### ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (47-43) at CHICAGO WHITE SOX (30-61)

#### WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost six straight games, 10 of the last 12 and 19 of 25 as they continue their final homestand before the All-Star break tonight vs. St. Louis.
- LHP Carlos Rodón is scheduled to start for the White Sox, who are a season-high 31 games under .500 for the first time since the end of the 2013 season (63-99).
- The Sox went 2-8 on their last trip ... they were swept in four games at Houston and lost two of three at Texas and Cincinnati.
- Following tonight's finale vs. the Cardinals and tomorrow's off day, the Sox will conclude the pre-All-Star portion of their schedule with three games vs. Kansas City from 7/13-15.
- Chicago will open the second half with a seven-game trip at Seattle (7/20-22) and Los Angeles-AL (7/23-26).
- The Sox went 4-3 on their last homestand vs. Oakland (2-2) and Minnesota (2-1) from 5/22-28 (rainout on 5/21).

#### TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox 30-61 record is tied for the worst start in franchise history (third time; last 1948) ... their 61 losses are the most before the All-Star break in club history.
- Chicago is trying to avoid being swept for the 11th time in a series of two games or more this season.
- The Sox have homered in six of their last eight games (12 home runs total), and hit 22 in the last 17 contests.
- Chicago is batting .293/.348/.495 with 20 homers and 89 runs scored in 12 home games (7.4 R/G) all-time vs. St. Louis.
- Carlos Rodón owns a 2.77 ERA (4 ER/13.0 IP), .196 opponents average (9-46), 0.92 WHIP and just two walks allowed in two starts at Guaranteed Rate Field this season.

#### ROSTER MOVES

- Prior to tonight's game vs. St. Louis, the White Sox purchased the contract of RHP Jeanmar Gómez from Class AAA Charlotte and designated RHP Bruce Rondón for assignment.
- Gómez, who will wear No. 54, went 5-0 with a 2.03 ERA (9 ER/40.0 IP), two saves and 35 strikeouts in 30 relief appearances with Charlotte ... he has limited lefties to a .186 (11-59) average, and opponents overall to a .135 (5-37) mark with RISP.
- Rondón went 2-3 with an 8.49 ERA (28 ER/29.2 IP), one save, five holds and 40 strikeouts over 35 relief outings in 2018.

#### LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- St. Louis snapped a tie game by scoring 12 unanswered runs over the final six innings in its 14-2 win over Chicago ... the White Sox losing streak was extended to six games.
- Charlie Tilson tied the game with a two-run single in the third before the Cardinals scored in five of the final six frames, including a grand slam by Dexter Fowler in a seven-run sixth.
- Dylan Covey suffered his fourth consecutive loss after allowing five runs (four earned) on nine hits over 5.0 IP.
- Three Sox relievers combined to allow nine runs in 4.0 IP.
- Chicago was limited to five hits (zero multihit efforts), walked twice, struck out nine times and went 1-4 with RISP.

#### WHITE SOX REMEMBER

- The White Sox organization mourns the loss of former infielder Sammy Esposito, who passed away on Monday at age 81.
- Esposito played nine seasons with the Sox (1952, '55-62) and was a part of their 1959 American League pennant winning team ... he appeared in two World Series games vs. the Dodgers.
- Following his playing career, Esposito served as the head baseball coach at North Carolina State University.

#### DYNAMIC DUO

- Xavier Cedeño (15 G) and Joakim Soria (17) have combined to allow just three earned runs with 36 strikeouts and a .156 (15-96) opp. average in 17 relief outings (28.1 IP) since 5/30.
- Soria has made 16 scoreless appearances, and Cedeño has not allowed a run in 14 outings.

#### MR. ABREU GOES TO WASHINGTON

- José Abreu has been selected by the fans to be the starting first baseman for the American League in the 2018 All-Star Game at Nationals Park on 7/17 ... it marks the second All-Star selection of his career (reserve in 2014).
- He paced AL first basemen with 1,829,598 votes.
- Abreu is the first White Sox to be voted into the ASG by the fans since first baseman Frank Thomas in 1996 ... Thomas did not play in the game due to injury.
- He is the sixth Sox player (11th time) to be fan elected as a starter, joining Thomas (1994-96), Carlton Fisk (1981-82), Richie Zisk (1977), Dick Allen (1972-74) and Luis Aparicio (1970).
- Abreu is the fourth Chicago first baseman since 1970 to make multiple All-Star teams, joining Allen, Thomas and Paul Konerko.

#### WHITE SOX VS. ST. LOUIS CARDINALS

- St. Louis leads the season series, 3-0, and is looking for its second season sweep of the White Sox (also 2001).
- Chicago is hitting .181/.250/.223 with zero homers, own a 6.75 ERA (19 ER/25.1 IP) with two QS and have been outscored, 20-6.
- The White Sox have lost five consecutive games and seven of the last nine ... the Sox and Cardinals split four games in 2015.
- The Sox trail in the all-time series, 11-17, going 6-6 in Chicago and 5-11 on the road (3-4 at new Busch Stadium).
- The Cardinals own a 158-145 edge in runs scored all-time.

#### CARDINAL CONNECTIONS

- White Sox bench coach Joe McEwing began his MLB career with the Cardinals, appearing in 162 games from 1998-99.
- Sox OF Charlie Tilson originally was drafted by St. Louis in the second round of the 2011 draft ... he was acquired by Chicago in exchange for LHP Zach Duke on 7/31/16.
- Cardinals INF José Martínez originally was signed by the White Sox as an international free agent in 2006 ... his father, Carlos, played for the White Sox from 1988-90.
- Cardinals INF Paul DeJong (Antioch) and RHP Luke Gregerson (Park Ridge) are natives of the Chicagoland area.
- St. Louis radio broadcaster John Rooney called White Sox games for 18 seasons, including the 2005 championship year.

#### INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT

- The White Sox are 4-12 during interleague play, losing three of the last four and six of the last nine ... they have been held to three runs or less eight times in 2018.
- The Sox will finish with a losing record vs. the National League for the fourth consecutive season (went 11-9 in 2014).
- Chicago is 4-4 over its last eight but 4-9 in its last 13 IL games at Guaranteed Rate Field ... the Sox went 6-14 in 2017.
- The Sox are 210-189 all-time during IL play (since 1997).

#### 1993 WHITE SOX REUNION

- The White Sox will welcome back coaches and players from the 1993 American League West Division Championship team on Saturday vs. Kansas City.
- Among those scheduled to appear in honor of the 25-year anniversary include: Ozzie Guillén, Bo Jackson, 1993 AL Cy Young winner Jack McDowell, Hall-of-Famers Tim Lincecum and Frank Thomas; pitchers Wilson Álvarez and Jason Bere, INF Craig Grebeck; OFs Mike Huff, Lance Johnson, Warren Newson and Dan Pasqua; and manager Gene Lamont.

#### ON THE MEND

- OF Nicky Delmonico is 1-11 (.091) with one walk in four injury rehab assignment games with Class AA Birmingham.
- Delmonico has been on the DL since 5/19 with a fractured third metacarpal on his right hand suffered on 5/18 vs. Texas.

#### BARRELING BACKSTOPS

- Omar Narváez and Kevan Smith are hitting a combined .355 (50-141) with seven doubles, two homers, 18 RBI and 15 multihit efforts in 39 games since 6/1 ... they have hit safely in 33 contests.
- Narváez (1st, .397) and Smith (3rd, .321) rank in the Top 3 among MLB catchers in average since 6/1 (minimum 65 PAs).
- Narváez owns nine multihit efforts and has hit safely in 16 games since 6/1 ... Smith has hit safely in 18 of his 20 games in 2018 since being recalled from Class AAA Charlotte on 6/5.

#### POWER AND SPEED

- Tim Anderson (13 HR/21 SB) is the only player in MLB this season with 13-plus home runs and 20-plus stolen bases.
- His 21 steals are a career high, and his 13 homers are four shy of his career-high 17 last season.
- Anderson is on pace for 23 home runs and 37 stolen bases in 2018 ... the 23 homers would tie Juan Uribe (2004) for the sixth-highest total by a White Sox shortstop, and the 37 steals would be the most since Luis Aparicio in 1961 (53).

#### STOP! THIEF!

- The Sox are tied for second in MLB with 70 steals in 2018 ... they are on pace for 125 stolen bases, which would be their most since 2010 (160) ... they have not led MLB since 1966 (153).
- Tim Anderson ranks second in the AL with 21 steals in 2018 ... he has stolen a base in four of his last six games.

#### TRIPLE THE FUN

- The White Sox rank second in the major leagues this season with 27 triples, trailing Arizona (31) ... Chicago led the American League with 37 triples last season.
- Yolmer Sánchez leads the major leagues with nine triples in 2018 after ranking sixth last season with eight.

### RODÓN AT A GLANCE

- The 25-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season, third at home and first during interleague play.
- His 411 career strikeouts are the most by a White Sox pitcher in his first 72 career games ... is averaging 9.04 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (409.1 IP) lifetime ... has struck out 10-plus seven times in his career.
- Started the 2018 season on the disabled list to continue his rehabilitation from left shoulder surgery ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left shoulder on 9/27/17.
- Began the 2017 season on the disabled list with left biceps bursitis ... went 2-5 with a 4.15 ERA (32 ER/69.1 IP) and 76 strikeouts over 12 starts before going back on the disabled list with left shoulder inflammation ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left shoulder on 9/27/17.
- Was selected in the first round (third overall) in the June 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of North Carolina State University ... was the highest pick by the Sox since taking outfielder Harold Baines first overall in 1977.
- Entered the 2014 draft rated by *Baseball America* as the No. 1 college prospect and the No. 3 prospect overall ... was rated by MLB.com as the No. 2 overall prospect.

### LAST START

- Received a no decision on 7/5 at Houston, allowing two runs on five hits over 6.0 IP ... walked a career-high tying six (fourth time) and struck out three.
- Held the Astros scoreless over the first four innings before allowing a two-run home run to José Altuve in the fifth ... has allowed a homer in five of his six starts this season.
- Departed with the game tied, 2-2, in the seventh ... threw 109 pitches (58 strikes) ... Yuli Gurriel hit a game-ending, RBI single in the ninth inning to give Houston the 4-3 victory.

### INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT

- Is scheduled to make his 11th career interleague start ... is 3-5 with a 5.81 ERA (34 ER/52.2 IP), 54 strikeouts and a .265 (52-196) opponents average lifetime.
- Has gone 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA (14 ER/20.1 IP), 22 strikeouts and a .266 opponents average over four career interleague starts at Guaranteed Rate Field.

### HE GONE!

- Has averaged 9.04 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (411 SO/409.1 IP) over his career, the 13th-best mark in the AL since 2015.
- Has recorded 10-plus strikeouts seven times in his career, including a career-high 11 on four occasions: 8/4/17 at Boston, 7/25/17 at the Cubs, 9/25/16 at Cleveland and 8/11/15 vs. Los Angeles-AL.

### QUALITY IS KEY

- Has made two quality starts with the White Sox this season.
- Six of his 12 starts last season were quality, including five straight from 7/30-8/21/17.
- Made 17 quality starts in 2016, going 9-3 with a 2.16 ERA (26 ER/108.1 IP) in those outings ... recorded 16 quality starts in 2015, the most among American League rookies and second-most among major-league rookies behind Cincinnati's Anthony DeSclafani (17).
- Recorded 10 consecutive quality starts from 8/11/15-4/13/16 ... went 6-3 with a 1.73 ERA (13 ER/67.2 IP), 61 strikeouts and a .202 (48-236) opponents average during that span.
- Is 21-9 with a 2.45 ERA (82 ER/300.2 IP) in 46 career starts when working at least 6.0 IP (41 QS).

### LOCKDOWN ON LEFTIES

- Is limiting lefties to a .226 (81-358) average with six home runs in his career ... right-handers are batting .267 (320-1,198) with 47 homers.
- Charlie Blackmon, Jackie Bradley Jr., Robinson Canó, Joey Gallo, David Ortiz and Corey Seager are the only lefties to homer off Rodón.

### CARLOS ON THE MEND

- Made four rehab starts during his stint on the disabled list: one with Class A Kannapolis and three with Class AAA Charlotte ... received a no decision in his only start with Kannapolis on 5/19 vs. Hickory ... allowed one run on three hits with no walks and six strikeouts over 5.0 IP ... went 1-0 with a 1.42 ERA (2 ER/12.2 IP), five walks and 22 strikeouts over three starts with Charlotte ... opponents hit .222 (10-45).

### 2017 REVIEW

- Began the 2017 season on the disabled list with left biceps bursitis ... went 2-5 with a 4.15 ERA (32 ER/69.1 IP) and 76 strikeouts over 12 starts before going back on the disabled list with left shoulder inflammation ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left shoulder on 9/27/17.
- Made five straight quality starts from 7/30-8/21-1 and pitched into the eighth inning or later in three straight starts for the first time in his career from 8/4-16
- His streak of 90 consecutive batters faced without issuing a walk ended on 8/16 at Los Angeles-NL ... matched his career high with 8.0 IP on 8/10 vs. Houston
- Struck out 10-plus batters for the seventh time in his career and third time in 2017 on 8/4 at Boston ... joined Sale (five times) and Jake Peavy (twice) as the only Sox pitchers since 2012 to record 11-plus strikeouts with zero walks in a game.
- Posted a ND on 7/30 vs. Cleveland despite allowing one run over 6.2 IP ... matched his career high with 11 strikeouts over 4.0 IP on 7/25 at the Cubs ... according to STATS, became the first pitcher since at least 1913 to work 4.0 IP or fewer in a start or relief appearance and record 11 strikeouts or more.
- Earned his first win on 7/3 at Oakland, allowing two runs on four hits over 6.1 IP ... made his season debut on 6/28 vs. the Yankees (L; 0 ER/5.0 IP; allowed three unearned runs).

### VS. ST. LOUIS CARDINALS

- Is scheduled to make just his second career start against the St. Louis Cardinals ... suffered the loss in his only start on 7/21/15 at Guaranteed Rate Field.

### FRIDAY'S SCHEDULED STARTER

- RHP James Shields (3-10, 4.53) is scheduled to make his 21st appearance (20th start) of the season, 13th start at home and second against the Kansas City Royals.
- Is 2-3 with a 2.56 ERA (15 ER/52.2 IP) and .195 (37-190) opponents average over his last eight starts at Guaranteed Rate Field.
- Suffered his 10th loss of the season in his last start on 7/2 at Houston, allowing a season-high tying eight runs on a season-high 10 hits over 5.2 IP ... walked two and struck out a season-high nine.
- Is 8-2 with a 4.18 ERA (43 ER/92.2 IP), 73 strikeouts and a .252 (89-353) opponents average over 14 career starts against Kansas City ... earned the win in his last start on Opening Day 3/29 at Kansas City (4 ER/6.0 IP).
