TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 2, 1941: Lou Gehrig dies of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis at age 37 in the Riverdale section of the Bronx.

June 2, 1935: Babe Ruth announces his retirement at age 40.

June 2, 1925: In an 8-5 win over Washington at Yankee Stadium, Lou Gehrig plays in the second game of his 2,130-game streak. After pinch-hitting in the streak's first game on June 1, he starts today's contest, replacing Wally Pipp in the lineup and going 3-for-5 with a double.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 3, 2003: Derek Jeter is named the 11th captain in club history.

June 3, 1933: Jumbo Brown strikes out a team-record 12 batters in relief (6.1IP) in a 17-11 win vs. the Philadelphia Athletics.

June 3, 1932: Lou Gehrig hits four consecutive HRs and narrowly misses a fifth, and Tony Lazzeri hits for the cycle as the Yanks win 20-13 at Philadelphia.

The Yankees tally 50 total bases, while the 33 combined runs ties for the most in a single game in franchise history.

AT A GLANCE: Today the Yankees play the second game of their rain-shortened three-game series at Camden Yards (through Sunday) after Thursday's game was postponed...are 1-0 so far...is the first stop of a now-10-game, four-city road trip, which will include a doubleheader in Detroit on Monday (makeups from ppd. games on 4/14 and 4/15), two games in Toronto from Tuesday-Wednesday, an off day on Thursday and a three-game Subway Series at the Mets from 6/8-10...went 4-2 on their recent homestand (2-1 vs. Los Angeles-AL and 2-1 vs. Houston).

- ▶ At 36-17 (.679), have the Majors' best winning pct....is the latest in a season they have had sole possession of MLB's best record since the end of play on 7/27/12 (.606, 60-39).
- ▶ Trailed Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 22-17, the Yankees are 27-8).
- ▶ Are a season-high 19G over .500...did not reach 19G over .500 in 2017 until their 157th game (88-69 at the close of play on 9/26/17)...reached a season-best 21G over .500 just once last season (91-70 after their 161st game on 9/30/17)...never reached 19G over at any point from 2013-16...is the earliest in a season they reached 19G over .500 since 1998 (26-7 at the close of play on 5/13).
- ▶ Have won 10 of their last 11 completed series since 4/19.
- ▶ Join the 1998 team (39-13) as the only Yankees clubs to start 36-17 or better through 53 results over the last 60 seasons (since 1959)...through 54 results, the 1998 team was 41-13.
- ▶ Are in the midst of playing 65 consecutive games in the Eastern Time Zone from 5/25-8/5 (does not include 6/18 resumption of 5/15 game)...are 5-2 so far.
- ▶ Are 12-9 vs. the AL East and 24-8 vs. all other divisions.
- ▶ Are a Major League-best 25-2 (.926) when their starters toss at least 6.0 innings this season.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Orioles, 4-1, at Camden Yards on Friday...**RHP Sonny Gray** (6.0IP, 4H, 1ER, 0BB, 1HP, 6K, 1HR) started and earned his fourth win...did not walk a batter for the first time since 9/28/16 at Los Angeles-AL...Machado's solo HR in the first inning is Gray's only HR allowed on the road this season (27.0IP)...**C Austin Romine** (2-for-3, 1 double, 1RBI, 1BB) extended his career-long hitting streak to 10 games...**LF Brett Gardner** (2-for-5, 1R, 1SB), **2B Gleyber Torres** (2-for-4, 1 double, 1RBI) and **CF Aaron Hicks** (2-for-4, 2 doubles) each had multi-hit games...**1B Greg Bird** (1-for-5) drove in the go-ahead run in the fifth inning with his first career triple...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-5) hit his team-leading 16th homer...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP, 3K) struck out the side in a perfect ninth for his 13th save.

▶ **RHP Dellin Betances** (1.0IP, 2BB, 1HP, 1K) loaded the bases with one out in the eighth before striking out Schoop and getting Davis to fly out...in his career, has held opponents to a .087 (4-for-46) BA with the bases loaded.

RISP MANAGEMENT: Yankees pitchers have limited opponents to a .173 BA (27-for-156) with RISP over the last 18 games (since 5/9)...their .205 opp. BA with RISP this season leads all AL staffs and is second to Washington (.188).

FOUR KEEPS: The Yankees are a Major League-best 28-1 (.966) when allowing four-or-fewer runs this season...no other team in the Majors has fewer than six losses when allowing 4R-or-less...the best mark over a full season since 1901 belongs to the 1931 Philadelphia Athletics (84-7, .923).

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees are 11-4 in their last 15 completed road games and 14-8 (.636) away from home in 2018...are 23-14 in 37 road games since 8/22/17.

- ▶ Are 4-2-1 in their first seven road series this year and 8-3-1 in 12 road series since 8/22/17.
- ▶ **OF Aaron Hicks** is hitting .328 (22-for-67) with 10XBH (4 doubles, 2 triples, 4HR) and 11RBI in 18 road games in 2018.

TANAKA TIME: RHP Masahiro Tanaka is undefeated in his last seven starts (since 4/23), going 4-0 with a 3.83 ERA (40.0IP, 28H, 17ER, 13BB, 35K, 7HR, 3HP)...opponents are hitting .196 (28-for-143) over the stretch, with right-handers hitting .176 (15-for-85)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in five-of-seven starts over the span...team is 6-0 during the stretch (including one suspended game on 5/15 at Washington, will resume on 6/18).

ROWING ALONG: **C Austin Romine** is batting .483 (14-for-29) with 9R, 4 doubles, 3HR and 10RBI during his career-high 10-game hitting streak (since 4/30), tied for the AL's longest active hitting streak...is the second-longest hitting streak by a Yankee this season (Judge, 12G from 4/1-16)...is one of four players with a double-digit hitting streak at catcher in 2018 (also the Rays' Wilson Ramos-17G, the Marlins' J.T. Realmuto-11G and the Dodgers' Yasmani Grandal-11G).

▶ Has reached in 12-of-20PA w/ RISP this season (.600 OBP), batting 8-for-16 (.500) with 2 doubles, 11RBI and 4BB...his 3.50 AB/RBI ratio (56AB/16RBI) leads the Majors (min. 50AB).

ALL RISE: **RF Aaron Judge** hit his 72nd career home run on Friday at Baltimore (in his 236th career game)...is the second-fastest player in Baseball history to reach the mark (in terms of games played), behind only Ryan Howard (235G).

- ▶ Is a career .343 (34-for-99) with 37R, 7 doubles, 13HR and 29RBI in 30 games vs. Baltimore, his most runs, doubles, HR and RBI against any team.
- ▶ Has played in all 54 of the Yankees' games this season...is one of three players in the AL East to appear in each of his team's games this season, joining Baltimore's Manny Machado (57G) and Toronto's Kevin Pillar (57G).
- ▶ Through 54G this season, has 42R, 28XBH (12 doubles, 16HR), 41RBI and 43BB...through his first 54G of his AL "Rookie of the Year" campaign in 2017, had 44R, 29XBH (9 doubles, 2 triples, 18HR), 41RBI and 34BB).

GARDY PARTY: **LF Brett Gardner** has hit safely in nine of his last 10G (since 5/18), batting .372 (16-for-43) with 6R, 3 doubles, 3HR and 5RBI.

- ▶ Is hitting .351 (27-for-77) with 14R, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR, 11RBI, 11BB and 4SB in his last 20G (since 5/4)...since 5/4, has raised his season BA 65 points (.194 to .259).
- ▶ Is a career .314 (229-for-729) hitter with 18HR and 72RBI in 205G in June, his highest batting average of any calendar month (next: May - .282).
- ▶ Has 247SB in his career...needs 2SB to tie Hal Chase (249) for fourth place on the Yankees' all-time stolen bases list.

THE GLEY-HEY KID: Since his debut on 4/22, **2B Gleyber Torres** leads MLB rookies with a .325 BA (38-for-117) and 27RBI and is tied for the lead with 9HR...is one of nine players in franchise history with at least 27RBI through his first 34 career games and the third to do so prior to turning 22 (Joe DiMaggio-37RBI at age 21 and Mickey Mantle-31RBI at age 19).

YOUTH BEING SERVED: Yankees rookie batters lead the Majors in runs scored (59), hits (114) and doubles (28), are tied for first in RBI (68) and are second with 22HR (San Diego-28)...also rank fourth with a .281 batting average (114-for-405)...rookies across the Majors are hitting .234.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have homered in 42 of their 54 games, trailing only Texas (43) for most in the Majors.

- ▶ Yankees batters lead the Majors in runs per game (5.61), HR (88), HR per game (1.63), OPS (.805) and walks (218), and rank second in runs (303), OBP (.338), SLG (.467), and XBHs (205) and third in total bases (865).

K/9 UNIT: Yankees relievers lead the Majors with 259K and a 12.16 K/9.0IP ratio (191.2IP)...are on pace to record 777K, which would be the most strikeouts by a bullpen in MLB history (Houston, 662K in 2017)...their 12.16K/9.0IP ratio would also be the best single-season mark all time...rank third with 3.28 K/BB (79BB) this season.

- ▶ Among relievers, **LHP Aroldis Chapman** is second in the Majors and leads the AL with a 16.27 K/9.0IP ratio (44K, 24.1IP)...his 44K are fourth-most among relievers (second-most in the AL)...among AL relievers, has the sixth-lowest ERA (1.48, 24.1IP, 4ER)...**RHP Dellin Betances** is third in the Majors (second in the AL) with a 15.38 K/9.0IP ratio (41K, 24.0IP), and is sixth among relievers with 41K (third-most in the AL).

SUNDAY NIGHT BASEBALL: On Friday, two Yankees games were picked up for ESPN's Sunday Night Baseball: Yankees at Blue Jays on 7/8 and Yankees at Red Sox on 8/5...first pitch for both games is scheduled for 8:05 p.m.

YANKEE DOODLES

#17 AARON BOONE—MANAGER Career Managerial Record: 36-17

- Was ejected in the sixth inning of Tuesday's loss at Texas (balls and strikes)...was his first career managerial ejection.
- Was named the 33rd manager in Yankees history on 12/4/17, signing a three-year contract through the 2020 season with a team option for 2021.
- Is the 18th Yankees manager to have also played for the club.
- Won his managerial debut (3/29 at Toronto) and first home game (4/3 vs. Tampa Bay).
- According to *Elias*, joins his father, Bob, as the third father-son duo to both serve as Major League managers, joining George and Dick Sisler and Bob and Joel Skinner...Bob Boone spent parts of six seasons as a Major League skipper.
- With his grandfather (Ray), father (Bob) and older brother (Bret), is part of the first family in Baseball history to produce three generations of Major League players.

#41 MIGUEL ANDÚJAR—INF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/7G (2x)

- Leads all Major League rookies in extra-base hits (24), is tied for most multi-hit games (17) and ranks second in hits (51).
- In last 38 games (since 4/13), is hitting .324 (48-for-148) with 25R, 17 doubles, 2 triples, 5HR and 15RBI.
- Did not play in Friday's win at Baltimore...has 20H in last 60AB...was 2-for-4 with 3R, 2 doubles and 1BB in Tuesday's win vs. Houston, setting a career high in runs scored...**on homestand** was 6-for-20 (.300) with 4R, 3 doubles, 1RBI and 3BB in 6GS at 3B.
- Had 26XBH through his first 49 career games, tied for fourth-most in Yankees history through 49G (Joe DiMaggio-40XBH; Gary Sánchez-31; Bob Meusel-28, Tommy Henrich-26).
- Hit "walk-off" RBI single in the ninth and was 2-for-5 with 2R in 5/4 win vs. Cleveland...was his first career "walk-off" hit...at 23y, 63d old, became the second-youngest Yankee with a "walk-off" hit since 2010 (Clint Frazier, 22y, 305d on 7/8/17 v. Milwaukee)...Gleyber Torres (2y, 144d) hit a "walk-off" HR on 5/6.
- Is in his first stint with the Yankees this season (4/1-present).
- Is the Yankees' No. 5 prospect (No. 59 in Baseball) according to *Baseball America*.
- Was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on July 2, 2011.

#26 TYLER AUSTIN—1B Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/5G

- Among Major League rookies, ranks third with 8HR (2nd in AL), is tied for sixth with 14XBH (T4th AL) and is sixth with 23RBI (3rd in AL).
- Did not play in Friday's win at Baltimore...is hitless in last 18AB...**on homestand** was 0-for-7 in 2GS at 1B.
- Hit two-run HRs (#7/8) and was 2-for-4 with a career-high-tying 4RBI in 5/20 win at Kansas City...was his second career multi-HR game (also 3/31 at Toronto)...was his career-high third straight multi-hit game...hit two-run HR (#6) and was 2-for-2 with 3RBI and 1SF in 5/15 suspended game at Washington...snapped an 0-for-23 stretch with a second-inning single.
- Was ejected in the top of the seventh inning of 4/11 win at Boston...served a four-game suspension for the incident from 4/27-30.
- Of his 15 career HR, 11 have tied the game (3) or given the Yankees the lead (8).
- Was selected by the Yankees in the 13th round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft.

#33 GREG BIRD—1B Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 4G/4G

- Has 5HR in last 13G (since 9/23/17) and 7HR in last 19G (since 9/15/17).
- Was 1-for-5 with 1 triple and 1RBI in Friday's win at Baltimore...**on homestand** was 4-for-16 (.250) with 1R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI and 1HP in 4GS at 1B...made his season debut and went 0-for-4 in 5/26 loss vs. Los Angeles-AL...hit solo HR (#1) in the seventh and was 2-for-4 in Monday's loss vs. Houston...was his first HR since 9/28/17 vs. Tampa Bay.
- Was placed on the 10-day D.L. from 3/29 (retro. to 3/26) - 5/25 recovering from right ankle surgery (missed the Yankees' first 47 games of the season)...had an initial examination with Dr. Daniel Murphy in Tampa and underwent a CT scan and an MRI on 3/24, revealing right foot inflammation...was evaluated by foot and ankle specialist, Dr. Martin O'Malley, in New York on 3/26 and underwent surgery on 3/27 to remove a small broken spur on the outside aspect of his right ankle...the surgery was performed by Dr. O'Malley at the Hospital for Special Surgery in Manhattan...in 12 rehab games with Single-A Tampa, Double-A Trenton and Triple-A Scranton/WB hit .205/.367/.436 (8-for-39) with 9R, 3HR, 8RBI and 10BB.
- Hit .190 (28-for-147) with 20R, 7 doubles, 9HR and 28RBI in 48 games with the Yankees in 2017...missed nearly four months of the season on the disabled list with a right ankle bruise (103 team games)...underwent surgery to remove the os trigonum, a bone in his right ankle, on 7/18/17...had 14R, 8HR and 25RBI in 29 games after returning from the D.L. on 8/26...reached safely in 12 of his 13 postseason games, hitting 3HR...hit a solo HR off Andrew Miller in the seventh inning of ALDS Game 3 vs. Cleveland, accounting for the only run of the game.
- Was selected by the Yankees in the fifth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft.

#11 BRETT GARDNER—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 2G/7G

- Is hitting .375/.452/.625 (24-for-64) with 13R, 3HR and 8RBI over his last 16G.
- Was 2-for-5 with 1R and 1SB in Friday's win at Baltimore...has reached base safely in 29 of his last 62PA (21H, 8BB)...hit leadoff HR (#3) in the first and game-tying two-run HR (#4) in the ninth and was 4-for-5 in Tuesday's win vs. Houston...was his sixth career multi-HR game (first since 5/30/17 at Baltimore)...was his 13th career leadoff HR and second of the season (also 5/26 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...his ninth-inning HR was his sixth career game-tying or go-ahead HR in the ninth inning or later and first since an 11th-inning "walk-off" solo HR on 7/27/17...according to STATS, is the second Yankee ever to hit a leadoff HR and a game-tying or go-ahead HR in the ninth inning or later in the same game, joining Snuffy Stirnweis, who did so with a go-ahead HR in the 10th inning on 8/27/47 at St. Louis...marked his most hits since going 4-for-5 on his 34th birthday (8/24/17 at Detroit)...**on homestand** was 9-for-21 (.429) with 3R, 3HR and 4RBI in 5GS (4-LF/1-CF).
- Hit leadoff HR (#2) and was 1-for-4 in 5/26 loss vs. Los Angeles-AL...was his first HR since the Yankees' season opener on 3/29 at Toronto, snapping a 159AB homerless stretch.
- Has 13 career leadoff HR, seventh-most in Yankees history (Frank Crosetti-14).
- Has seven seasons with at least 20SB (2009-11, '13-15, '17), the third-most 20SB seasons in Yankees history behind Derek Jeter and Hal Chase (eight each).
- Is the Yankees' longest-tenured player...was selected by the club in the third round of the 2005 First-Year Player Draft and made his Major League debut in 2008...is one of five players drafted by the Yankees to collect at least 1,000 hits with the club (also Thurman Munson, Don Mattingly, Derek Jeter and Jorge Posada).

#18 DIDI GREGORIUS—SS Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 4G/9G

- Was 1-for-4 with 1R and 1SB in Friday's win at Baltimore and has 6H in last 16AB...was 2-for-5 in Tuesday's win vs. Houston, collecting multiple hits in consecutive games for the first time since back-to-back 3H games from 4/24-25...**on homestand** was 5-for-24 (.208) with 2R, 1RBI and 1BB in 6GS at SS...was 2-for-4 in Monday's loss vs. Houston, his first multi-hit game since 5/3 at Houston (2H).
- Snapped an 0-for-30 stretch with a fifth-inning single on 5/12 vs. Oakland...was the longest hitless stretch by a Yankee since Russell Martin went 0-for-30 in 2012.
- Was named April AL "Player of the Month," his first career monthly award...hit 10HR with 30RBI in April, both single-month career highs...were the third-most RBI in April in franchise history (since RBI became official in 1920), trailing Tino Martinez (34 in 1997) and Alex Rodriguez (34 in 2007)...during the month, led the Majors in HR and RBI, ranked second in SLG (.739) and tied for fifth with 22R.
- Has two multi-HR games as a shortstop this season, tied for the single-season franchise record (Jeter-2004, Smalley-1982, Kubek-1960, Crosetti-1936)...is the first Yankees SS ever with consecutive 20HR seasons (25HR in 2017, 20HR in 2016).
