MEDICAL MATTERS—RH **Chris Archer** (left abdominal strain) threw a 25-pitch bullpen session yesterday...SS **Adeiny Hechavarria** (right hamstring strain) completed defensive work yesterday and is scheduled to begin a rehab assignment with Class-A Charlotte tomorrow...CF **Kevin Kiermaier** (torn ligament in right thumb) is scheduled to take live BP today and begin a rehab assignment with the Stone Crabs on Tuesday...Kiermaier has been on the disabled list since April 16, and the Rays have gone 26-22 (.542) in his absence, compared to 29-32 in 2017 and 14-34 in 2016.

RAY MATTER—The Rays won, 7-3, yesterday to snap an 8-game losing streak, which matched their season high and was one shy of the longest losing streak in the majors this season...they scored 7 runs, their most since May 27 vs. BAL (8), after averaging 2.38 runs per game during the losing streak...the Rays scored in each of the first three innings, and the 4-1 lead after the 2nd inning was their first lead since Sun at SEA, going 39 consecutive innings of tied or trailing in between...furthermore, it was their first lead by multiple runs since their 6-0 win on May 30 at OAK.

- + The Rays are 1-8 in their last 9 games, compared to 12-4 in their previous 16 games and 24-13 in their previous 37 games...this stretch has seen them go from a season-high 2 games over .500 (28-26) to 5 games under .500 (29-34)...during this 9-game span, the Rays have pitched to a 4.44 ERA, are batting .224 (68-for-304) overall and .193 (11-for-57) with RISP and have averaged 2.89 runs per game.
- + The Rays are 12-15 (.444) this season at Tropicana Field, but they are 10-8 in their last 18 games here following a 2-7 start to the season...they have played 27 games at home, fewest in the majors.

HOT AND COLD—The Rays have arguably been the streakiest team in all of baseball, as so far they have gone on winning streaks of 8, 6 and 5 games and losing streaks of 8, 8, 5 and 4 games...they are the only team in the majors with *multiple* winning streaks of 5 games or more *and* *multiple* losing streaks of 5 games or more this season...this is the first time in club history they have had *three* separate winning streaks of 5 games or more *and* *three* separate losing streaks of 5 games or more in the same season.

- + The Rays are one of three teams with three separate winning streaks of 5 games or more, joining the Astros and Yankees...in comparison, they had one 5-game winning streak over the previous three seasons, coming in **Kevin Cash's** first month on the job.
- + The Rays are one of four teams with three separate losing streaks of 5 games or more, along with the Orioles, Royals and White Sox.
- + The Rays are the only team in the majors this season with *multiple* losing streaks of 8 games or more, and this is the fifth time in club history they have had a pair of losing streaks that long in the same season (2016, 2007, 2005, 2002).

GUT CHECK—The Rays have played 25 games so far this season against the 10 teams currently positioned to make the postseason, and they are a combined 5-20 (.200) in these games against the Yankees (0-2), Indians (0-0), Mariners (1-5), Red Sox (4-9), Astros (0-0), Nationals (0-2), Brewers (0-0), Diamondbacks (0-0), Cubs (0-0) and Braves (0-2)...they are 11-25 (.306) this season against teams currently .500 or better and 18-9 (.667) against teams currently below .500...from June 1-July 1, 25 of the club's 28 games are against teams currently positioned to make the postseason, the only exception the upcoming 3-game series against the Blue Jays.

- + The Rays are in the middle of a stretch of 40 games in 41 days from May 11-June 20, and they have gone 14-15 over this span so far.

CLOSE SHAVES—Four times in their last 8 games the Rays have lost by a 1-run margin...the Rays have played 25 games decided by 1 run this season, 2nd-most in the majors to the Mariners (29)...they are 9-16 (.360) in 1-run games, the most losses and 8th-lowest winning pct. in the majors.

- + 39.7 pct. of the Rays games this season have been decided by 1 run, compared to 28.0 pct. of games in the majors (534 of 1,910).
- + 71.4 pct. of the Rays games this season have been wins or 1-run losses...they have lost by 2 runs or more in 28.6 pct. of their games.
- + Since 2016, the Rays are 43-67 (.391) in 1-run games, 2nd-worst winning pct. in the majors over that span to the Twins (.355).

RAYS vs. MARINERS—The Rays are 1-5 against the Mariners this season (1-2 at home, 0-3 on the road), with 4 losses by a 1-run margin...they are 75-98 (.434) all-time against them (37-46 at home, 38-52 on the road)...this

is the fifth consecutive year they have lost the season series, going 10-22 (.313) since the start of 2014...they are 2-11 in their last 13 games against the Mariners...in addition, they are 4-11 in their last 15 home games and 7-14 in their last 21 home games after a 8-0 stretch from 2011-12.

- + The Rays were swept by the Mariners last weekend, giving them their first 9-game losing streak at any opposing ballpark since Sep 11, 2007-Sep 8, 2008, when they went 0-9 at Fenway Park.

UP NEXT: BLUE JAYS—The Rays won two of three in a home series against the Blue Jays from May 4-6, losing the series finale, 2-1, to miss a chance at the sweep...tomorrow is the fourth of 19 meetings between the two clubs this season (9 at Tropicana Field, 10 at Rogers Centre)...the two teams meet only six times before the All-Star break, compared to 13 times in the second half (and 10 times in September)...the Rays went 9-10 last season (6-4 at home, 3-6 on the road), just the second time they lost a season series to the Blue Jays in the "Rays" era (2014)...they are 187-168 (.527) all-time against Toronto, their most wins against any opponent.

RAKE SEASON—Last night **Jake Bauers** recorded the first 2 hits of his major league career, a 1st-inning double and 4th-inning single...his first career hit came off 6-time All-Star, 2-time AL ERA leader and 2010 AL Cy Young Award winner **Félix Hernández**...the exit velocity on his double was 103.8 mph...he has put nine balls in play in his 3 games, including six with an exit velocity of 90 mph or more and four at 100 mph or more.

SAVE SAVVY—Six different players have recorded a save for the Rays this season, most in the majors ahead of the Angels (5), Brewers (5), Phillies (5) and White Sox (5)...the club record is nine different pitchers with a save (2009)...since the May 25 trade of **Alex Colomé** to the Mariners, the Rays have recorded 4 saves, coming from four different pitchers:

- + **Austin Pruitt** on May 27 vs. BAL, the first save of at least 5.2 IP in the majors since **TEX Joaquin Benoit** on Sep 3, 2002 at BAL (7 IP);
- + **Jonny Venters** on May 28 at OAK, his first save since Aug 22, 2011 at CHC (with ATL), going 2,470 days in between;
- + **Sergio Romo** on May 29 at OAK, his first save since Oct 1, 2016 vs. LAD (with SF), going 604 days in between;
- + **Chaz Roe** yesterday vs. SEA, his first save in the majors (132nd app)...since Roe debuted for the Diamondbacks on July 1, 2013 at NYM, 400 other pitchers had recorded a save before him, with LAD **Kenley Jansen** (204) leading the way over that span.

ODDS & ENDS—The Rays have used 13 different starting pitchers this season, most in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (11) and A's (11)...this is only the fifth time the Rays have used 13 different starting pitchers for an *entire* season, following 2004 (14), 2003 (14), 2000 (13) and 1999 (13).

- + The Rays are 21-14 (.600) when outhitting their opponent, already more losses than they had last season when doing so (62-12).
- + The Rays have a major-league-most 9 losses when yielding 2 runs or fewer...they are 9-9 in these games, compared to 40-6 in 2017.
- + Since 2015, the Rays have hit only two walk-off home runs, fewest in the majors...during that same span, they have yielded 14 walk-off home runs, 2nd-most in the majors behind the Indians (15).
- + Rays relievers lead the majors with 278.2 IP, 23.1 IP more than any other team (Dodgers, 255.1 IP) while Rays starters have covered 284.2 IP, fewest in the majors by 39.2 IP (Marlins, 324.1 IP).

#VOTERAYS—For the fourth consecutive season, All-Star balloting is being conducted exclusively online and via mobile devices at mlb.com, all 30 club web sites and the MLB At Bat and MLB Ballpark apps...the Mid-summer Classic will be held on July 17 at Nationals Park in Washington, D.C., the fifth All-Star Game to be played in the nation's capital.

- + Fans can cast votes for starters a total of 35 times, including a maximum of five valid ballots cast in any 24-hour period.

THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY—On June 10, 2017, the Rays hosted the Athletics in Major League Baseball's first scheduled doubleheader since July 16, 2011, when the Angels played at Oakland...the Rays won the first game, 6-5, on **Evan Longoria's** walk-off single, and lost Game 2, 7-2...it was the second doubleheader in Tropicana Field history—on Sep 30, 2004, the Rays and Tigers played a traditional doubleheader to make up games that had been postponed four weeks earlier due to Hurricane Frances.

LAST START—On Tues at WAS, made his second start of the season and took his first loss since Aug 4, 2016 vs. NYM (with NYY)...yielded 4 runs on 4 hits, including 2 runs on 3 hits in the 2nd inning (**Matt Adams** solo homer, **Wilmer Difo** RBI groundout)...charged another 2 runs in the 4th inning on a walk, RBI triple and run-scoring wild pitch (with 2 outs and the pitcher batting)...received no run support opposite **Max Scherzer** in the 4-2 loss...his line: L, 5 IP, 4 H, 4 R, 1 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 86 pit, 66 str.

THE COMEBACK—Will be pitching at Tropicana Field for the first time with the Rays and the fourth time in his career (last July 30, 2016, with NYY)...his season debut was his first game in the majors since Aug 10, 2016 at BOS (with NYY), which he exited due to right elbow discomfort after a clean 1st inning...among his Yankees teammates who played in that game were since-retired **Mark Teixeira**, **Alex Rodriguez** and current teammate **Rob Refsnyder**...he became the 35th player to pitch in the majors after multiple Tommy John surgeries, and only the 12th pitcher at the time to start in the majors after doing so (see chart above)—on Wed at WAS, **Jonny Venters** became the 13th pitcher to start in the majors after multiple Tommy John surgeries (and the first to start in the majors after three Tommy John surgeries).

- + Of the other players to start a game after multiple Tommy John surgeries, only six made more than 4 starts and only two made more than 20 starts.
- + He is the fourth to pitch for the Rays after multiple Tommy John surgeries, following **Lance Carter** (two), **Al Reyes** (two) and **Jonny Venters** (three), and the first of two to start a game for them...he was the fourth pitcher to return to the majors this season after multiple Tommy John surgeries, following Venters, WAS **Tim Collins** and CWS **Jace Fry**...he underwent Tommy John surgeries on Aug 19, 2016 (**Dr. Christopher Ahmad**) and as a high school junior on May 27, 2007 (**Dr. David Lintner**).

WELCOME BACK—In his season debut on May 30 at OAK, his only baserunner allowed in 6 IP was a 1st-inning, 1-out walk, and after that he retired his next 17 BF...was his first game in the majors since Aug 10, 2016 at BOS (with NYY), going 657 days in between, and his first win since July 24, 2016 vs. SF (with NYY)...did not allow a hit in 6 IP, matching the longest no-hit bid of his career (April 25, 2016 at TEX)...only one other time has a Rays pitcher finished an outing having gone at least 6 IP without allowing a hit: **Matt Garza's** no-hitter on July 26, 2010 vs. DET (9 IP)...became the fourth pitcher to go at least 6 IP without allowing a run in his Rays debut, following **Nate Karns** in 2014, **Dwight Gooden** in 2000 and **Steve Trachsel** in 2000.

SNYDER SAYS—Pitching coach **Kyle Snyder** said this about Eovaldi's return: "It's going to be a huge accomplishment for him, but it's going to be something felt throughout the clubhouse. He's probably one of the hardest workers I've ever seen from me being a player and a coach at this point."

- + Eovaldi signed with the Rays as a free agent in February 2017 due in part to the club's reputation in handling pitchers recovering from Tommy John surgery...he achieved his goal of being physically ready to return by the end of 2017, pitching on rehab assignment in both the Southern League and International League Finals last September...the Rays exercised his 2018 club option.

THE SETBACK—Originally was tabbed by Manager **Kevin Cash** on March 15 to start the fourth game of this season, but was placed on the disabled list the day before Opening Day...on March 30, he underwent arthroscopic surgery to remove loose bodies in his right elbow, performed by **Dr. Koco Eaton** in St. Petersburg...totaled four rehab starts between Class-A Charlotte and Triple-A Durham.

vs. SEATTLE—Is 0-0 with a 0.75 ERA (12-IP, 3-R/1-ER) in 2 starts against the Mariners...last faced them on April 18, 2014 (with MIA), yielding 2 unearned runs in the 2nd inning on a **Dustin Ackley** single and an earned run in the 5th inning on a **Brad Miller** groundout...his only other app/start against them came on June 8, 2012 (with LAD), and he did not allow a run over 6 IP at Safeco Field.

NASTY FACTOR—Has averaged 96.7 mph on his 64 fastballs thrown this season—96.9 mph in his first start and 96.5 mph in his last start, according to StatCast...nine times this season he has hit at least 98.0 mph, and his max velocity is 99.0 mph, on a 1-1 pitch to **Bryce Harper** in the 1st inn. on Tues at WAS (foul ball)...in 2016, averaged 97.1 mph on his fastball according to FanGraphs, the 2nd-hardest in the majors (min. 100 IP) behind NYM **Noah Syndergaard** (98.0)...PITCHf/x clocked him with 36 pitches of at least 100 mph that year, topping out at 101.4 mph...in 2015, he was clocked as high as 102.4 mph.

HOMETOWN HERO—Grew up in Alvin, Texas, and the city's claim to fame is Hall of Famer **Nolan Ryan**, whose name and likeness are ubiquitous...although the two attended the same high school, Eovaldi had never met Ryan until 2016, when the Yankees visited the Astros...Ryan once sent him a signed baseball during spring training congratulating him on his achievements.

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
