**LEADING OFF:** Angels open second trip of 2018 to **Texas** (April 9-11) and Kansas City (April 12-15)...Halos went 4-2 on initial home stand of 2018 vs. Cleveland (2-1) and Oakland (2-1)... Halos have won seven of last nine games...LAA is 7-3 thru 10 G - first 7-3 start thru 10 G since 1987 (also started 8-3 in 1987)...An 8-3 start would match best in Club annals thru 11 G (done three times previously in 1987, 1982 & 1979)... PLEASE NOTE: Wednesday's game will air on KCOP to accommodate NHL playoffs.

SEEING RED: Yesterday's home attendance of 44,742 marked the largest day game total (regular season) since the renovation in 1998.

KNOW THIS: Angels lead the A.L. with 60 runs scored, 97 hits, extra base hits, 17 HR and 172 total bases

SHOHEI'S DAY: Yesterday Shohei Ohtani (W; 7 IP, 1 H, 1 BB, 12 SO, 91 pitches/59 strikes) retired the first 19 batters faced... Third player all-time to pitch 7+ innings with one-or-fewer hits and 12+ strikeouts in one of first two career pitching appearances (Steve Woodard, MIL in 1997 and Juan Marichal, SF in 1960)...Third player all-time to homer in three consecutive games and have a double-digit strikeout game in the same season (Ken Brett in 1973 and Babe Ruth in 1916)... Became the first player with two wins and 3+ home runs in his team's first 10 games of a season since Jim Shaw for the 1919 Washington Senators (Shaw's three HR came in the games where he pitched( (STATS LLC).

SHOKKKKKKKKKKK OHTANI: 18 total strikeouts this year tie Angels record in first two career pitching appearances (also, Tim Fortungo)...12 strikeouts Sunday tied the American League record for a player in one of their first two games as a pitcher (Fortungo in 1992 and Elmer Myers (Philadelphia A's) in 1915...Third Angels rookie with 12+ strikeouts in a game (Fortugno in 1992 and Jorge Rubio (15 SO) in 1966)...Ohtani logged 25 swinging strikes among the 91 pitches he threw on Sunday -- the most by any pitcher in a game this season. Sixteen of those came on his splitter (MATT OLSON — STATCAST)

FROM MLB.com: Ohtani retired the final eight A's batters he faced in his Major League pitching debut on April 1 at the Oakland Coliseum. Combined with 19 straight Oakland batters he retired on Sunday before giving up a single to Semien, Ohtani retired 27 A's in succession spanning the two starts.

FISH FACTS: Yesterday Mike Trout scored his 700th career run; fifth Angel all-time to do so...Only eight players have hit 200 home runs and scored 700 runs prior to their age-27 season all-time: Albert Pujols, Alex Rodriguez, Frank Robinson, Hank Aaron, Mickey Mantle, Eddie Matthews, Mel Ott and Jimmie Foxx...HR in second marked 500th career hit at Angel Stadium.

BACK TO COMING BACK: Four of seven wins on season have been in comeback fashion (Halos led MLB with 47 comeback wins in 2017)...LAA erased a 6-0 deficit to win 13-9 Friday second straight April Angels overcame 6-run deficit to win (also April 9, 2017 vs. Seattle).

THIS N' THAT: Halo relievers rank second in A.L. with a 2.51 ERA (46.2 IP - 13 ER) and lead the circuit with a .194 BAA...LAA has committed just two errors thru 10 games...Halos hurlers have issued 45 free passes to lead the A.L.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Earlier today, Shohei Ohtani was named the American League Player of the Week...He is the first Angels player to win the award since Matt Shoemaker claimed weekly honors for the period ending July 17, 2016.

SO FAR, SHO GOOD: Ohtani has set Angels' records with 16 total bases and 7 RBI through first four career games with a plate appearance...Just fourth player all-time to homer in his first three career home games with a plate appearance (also, Chris Davis, Tom Murphy and Matt Kemp).

PLAYER POINTS: In March/April-May across last two seasons, Zack Cozart is batting .327 (69/211)...Andrelton Simmons is tied for second in A.L. with 15 hits (Elvis Andrus leads with 16)... Justin Upton's 23 total bases lead LAA and rank  $5^{th}$  in A.L....Shohei Ohtani is the first Angel rookie to homer in each of his first three home games with an AB and the second Angel to hit a HR in each of his first three home games of a season (Bobby Bonds in 1977).

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: Ohtani is the first A.L. player to homer in three straight games in the same season that he started a game as a pitcher since Babe Ruth (five times; 1918-1921, 1930 - STATS LLC)...First player to earn a win and then hit a home run in a start as a non-pitcher in his next game since **Babe Ruth** on June 13-14, 1921...Ohtani became the first player to start as a non-pitcher on Opening Day and then start as a pitcher within his team's first 10 games since Ruth (BOS) in 1919 (STATS LLC)...Prior to Ohtani, the last time a player started as a pitcher and a non-pitcher in the first  $% \left( 1\right) =\left( 1\right) \left( 1\right) \left($ 10 games of a season was 1920, when both Bullet Joe Bush (Red Sox) and Clarence Mitchell (Dodgers) started as pitchers and outfielders (STATS LLC).

THE MANAGER: Mike Scioscia is the longest tenured manager in the Majors (19<sup>th</sup> season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with current club...His current .539 (1,577-1,349) winning percentage and 1,570 wins are both tops in franchise history... Scioscia is one of just three active managers with at least 1,500 career wins (Bochy & Showalter)

ONLY ONE: Entering 2018, 19,183 people had played Major League Baseball. Of those players, just one of them has 200 HR, 150 SB, and a .400 OBP through his first seven seasons. His name is Mike Trout.

ANOTHER TROUT NIBBLE: Mike Trout has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old campaign. Only others to do so? Rogers Hornsby (4) and Ty Cobb (4).

3000/600: Albert Pujols is 21 hits shy of 3,000...When he reaches the mark, he will become just the fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs joining Hank Aaron, Willie Mays and Alex Rodriguez.

@ TEXAS: First of three stops in Arlington in 2018 (also Aug. 16-19) and Sept. 3-5)...Texas claimed the 2017 season series 11-8 (Angels were 4-5 on road) and also won the 2016 season series 10-9... Halos are 7-11 in last two seasons in Arlington.

#### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER - RHP GARRETT RICHARDS

1-0, 5.06 ERA

Since 2014, is 3-1 with a 1.97 ERA (32 IP – 7 ER) in five starts at Globe Life Park

- Making third start of the season and second on the road.
- LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win in last start on Tuesday vs. Cleveland after tossing 5.2 innings and allowing two earned runs on one hit with four walks and nine strikeouts...Both Indians runs came on only hit allowed (Jose Ramirez tworun HR in 1st inning)...Became first Angels starter to finish with two runs on one hit since **Chuck Finley** on Sept. 25, 1999 at Seattle.
- LOW AVERAGE: Ranks third in the American League (min. 400 IP) with a .219 (362/1655) batting average against since the start of 2014 with Chris Sale and Corey Kluber.
- ROAD WARRIOR: In eight road starts since 2016, has pitched to a 2.77 ERA (39 IP 12 ER)...Has allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in six of the eight starts...Seeking first winning decision on the road since Sept. 19, 2015 (Game 2) at Twins
- DIVISIONAL PLAY: Since 2013, owns a 19-16 record and 3.38 ERA (298 IP 112 ER) in 56 games (47 starts) vs. A.L. West opponents...The 19 wins are seventh most in the Majors in that span.
- BRINGING THE HEAT: According to Fangraphs, ranks second among active Major Leaguers with an average fastball velocity of 95.9 MPH since the start of the 2014 season (min. 400 IP), behind Rays' Nathan Eovaldi (96.3 MPH).
- VS. TEXAS: In 21 career games (17 starts) against the Rangers, is 9-4 with a 3.60 ERA (100 IP 35 ER) and 84 strikeouts...Nine wins over Rangers are his most against any opponent...Has been winning pitcher in seven of last 11 starts vs. Rangers...Has allowed 16 ER in last 64.2 innings pitched (2.23 ERA) vs. Rangers and has yielded two-or-fewer earned runs in nine of last 10 starts vs. Texas...As a starter, is 8-4 with a 2.96 ERA (97.1 IP – 30 ER)...Made one start vs. Rangers last year on Sept. 17 at Angel Stadium (L; 5 IP, 2 H, 3 R, 2 ER, 1 BB, 7 SO)...Angels went 2-8 in the 10 games he pitched vs. TEX from 2011-2013 but are 8-3 since.
- AT GLOBE LIFE PARK: Tonight marks first start at Globe Life Park since May 1, 2016...Owns a 4-2 career record with a 3.27 ERA (44 IP -16 ER) in 10 appearances (seven starts) in Arlington...Since start of 2014, is 3-1 with a 1.97 ERA (32 IP – 7 ER) in his five starts in Arlington, with lone loss coming in final game of 2015 season on three days rest...As a starter is 3-2 with a 3.21 ERA (42 IP – 15 ER) and 35 strikeouts.
- **OPENING DAY STARTER:** Made second career Opening Day start on April 29 in Oakland...Previously got the nod on Opening Day in 2016 against the Chicago Cubs at Angel Stadium.
- STREAK SNAPPED: Four runs allowed in first start on Opening Day in Oakland, snapped streak of 16 consecutive starts having allowed three-or-fewer earned runs, which dated back to Sept. 19, 2015...The streak was the longest of his career (previous was 10 straight starts, Aug. 4, 2014 – May 17, 2015) and is tied for fifth longest in Angels history.
- 2017 SEASON: Exited first start of year (Apr. 5, 2017 at OAK) after five scoreless innings with right biceps strain...Missed 135 games on disabled list...Returned to Angels on Sept. 5, 2017 at OAK...Made five September starts and pitched to a 2.74 ERA (23 IP – 7 ER) for the month...Allowed one-or-fewer runs in four of six starts on the season.
- $\underline{\textbf{CAREER TOTALS:}}\ \text{In 156 career games (101 starts), is 41-34 with a 3.55 ERA (679 IP-268 ER) and 571 strikeouts across a$ eight seasons with the Angels...Since 2014, is 30-21 with a 3.11 ERA (449 IP - 155 ER).
