OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-20) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (27-12)

SUNDAY, MAY 13, 2018 — YANKEE STADIUM — 1:05 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have split the first two games of this series...were 3-3 on the recently completed homestand vs. Baltimore (3-0) and Houston (0-3)...are 14-10 (.583) over the last 24 games dating back to April 15 after starting the year 5-10 (.333)...are in fourth place in AL West for 18th consecutive day...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 34 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

TAKING THE LEAD: Khris Davis and Jed Lowrie are tied for the AL lead and are tied for second in the Majors with 11 go-ahead RBI this season behind Arizona's A.J. Pollock (12)...Davis has hit a Major League leading eight go-ahead home runs, including one in each of the first two games of this series.

EXTRA! EXTRA! Khris Davis has homered in two straight games and his last 10 hits are as follows: HR, HR, 1B, 2B, HR, HR, 1B, HR, 2B, HR since April 22...his 11 home runs are T6th in the AL behind Mookie Betts (13), Manny Machado (13), Joe Gallo (12), Francisco Lindor (12) and Mike Trout (12).

PREACHING PATIENCE: Oakland drew eight walks yesterday and are tied for fourth in the American League with 133 walks behind New York-AL (175), Houston (151) and Toronto (144)...it was the third time this season drawing at least eight walks in a game, including a season-high 12 on April 18 vs. Chicago-AL and 10 on April 7 at Los Angeles-AL.

THEY'LL DRIVE YOU HOME: This series features three of the top five RBI players in the Majors...Jed Lowrie (T2nd, 35), Khris Davis (T2nd, 35) and Aaron Judge (T4th, 34) all trail Baltimore's Manny Machado (36)...Lowrie has driven in 35 runs over his last 34 games.

ROAD WARRIOR: Jed Lowrie is hitting .351 (27-for-77) with 11 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 7 home runs, 19 RBI with a .393 on-base percentage and a .675 slugging mark in 19 road games...his seven home runs on the road this season are T3rd in the American League, while his 19 road RBI are T2nd.

MORE BANG FOR THE BUCK: Khris Davis has driven in a run in 7 of the last 8 games for a total of 12 RBI...while he only has 6 hits in the last 8 games, five of them have gone for extra bases (2B, 4 HR)...since start of the 2017 season, he has driven in 145 runs, the 4th-most in Major Leagues behind Giancarlo Stanton (155), Colorado's Nolan Arenado (152) & Aaron Judge (148).

NOT TO BE OVERLOOKED: Closer Blake Treinen has posted a 1.69 ERA (11 er, 58.2 ip) with 65 strikeouts over his last 51 relief appearances since July 4, 2017...his 1.69 mark is the 4th-best by a Major League reliever (min. 40.0 ip) behind Milwaukee's Matt Albers (1.11), Chicago's Steve Cishek (1.49) and San Diego's Craig Stammen (1.62)...of his 48 appearances since joining Oakland, he has tossed 1.1+ innings in 15 of those games, including in 8 of his 13 relief appearances this season.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's won the season series last year, 5-2...swept a four-game series in Oakland and lost two of three at New York...have now won the season series four times in the previous five years and are 22-13 (.629) over that span, which dates back to 2013...that is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 248-279 against the Yankees...that includes 136-127 in Oakland and 112-152 in New York...are 15-21 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 789-1145 against the Yankees/Orioles.

FIRST PLACE AND OTHER TOUGH TEAMS: Today's game marks the A's fifth straight contest against a team with at least a share of the lead in its division...are currently in a 19-game stretch that began on Monday and runs through May 27 where they will play Houston, New York, Boston, Toronto, Seattle and Arizona...those six teams are currently a combined 146-90 (.619)...the A's are 1-4 during this stretch.

LATE INNINGS: The A's are T4th in the majors with a .264 (121-for-458) batting average in the seventh inning or later and are fourth with 67 runs scored...are hitting .240 (212-for-884) over the first six innings...the pitching staff has a 3.26 ERA (43 er in 118.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is second lowest in the American League (Toronto, 2.57)...have a 4.85 (126 er in 234.0 ip) over innings one through six...have 20 runs scored in the ninth inning, which is tied for the second most in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.87 ERA (95 er in 220.2 ip) over the last 24 games after logging a 5.05 ERA over the first 15 contests...are averaging 2.65 walks per nine innings, which is the 3rd-lowest mark in the majors behind of Houston (2.52) and Cleveland (2.55).

OFFENSE: The A's scored 16 runs in the last two games...in the previous 11 games, hit .196 (70-for-358) with 26 runs scored (2.4 runs per game) after hitting .268 and average 5.2 runs per game over the first 26 contests...rank tied for fourth in the American League in walks (133), tied for fifth in hit by pitches (18) and T6th in extra base hits (130)...also have the fifth most strikeouts (356) and tied for fifth most grounded into double plays (32).

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 6-2 against the American League East after winning two of three from Boston last month, sweeping a three-game series from Baltimore last homestand and splitting the two games this series...each of the A's 10 games on this road trip are against the East...Oakland will play New York, Boston and Toronto on the same trip for the first time since April 11-17, 1997...have a 10-3 (.769) record in interdivision play compared to 9-17 (.346) against the AL West...have the second worst intradivision record in the AL to Baltimore (5-8)...are batting .235 (202-for-861) and are averaging 3.69 runs per game (96 runs in 26 games) against the AL West, .272 (131-for-481) with an average of 6.31 runs per game (82 runs in 13 games) against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 4.92 ERA (124 er in 277.0 ip) against the AL West, 3.22 (45 er in 125.2 ip) against all other teams.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-1), Boston (three games) and Toronto (four games) today...this trip concludes a stretch that began on April 23 where the A's will play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 4-5 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Houston (1-2) and Seattle (1-2) and are now 8-11 (.421) on the road compared to 11-9 (.550) at home...the A's have compiled a 4.98 ERA (90 er in 162.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.74 at home...have the fourth highest road ERA in the American League and the third lowest home ERA...have allowed 32 home runs on the road, which is tied for the most in the AL...the offense has hit 33 home runs on the road, which is second most in the AL (Boston, 35), compared to 14 at home, which is tied for second fewest.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost a one-run game yesterday but have won five of the last six one-run games and are 6-2 (.750) in one-run decisions for the season...including 3-1 on the road...the A's .750 winning percentage in one-run games is the best in the majors, but the seven decisions are tied for the second fewest...are 6-1 in games decided in the last at bat...are 3-1 in extra inning games...have three walk-off wins.

THE DISABLED LIST: The have six players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Buchter, Cahill, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL 10 times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A'S ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on 1550 AM: Monday and Wednesday against Boston and May 22 against Seattle...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Santiago Casilla has the lowest opponents slugging percentage among American League relievers (.118), fifth best opponent's on-base percentage (.230), and the third lowest batting average (.098)...**Matt Chapman** leads Major League third baseman with 141 total chances, which is 39 more than any other third baseman...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for first in hits (52) and multiple hit games (16)...**Lou Trivino** has not allowed a run in eight of his nine appearances and his 0.75 ERA ranks third among AL relievers.

In **1981** Matt Keough improves to 6-0 as the A's defeat the Yankees at New York, 5-4...in **1986** Dave Kingman hits a three-run homer in the bottom of the 10th inning after the A's score single runs in the seventh, eighth and ninth innings in a 6-3 win over Toronto...in **2007** the A's score five times in the bottom of the ninth inning to defeat Cleveland, 10-7...Milton Bradley hits a two-run home run to tie the game and Jack Cust hits a three-run homer for the win as he homers in his fourth consecutive game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (0-1, 8.68 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start since he was selected from Triple-A Nashville May 2...was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19...was originally selected by Arizona in the 2nd round of the 2006 draft but was one of six players traded to Oakland in the Dan Haren trade following the 2007 season...made his Major League debut with the A's in 2009 at the age of 21 and went 26-29 with a 3.81 ERA in 84 games, 73 starts, in five seasons with Oakland from 2009-13...has gone 16-18 with a 4.40 ERA in 56 games, 55 starts, in four seasons since then with Colorado (2014), Los Angeles-NL (2015-16), Chicago-NL (2017) and Toronto (2017).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle May 2...allowed his only two runs in the third inning on a leadoff home run by Healy and a RBI single by Segura...retired 11 straight before allowing back-to-back singles to Haniger and Seager with one out in the seventh...was relieved by Dull with Oakland trailing 2-0 but the A's scored twice in the eighth to get him off the hook and once in the ninth for the win.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 16-2 loss to Houston last Monday in Oakland...allowed nine runs on 10 hits in 3.0 innings...yielded a two-run single to Gonzalez in the first and a three-run home run to Springer in the second...then allowed a RBI double to Stassi and a RBI single to Altuve in the fourth and was relieved by Hatcher with runners on first and second and no outs...Hatcher allowed both runs to score plus two more of his own.

ANDERSON vs. NEW YORK: Is 0-5 with a 6.81 ERA (35.2 ip, 52 h, 31 r, 27 er, 9 bb, 26 so, 6 hr) in seven career starts...the five losses are his most against any team...is 0-2 with a 3.91 ERA (10 er in 23.0 ip) in four starts at Yankee Stadium and 0-3 with a 12.08 ERA (17 er in 12.2 ip) in three starts in his home ballparks...went 0-1 with a 8.44 ERA (5.1 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 5 r, 0 bb, 4 so) in two starts last year...the loss came in an 11-6 decision with the Cubs at Wrigley Field May 6...faced seven batters and allowed five runs on six hits while recording just one out...started and had a no decision for Toronto in a 2-1 Blue Jays win at Yankee Stadium on Oct. 1...blanked New York on three hits in five innings and left with a 1-0 lead.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 1-1 with a 1.89 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in four starts with Triple-A Nashville...did not allow a home run in 19.0 innings...struck out 25 (11.84 per nine innings) and walked just two (0.95 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 12.5...his opponents batting average included a .193 (11-for-57) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .353 (6-for-17) against left-handers...yielded a .167 batting average and just one walk to batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .143 with the bases empty, .344 with runners on.

2017 RECAP: Was signed by the Chicago Cubs Jan. 30 and went 2-2 with an 8.18 ERA in six starts before going on the disabled list May 7 with a strained lower back...missed nearly three months of the season and would not pitch for the Cubs again as he was released July 31...signed a minor league deal with Toronto Aug. 15 and returned to the majors Aug. 29...went 2-2 with a 5.13 ERA in seven starts for the Blue Jays and combined with both clubs for a 404 record and a 6.34 ERA in 13 starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .322 opponents batting average, including .298 (56-for-188) against right-handed hitters compared to .436 (17-for-39) against left-handers...surrendered all five of his home runs to righties...yielded a .371 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .345 when leading off an inning, but he issued just one walk.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 1-2 with a 15.68 ERA in four starts at Wrigley Field and 1-2 with a 7.62 ERA in three starts in Rogers Centre for an 11.19 ERA in seven starts in his home ballparks...was 2-0 with a 2.81 ERA in six starts on the road.

SPLITS: Was 2-0 with a 2.05 ERA in four starts during the day, 2-4 with a 9.18 ERA in nine starts at night...was 1-1 with an 8.84 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 3-3 with a 5.00 ERA in eight starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 7.04 ERA over the first two innings of his starts, 3.06 after that...opponents were successful in 6-of-7 (85.7%) stolen base attempts...allowed five runs in 0.1 innings for the loss in his only interleague start and is now 1-6 with a 5.76 ERA (29 er in 45.1 ip) in nine career interleague starts...went 1-for-7 (.143) with a RBI, walk and three strikeouts in eight plate appearances with the Cubs.

MORE 2017: Was in the Cubs starting rotation to open the season and allowed just one run over his first two starts...struck out a season-high five batters and allowed six runs on a season-high eight hits in 3.2 innings on April 18 against Milwaukee, but had a no decision in a 9-7 win...walked a career-high six batters April 24 at Pittsburgh, but allowed three runs in a season-high 6.0 innings for the win...finished April 2-0 with a 3.54 ERA in four starts...then allowed seven runs on seven hits in 1.1 innings May 1 against Philadelphia and five runs in 0.1 innings on May 6 against New York (AL), both losses...was placed on the 10-day disabled list May 7 with a strained lower back...it was his 10th career stint on the DL...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 8...went 2-2 with a 4.61 ERA in six games, including five starts, on a rehab assignment with Double-A Tennessee from June 25 to July 23...was reinstated from the DL and designated for assignment July 26...was released July 31 and signed a minor league deal with Toronto Aug. 15...went 1-1 with a 0.93 ERA in two starts with Triple-A Buffalo before he was selected by the Blue Jays Aug. 29...started and lost that day to Boston, despite allowing just one run in 5.2 innings...tossed a season-high tying 6.0 innings in his next two starts on Sept. 3 at Baltimore and Sept. 9 against Detroit...picked up his first win as a Blue Jay and matched his season-best with five strikeouts in the start against the Tigers...yielded a season-high eight runs on seven hits and two walks in 1.1 innings in a 15-5 loss to Kansas City on Sept. 25...then had a win and a 2.70 ERA over his final two starts.

LHP Sean Manaea (4-4, 2.11 ERA):	Has allowed four runs in each of his last two starts after allowing six runs over his first six starts...is 0-2 with a 6.17 ERA and .289 opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first six starts...has the third lowest opponents batting average (.170), on-base percentage (.215) and OPS (.503) in the American League, the fourth lowest ERA (2.11) and the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.289)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-2 A's loss to Houston last Tuesday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 0 bb, 3 so)...is 2-2 with a 7.52 ERA (20.1 ip, 26 h, 18 r, 17 er, 2 bb, 18 so, 4 hr) in four career starts against Boston...is 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA in two starts in Oakland and 0-2 with a 21.32 ERA in two starts in Fenway Park...no-hit the Red Sox in his only start this year, a 3-0 A's win in Oakland on April 21...walked two and struck out a career-high tying 10.
