THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 5-1 through six games on their 10-game, 11-day roadtrip winning each of the last five (3-1 at Chicago-AL and 2-0 at St. Louis)...tonight they will begin a four-game series against the Angels through the weekend.

TWINS EXTEND WINNING STREAK: The Twins beat the Cardinals on Wednesday afternoon by a score of 7-1...Jake Odorizzi (3-2) was the starter and winner, allowing one run on two hits in 5.0 innings pitched...Ryan Pressly, Taylor Rogers and Phil Hughes all combined for 4.0 perfect innings of relief...the offense recorded 10 hits, two from both Eduardo Escobar and Robbie Grossman...the Twins went 4-for-10 with runners in scoring position.

TWINS AND ANGELS: The Twins and Angels are playing the first of seven games this season...the Angels will travel to Minnesota for three from June 8-10...last season the Twins went 5-2, going 2-1 at Target Field and 3-1 at Angel Stadium...the Twins are 9-4 against the Angels since 2016, going 3-1 in those series...this ties for their most series wins against any non-divisional opponent in that span.

- ☞ Twins hitting coach James Rowson was a hitting coach in the Angels system from 2002-05.
- ☞ Twins outfield coach Jeff Pickler was the Angels minor league infield coordinator in 2011.
- ☞ Infielder Gregorio Petit played in a career-high 89 games for the Angels in 2016, hitting .245 (50-for-204) with two home runs and 17 RBI.
- ☞ Pitcher Fernando Rodney pitched two seasons for the Angels from 2010-11, going 7-8, 4.32 ERA (100.0 IP, 48 ER) with 17 saves in 111 games.
- ☞ Catcher Bobby Wilson was drafted by the Angels in the 48th round of the 2002 First-Year Player Draft...he played parts of five seasons for the Angels from 2008-12, hitting .208 (81-for-389) with eight home runs in 191 games.

RED HOT ROSIE: Eddie Rosario has hit safely in nine straight and in 11 of his last 12 games...Rosario is batting .396 (21-for-53) with seven doubles, five home runs and 15 RBI in his last 12 games...Rosario has a 1.219 OPS in that span, fifth best in the AL, trailing Mookie Betts (1.478), Mike Trout (1.323), Francisco Lindor (1.290) and Nomar Mazara (1.237)...Rosario's nine game streak is the third longest of his career, having previously hit in 15 and 11 straight last season...it is fifth longest active streak in the AL:

WE'RE GOING STREAKING: The Twins have won a season-long five straight games, their longest since September 21-26, 2017 (also 5)...their last six-game streak was August 6-11, 2017...during the streak, the Twins have out-scored opponents 32-12 and out-hit them 48-31...

- ☞ Their plus-20 run differential during this five-game winning streak is their highest five-game span in 2018...they have recorded four 10+ hit games in these past five games after recording 10+ hits just five times previously in the season.
- ☞ Five straight is the second longest active streak in baseball, trailing the Yankees' eight straight.

ESCY FOGO POWER: Since April 18, Eduardo Escobar has hit .338 (26-for-77) with 10 doubles, six home runs, 13 RBI, nine walks, 19 runs and a .407 on-base percentage in 19 games...since that date, he ranks seventh in the AL in OPS (1.108)...for the season, he is tied with Kevin Pillar for first in baseball in doubles (15).

RG36: Robbie Grossman is hitting .316 (12-for-38) with five doubles, one home run, eight RBI, five walks and a .378 on-base percentage in his last 11 games.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1997, a streak of 19 straight steals by Twins baserunners is stopped when Denny Hocking is caught stealing, the Twins fall to the Blue Jays, 6-4...in 2000, the Twins defeat the Indians, 10-9, overcoming an 8-1 deficit at the Metrodome...it still remains the biggest comeback in Twins history...in that game, current Twins bullpen coach, Eddie Guardado, was the winner; Torii Hunter went 2-for-3 from the ninth spot in the lineup.

LAST START: Berríos stopped his personal two-game losing streak by earning his third win of 2018 at Chicago-AL on May 4...allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings on six hits and two walks with two strikeouts...allowed a first inning two-run home run to José Abreu...gave up another home run to Leury Garcia in the fourth inning, but held the White Sox scoreless in his final two innings of work.

SOUVENIRS FROM THE ISLAND: Berríos made the start in his native Puerto Rico on April 18 vs. Cleveland...he became the just the second different Puerto Rican pitcher to start a major league game at Hiram Bithorn Stadium, the other being Javier Vazquez (4 starts)...two other pitchers appeared in relief: Pedro Feliciano (1 game) and Roberto Hernandez (3 game)...he and teammate Eddie Rosario became the first Twins Puerto Rico natives to play in Hiram Bithorn.

THE ROCKET AND LA MAQUINA: By shutting out Cleveland over 7.0 innings in his start on April 18, Berríos became the first pitcher since Roger Clemens in 1991 to throw 7.0+ shutout innings three times in their teams' first 13 games of a season...Clemens went on to lead the AL in ERA (2.62) and win the Cy Young Award.

AGAINST THE ANGELS: Berríos is making his second career start against Los Angeles-AL...only career start came June 4, 2017 at Los Angeles, earned the win after allowing two runs on six hits and two walks with four strikeouts over 6.0 innings...this will be Berríos' second start against an AL West opponent in 2018 and ninth of his career...last start against an AL West opponent came April against Seattle 7, Berríos' second start of 2018...allowed five runs on six hits over 4.2 innings after retiring the first nine batters of the game and suffered his first loss of the season.

LEFT AND RIGHT: He has held right-handed hitters to a .186 (13-for-70) average with two home runs, one walk, 20 strikeouts and a .208 OBP...in his three starts at Target Field, righties are batting .156 (5-for-32) with just two extra-base hits (2 2B)...lefties have hit .226 (19-for-84) with three homers, 18 strikeouts and a .286 OBP in 2018...for his career righties have hit .242 with 30 walks and 123 strikeouts and lefties have hit .262 with 61 walks and 103 strikeouts...he allowed his first walk to a right-handed batter in 2018 in his start against Cincinnati on April 29.

WIZARD OF WHIFF: With his outing on April 12 vs. Chicago-AL, Berríos has now thrown the three most recent 10+ K, 0 run games in Twins history (August 30, 2017 vs. Chicago-AL, May 18, 2017 vs. Colorado)...the last to do it before Berríos was Ervin Santana on August 30, 2015 vs. Houston...with three games of 10+ strikeouts and 0 walks, he follows Johan Santana (8) and Bert Blyleven (6) for most such performances in Twins history...Berríos is 12th in the AL in strikeout-to-walk ratio at 4.75.

2017 RECAP:

- Berríos started 25 games, a single-season career-high.
- In first full season, Berríos finished 14-8 with 139 strikeouts and 48 walks over 145.2 innings.
- Set career highs in wins (14), strikeouts (139), innings (145.2) and ERA (3.89)...he ranked second on Twins staff in wins, and strikeouts, and third in starts and innings pitched.
- Tied for ninth in the AL in wins.
- The youngest pitcher in baseball to record an 11-strikeout game last year against Colorado on May 18.
- Made first career postseason appearance against New York-AL in the Wild Card Game... allowed three runs in three innings and was credited with a loss.

KEEPING 'EM OFF THE BASES: Through seven starts in 2018, Berríos has walked eight batters, giving him a BB/9 rate of 1.77, which is sixth best in the AL and 10th in baseball...Berríos has also only allowed 32 hits and owns a 0.98 WHIP, which is 10th best in the AL and 15th in baseball.

HIT OR MISS: In three of his first four starts in 2018, Berríos shut out his opponents over 7.0 innings or more in each start...since April 24 at New York-AL, Berríos has allowed four or more runs to opposing teams in three starts and has now allowed at least four runs in four of his seven starts...in games in which the Twins win, Berríos is 1.24 (29.0 IP, 4 ER) while his ERA in Twins losses is 10.80 (11.2 IP, 14 ER).

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: Since the beginning of 2017, Berríos is 10-3 with a 2.73 ERA (89.0 IP, 27 ER) in 15 games (14 starts) in home games...his 2.73 ERA at home is fifth best in the AL and 10th best in baseball since the beginning of last season...Berríos is 1-2 with a 3.74 ERA (21.1 IP, 9 ER) in four home starts in 2018...on the road, Berríos is 7-8 with a 4.99 ERA (97.1 IP, 54 ER) in 18 starts since the beginning of 2017.

Lynn has made six starts in 2018, 1-3, 7.28 ERA (29.2 IP, 24 ER) with 23 walks and 33 strikeouts...in his last start on May 5 at Chicago-AL, earned his first win of the season after allowed just two runs on eight hits with seven strikeouts over 6.0 innings...has made one career start against Los Angeles-AL on July 2, 2013, allowed five runs on nine hits and one walk with eight strikeouts over 6.0 innings and suffered the loss...has made three starts against AL West teams, 0-2 with a 4.34 ERA (18.2 IP, 9 ER) with nine walks and 21 strikeouts.
