit, a game-tying single off Brent Suter in the fifth inning.

#### SOX SELECT MADRIGAL AND WALKER

- The White Sox selected INF Nick Madrigal from Oregon State with their first pick (fourth overall) in the First-Year Player Draft.
- Madrigal, a 21-year-old junior, is batting .406 (54-133) with seven doubles, four triples, three home runs, 32 RBI, 32 runs scored, 11 stolen bases, a .470 on-base percentage, .586 slugging percentage and 1.000 fielding percentage in 32 games for No. 3 Oregon State this season.
- The Sox drafted OF Steele Walker from Oklahoma with their second-round pick (No. 46 overall) ... Walker, the No. 30 overall prospect according to MLB Pipeline, hit .352/.441/.606 (76-216) with 13 homers, 53 RBI and 48 runs scored in 54 games as a junior ... he led the Sooners in virtually every offensive category.

#### LET'S PLAY TWO

- The White Sox are playing their second doubleheader of the season ... the Sox split a twinbill on 4/28 at Kansas City, winning the opener, 8-0, before dropping the nightcap, 5-2.

#### SEEING STARS

- Class A Kannapolis will send seven players plus manager Justin Jirschele to the South Atlantic League All-Star Game.
- RHPs Blake Battenfield, Jake Elliott and Tyler Johnson, OFs Craig Dedelow and Luis González and INFs Tate Blackman and Laz Rivera will represent the Intimidators at the All-Star Game on 6/19 in Greensboro, S.C.
- The Intimidators are a SAL-best 34-19 (.642) in Jirschele's second season at the helm.

#### WHITE SOX VS. MINNESOTA

- The Twins lead the season series, 4-1, winning three of four games at Guaranteed Rate Field from 5/3-6 after winning on 4/12 at Target Field (last three were PPD).
- The Sox are batting .216/.256/.389 (35-162) with a 4.91 ERA (24 ER/44.0 IP) and have been outscored, 28-17.
- Chicago is 3-12-2 in the last 17 season matchups (2001-17).
- The White Sox trail the all-time series, 426-477 ... they are 231-221 at home (117-102 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and 195-256 on the road (36-41 at Target Field).

#### SOX-TWINS CONNECTIONS

- HOF Jim Thome played for both the White Sox (2006-09) and Twins (2010-11) and hit a game-winning homer in Chicago's 1-0 victory vs. Minnesota in Game 163 of the 2008 season.
- White Sox pitching coach Don Cooper (1981-82) and bullpen catcher Mark Salas (1985-87) both played for the Twins.
- Sox OF Daniel Palka played in the Twins organization in 2017.
- Twins LHP Zach Duke (2015-16), INF Eduardo Escobar (2011-12) and RHP Addison Reed (2011-13) played for the Sox.

#### REMEMBERING SNOW DAYS

- The final three games of the series between Chicago and Minnesota from 4/13-15 at Target Field were postponed due to rain, snow and blizzard conditions.
- According to Elias, the three straight postponements were the most in the major leagues since Seattle and Cleveland endured four in a row in April 2007.
- The last time the White Sox had three consecutive games postponed was 9/12-13/08 (included makeup game and DH).

#### LOOKING FOR CENTRAL COMMAND

- The White Sox are 7-14 against the American League Central in 2018, going 1-6 at home and 6-8 on the road.
- Chicago has lost 14 of its last 19 games vs. the AL Central, and is 15-29 in its last 44 road games against the division.
- The Sox are 298-391 vs. the AL Central since 2009, posting a losing record every season except 2012 (37-35).

#### ON THE FARM

- Class AA Birmingham OF Eloy Jiménez has been named Southern League Player of the Month for May ... Jiménez, 21, batted .374 (40-107) with 11 doubles, one triple, six home runs, 25 RBI and 17 runs scored over 26 games.
- Class AAA Charlotte OF Jacob May has been named International League Player of the Week for the period of 5/28-6/3 ... May batted .429 (12-28) with one home run, five RBI and six runs scored in seven games last week.

#### 30/30 THREAT

- SS Tim Anderson (11 HR/12 SB) is one of three players in the major leagues this season with at least 10 home runs and 10 stolen bases, joining Boston's Mookie Betts (17/13) and the Angels Mike Trout (19/13).
- Anderson is on pace to record career highs with 32 homers and 35 steals ... the 32 home runs would be the most by a shortstop in Sox history, and the 35 steals would be the most since Ozzie Guillén in 1989 (36).

#### STOP! THIEF!

- The White Sox lead the major leagues with 50 stolen bases this season and rank third with an 82.0 (50-61) success rate.
- The Sox are on pace to steal 145 bases this season, which would be three less than their combined total of 148 from 2016-17 ... they have not led the majors in steals since 1966 (153).

#### TRIPLE THE FUN

- The White Sox lead the American League and rank fourth in the majors this season with 18 triples ... the Sox led the AL with 37 triples last season, their highest total since 1999 (also 37).
- Yolmer Sánchez is tied for the major-league lead with six triples in 2018, and Daniel Palka is tied for 12th with three.

#### NO RISP, NO REWARD

- The White Sox rank 13th in the American League and 26th in the majors with a .230 (98-427) average with RISP in 2018.
- The Sox are hitting .172 (15-87) with RISP in their last 13 road games (since 5/1).

#### QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- The White Sox have made a major-league leading 1,337 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, two more than the second-place New York Mets (1,335) and 42 more than Oakland (1,295), the next-closest American League team.

## LÓPEZ AT A GLANCE

- The 24-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season, seventh on the road and second career vs. Minnesota.
- Is 1-0 with a 1.20 ERA (2 ER/15.0 IP), 0.80 WHIP, .143 opponents average (7-49) and 11 strikeouts over his last two starts ... has allowed two runs or less in three of his last four outings.
- Went 3-0 with a 4.62 ERA (13 ER/25.1 IP) over his final four starts of 2017 ... made his White Sox debut on 8/11/17 vs. Kansas City, receiving a no decision after allowing two runs with six strikeouts over 6.0 IP.
- Was named the White Sox Minor League Pitcher of the Month for July 2017 after posting a 2.10 ERA (7 ER/30.0 IP) with 38 strikeouts and a .183 (20-109) opponents average over five starts.
- Was acquired from Washington with RHPs Dane Dunning and Lucas Giolito in exchange for OF Adam Eaton on 12/7/16 ... originally was signed by the Nationals as a non-drafted free agent on 6/21/12.

## LAST START

- Recorded his fourth loss of the season on 5/30 at Cleveland ... allowed a season-high eight runs (seven earned) on seven hits over 2.2 IP.
- Gave up two runs in the first inning, one on a wild pitch and the other on a RBI single to Yonder Alonso ... allowed a RBI single to Edwin Encarnacion, a RBI double to Melky Cabrera for three more runs in the third.
- Departed with the White Sox trailing, 7-0 after tossing 73 pitches (52 strikes) ... the Indians went on to win, 9-1, after scoring two more runs in the fourth inning.

## TWO OR LESS IS BEST

- Has allowed two earned runs or less in eight of his 11 starts this season, including three of his last four ... the eight starts of two earned runs or less is the seven-most in the American League ... Houston's Justin Verlander leads the American League with 11 such starts.
- Allowed two earned runs or less in five of his first six starts in 2018.
- Is 1-2 with five no decisions when allowing two earned runs or less ... the White Sox have scored a total of 18 runs of support in those outings (3.08 RSA; 18 RS/52.2 IP), going 2-6.

## ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- Is making his 14th career start on the road ... has gone 4-6 with a 5.72 ERA (46 ER/72.1 IP), 60 strikeouts and a .288 (82-285) opponents average in his career.
- Owns a 0-3 record with a 6.00 ERA (20 ER/30.0 IP) in six road starts this season, compared to 1-1 with a 1.85 ERA (7 ER/34.0 IP), 21 strikeouts and a .147 (17-116) opp. average in five starts at home.

## HELP WANTED

- Owns a 3.23 run support average (23 RS/64.0 IP) in 2018, the sixth-lowest in the American League.
- Has received three runs of support or less in seven of his 11 starts, including zero runs four times.
- Received a 7.55 RSA (40 RS/47.2 IP) in eight starts last season.

## MAKING HISTORY

- Is the first White Sox pitcher with 6.0-plus IP, two-or-fewer hits allowed, and one-or-fewer runs allowed in each of his first two starts of the season (source: Elias).
- Became the first White Sox starting pitcher since at least 1908 to lose a game in which he thre 7.0-plus IP while allowing two or less hits and one run which was unearned (source: Baseball Reference and STATS LLC) ... the last five pitchers to accomplish this feat:

## 2017 REVIEW

- Made eight starts with the White Sox in his first season with the organization ... went 1-2 with a 3.56 ERA (12 ER/3.0 IP) in five starts at home and 2-1 with a 6.75 mark (13 ER/17.1 IP) over three road starts.
- Five of his seven starts were quality ... went 2-2 with a 3.15 ERA (11 ER/30.1 IP) and 16 strikeouts in those outings.
- Worked a career-high tying 7.0 IP (four runs) in a win on 9/16 at Detroit ... allowed three runs in the second inning before limiting the Tigers to one run on five hits over his final 5.0 IP.
- Suffered his first loss with the White Sox on 8/17 at Texas, allowing six runs on five hits over 4.1 IP before exiting game with soreness on his right side.
- Was placed on the disabled list on 8/19 (retro to 8/18) with a back strain ... reinstated on 9/1, made the start that night vs. Tampa Bay (L; 3 ER/6.0 IP).
- Made 22 starts with Class AAA Charlotte, going 6-7 with a 3.79 ERA (51 ER/121.0 IP) and 131 strikeouts ... allowed two earned runs or less in seven of his final eight starts from 6/29-8/6 before being promoted.
- Entered the season ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 3 Prospect in the White Sox organization and No. 31 in baseball ... was rated by MLB.com as the No. 4 Prospect in the Sox system, No. 38 in baseball and the No. 9 right-handed pitching prospect.

## PERSONAL NOTES

- His grandfather sold two cows in the Dominican Republic to buy him a used glove, a pair of cleats and an aluminum bat when he started playing baseball.

## VS. AMERICAN LEAGUE CENTRAL

- Is making his 11th career start against the American League Central and sixth this season.
- Has gone 3-3 with a 3.98 ERA (27 ER/51.0 IP) in 10 career starts against the division.
- Suffered the loss in his last start on 5/30 at Cleveland, allowing a season-high seven runs on eight hits over 2.2 IP.
- Is 0-2 with a 2.82 ERA (15 ER/29.2 IP), 12 strikeouts and a .282 (31-110) opponents average in five starts this season.

## VS. MINNESOTA TWINS

- Is making his second career start against Minnesota and second this season ... received a no decision on 5/3 at Guaranteed Rate Field, allowing five runs on six hits and two walks over 6.2 IP.
