Guillermo Heredia has reached base safely in 9 of his last 15 plate appearances...in his last 4 games (9/17-c), Heredia is 6-for-12 (.500) with 3 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 3 RBI and 3 walks.

The Mariners and Athletics meet for the 17th (9-7) of 19 games in 2018...the Mariners are 17-8 in their last 25 games vs. Oakland, dating back to July 9, 2017...with a win tonight, the Mariners would clinch the season series for the 6th consecutive season (2013-c):

(Fri. 9/28) - **Fan Appreciation Night**, all fans get a team poster and prizes given out thru the game & **Postgame Fireworks**, presented by T-Mobile. (Sat. 9/29) - **Ken Griffey Jr. POP! Collectible**, for the first 20,000 fans courtesy of T-Mobile. (Sun. 9/30) - **Kids Appreciation Day / Moose Posters**...all kids (14 and under) take home a Moose Poster courtesy of Ivar's and Kidd Valley.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners began their final homestand of the season with the first of 3 games vs. the Oakland Athletics...on this homestand, will also host the Texas Rangers for 4 games beginning Thursday...went 6-4 on the final road trip of the season, going 3-1 at Los Angeles-AL, 2-1 at Houston and 1-2 at Texas...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners lost yesterday, but have won 6 of their last 10 and 7 of their last 13...are 20-20 in their last 40 games since Aug. 9...are 30-39 in their last 69 games since July 4 after winning a season-high 8 straight games, spanning June 25 - July 3...the Mariners are 45-46 in their last 91 games since June 10...Seattle is 71-59 in its last 130 games (4/28-c) and 76-62 over its last 138 games (4/20-c)...Seattle is 24-27 during the day and 61-43 at night...Seattle is 41-33 at Safeco Field, 44-37 on the road.

- **Hit Parade** - **Mitch Haniger** has hit safely in 11 consecutive games, tied for the 3rd longest active hitting streak in the Majors (also: Trea Turner-WAS); he trails Charlie Blackmon-COL (15) and Whit Merrifield-KC (14)...during the streak (9/11-c), Haniger is batting .422 (19x45) with 12 runs, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 6 RBI and 4 walks...he has hit safely in 29 of his last 31 games (8/18-c), including a 17-game hitting streak from Aug. 18 - Sept. 5.
- **Daily Double** - **Mitch Haniger** has 20 doubles since the All-Star Break, 5th-most in the Majors, behind Matt Chapman-OAK (25), Justin Turner-LAD (22), Mookie Betts-BOS (21) and Joey Wendle-TB (21)...Haniger is the 12th Mariners player in club history (done 16x) with at least 20 doubles after the All-Star Break and the first since Jose Lopez in 2009 (24).
- **Exist to Assist** - **Mitch Haniger** has 12 outfield assists this season, tied with Andrew Benintendi-BOS and Billy Hamilton-CIN for the Major League lead...each of Haniger's 12 outfield assists have come as a right fielder, tops by any right fielder in the Majors...Haniger's 12 outfield assists are the most by a Mariners player since **Ichiro Suzuki** also had 12 outfield assists in 2004.
- **Four Score** - the Mariners are 62-19 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 23-51 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Get Through 8** - the Mariners are 1 of 2 Major League clubs with a 1.000 winning percentage (74-0) when leading after 8 innings this season, joining Oakland (76-0).
- **Division Rivals** - the Mariners are in the midst of playing their final 17 games (6-4) vs. AL West foes...Seattle is 37-31 (.544) vs. the AL West this season (**9-7 vs. OAK**, 10-9 vs. HOU, 11-8 vs. LAA and 7-8 vs. TEX).

RING 'EM UP...**James Paxton** enters tonight's start with 194 strikeouts, 11th-most in the American League this season...with 6 more strikeouts, Paxton will become the 6th Mariners pitcher in club history to record at least 200 strikeouts in a season and the first since **Félix Hernández** in 2014 (248 K)...when Paxton reaches this milestone, it will mark the 20th season of 200-or-more strikeouts by a Mariners pitcher in club history...Randy Johnson has the most 200-strikeout seasons in a Mariners uniform with 7, followed by Hernández (6), Mark Langston (4), Floyd Bannister (1) and Erik Hanson (1)...Paxton will join Johnson, Langston and Bannister as the only Mariners left-handers with 200-plus punchouts in a season (last: Randy Johnson, 213 K, 1998).

HE'S GOT THEIR NUMBER...in 9 career starts vs. the Athletics, **James Paxton** is 4-0 with a 3.70 ERA (20 ER, 48.2 IP) with 62 strikeouts and 17 walks...Paxton's 9 starts against Oakland are the most of any pitcher in club history vs. any single opponent without being charged with a loss (*STATS LLC*); he ranks ahead of Jeff Fassero (8 GS vs. TEX) and **Marco Gonzales** (8 GS vs. LAA)...Paxton has recorded at least 10 strikeouts in 2 of his 3 starts against Oakland this season, including a career-high 16 punchouts on May 2 at Safeco Field (in the other start, he was removed from the game in the 1st inning after taking a line drive off his left forearm)...in 3 career starts vs. the Athletics at Safeco Field, Paxton is 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA (4 ER, 20.0 IP) with 33 strikeouts and 7 walks...he has worked at least 6.0 innings in each of those 3 home starts, while allowing 2-or-fewer runs in each outing and striking out at least 8 in each of those starts.

FIRST THINGS FIRST...**Ryon Healy** (24 HR, 73 RBI) is the first Mariners 1st baseman with at least 20 home runs and 70 RBI in a season since Russell Branyan (31 HR, 76 RBI) in 2009...among American League 1st basemen, Healy ranks 3rd in home runs and 6th in RBI.

THE CANÓ SHOW...**Robinson Canó** has recorded 5 consecutive multi-hit games, going 13-for-19 (.684) with 3 runs, 5 doubles, 1 home run and 7 RBI in that span...since Sept. 4, Canó is batting .397 (25x63) with 9 runs, 7 doubles, 3 home runs, 16 RBI, 1 HBP, 6 walks, a .457 on-base percentage and a .651 slugging percentage (1.108 OPS) in 17 games...he has 7 extra-base hits (6 2B, 1 HR) in his last 8 games (9/15-c).

COMING IN HOT...**Mitch Haniger** has hit safely in 42 of his last 48 games, dating back to July 31...during that span, he's batting .337 (67x199) with 35 runs, 20 doubles, 2 triples, 8 home runs, 23 RBI, 2 HBP, 17 walks, a .391 on-base percentage and a .578 slugging percentage (.969 OPS)...**Haniger leads the Major Leagues in hits since July 31**, while also ranking 3rd in doubles, T3rd in extra-base hits, 7th in batting, 10th in OPS and T12th in runs...Mitch went 3-for-5 on Saturday and has 7 multi-hit games in his last 10 contests.

THE EDWIN DÍAZ REPORT...in 71 games this season, **Edwin Díaz** is 56-for-60 (93.3%) in save opportunities with a 2.02 ERA (16 ER, 71.1 IP) with 120 strikeouts and 16 walks...he has limited opposing batters to a .161 (40x249) average against with a 0.79 WHIP (16 BB, 40 H, 71.1 IP)...here are some notes on Díaz's standout season:

- Leads the Major Leagues with 56 saves...Craig Kimbrel-BOS is 2nd with 42.
- Is the 14th pitcher (done 17x) in Major League history to record at least 50 saves in a season.
- Ranks 2nd among Major League relievers with 120 strikeouts...Josh Hader-MIL is 1st with 136.
- Is 27-for-30 (90.0%) in one-run save opportunities with a 0.89 ERA (3 ER, 30.1 IP) with 55 strikeouts and 5 walks...the Mariners are 30-0 this season when he enters with a one-run lead.

AS YOU KNOW...**James Paxton** is 6 strikeouts shy of reaching the 200-strikeout plateau for the first time in his career...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that when he reaches the milestone, Paxton will become the 7th Canadian-born pitcher in Major League history with at least 200 strikeouts in a single season?...the last Canuck with 200 punchouts in a season was the Cubs Ryan Dempster (Sechelt, British Columbia), who had 208 strikeouts in 2010...the only Canadian-born left-hander with 200 strikeouts in a season is Erik Bedard (Navan, Ontario), who tallied 221 strikeouts for the Orioles in 2007...when Paxton reaches this milestone, it will mark the 13th season of 200-or-more strikeouts by a Canadian-born pitcher in Major League history; Hall of Famer Ferguson Jenkins (Chatham, Ontario) had 6 such seasons, followed by Dempster with 2 and Bedard, Bob Emslie (Guelph, Ontario), Russ Ford (Brandon, Manitoba) and Kirk McCaskill (Kapusksing, Ontario) with 1 apiece.

ALL HANDS ON DECK...the Mariners have used a total of 53 different players this season...that's the 3rd-most players used in a single season in franchise history, trailing only the 61 players used in 2017 and the 54 used in 2016...Seattle has used 32 different pitchers (including 2 position players: **Andrew Romine**, 3 games, and Taylor Motter) this season; that's tied for second-most ever (1. 40 in 2017; T2. 32 in 2016)...all 38 players on the Mariners current active roster have already appeared in a game this season.

NEED TO GET TO 4...Seattle lost 6-1 at the Rangers yesterday...was the 74th time this season the Mariners had scored 3 or fewer runs in a game, and Seattle fell to 23-51 in those games...74 team games with 3 or fewer runs is the 5th-most in the AL, trailing only BAL (88), DET (80), LAA (79) and KC (76) and ranks 9th in MLB...Seattle's 23 wins when scoring 3 or fewer leads the Majors, ahead of the Cubs (22-49), Giants (21-65), Rockies (21-42) & A's (21-40).

OUR LEADERS...Mariners leadoff hitters this season – **Dee Gordon** (99 games), **Mitch Haniger** (39 games), **Jean Segura** (14 games), **Guillermo Heredia** (2 games) and **Denard Span** (1 game) – have combined to hit .356 leading off a game this year, going 53-for-149 with 9 extra-base hits, including 2 home runs...the .356 average leads MLB.

IN THE BLACK...at 85-70, the Mariners have clinched a winning season...2018 is just the third time in franchise history that Seattle never took the field with a record under .500...the Mariners were exactly .500 3 times this year (at 1-1, 3-3 & 4-4) but never fell under .500...the only other seasons the Mariners have been .500 or better on every day of the season were 1996 and 2001.

FOR STARTERS...**Matt Festa** (1.0 IP on Sept. 19) was the 11th different starting pitcher used by the Mariners this season...the 11 starters used by the Mariners this season is tied (w/7 other teams) for 14th-most starters used this season...for Seattle, 5 guys (**Mike Leake**, **Marco Gonzales**, **Félix Hernández**, **James Paxton**, **Wade LeBlanc**) have combined for 137 starts, with each making at least 26, and **Erasmó Ramírez** has chipped in 10, with five other pitchers combining for 8 starts (Eliás, 3; Bergman, 2; Festa, Miranda, Vincent, 1)...Seattle used a club-record tying 17 starters in 2017.

THE ROTATION...**Mike Leake** (30 GS), **Marco Gonzales** (28 GS), **Félix Hernández** (27 GS), **James Paxton** (26 GS) and **Wade LeBlanc** (26 GS) have all made 25+ starts this season...2018 is just the fourth time in Seattle franchise history that the club has had five pitchers make at least 25 starts...this year joins 2006 (**Hernández**, Meche, Moyer, Piñeiro & Washburn), 2003 (Franklin, García, Meche, Moyer & Pineiro) and 1991 (DeLucia, Hanson, Holman, R. Johnson & Krueger).

DON'T WALK...Mariners pitchers did not walk a Padres batter Sept. 11, marking the 22nd game this season in which Seattle hurlers did not issue a free pass...the Mariners 22 games issuing 0 walks are tops in the American League and 2nd-most in the Majors this season...they trail only the Dodgers (28), while ranking ahead of Washington (15), Oakland (15) and San Diego (13)...the 22 games with 0 walks issued by Mariners pitchers are the most in single-season club history, surpassing the previous mark of 17 such games set by the 2002 Mariners.

GOOD TO BE HOME...**Nelson Cruz** has hit 20 home runs at Safeco Field this season, which is 2nd-most all-time at Safeco Field, trailing only Richie Sexson's 21 home runs at Safeco Field in 2005...Cruz, who hit 19 home runs at Safeco Field in 2017, is joined by Bret Boone (2001) and Edgar Martínez (2000) as the only other players to hit 19 home runs at Safeco Field in a single season...overall this season, Cruz's 20 home runs at home are T5th-most in the American League (also: Francisco Lindor-CLE & Giancarlo Stanton-NYY), trailing only J.D. Martínez-BOS (24), Khris Davis-OAK (23) and Joey Gallo-TEX (23).

40/100...**Nelson Cruz** has 36 home runs and 92 RBI this season in 155 team games; that puts him on pace for 38 home runs and 96 RBI...Cruz is the only player in baseball to have averaged more than 40 homers and 100 RBI over the past five seasons...since the start of the 2014 campaign, Cruz leads the Majors with 202 home runs (40.4 per year) and is 3rd (trailing Nolan Arenado, 557, & Edwin Encarnación, 543) with 517 RBI (103.4 per year)...he had at least 39 homers and 93 RBI in every season from 2014-2017.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME...the Mariners finished their road slate at 44-37 (.543), and are currently tied for the 4th-most road wins in the Majors...the Mariners are tied with Chicago-NL (44-37/.543), Colorado (44-37/.543), Oakland (44-31/.587) and St. Louis (44-34/.564), while trailing Houston (52/22/.703), Boston (51-30/.630) and Atlanta (45-30/.600)...in Mariners club history, the 2018 club is also tied for the 5th-most road wins in a single season (also: 2000, 44-37/.543), trailing 2001 (59-22/.728), 2014 (46-35/.568), 2002 (45-36/.556) and 1997 (45-36/.556).

HOME ON THE ROAD...Seattle finished its road schedule at 44-37 (see above)...Mariners have had a winning road record just 9 times in franchise history, last turning the trick in 2016 (also: 2014, 2003, 2002, 2001, 2000, 1997, 1996).

MR. CONSISTENT...**Mike Leake** has made 30 starts this season, his 7th consecutive season of 30 or more starts...Leake should become just the second pitcher in the live ball era with at least 7 straight seasons of 30+ starts and 50 or fewer walks...Leake enters play tonight with 34 walks this year...only Greg Maddux (13 straight, 1996-2008) had more than 7 consecutive 30+ GS/50 or fewer walk seasons...Roy Halladay (2006-11) and Fritz Peterson (1969-74) each had 6 such seasons.

THE OCHO...**Edwin Díaz** notched his 8th save vs. Houston this season on Sept 17; that matches the Mariners club record for most saves by a Mariners pitcher vs. any single opponent in a single season...**Edwin also has 8 vs. Oakland this year** (3 games remaining)...Fernando Rodney (8 vs. OAK in 2014) is the only other Mariners pitcher to record 8 saves vs. 1 opponent in a single season...the AL record is 10, shared by Neftalí Feliz-TEX vs. LAA (2010), Mariano Rivera-NYY vs. BAL (2004) and José Valverde-DET vs. KC (2011).
