HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 6-3 in their last 9 games.
- ♦ The D-backs took 2 of 3 vs. Rockies during the season-opening series, March 29-31...the D-backs are 4-1 in their last 5 games vs. Rockies, 9-3 in their last 12 games (since July 1, 2017) and 11-4 in their last 15 games (since June 21, 2017).
- ♦ Among NL teams since May 28, the D-backs rank in home runs (2nd, 15), slugging pct. (3rd, .478), OPS (T-3rd, .813), runs (4th, 52), walks (5th, 35) and on-base pct. (7th, .334).
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** in his last 3 starts vs. Rockies, is 1-0 with a 2.29 ERA (5 ER in 19.2 IP), .181 opponent average (13-for-72) and 23 strikeouts (0 BB).
 - In his last 7 starts (5 quality) since April 30, is 2-2 with a 2.49 ERA (12 ER in 43.1 IP), .216 opponent average (35-for-162) and 46 strikeouts (allowed 1 run 4 times, 2 runs twice).
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has hit safely in 10 of his last 12 games at a .362 clip (17-for-47)/.434 OBP/1.136 OPS with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers, 9 RBI, 1 hit by pitch and 5 walks.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte**, in his last 9 games, is batting .357 (10-for-28)/.379 OBP/1.272 OPS with 5 doubles, 2 triples, 2 homers, 8 RBI, 1 walk.
- ♦ **Chris Owings'** .383 average at Coors Field is second-highest among active players (min. 100 AB), behind Adrian Beltre (.400) and ahead of Buster Posey (.379).

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs lost @ Giants, 5-4.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** tied his career high in hits and doubles, going 4-for-5 with 3 doubles and 2 RBI...set a club record with his 12th 4-hit game.
- ♦ **Jarrold Duxson** scored 3 runs.
- ♦ **Clayton Kershaw** allowed 2 runs with 7 strikeouts in 6.0 innings.
- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano** (1.0 IP) and **Archie Bradley** (1.0) each threw a scoreless frame.

- ♦ T.J. McFarland is celebrating his 29th birthday...after 11 years, he recently earned his degree from the University of Phoenix (Bachelor of Science in Business Management as well as a certificate in Financial Planning).

D-BACKS ACQUIRE JON JAY FROM THE ROYALS

- ♦ On Wednesday, the D-backs acquired OF **Jon Jay** (No. 9) from the Kansas City Royals for LHP Gabe Speier and RHP Elvis Luciano...to make room on the D-backs' 40-man roster, the club designated INF/OF **Kristopher Negrón** for assignment.
- ♦ Jay, 33, has hit over .290 in 6 of his 8 full Major League seasons (2010-12, '14, '16-17)...in 59 games for the Royals, he hit .307 (73-for-238) with 9 doubles, 2 triples, 1 home run, 18 RBI and 28 runs scored with 27 starts in left field, 15 in center and 9 in right, and has not committed an error in his last 238 games in the outfield (450 total chances) since April 15, 2016.
 - The 5-foot-11, 195-pound left-handed hitter ranks tied for second in the Majors with 61 singles...Royals' Player of the Month for May after batting .368 (43-for-117)/.402 OBP/.436 SLG with 6 doubles, 1 triple, 10 RBI...his 43 hits in May tied for the second most in baseball (also: Eddie Rosario/MIN), 1 shy of Francisco Lindor/CLE (44).
 - His .996 career fielding pct. (8 E in 1,913 TC) is the best among all active outfielders.
 - Has 67 games of postseason experience, fifth most among active players, and has appeared in 2 World Series (2011 and '13).

DRAFT RECAP

- ♦ In this year's First-Year Player Draft, the D-backs selected 33 college players and 8 high school players with 20 right-handed and 3 left-handed pitchers, 9 infielders, 6 outfielders, 3 catchers.
- ♦ They selected 11 players in the first 10 rounds:
 - INF Matt McLain No. 25 overall (First Round); OF Jake McCarthy No. 39 pick (Competitive Balance A); OF Alek Thomas No. 63 (Second Round); RHP Jackson Goddard (Round 3); RHP Ryan Weiss (Round 4); RHP Matt Mercer (Round 5); RHP Ryan Miller (Round 6); RHP Travis Moths (Round 7); RHP Levi Kelly (Round 8); LHP Tyler Holton (Round 9); C Nick Dalesandro (Round 10).

CONGRATS CRANK!

- ♦ **Wacy Crenshaw**, the son of **Ken "Crank" Crenshaw**/D-backs' Director, Sports Medicine and Performance, was taken by the D-backs as the club's fourth-annual "Cory Hahn 34th Pick" (34th round)...the selection is named after Hahn, who currently works in the D-backs' scouting department, wore No. 34 for Arizona State University, and was the club's 34th-round pick in 2013.
 - In 2 seasons at Glendale (Ariz.) Community College, Crenshaw hit .261 (49-for-188) with 5 homers and 32 RBI in 77 games...he attended Perry (Ariz.) High School where he received 2016 Second-Team AIA All-Section 1 honors.

GREINKE AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Third season with the D-backs...signed a 6-year free agent contract on Dec. 11, 2015.
- ◆ Won the 2009 AL Cy Young Award and finished runner-up in 2015 race to the Cubs' Jake Arrieta.
- ◆ Is a 4-time All-Star (2009, '14-15, '17), won 3 NL Rawlings® Gold Gloves (2014-16) and earned a Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger™ in 2013.
- ◆ 1 of 3 pitchers all-time with a Cy Young, Silver Slugger and Gold Glove (also: Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser).
- ◆ Won 2 ERA titles: 2009 (2.16) & 2015 (1.66)...1.66 ERA was the lowest in the Majors since Atlanta's Greg Maddux (1.63) in 1995...6 career 200+ strikeout seasons (2009, '11-12, '14-15, '17).

SNAKEBITES

- ◆ In his last 7 starts (5 quality) since April 30, is 2-2 with a 2.49 ERA (12 ER in 43.1 IP), .216 opponent average (35-for-162) and 46 strikeouts...has allowed 1 run 4 times and 2 runs twice.
- ◆ In his last 3 starts vs. Rockies, is 1-0 with a 2.29 ERA (5 ER in 19.2 IP), a .181 opponent average (13-for-72) with 23 strikeouts (10.53 K/9)...in his last 8 games vs. Rockies, is 2-1 with a 3.25 ERA (19 ER in 52.2 IP) and 58 strikeouts (9.91 K/9).
- ◆ His 2,314 career strikeouts are 51st on the all-time strikeout list, surpassing Juan Marichal (2,303)...next up is Rube Waddell (50th, 2,316).
- ◆ In last 5 games, has held righties to a .233 average (17-for-73) with 20 strikeouts (2 BB).
- ◆ In his last 6 games, has held lefties to a .173 average (9-for-52) with 14 strikeouts (3 BB).
- ◆ In his last 9 games with runners in scoring position, has held opponents to a .188 average (6-for-32) and 9 strikeouts.

LAST START

- ◆ Won, 6-2, vs. Marlins on June 2, allowing 1 run in 6.2 innings with 6 strikeouts.

VS. ROCKIES

- ◆ In 26 career games (25 starts), is 9-5 with a 3.85 ERA (66 ER in 154.1 IP), .274 opponent average (165-for-603) and 157 strikeouts (9.16 K/9).
- ◆ His 9.16 strikeouts per 9.0 innings ratio vs. Rockies is the fourth best ratio among active pitchers vs. Rockies (min. 250 BF), behind Oliver Perez (10.60), Clayton Kershaw (9.96) and Ian Kennedy (9.37).

DUCKS ON THE POND

- ◆ Among NL pitchers with runners on base, is second with a .218 opponents on-base pct. and tied for sixth with a .172 opponents average.

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ Is an avid fantasy football player.
- ◆ Was a tennis prodigy at 8 years old.
- ◆ 2002 Gatorade National Baseball Player of the Year...played shortstop at Apopka (Fla.) High School before transitioning to starting pitcher his senior season.
- ◆ Committed to Clemson University before signing with the Royals.
- ◆ Began his career at Rookie level as a shortstop and pitcher...after just 1 workout, he gave his infielder glove to Andres Blanco because he decided to become a pitcher.
- ◆ During his 2004 rookie season with the Royals, lived with Hall of Famer George Brett.
- ◆ Gave his 2009 AL Cy Young Award to his parents but kept the samurai sword Mizuno presented him in recognition of his season.
- ◆ Donates 1% of his annual salary to the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation.

CLIMBING THE K CHARTS

- ◆ His 2,314 career strikeouts are 51st on the all-time strikeout list, surpassing Juan Marichal (2,303)...next up are Rube Waddell (50th, 2,316), Early Wynn (49th, 2,334), Robin Roberts (48th, 2,357), Charlie Hough (47th, 2,362), Felix Hernandez (46th, 2,393) and Sandy Koufax (45th, 2,396).
- ◆ His 2,314 career strikeouts are fifth among active pitchers behind C.C. Sabathia (2,890), Justin Verlander (2,520), Bartolo Colon (2,499) and Felix Hernandez (2,404).

JUNE NUMBERS

- ◆ In 12 June starts as a D-back, is 8-1 with a 2.03 (17 ER in 75.1 IP), .221 opponent average and 69 strikeouts (16 walks).
- ◆ Among all pitchers in June since 2016 (min. 8 GS), he is fourth in ERA (2.03), 11th in WHIP (1.05) and 16th in opponent average (.221).

FREE PASSES AT A MINIMUM

- ◆ His 1.35 walks per 9.0 innings ratio (11 BB:73.1 IP) is fourth in the NL.
- ◆ Since 2017, his 56 walks are sixth fewest by a NL starter (min. 35 GS) [leader is Clayton Kershaw/LAD, 41].
- ◆ Has 7.09 strikeout-to-walk ratio (78 K:11 BB) is second in the Majors, behind Corey Kluber (9.50, 95:10).
