### PITTSBURGH PIRATES (19-16) at CHICAGO WHITE SOX (9-23)

#### WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost three straight games, seven of eight, nine of 13 and 16 of 21 as they continue a six-game, seven-day homestand tonight with the opener vs. Pittsburgh.
- RHP Lucas Giolito, who is making just his third start at Guaranteed Rate Field this season, is scheduled to start for Chicago.
- The White Sox opened the homestand by losing three of four to Minnesota, scoring four runs or less in all three losses.
- The Sox 9-23 (.281) record is the third-worst in baseball ahead of Baltimore (8-26, .235) and Cincinnati (8-27, .229).
- Following tomorrow's series finale vs. the Pirates and an off day Thursday, the Sox will take a five-game, interleague trip to Wrigley Field (5/11-13) and PNC Park (5/15-16).
- The White Sox went 3-4 on their last trip at Kansas City and St. Louis from 4/26-5/2 and 1-5 on their last homestand vs. Houston (0-3) and Seattle (1-2) from 4/20-25.

#### TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- Chicago is a season-high 14 games under .500 ... the club's 9-23 start is its second-worst in club history (8-24 in 1948) ... the last time the White Sox started with a 9-24 record or worse was 1948 (8-25).
- The White Sox 3-13 (.188) home record is the worst in MLB, and the club's worst 16-game start in Chicago since 1971 (2-14) ... the last time the Sox started 3-14 at home also was 1971.
- Chicago relievers own a 1.04 ERA (2 ER/17.1 IP), 15 strikeouts and a .210 opponents average (13-62) over the last five games ... the group has allowed two hits or less three times.
- Lucas Giolito owns a 1.97 run support average (7 RS/32.0 IP) this season, the lowest in the major leagues ... he has received zero runs of support four times and one run once in 2018.
- Yolmer Sánchez is hitting .333/.367/.474 (19-57) with six doubles, one triple and eight RBI in the last 14 games.

#### SUNDAY'S RECAP

- Minnesota scored in each of the final three innings, including Max Kepler's game-winning, RBI groundout in the eighth en route to a 5-3 win, clinching a four-game series victory.
- The White Sox led 1-0 through three after Adam Engel scored on a wild pitch, and 2-0 after six on Matt Davidson's sac fly ... the Twins scored three times in the top of the seventh but Leury García tied the game with a RBI single in the bottom of the frame.
- The final seven Sox hitters were retired to end the game.
- James Shields retired the first 16 batters of the game and took a no-hitter into the seventh before surrendering a one-out single to Eduardo Escobar ... the Sox bullpen allowed two runs on two hits in 2.1 IP and was charged with the loss and blown save.
- José Rondón (2-4) made his first start with Chicago ... the White Sox went 1-5 with RISP and struck out 12 times.

#### BIG-GAME TEASE

- James Shields held Minnesota hitless into the seventh inning on Sunday before allowing a one-out single to Eduardo Escobar.
- It marked the second-longest no-hit bid of Shields' career (7.0 IP on 8/2/09 vs. Kansas City), and the longest by a Sox since José Quintana on 5/21/13 vs. Boston (6.1 IP) ... source: STATS.

#### DANNY FARQUHAR UPDATE

- The White Sox yesterday announced that RHP Danny Farquhar, who suffered a brain hemorrhage from a ruptured aneurysm during a home game on 4/20, has been discharged from RUSH University Medical Center and is resting at home with his family.
- Farquhar's neurosurgeon expects Danny to be able to pitch again in the future, but he will not be medically released to pitch in a competitive game during the 2018 season.
- The White Sox organization continues to wish Danny a speedy and full recovery, and will provide additional updates on his health as appropriate.

#### STREAKING IN CHICAGO

- The White Sox have lost each of their first five series at Guaranteed Rate Field to start the 2018 season.
- The five-series home losing streak is the second-longest in franchise history (two-plus games per series) to open a season ... the 1971 Sox lost each of their first six home series.

#### PROVIDING RELIEF

- Chicago relievers own a 1.69 ERA (8 ER/42.2 IP) with 35 strikeouts and four holds over the last 13 games since 4/24 ... the 1.69 ERA is the lowest in the major leagues during that span.
- The White Sox bullpen has worked 2.0-plus IP 11 times, 3.0-plus IP six times and 4.0-plus IP four times ... the group has held the opponent scoreless in seven contests.
- By comparison, Sox relievers owned a 6.27 ERA (26 ER/37.1 IP) and .308 opp. average (45-146) in the previous seven games.

#### WHITE SOX VS. PITTSBURGH

- Chicago and Pittsburgh play four times this season, including two games at Guaranteed Rate Field and two at PNC Park.
- The Pirates swept all four games in the last season series in 2015, outscoring the White Sox by a 20-4 margin ... prior to 2-15, the Sox had won eight of nine games from 2008-19.
- The White Sox and Pirates met in each of the first three years of interleague play (1997-99) and every season from 2006-10.
- The White Sox are 17-13 all-time, going 9-5 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 8-8 on the road (6-5 at PNC Park).

#### WINDY CITY MEETS THE STEEL CITY

- White Sox manager Rick Renteria was drafted by Pittsburgh in the first round (20th overall) of the 1980 draft.
- Sox RHPs Joakim Soria (29 games) and Chris Volstad (one game) played for the Pirates in 2015.
- Pirates third-base coach Joey Cora was on the Sox coaching staff from 2004-11, and played for the club from 1991-94.
- Pirates pitching coach Ray Searage pitched for the White Sox from 1986-87.
- Pittsburgh RHP George Kontos is a native of Lincolnwood, Ill., graduate of Niles West H.S. and pitched for Northwestern.

#### MINOR-LEAGUE MENTIONS

- Below is a breakdown of White Sox minor-leaguers:
  - ◆ Class AAA Charlotte RHP Michael Kopech ranks third in the International League in strikeouts/9.0 IP (11.40) and fourth in strikeouts (38).
  - ◆ Class AA Birmingham OF Eloy Jiménez yesterday was named the Southern League Player of the Week for 4/30-5/6 ... he is hitting .400 (20-50) with six doubles, four home runs, 15 RBI, 10 runs scored and a .412 on-base percentage during his current 11-game hitting streak.
  - ◆ Birmingham C Zack Collins currently owns a 13-game on-base streak, hitting .425 (17-40) with two doubles, one triple, three homers, 10 RBI, 17 walks and a .603 on-base percentage.
  - ◆ Birmingham RHP Dane Dunning is tied for second among all minor-league pitchers with 46 strikeouts ... he is 2-0 with a 3.06 ERA (6 ER/17.2 IP) and 15 strikeouts since being promoted to the Barons.
  - ◆ Class A Winston-Salem RHP Dylan Cease was named Carolina League Pitcher of the Week for 4/30-5/6 ... is 2-0 with a 0.54 ERA (1 ER/16.2 IP), 24 strikeouts and 14 hits allowed in his last three starts.

#### INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT

- The White Sox are 0-2 during interleague play this season with 17 games remaining, including seven more in May.
- The Sox went 6-14 during IL play last season and have not recorded a winning record since 2014 (11-9).
- Chicago is 4-7 over its last seven IL games at home.
- The Sox are 206-179 (.535) all-time during interleague play (since 1997), the fifth-best record in baseball..

#### PUT AWAY THE SUITCASE

- The White Sox currently are in a stretch playing 17 of 19 games in Chicago, including 14 at Guaranteed Rate Field, from 5/3-24.
- Following this six-game homestand vs. Minnesota and Pittsburgh, the Sox will play three games at Wrigley Field (5/11-13) and four-game series vs. Texas (5/17-20) and Baltimore (5/21-24).
- The club's only road games are at the Pirates on 5/15-16.
- Chicago has been outscored, 88-51, at Guaranteed Rate Field.

#### ONE (RUN) AND DONE

- Chicago has gone 4-9 in one-run games in 2018, tied for the second-most in the major leagues behind Tampa Bay (5-11) ... the nine one-run losses also are tied for the second-most in MLB.
- The White Sox have scored one run or less eight times this season, tied for the sixth-most in baseball.
- The Sox were 21-23 in one-run games in 2017.

#### STOP! THIEF!

- The White Sox lead the American League and rank second in baseball with 31 stolen bases ... the club ranks third in the major leagues with an 81.6 (31-38) success rate.
- Tim Anderson (2nd, 10), Leury García (T6th, 6) and Adam Engel (T10th, 5) rank among AL leaders this season.
- The Sox are on pace to steal 157 bases this season ... by comparison, they stole 71 bases in 2017 and 77 in 2016.

#### QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- The White Sox have made a major-league leading 1,327 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, three more than the second-place New York Mets (1,324) and 44 more than Oakland (1,283), the next-closest American League team.

#### NO RISP, NO REWARD

- The White Sox rank 13th in the American League and 27th in MLB with a .214 (55-257) average with RISP this season.
- Chicago is hitting .200 (10-50) with RISP in the last seven games, compared to .305 (18-59) in the previous eight from 4/22-28 ... the Sox have been limited to two hits or less 24 times.

#### GIOLITO AT A GLANCE

- The 23-year-old makes his seventh start of the season (third at home) and first against Pittsburgh.
- Is 1-1 with a 3.75 ERA (5 ER/12.0 IP) and four walks over his last two starts, compared to 0-3 with a 9.00 ERA (20 ER/20.0 IP) and 19 walks over his first four.
- Is receiving just 1.97 runs of support per 9.0 IP, the lowest in the major leagues ... has received zero runs of support four times and one run once.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster.
- Went 3-2 with a 1.83 ERA (8 ER/39.1 IP) over his final six starts with the White Sox in 2017.
- Lost 10 pounds in the offseason, dropping from 255 to 245.
- Was acquired from Washington on 12/7/16 with RHP Dane Dunning and RHP Reynaldo López in exchange for OF Adam Eaton.

#### LAST START

- Suffered his fourth loss on 5/2 at St. Louis ... allowed three runs on four hits over 6.2 IP for his third quality start of the season ... walked two and struck out a season-high seven ... was working on a one-hit shutout when he gave up a solo home run to pitcher Carlos Martínez with two outs in the sixth inning ... yielded a two-run homer to Dexter Fowler in the seventh ... left with a 3-0 deficit after throwing 87 pitches (55 strikes) ... Sox lost, 3-2.

#### 2018 NOTES OF INTEREST

- Has limited opponents to a .231 (27-117) average but has issued 6.5 walks per 9.0 IP (24 BB/32.0 IP) with a 0.78 SO/BB ratio ... is tied for the American League lead with 23 walks and is tied for second with five hit batsmen ... has made three quality starts in six outings.
- Earned his first victory of the season and first career road win on 4/26 at Kansas City ... allowed career highs of nine runs and seven walks over 2.0 IP on 4/21 vs. Houston ... his three HBP on 4/7 vs. Detroit were the most by a Sox starter since Chris Sale on 9/21/16 at Philadelphia (also three).

#### DAY AND NIGHT

- Has gone 3-2 with a 2.52 ERA (11 ER/39.2 IP) and .167 (23-138) opponents average over six starts during the day since 2017, compared to 1-5 with a 6.16 ERA (26 ER/38.0 IP) and .246 (35-142) opponents average in seven starts at night.
- His 0.99 ERA during the day in 2017 would have led the American League with the required IP.

#### IT'S ALL ME

- Is one of 35 members of the Taylor Hooton Foundation advisory board, which is recognized as the leader in advocacy against appearance and performance enhancing drug use by the youth of America.
- The advisory board is comprised of at least one member from each of the 30 Major League clubs ... the players will participate in the THF 2018 public service campaign, including "It's All Me" themed PSAs which will appear in MLB's 2018 All-Star Game, League Championship Series and World Series programs.

#### 2017 RECAP

- Made 24 starts with Class AAA Charlotte and seven with the White Sox in his first season in the organization.
- Went 3-2 with a 1.83 ERA (8 ER/39.1 IP), 30 strikeouts, a .177 (25-141) opponents average and 0.94 WHIP over his final six starts ... five of the outings were quality.
- Was recalled on 8/23 and made his White Sox debut that night vs. Minnesota (4 ER/6.0 IP; 3 HR) ... earned his first win with the Sox on 8/27 vs. Detroit, allowing just three hits over 7.0 scoreless IP.
- Allowed one run and struck out a career-high 10 over 7.0 IP on 9/3 vs. Tampa Bay ... became the first Sox pitcher to strike out 10-plus batters within his first three starts with the club since Chris Sale in 2012.
- Received a ND on 9/13 at Kansas City, allowing one run on four hits in 6.1 IP ... became the 15th Sox pitcher to make four-plus straight starts of 5.0-plus IP and four hits or less allowed ... earned the win in his final start on 9/24 vs. Kansas City (1 ER/7.0 IP).
- Began the season with Charlotte ... at the time of his promotion, ranked among the IL leaders in shutouts (2nd), starts (T2nd), strikeouts (3rd), SO/9.0 (4th, 9.37) and IP (7th).
- Went 3-1 with a 1.71 ERA (6 ER/31.2 IP), 28 strikeouts and just two home runs allowed over his final five starts ... threw his first professional no-hitter on 5/25-1 vs. Syracuse (7.0 IP), marking the first no-hitter in BB&T Ballpark history ... was named IL Pitcher of the Week for 5/22-28.
- Entered the season ranked by MLB.com as the No. 12 Prospect in baseball.

- His parents, Rick Giolito and Lindsay Frost, are Hollywood actors ... Rick has appeared in "As the World Turns," "Who's the Boss," "Hunter," "Jake and the Fatman," "Twin Peaks" and "Hit the Dutchman" ... Lindsay acted in "The Ring," "Collateral Damage," "Without a Trace," "The Unit," "Boston Legal," "Crossing Jordan," "Lost," "Frasier" and "CSI."
- His uncle, Mark Frost, is a co-creator and writer of the ABC and Showtime drama "Twin Peaks."
- Grandfather, Warren Frost, was a veteran actor who played George Costanza's father-in-law, Henry Ross, on the award-winning sitcom "Seinfeld."

#### CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Was selected by Washington in the first round (16th overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft ... was committed to play baseball at UCLA prior to signing with the Nationals.
- Is a 2012 graduate of Harvard-Westlake High School in Los Angeles, where he was teammates with RHP Max Fried ... Fried was selected by San Diego with the seventh overall pick in the 2012 draft and currently pitches for the Atlanta Braves.

#### VS. PITTSBURGH PIRATES

- Makes his first career start against the Pirates and third career during interleague play ... is 0-2 with a 4.63 ERA (6 ER/11.2 IP) lifetime in IL play ... lost his last start on 5/2 at St. Louis (see "Last Start") ... also lost his previous start on 9/8/17 vs. San Francisco when he allowed five runs (three earned) on three hits and four walks over 5.1 IP.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER

- RHP Reynaldo López (0-2, 2.43) is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season (fourth at home) and second career against Pittsburgh ... ranks ninth in the American League in ERA ... has allowed two or fewer earned runs in five of his six starts.
- Posted a ND in his last start on 5/3 vs. Minnesota, allowing a season-high five runs (four earned) on six hits with zero strikeouts over 6.2 IP ... struck out 10 batters on 4/16 at Oakland ... lost on 4/8 vs. Tampa Bay despite allowing one unearned run on two hits over a career-high tying 7.0 IP ... became the first Sox starter since at least 1908 to lose a game in which he threw 7.0-plus IP while giving up two or fewer hits and one run which was unearned (source: Baseball Reference and STATS LLC).
- Won his only previous start against the Pirates on 9/24/16 at PNC Park with Washington, allowing three hits over 5.1 scoreless IP ... was acquired from Washington on 12/7/16 with RHP Dane Dunning and RHP Lucas Giolito in exchange for OF Adam Eaton.
