NATIONALS NEWS

MAX BEING MAX

The Washington Nationals topped the Tampa Bay Rays, 4-2, on Tuesday night behind yet another strong outing by Max Scherzer...He struck out 13 batters in 8.0 innings of five-hit, two-run ball...It was his Major-League leading 10th win of the seasons and ninth in a row...In the top of the sixth inning, he recorded his second career "immaculate inning," striking out the side via nine strikes...He became the fifth pitcher in MLB history to do it twice (**Lefty Grove**, **Sandy Koufax**, **Nolan Ryan** and **Randy Johnson**).

- The Nationals will cap this two-game series with the Rays this afternoon before enjoying a day off on Thursday...The San Francisco Giants will visit Nationals Park for a three-game set beginning Friday.

WINNING WAYS

The Nationals have won 10 of their last 14 games and since April 29, the Nationals (23-9, .719) boast the best record in Major League Baseball...They have outscored their opponents 134-87 during this stretch of games...Washington is ahead of the New York Yankees (22-9, .710) for the best record in MLB since April 29.

DIFO TIME

Since April 28, **Wilmer Difo** is hitting .277 with three doubles, three triples, three home runs, 11 RBI, nine walks and 20 runs scored...His 20 runs scored are tied for 13th in the National League during this span... Entering play on April 28, Wilmer Difo was hitting .200 with a .293 on-base percentage and a .246 slugging percentage...He has since raised those numbers to .247/.319/.373 thanks to this stretch of games.

START ME UP

Washington's starting rotation leads the National League in ERA (2.89), strikeouts (408), opp. AVG (.211), opp. OBP (.273), hits per 9.0 IP (6.95), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (9.99), WHIP (1.05)...The staff ranks second in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.00), opp. SLG (.356), and opp. OPS (.629) and third in home runs allowed per 9.0 IP (0.80).

- Since April 28, Nationals starters have allowed three earned runs or fewer in 32 of 34 starts.
- The Nationals boast four starters in the top 20 in the National League in ERA...No other team has more than three: **Max Scherzer** (2nd, 1.95), **Gio Gonzalez** (5th, 2.27), **Stephen Strasburg** (14th, 3.20) and **Tanner Roark** (20th, 3.61).

BULLPENING

Over the last 14 games, **Henry Blanco's** bullpen has tossed 43.0 innings of relief, striking out 40 batters, walking nine and surrendering just five earned runs along the way (1.05 ERA)...Nationals relievers have inherited 18 runners during this stretch and have allowed just one to score.

- Washington's 1.05 bullpen ERA is the best in Major League Baseball since May 21.
- On the season, Washington relievers rank among National League 'pens in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3rd, 2.89), inherited runners scored percent (3rd, 20.0%), and strikeouts per 9.0 IP (4th, 9.33).

DINGERS OF THE DAY

The Nationals lead the National League with 76 home runs...**Bryce Harper** (1st, 18) and **Matt Adams** (6th, 13) rank in the top 10 in the National League...Harper's 18 home runs are tied for fourth in Major League Baseball.

- Since joining the Nationals on May 13, **Mark Reynolds'** six home runs are tied for third-most in the NL.

With 97 in hand, **Trea Turner** is approaching 100 career stolen bases...According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, here is the list of quickest active players in terms of games (Turner: 258 games) to reach 100 stolen bases:

NATIONALS HISTORY

June 6 (4-5 on this date)

2009 - **John Lannan** went the distance for the first time and the Nationals matched a franchise mark for double plays in a single game (5 total, 4 GIDP) in a 7-1 victory over the visiting Mets. Lannan was touched for just one unearned run while notching Washington's third complete game of the 2009 season.

OPPONENT

TAMPA BAY RAYS

Dave Martinez spent seven seasons (2008-14) as the bench coach for the Tampa Bay Rays...He was the longest tenured bench coach in Rays history...**Tim Bogar** worked with Martinez during the 2008 season, serving as Tampa Bay's quality assurance coach...Joe Dillon spent the 2009-10 seasons in Tampa Bay's system, appearing in 15 games for the Rays in 2009...Rays catcher **Wilson Ramos** spent seven seasons (2010-16) with the Nationals.

THE SERIES

The Nationals and Rays will play four times in 2018 (2 in D.C. and 2 in Tampa)...Tampa Bay took three of four from Washington in 2015, the last time these two clubs faced off in Interleague Play.

DAVE MARTINEZ

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon's** bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

#57 - TANNER ROARK - RHP

Right-hander is one of MLB's top unheralded pitching performers...Is 52-41 with a 3.43 ERA in 122 career starts...He has eclipsed the 13-win mark in each of his seasons as a full-time starter (2014, 2016-pres.)...Since 2014, he ranks fifth among MLB starting pitchers in hard-hit rate (25.5%), according to FanGraphs.com...Has tossed 7.0 innings in 48 of his 122 career starts (39%), going 27-10 with a 1.55 ERA in those 48 starts...Helped Team USA bring home the Gold Medal in the 2017 World Baseball Classic...Is stellar with the glove, having committed just two errors in 116 games (574.2 IP) since the start of 2015 - a .983 fielding percentage.

AGAINST THE RAYS: Will make his second career start against the Rays, first at Nationals Park...Tossed 7.0 innings of one-run ball in Washington's 16-4 win over the Rays at Tropicana Field on June 16, 2015.

LAST START: Walked a season-high five batters in Washington's 4-2 loss at the hands of the Atlanta Braves on May 31 at Atlanta...Also appeared in the final game of the series out of the bullpen...Was saddled with losses in both contests.

2018 NOTES

- Ranks in the National League in hits allowed per 9.0 IP (9th, 6.84), opp. AVG (9th, .212), WHIP (8th, 1.09), baserunners allowed per 9.0 IP (11th, 10.45), and opp. OBP (12th, .290).
- Ranks sixth in the National League with a .181 opp. AVG vs. right-handed batters...They are 21-for-116 with four doubles, three homers, nine RBI, 12 walks and 25 strikeouts against him.
- Has allowed just one earned run in three of his last four starts, pitching to a 2.93 ERA (9 ER/27.2 IP) along the way...Has struck out 20 batters while walking eight...Has not allowed a home run during this stretch of starts (allowed walk-off home run in relief on 6/3 at ATL).
- Has tossed at least 7.0 innings in six of his 11 starts, including three of his last four starts...His six starts of at least 7.0 IP are tied for second in the National League and third-most in Major League Baseball.
- Has received just six total runs of support in his last five starts combined (1.2 runs of support per game)...His 3.36 runs support average is third-lowest in the National League.
- Matched a season-high nine strikeouts on May 5 vs. PHI, but was saddled with the loss.
- Struck out a season-high nine batters in 5.0 innings pitched on April 8 vs. New York.
- Opened the season with 7.0 strong innings on April 2 at ATL...Allowed one earned run on four hits while striking out six and walking one as Washington topped Atlanta, 8-1...Right-handed batters went 0-for-6 with one strikeout against him.

2017 NOTES

- Was one of the top pitchers in the National League in the season's second half...In 12 starts post-All-Star break, he went 7-5 with a 3.90 ERA in 14 games (13 starts)...He struck out 86 batters in 80.2 IP and held opposing batters to a .223 AVG.
- After the break, he ranked among NL pitchers (min. 13 GS) in opp. AVG (6th, .223), opp. OBP (7th, .292), hits per 9.0 IP (6th, 7.59), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (9th, 9.60).
- He recorded 42 strikeouts against just eight walks in his last six starts.
- His 10.51 strikeouts per 9.0 IP ranked sixth and his 5.25 SO/BB ranked ninth in the National League from Aug. 27 through the end of the season.
- Improved from 7.4 strikeouts per 9.0 IP in 2016 to 8.2 strikeouts per 9.0 IP in 2017.
- Went 6-6 with a 5.27 ERA in 18 games (17 starts) prior to the All-Star break.
- Threw a season-high 7.2 IP on June 5 at OAK. (7.2 IP, 5 H, 4 ER, BB, 4 SO).
- Recorded two 10+ strikeout games (11, 7/22 at ARI and 10, 9/1 at MIL) after entering the season with just two for his career.
