THE TWINS: After going 1-5 on their six-game roadtrip, the Twins began their 11-game homestand by going 2-1 through three games vs. the Indians...today they will play the four-game series finale vs. Cleveland...they will enjoy an off-day tomorrow, followed by four vs. Chicago-AL (Tuesday doubleheader) June 5-7 and three vs. Los Angeles-AL June 8-10...12 of the Twins last 14 games have been decided by three runs-or-less with the Twins going 4-8 in those games.

TWINS TAKE ANOTHER FROM TRIBE: The Twins beat the Indians yesterday afternoon by a score of 7-1...Lance Lynn (4-4) was the starter and winner, allowing one run on just two hits in 6.0 innings pitched...the bullpen combined for 3.0 scoreless innings of relief...the offense recorded eight hits two from both Logan Morrison and Brian Dozier...Dozier and Eddie Rosario each drove in two runs-a-piece...the Twins went 5-for-13 with runners in scoring position.

TWINS-INDIANS: The Twins and Indians are playing each other for the sixth of 19 scheduled games this season...they are 3-2 vs. the Tribe this season, going 1-1 in Puerto Rico and 2-1 at Target Field...their next meeting will be three games at Progressive Field from June 15-17.

☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .335 (66-for-197) with eight doubles, three triples, 10 home runs, 27 RBI and 30 runs scored in 53 career games against the Indians...the hits and home runs are his personal most vs. any opponent.

☞ Robbie Grossman was an invite to Indians spring training in 2016 and was reassigned from camp to Triple-A Columbus...he hit .256 (30-for-117) for the Clippers in 34 games before opting out of his contract on May 16.

☞ Twins Bench Coach Derek Shelton was Cleveland's hitting coach from 2005-09...prior to that, he was Cleveland's minor league hitting coordinator from 2003-05.

☞ Ryan LaMarre is hitting .438 (7-for-16) with four RBI against Cleveland this season.

THE STARTERS: Twins starters have posted a 3.95 ERA (114.0 IP, 50 ER) with opponents hitting .238 (101-for-425), 42 walks and 114 strikeouts in 20 games since May 12...they have been supported with 43 runs for an average of 3.39...since that date, they rank fifth in the AL in opponent batting average and strikeouts...they have the second-lowest run support average in baseball since that date, trailing only Philadelphia (2.84).

GETTING OFFENSIVE: The Twins hit .196 (55-for-280) with 2.9 runs-per-game and a .270 on-base percentage in nine games from May 18-27...since May 28, the Twins have recorded 10-plus hits in three of six games and have averaged 9.8 hits-per-game, 6.5 runs-per-game with a .352 on-base percentage in those six.

MIGGY MAKING MOVES: Miguel Sanó has hit safely in a season-long six straight games entering today...during the six-game hit-streak he has two doubles, two home runs and 10 RBI...during the streak, he is hitting .292 (7-for-24) against right-handed pitching...his longest hit-streak is 10 done twice, last from June 30-July 8, 2017.

BASEBALL AMERICA TOP 100 UPDATE: Baseball America recently released their updated Top 100 prospects in baseball...the Twins have five ranked: Infielder Royce Lewis at 16, outfielder Alex Kirilloff at 88, right-handed pitcher Brusdar Graterol at 92, outfielder Brent Rooker at 94 and infielder Nick Gordon at 100.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1967, Harmon Killebrew hit the longest home run ever by a Twin at an estimated 520 feet...Killebrew hit a three-run shot off California right-hander Lew Burdette, which landed in the sixth row of the upper deck at Metropolitan Stadium...the ball cracked the seat, and was later painted orange to commemorate the event...the seat is now located in the Mall of America — the former site of "Met" Stadium — bolted to a wall in the amusement park, marking the height and position where the ball would have landed in the upper deck.

TWINS WEEKLY MINOR LEAGUE HONORS: The Twins have named Single-A Cedar Rapids infielder José Miranda and Double-A Chattanooga right-handed pitcher Omar Bencomo as Twins minor league Player and Pitcher of the Week...in eight games for the Kernels, Miranda hit .414 (12-for-29) with four doubles, one home run and nine RBI...the Manati, Puerto Rico native was drafted by the Twins in the second round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft...Bencomo made two starts for the Lookouts, going 2-0, 0.69 ERA (13.0 IP, 1 ER) with five hits allowed, two walks and 11 strikeouts...the Valencia, Venezuela native signed with the Twins as a minor league free agent on January 19, 2018.

WHAT WE'RE DOING TOMORROW: Major League Baseball will hold day one of the 2018 MLB Draft tomorrow night...the Twins have the 20th pick in the first round...the last time the Twins drafted 20th overall was in 2006 selecting first baseman/outfielder Chris Parmelee out of Chino Hills High School...they have also selected 20th overall six different times including drafting Torii Hunter in 1993, Denard Span in 2002 and Trevor Plouffe in 2004...last June draft, the Twins selected first overall, taking shortstop Royce Lewis out of JSerra Catholic High School.

LAST START: Gibson threw 7.0 shutout innings against Kansas City on May 29, allowing five hits and one walk with eight strikeouts, his second most of the season...Gibson entered the game with the best road opponent average in baseball and allowed five hits to 27 batters faced... this was his longest shutout start since June 28, 2016 when he blanked the White Sox over 7.0 innings...left the game with a 1-0, but did not factor into the decision after Addison Reed walked in the tying run in the 8th inning.

AGAINST THE INDIANS: Gibson is making his 14th career starts against Cleveland, is 2-6 with a 5.82 ERA (65.0 IP, 42 ER) with 28 walks and 41 strikeouts...is on a four-game losing streak to the Indians (two no decisions in that span), has a 5.87 ERA (30.2 IP, 20 ER) with 12 walks and 16 strikeouts over the streak...last outing against the Tribe was August 17, 2017, suffered the loss after allowing three runs on seven hits and one walk with three strikeouts over 4.0 innings...last win was September 30, 2015 at Cleveland, shut out the Indians over 6.0 innings on four hits and two walks with nine strikeouts.

ROAD RUNNER: In 2018, Gibson is holding opposing hitters to a .142 average on the road, which is best in baseball, and is third in the AL in road ERA with 2.13, holding opponents scoreless in three of his six road starts this year...over his career, Gibson has had success on the road, posting a 25-23 record across 69 starts away from Target Field as compared to his 20-28 record at home...since 2016, Gibson has posted a 12-7 record on the road, in contrast to his 7-17 record at home...his road ERA in that span is 4.11 as compared to 5.52.

PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF: After a rough first half of 2017, Gibson finished the second half of the season 7-3, 3.76 ERA (76.2 IP, 32 ER) with 22 walks and 70 strikeouts...since July 16, 2017, Gibson is 8-6, 3.67 ERA (139.2 IP, 57 ER) with 50 walks and 136 strikeouts and is holding opponents to a .247 average...his ERA is 20th in the AL over that span while his 136 strikeouts ranks tied for 19th.

SWING AND A MISS: Thus far in 2018, Gibson has recorded 66 strikeouts through 11 starts and owns a strikeout rate of 24.8 percent and a swing-and-miss rate of 29.1 percent, 11th best in the AL and ninth highest in baseball...his career strikeout rate is 16.7 percent while his career swing-and-miss rate is 22.8 percent.

KEEP THE K'S COMING: Gibson has improved his strikeouts-per-9.0 innings rate nearly every year in his career, setting a career-high in 2017 with 6.89 K/9...through 11 starts in 2018, Gibson is striking out 9.43 batters-per-9.0 innings, 14th in the AL.

LIMITING THE DAMAGE: Gibson has only allowed 17 XBH this season, tied for the seventh fewest allowed in the AL and tied for 20th fewest in baseball among starters with at least nine starts...opponents are slugging .348 against Gibson, 11th lowest in the AL...Gibson has given up 10 doubles, which is tied for ninth best in the AL among starters with at least nine starts, and five home runs, tied for fourth best in the AL.

2017 RECAP:

- Was the Twins third starter to begin the season.
- Optioned to Triple-A after six starts, going 0-4 and allowing 24 earned runs over 26.1 innings on 39 hits.
- In return to Twins, recorded his first win on May 22 against Baltimore.
- Won his final six decisions, allowing 11 runs over 31.2 innings in the six wins, notching the longest win streak of his career.
- Made his 100th career start on April 12 at Detroit...the first pitcher to make 100 starts for the Twins since Francisco Liriano from 2005-11...was the 25th pitcher in Twins history to make 100-plus starts for the club.

KILLING TWO BIRDS WITH ONE STONE: Gibson induced 26 double plays in 2017, ranking third in the AL...his 1.48 GDP/9 ranked fourth in baseball among pitchers who threw more than 150 innings in 2017...since 2014, Gibson is tied for the most GDP in the majors with 102 (Dallas Keuchel) and is second in GDP/9 with 1.24 (Martin Perez - 1.61)...has induced six double plays in 2018, tied for the team lead with Lance Lynn and owns a 0.86 GDP/9 rate, good for 14th in the AL.

NO HITS, NO PROBLEM: In Gibson's 2018 debut, he didn't allow a hit in 6.0 innings of work against Baltimore on March 31...his 6.0 hitless innings is his longest outing in his career without allowing a hit...Gibson's previous career-low in hits allowed in a game was four, which has happened four times, most recently on July 22, 2016 at Boston.

- His 2.85 ERA pre-ASG in 2015 was the fourth-lowest for a Twins starter since 1992 with a minimum of 80.0 IP (Liriano - 1.83 in 2006, Santana - 2.75 in 2007, Radke - 2.77 in 1998).
- In 2014, his first full season in the majors, became one of three pitchers in Twins history to win each of their first three games while posting a sub-1.00 ERA.
- Earned the win in his MLB debut 6/29/13 vs. KC allowing three runs on eight hits in 6.0 innings.
- Named the Twins Minor League Player of the Week for May 12, 2013 after tossing a CG SHO.
- Named an Arizona Fall League Rising star in 2012 and the AFL Player of the Week, 10/23/12.
- Selected to the 2011 Futures Game where he tossed 1.1 inning, allowing two hits.
- Named to the 2010 Eastern League Mid-Season All-Star Team.
- Named the Florida State League Pitcher of the Week, May 3, 2010.
- Selected in the first round (22nd overall) by the Twins in the 2009 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Missouri as a senior...major was communications.
- Originally selected by Philadelphia in the 36th round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft out of Greenfield Central High School in Greenfield, IN.
- Named to the All-Big 12 honorable mention team in 2007 and 2008 and All-Big 12 First-Team in 2009 as the Tigers' Friday night starter.
