AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 1-0 on their nine-game homestand, winning the opener of their 3G series vs. Cleveland (through Sun.)...also play 3G vs. Boston (Tues.-Thurs.) and 3G vs. Oakland (5/11-13)...recently completed a 6-1 road trip (3-0 vs. Los Angeles-AL, 3-1 at Houston)...following this homestand, begin an 8G road trip to Washington (5/15-16), Kansas City (5/18-20) and Texas (5/21-23).

- ▶ At 22-10 (.688), **own the second-best record in the Majors** (Boston 23-9, .719)...is their best 32G start since 2004 (23-9)
- ▶ Are a season-high 12G over .500...**trail Boston in the AL East by 1.0G, matching their smallest deficit since the close of play on 4/4.**
- ▶ Are 13-1 in their last 14G, reducing their division deficit from a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston is 6-7 in this span)...have won four straight games.
- ▶ Have a +56 run differential, third-best in the Majors (Houston, +66; Boston, +61).
- ▶ Are 16G into a season-long stretch of 18 consecutive game days (4/19-5/6)...are 14-2 so far.
- ▶ Are 13-2 outside the AL East this season (6-0 vs. AL Central, 6-1 vs. AL West, 1-1 vs. NL East).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees earned their second "walk-off" win of the season with a 7-6 victory over Cleveland on Friday at Yankee Stadium...**LHP CC Sabathia** (6.0IP, 3H, OR, OBB, 7K) started and tossed 6.0 shutout innings but took a no-decision...**2B Gleyber Torres** (2-for-4) hit his first career Major League home run, a three-run shot in the fourth...**C Gary Sánchez** (1-for-4, 1BB) hit a solo HR in the fifth...**RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 1BB) hit a solo HR in the fourth and drew a bases-loaded walk in the eighth to put the Yankees up, 6-5...**3B Miguel Andújar** (2-for-5) recorded his first career "walk-off" hit with a two-out RBI single in the ninth...**1B Neil Walker** (2-for-3, 2BB) reached safely four times...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP, 1H, 1ER, 3K, 2WP, 1HP) recorded the win despite blowing his first save in eight chances this season.

- ▶ Torres and Cleveland's Bradley Zimmer became the first pair of starting No. 9 hitters to hit a three-run HR (or grand slam) in the same game since Texas' Bill Haselman and Oakland's Carlos Peña did it on 4/4/02 in Oakland.

CCENSATIONAL: **LHP CC Sabathia** tossed 6.0 shutout IP (3H, OBB, 7K) but took a no-decision in Friday's win vs. Cleveland...is undefeated in his last 14 regular season starts since 8/19/17, posting a 7-0 record w/ a 2.29 ERA (78.2IP, 20ER).

- ▶ In four starts since his 4/19 return from the D.L., is 2-0 with a 0.39 ERA (23.1IP, 14H, 4R/1ER, 3BB, 16K, OHR, .165 opp BA)...has allowed 0ER in three of his last four starts.
- ▶ **Ranks fourth in the Majors with a 1.39 ERA (32.1IP, 5ER),** having allowed just 5BB all season.

ROCKIN' AND ROLLIN': The Yankees are 13-1 in their last 14 games (since 4/21), their best 14-game stretch since going 13-1 from 6/3-18/12...matches the best 14-game stretch in the Majors this season (Boston had five such 14G stretches, topping out with a 17-1 run from 3/30-4/20)...**with a win today,** would mark their first 14-1 stretch since 6/24-7/12/98.

- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** have posted a 2.00 ERA (126.0IP, 91H, 31R/28ER, 36BB, 132K, 9HR) during the stretch...have not allowed a run prior to the seventh inning since Monday at Houston.
- ▶ **Yankees batters** have averaged 6.14 runs per game over the stretch, hitting .254/.331/.462 as a team with 86R, 33 doubles, 1 triple, 21HR and 56BB.
- ▶ Have gone ahead in their last at-bat in three of their last 4G.

HOME COOKING: The Yankees have won seven consecutive games at Yankee Stadium (since 4/21), matching their longest home winning streak since 2011...their last longer streak was an eight-game home winning streak from 8/21-9/4/10...have outscored opponents, 54-19, during the streak.

- ▶ Are 12-5 (.706) at home in 2018, the most home wins and second-best home winning pct. in MLB (Boston, 11-4, .733).
- ▶ Have been "walk-off" winners in each of their last two home games.

KID CAN PLAY: **2B Gleyber Torres** connected on his **first career Major League home run** in Friday's win vs. Cleveland, a three-run shot in the fourth.

- ▶ At 21 years, 142 days, **was the youngest Yankee to hit a home run since John Ellis (20 years, 269 days) hit an inside-the-park HR on 5/17/69 vs. California...**was the youngest Yankee *born outside the U.S.* to ever hit a homer (prev. Jesús Montero, 21 years, 281 days on 9/5/11 vs. Baltimore)...was the youngest Yankees second baseman ever to hit a homer (prev. Jerry Priddy, 21 years, 178 days on 5/6/41 vs. Detroit).
- ▶ Was the third-youngest player to homer in the Majors this season (Atlanta's 20-year-old Ronald Acuña Jr. and a younger 21-year-old Ozzie Albies)...was the youngest AL player to homer since Boston's Rafael Devers in 2017.
- ▶ Was the second Yankee since 1999 to hit a HR with at least two runners on for his first career homer (also Colin Curtis, three-run HR, on 7/21/10 vs. Los Angeles-AL; and Hideki Matsui, grand slam, on 4/8/03 vs. Minnesota).
- ▶ Also went 1-for-3 with 3RBI on Thurs. at Houston, including a game-tying two-run single in the ninth...was the youngest Yankee with a game-tying or go-ahead hit in the ninth inning-or-later since Bobby Murcer (20y-134d) on 10/1/66 at Chicago-AL...**is the youngest Yankee ever to record at least 3RBI in consecutive games** (prev. Jerry Priddy, 21 years, 179 days, 5/6-5/7/41).
- ▶ The Yankees are a **Major League-best 12-1 since he was recalled on 4/22,** with Torres starting all 13 games...**is the first Major League position player in the Modern Era (since 1900) to start and be on the winning side in 12 of his first 13 big league games.**

COMETO PAPÁ: **3B Miguel Andújar** recorded his first career "walk-off" hit with a two-out RBI single in the ninth...at 23 years, 63 days, was the second-youngest Yankee to record a "walk-off" hit since 2008, following Clint Frazier (22 years, 305 days) on 7/8/17 vs. Milwaukee.

- ▶ Has two straight multi-hit games, and 12 in 30 career games...is the sixth Yankee since 1908 with at least 12 multi-hit efforts in his first 30 career games.
- ▶ **Leads AL rookies with 29H,** and is second among MLB rookies to Miami's Brian Anderson-30.

THE SÁNCCHINO: **C Gary Sánchez** hit a solo HR in the fifth, estimated by Statcast at a projected distance of 461 feet, the longest by a Yankee this season (prev. Stanton, 458 feet on 4/4 vs. Tampa Bay).

- ▶ **Was the 62nd homer of his career in his 206th career game...**is tied with Mark McGwire and Rudy York for the second-most HRs through 206 career games in Baseball history behind Aaron Judge (63).
- ▶ Leads MLB catchers and is tied for sixth among AL hitters with 9HR...is third in the AL with 28RBI.
- ▶ Of his last 11H, 10 have been XBHs (4 doubles, 6HR).

ALL RISE: **RF Aaron Judge** hit a solo HR on Friday vs. Cleveland...marked his 64th homer in his 214th career game, becoming the fastest player ever to reach 64HR, in terms of games played (prev. Rudy York, 215th game).

- ▶ **Has reached base safely in 31 consecutive home games (since 9/3/17), the second-longest on-base streak at the current Yankee Stadium** (Mark Teixeira, 33G, 6/3-8/16/10)...is hitting .346/.493/.860 (37-for-107) with 34R, 7 doubles, 16HR, 39RBI and 33BB at Yankee Stadium during the streak.

CENTRAL PERK: The Yankees are 66-39 (.629) vs. the AL Central since the start of 2015, **the highest winning percentage by an AL team against any AL division in that span...**are 20-8-3 in 31 series over the stretch (min. 2G).

- ▶ Are 6-0 vs. the AL Central this season...is the best mark by an AL team vs. any AL division this year...**have won their last 10 regular season games vs. AL Central teams** (since 9/18/17), their longest streak over the Central since a 12-game winning streak from 9/15/02-5/30/03.

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 5, 1955: The musical *Damn Yankees* opens on Broadway.

May 5, 1922: The construction contract for Yankee Stadium is awarded to New York's White Construction Company with the edict that the job be completed "at a definite price" of \$2.5 million by Opening Day 1923. In just 284 working days, the Stadium hosts its inaugural game on April 18, 1923, as the Yankees defeat the Red Sox, 4-1 in front of an estimated crowd of 74,200.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 6, 1930: The Yankees acquire RHP Red Ruffing from the Red Sox in exchange for OF Cedric Durst and \$50,000. Ruffing went 39-96 with Boston but goes 231-124 with New York, posting seasons of 20, 20, 21 and 21 wins on the World Championship clubs from 1936-39.

May 6, 1922: Carl Mays tosses a two-hit, 2-0 shutout over the Philadelphia Athletics at Shibe Park in a game that takes 1 hour, 11 minutes.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP SONNY GRAY (1-2, 6.67 ERA)

RHP Sonny Gray will make his seventh start of the season today vs. Cleveland...the 28-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...in his last start on Monday at Houston, took the loss despite throwing 6.0IP with just 4H and 2ER...was his second start this season of 6.0IP...has 49 wins in 131 career games (129 starts)...made his fourth career Opening Day active roster (also: 2014-16 with Oakland)...went 4-7 with a 3.72 ERA (65.1IP, 27ER) in 11 regular season starts with the Yankees in 2017 after being acquired along with international signing bonus pool money from Oakland in exchange for OF Dustin Fowler, RHP James Kaprielian and INF/OF Jorge Mateo on 7/31/17...has thrown at least 6.0IP in 92-of-129 career starts...was an AL All-Star and finished third in AL Cy Young Award voting in 2015...was originally selected by Oakland in the first round (18th overall) of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Vanderbilt University.

LAST START: Took his second loss of the season on Monday at Houston despite going 6.0IP and giving up just 4H and 2ER (3BB, 4K)...was his second quality start of the season (also 4/7 vs. Baltimore)...tied his season low in hits (also 4/7 vs. Baltimore)...after allowing Springer to score in the first, retired the Astros in order in the second and third innings...in the fourth, Altuve scored off a Gurriel double.

VS. CLEVELAND: Is 3-3 with a 3.38 ERA (48.0IP, 18ER) and 1CG in eight career starts against Cleveland...went 1-2 with a 4.86 ERA (16.2IP, 9ER) in three starts vs. the Tribe in 2017...made his Yankees debut on 8/3/17 at Cleveland, taking the loss after allowing 4R/2ER over 6.0IP (4H, 3BB, 6K)...has never faced Cleveland at Yankee Stadium.

- ✦ Started and took the loss in the Yankees 4-0 defeat in Game 1 of the 2017 ALDS at Cleveland, throwing 3.1IP with 3H and 3ER (4BB, 2K, 1HR, 1HP, 1WP).
- ✦ In 3GS vs. Cleveland at the Coliseum with Oakland, went 1-0 with a 0.47 ERA (19.0IP, 1ER)...all three starts were quality starts...in his last home start vs. Cleveland on 7/14/17, earned the win and went 6.0IP and gve up just 2H with 1BB and 5K.

HOME COOKING: Is 1-0 with a 7.07 ERA (14.0IP, 11ER) in three home starts in 2018...did not take a decision in the Yankees' 7-4 win vs. Minnesota on 4/25 (4.2IP, 6H, 3ER, 1HR, 5BB, 4K)...took a no-decision on 4/20 vs. Toronto, allowing 5ER in 3.1IP (5H, 4BB, 1HR)...was his first start without recording a strikeout since 8/20/17 at Boston and just his second OK start in 129 career starts...earned the win on 4/7 vs. Baltimore, going 6.0IP with 3ER (4H, 2BB, 4K)...was his first homerless start at Yankee Stadium since joining the club.

- ✦ In eight starts as a member of the Yankees, has gone 3-3 with a 6.12 ERA (42.2IP, 29ER) at home.
- ✦ Went 7-5 with a 3.90 ERA (90.0IP, 39ER) in 15 home starts overall in 2017...won five straight home starts from 7/5-8/26/17 but allowed at least 4ER and took the loss in each of his three starts in the Bronx in Sept. 2017 (8.62 ERA, 15.2IP, 15ER).
- ✦ Allowed at least 1HR in each home start (8HR total) with the Yankees last season.

2018: Is 1-2 with a 6.67 ERA (27.0IP, 20ER) in six starts...has failed to complete 5.0IP in four of six starts, including a career-long streak of three straight (4/12-4/25).

- ✦ His 51BF with runners in scoring position is the third-highest total in Baseball (Ivan Nova-55BF, Dylan Bundy-53BF)...opponents are hitting .244 (11-for-45) with 5BB and 12K with runners in scoring position.
- ✦ Opponents are batting .143 (5-for-35) with 14K and 2BB in plate appearances ending with a curveball (Brooks Baseball).
- ✦ His 45.1% groundball rate is the highest in his career, while his 23.1% line-drive rate is a career high (FanGraphs)...has a career-worst 14.1% walk rate.

SUNDAY'S STARTING PITCHER VS. CLEVELAND: RHP DOMINGO GERMÁN (0-1, 3.77 ERA)

RHP Domingo Germán will make his first career start (and 13th career appearance) in Sunday's series finale vs. Cleveland...will pitch on four days' rest after throwing 4.0IP (4H, 1BB, 4K) in Tuesday's combined shutout at Houston...since being recalled from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on 4/7, has pitched in relief five times while compiling an 0-1 record and 3.77 ERA (28.2IP, 11ER)...has gone at least 2.0IP in 9-of-12 career MLB games...made his Major League debut with the Yankees in 2017, going 0-1 with a 3.14 ERA (14.1IP, 5ER) in seven relief appearances...was re-signed by the Yankees as minor league free agent on 12/11/15...was acquired by the Yankees, along with RHP Nathan Eovaldi and INF Garrett Jones, from the Miami Marlins in exchange for RHP David Phelps, INF/OF Martin Prado and cash considerations on 12/19/14...was originally signed by the Marlins as a non-drafted free agent on 8/8/09.

LAST APPEARANCE: Made his fifth appearance of the season in Tuesday's win at Houston, tossing 4.0 shutout innings (4H, 1BB, 4K)...matched his longest Major League outing (also 6/17/17 at Oakland)...was the longest relief appearance by the Yankees since Bryan Mitchell (4.0IP, 0R) on 8/8/17 at Toronto.
