ROSTER NOTES: Prior to tonight's game, the Mets are expected to return infielder Todd Frazier from his rehabilitation assignment and reinstate him from the Disabled List...Frazier has been on the DL since July 9 with a left rib cage strain...The Mets are also expected to select the contract of RHP Bobby Wahl from Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League...Wahl, 26, will wear #61...He was acquired from Oakland on July 21 as part of the Jeurys Familia deal...Wahl is 4-2 with 12 saves, a 2.20 ERA (11 earned runs/45.0 innings) and 73 strikeouts in 38 combined games between Las Vegas and Nashville (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League this year... He has 292 strikeouts in 221.2 career minor league innings...The Mets will have corresponding roster moves.

TODD FRAZIER: Went 1-4 with a single last night for Brooklyn (A) of the New York-Penn League vs. Tri-City...He played 9.0 innings at third base...Frazier was 3-12 (.250) with a double, homer and three RBI in four minor league rehabilitation games.

METSCELLANEOUS: New York has lost two straight and is 4-6 in its last 10 games...New York went 12-12 in July...The 12 wins last month were tied for the second-most among NL East teams with Miami, behind the Phillies, who had 15 victories in July...The Mets are 19-22 vs. the NL East...New York is 19-40 in its last 59 games.

AT HOME: New York is 7-7 in its last 14 home games and 9-22 in their last 31 home games...Overall, the Mets are 21-33 at home this year, the second-worst winning percentage (.389) in the National League.

HISTORIC NOTE: According to Elias Sports, José Reyes became the first player in major league baseball's modern era to give up two home runs and then hit two home runs in the team's very next game...Hall of Famer Cap Anson of the Chicago White Sox accomplished the feat in 1884.

MORE REYES NOTES: Reyes hit a home run from each side of the plate yesterday at Washington...He also has done so on August 15, 2006 at Philadelphia and August 23, 2003 at Atlanta... It was also his 11th career multi-home run game...Reyes became the fourth player in team history to hit two homers in a game they did not start...Also: Curtis Granderson, August 30, 2016, Scott Hairston, July 31, 2011 and Hawk Taylor, June 20, 1964.

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Is 13-for-38 (.342) with three homers, four doubles and nine RBI, a .409 OBP and a .684 slugging percentage in 11 games since the All-Star break...Over his last 15 games, Conforto is hitting .320 (16-50) with four home runs, four doubles, 12 RBI, 12 runs scored and a .417 OBP...Conforto has a 14.6 percent walk-rate, the 10th-best in the majors.

IN THE SECOND HALF: Michael Conforto is tied for eighth in the NL with a .342 second-half batting average, seventh with a .684 slugging percentage, 12th with a .409 OBP, tied for ninth with four doubles, tied for seventh with seven extra-base hits and tied for 11th with three homers.

WILMER FLORES: Hit his 10th homer of the year yesterday...He has four straight double-digit home run seasons...Flores has two homers and four RBI over his six games.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 207-207-1 all-time vs. the Braves in Queens.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



JASON VARGAS: Since joining the Mets, Vargas is 2-1 in three games against NL East opponents...Vargas has thrown 10.0-consecutive scoreless innings against his divisional foes... He owns a 3.68 ERA (six earned runs/14.2 innings pitched) with four walks and 12 strikeouts over those three games.

ROBERT GSELLMAN: Is tied for fourth among all major league relievers with six wins and is tied for sixth in the majors with 59.0 innings as a reliever...Gsellman has five saves this year after not having one since his first year of professional baseball in 2011.

NIMMO NOTES: Brandon Nimmo is 12th in the NL with a .376 on-base percentage and tied for fifth in the majors with six triples... Nimmo has a career-high 13 homers, but has one home run in his last 35 games.

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: His next home run will be his 340th career homer and tie him with Jack Clark for 98th on major league baseball's all-time list...Bautista is sixth among active players in home runs, behind Albert Pujols, Adrián Beltré, Miguel Cabrera, Edwin Encarnacion and Nelson Cruz.

1,000: Bautista has scored 999 runs during his career...He will be one of 10 active players with 1,000 runs scored.

AMED ROSARIO: Is tied for second in the NL with three stolen bases in the second-half...Overall, is tied for fifth in the majors with six triples.

JEFF McNEIL: Slugged his first major league home run on Monday...He was the first rookie to homer this year for the Mets...He has a .435 OBP in the majors...McNeil hit 19 combined homers in the minors this year between Binghamton (AA) and Las Vegas (AAA).

IN THE MINORS: RHP Stephen Villines, the Mets 10th-round pick from last year, has a 0.54 ERA and three saves (one earned run/16.2 innings) in 12 games since his promotion to St. Lucie (A) of the Florida State League.

SYNDERGAARD AS THOR BOBBLE: This Saturday, the first 25,000 fans attending the Braves-Mets 7:10 p.m. will receive a Noah Syndergaard as Thor bobblehead presented by Marvel.

- » Strained calf (on D.L. from June 20-July 27)
- » Non-displaced fracture of the hamate bone in his right hand...Underwent surgery on March 20, 2018 to remove the bone.
- » Tommy John Surgery (2015)...On D.L. from July 22, 2015-September 17, 2016.

LAST START: Started his first game since June 19 in Colorado after a stint on the D.L. with a strained calf...Pitched 4.1 innings and gave up three runs, earned, on three hits with three walks and three strikeouts on July 27 in Pittsburgh...Received a no-decision in his 10th start of the season...Held his opponent to three runs or fewer for the fourth time in his last five starts.

VS. BRAVES: Will face Atlanta for the fifth time in his career (fourth as a starter) and third time this season...Last pitched against the Braves on May 30 of this year in Atlanta...Earned his second win of the season after tossing 5.0 shutout innings and yielding a season-low-tying two hits...Walked one batter and struck out two in the Mets' 4-1 win...Vargas is 1-1 with a 4.97 ERA (seven earned runs/12.2 innings) with nine strikeouts and five walks lifetime against Atlanta...In his last home game against Atlanta, Vargas suffered the loss after giving up six runs, earned, on a season-high 11 hits over 4.2 innings on May 3 at Citi Field...Walked two batters, struck out three and allowed a season-high-tying three home runs in the Mets' 11-0 defeat.

VARGAS AT HOME: Vargas will be making his fourth home start of the season...Is 1-2 with a 4.91 ERA (eight earned runs/14.2 innings) in three starts at Citi Field this season...His last start at Citi Field came on June 5 against the Orioles...Vargas suffered the loss after tossing 5.0 innings and allowing two runs, earned, on five hits...Has thrown at least 5.0 innings in consecutive home starts, posting a 1.80 ERA (two earned runs/10.0 innings) between the two outings.

VARGAS VS. NL EAST: Since joining the Mets, Vargas is 2-1 in three games against NL East opponents...Has thrown 10.0-consecutive scoreless innings against his divisional foes...Owns a 3.68 ERA (six earned runs/14.2 innings pitched) with four walks and 12 strikeouts over those three games...In his career, Vargas is 3-5 in 15 games, nine starts, against the NL East (excluding the Mets)...Owns a 3.27 ERA (20 earned runs/55.0 innings) with 23 walks and 39 strikeouts...Prior to this season, last faced an NL East squad in 2011.

ALL-STAR-WORTHY 2017: At the All-Star Break last season, Vargas led the American League in both wins (12) and ERA (2.62), while ranking among the league leaders in WHIP (1.15, 11th) and walks per nine innings (2.12, eighth)...Won seven consecutive starts from May 27-June 30, 2017...Pitched a complete game shutout on June 2 vs. Cleveland, his 12th career complete game and seventh shutout...Was the first pitcher in the majors to reach 10 wins, doing so in his 14th start on June 18...Posted a sub-2.00 ERA in both April and June...Was 6-0 with a 1.98 ERA (nine earned runs/41.0 innings) in his six June starts with 23 strikeouts and nine walks.

VARGAS' CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » Vargas was selected by the Florida Marlins in the second round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft.
- » Acquired by the Mets on November 20, 2006...Started two games for the Mets in 2007.
- » Acquired by Seattle on December 10, 2008 as part of a three-team, 12-player trade.
- » From 2010-12, was one of eight lefthanded pitchers to log 192.0 innings or more each year...During that time, his 168 walks were third-fewest among MLB lefties behind only Mark Buehrle (134) and Cole Hamels (157).
- » Acquired by Los Angeles-AL on December 19, 2012 in exchange for Kendrys Morales.
- » Named AL Pitcher of the Month in May, 2013, going 5-0 with a 2.30 ERA (11 earned runs/43.0 innings).
- » Signed to a four-year contract by the Kansas City Royals on November 22, 2013.
- » Selected to his first All-Star team in 2017...Worked a scoreless fourth inning in Miami.
- » Tied Clayton Kershaw, Carlos Carrasco and Corey Kluber for the major-league lead with a career-best 18 wins in 2017.
- » Signed by the New York Mets to a two-year contract with a team option for a third year on February 18, 2018.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JACOB deGROM (5-6, 1.82)

LAST OUTING: Suffered the loss in the Mets' 5-0 loss to the Pirates on July 28 at PNC Park, despite tossing his 17th quality start of the year (13th-straight)...Tossed 7.0 innings and allowed three runs, earned, on eight hits...Struck out five batters and did not issue a walk for the fourth time this season...Fell to 1-6 in his last nine starts (2.18 ERA in that span).

JAKE IN deCITI: Is 2-3 in 11 starts at Citi Field this season with an MLB-leading 1.66 home ERA (14 earned runs/76.0 innings)...Owns a 1.20 home ERA (four earned runs/30.0 innings) against the Braves in his career in five starts...Has thrown 10.0-consecutive scoreless innings at home vs. Atlanta.
