## NEW YORK YANKEES (53-27) vs. BOSTON RED SOX (56-28)

### RHP Luis Severino (12-2, 2.10) vs. LHP David Price (9-5, 3.66)

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees continue their six-game homestand tonight, their final home games before the All-Star break...are 1-1 so far vs. Boston...will also play 3G vs. Atlanta (Mon.-Wed.)...on Friday, begin an 11-game road trip to finish the "first half": 3G at Toronto (Fri.-Sun.), 4G at Baltimore (7/9-11, incl. DH on 7/9) and 4G at Cleveland (7/12-15).

- ▶ **At 53-27 (.663), have the Majors' second-best record, behind Boston (56-28, .667)...have held sole possession of the Majors' best record for 13 of the last 16 days (since 6/16)...is the latest in a season they had sole possession of MLB's best record since the end of play on 7/27/12 (.606, 60-39).**
- ▶ **Are 26G over .500, 2G shy of their season high...are 3-5 since they were 28G over .500 at the end of play on 6/21 (50-22).**
- ▶ **Are 1.0G behind Boston for first place in the AL East...since 5/7, the AL East division lead has changed hands 10 times...trailed Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 39-26, the Yankees are 44-18).**
- ▶ **Are 17-3-2 over their last 22 series (since 4/19)...are 44-18 in their last 62G...are a Major League-best 37-4 (.902) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 34-5 (.872) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.**
- ▶ **Are 19-14 vs. the AL East and 34-13 vs. all other divisions.**

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees were shut out, 11-0, by the Red Sox on Saturday night at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Sonny Gray** (2.1IP, 7H, 6ER, 2BB, OK, 1HR) started and took his sixth loss...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-4) had the Yankees' only hit before the ninth, a one-out single in the first inning...**2B Gleyber Torres** (1-for-4) singled with two outs in the ninth...hit cleanup for the first time in his career, the third-youngest cleanup hitter in Yankees history...**RHP Adam Warren** tossed 2.2 scoreless innings (2H, 4K) to extend his scoreless streak to 10.2IP since returning from the DL.

- ▶ Tonight's first pitch temperature of 92° F was the hottest at Yankee Stadium since 8/14/16 vs. Tampa Bay (95°).

**THE GLEY-HEY KID:** **2B Gleyber Torres** hit cleanup for the first time in his career on Saturday...at 21 years, 199 days, is the third-youngest cleanup hitter in Yankees history, behind Mickey Mantle (27G from 1951-53, first on 9/29/51-G1 vs. Boston at 19.344) and Lou Gehrig (4G in 1923, first on 9/27/23 at Boston at 20.100)...is the youngest since Mantle hit cleanup on 5/5/53 at Cleveland at 21 years, 197 days.

**HOME COOKING:** The Yankees **are a Major League-best 30-12 (.714) at home in 2018**, including 25-7 in 32G since 4/21.

- ▶ **Are 16-1-2 in their last 19 home series (since 8/31/17), going 44-16 in 60G over that span, including 6-3 vs. Boston...their only home series loss in that span was 4/5-8 vs. Baltimore (1-3)...have won 9-of-10 home series since 4/19 (9-0-1).**
- ▶ **Lead Major League clubs in HRs hit at home (71)...have hit multiple HRs in eight of their last 11 (22HR)...rank third in SLG (.464) and OPS (.806), and fourth in OBP (.343) at home.**

**ALL THAT'S LEFT:** The Yankees had their seven-game winning streak in games vs. left-handed starting pitchers snapped on Saturday...**are a Major League-best 19-6 (.760) when they face a left-handed starter in 2018.**

- ▶ **Despite going 1-for-22 on Saturday, Yankees batters are still hitting .251/.336/.466 vs. left-handers in 2018...their AL-best .802 OPS vs. southpaws ranks second in the Majors to Atlanta (.812).**

**FAN FAVORITES:** The Yankees drew a season-high paid attendance of 47,125 on Saturday night...marked their 13th sellout in 42 gates at Yankee Stadium in 2018, **matching their sellout total from all of 2017**...have recorded sellouts in six of their last seven home games...have drawn at least 44,000 fans in each of their last 17 home games (since 5/25).

- ▶ **Through 42 home gates, the Yankees lead the AL in total home attendance (1,784,926) and average attendance per home gate (42,498), trailing only the Dodgers in average home attendance (46,287 per gate).**

**MAIN EVENT OF THE EVENING:** According to *Elias*, tonight marks the latest in a season that the Yankees (53-27) and Red Sox (56-28) will face each other while holding the Majors' two best records since the teams played an AL East tiebreaker game in Game 163 on 10/2/78 at Fenway Park when they were both 99-63 (the Yankees won, 5-4).

- ▶ **The Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the two best records in the Majors on 58 of the last 59 days (since the end of play on 5/3)...over that span, the teams have been separated by no more than 2.5G.**

**THE PRICE IS RIGHT:** Yankees batters have scored at least 4R in 6-of-8G vs. Red Sox starter David Price since the start of 2016, batting .349 (65-for-186) against him...over the same span, Price has gone 2-5 with a 7.42 ERA (43.2IP, 36ER) in his eight starts against the Yankees...eight of his 18 career games with at least 6ER allowed – and seven of his 20G with at least 10H allowed – have come against the Yankees.

- ▶ Price leads active pitchers in runs allowed (126), starts (38), wins (15) and strikeouts (203) vs. the Yankees.

**STANTON ISLAND:** **OF Giancarlo Stanton** is 10-for-23 (.435) with 3R, 2 doubles, 1HR and 4RBI in the last 6G...is hitting .370/.443/.667 (20-for-54) with 6R, 4 doubles, 4HR and 10RBI in his last 14G.

- ▶ **Is batting .346/.409/.790 (28-for-81) with 4 doubles, 1 triple and 10HR vs. left-handed pitchers this season...is 7-for-17 (.412) since 6/16...his AL-high 10HR vs. LHP are second-most in the Majors (Christian Villanueva-11HR), while his 1.199 OPS is third-highest.**
- ▶ **In 8G vs. Boston this season, is batting .414/.500/.759 (12-for-29) with 7R, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR, 7RBI, 3BB, 2HP and 2SB.**

**BRONX BOMBERS:** Yankees batters have hit 131HR this season, 3HR shy of their franchise record for most HRs before the All-Star break (134HR in 2002, '12).

**DELLIN DONUTS:** **RHP Dellin Betances** has allowed just 1H with 24K in 14.0 scoreless innings (10BB, 2HP) over his last 14 appearances (since 5/27)...is the second-longest streak of scoreless appearances in his career, behind an 18-game scoreless stretch from 7/8-8/19/15 (20.1IP).

- ▶ **According to *Elias*, is the third pitcher in Yankees history to allow 1H-or-fewer over a span of at least 14 appearances, joining LHP Paul Assenmacher (1H in 9.1IP over 14G, 8/2-9/5/93) and LHP Tommy Layne (1H in 8.0IP over 16G, 8/13-9/9/16).**
- ▶ **Since Devon Travis's single on 6/6 at Toronto, opposing batters are 0-for-27 with 18K, 5BB and 1HP...is the Majors' longest current streak of hitless ABs.**

**SAVES THE DAY:** **LHP Aroldis Chapman** recorded 11 saves and one win in 12 June appearances while posting a 0.77 ERA (11.2IP, 4H, 1ER, 4BB, 19K, 1HR, 1HP).

- ▶ **His 11 saves tied for the third-most in a calendar month in Yankees history, trailing only John Wetteland (15 in June 1996) and Spaky Lyle (12 in June 1973)...was just the second Yankee since 2005 to record 11 saves in a month (Rafael Soriano, 11 in June 2012).**
- ▶ **Overall, is tied with Colorado's Wade Davis and San Diego's Brad Hand for third in the Majors with 23 saves (in 24 chances), behind Seattle's Edwin Diaz (31) and Boston's Craig Kimbrel (24)...only one Yankee since 2005 has recorded more saves prior to the All-Star break (Mariano Rivera, 30 in 2013).**

**HOLD IT RIGHT THERE:** **RHP Jonathan Holder** had his 10.2-inning scoreless streak snapped on Sat. vs. Boston (1.0IP, 2H, 1ER)...allowed his first earned run since his recall on 4/21, ending his AL season-best streak of 23 consecutive relief appearances without an ER from 4/21-6/27 (27.2IP, 10H, 3R/0ER, 3BB, 26K)...was tied with Milwaukee's Jeremy Jeffress for the second-longest streak in the Majors this season behind Arizona's Yoshihisa Hirano (25G).

### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**July 1, 2004:** Derek Jeter makes his most famous catch, diving into Yankee Stadium's third base stands to nab a 12th-inning popup from Boston's Trot Nixon. John Flaherty gives the Yankees a 5-4 win with a 13th-inning RBI single.

**July 1, 1950:** Whitey Ford makes his MLB debut, allowing 5R in a relief appearance at Boston.

**July 1, 1935:** At the suggestion of Yankee outfielder George Selkirk, the Stadium gets a six-foot-wide cinder path in front of the fences to alert fielders when they are approaching the wall. Yankee Stadium is the first Major League ballpark to have the feature, which will subsequently become known as the 'warning track'.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**July 2, 1941:** Joe DiMaggio goes 1-for-5 with a two-run home run off Dick Newsome, extending his hitting streak to 45 games and surpassing Wee Willie Keeler's single-season Major League record 44-game streak set in 1897.

## YANKEES vs. BOSTON RED SOX

**OVERALL TRENDS:** The Yankees are 4-4 vs. the Red Sox in 2018...will play the ninth of 19 games against the Red Sox tonight (9G in the Bronx, 10G at Boston)...are 18-12 in 30G vs. Boston since 9/27/16...**IN 2017:** Went 11-8 vs. Boston, including 6-4 at home and 5-4 at Fenway Park...held Red Sox batters to a .196 BA and .578 OPS, both the lowest figures for Yankees pitchers in the rivalry since at least 1954... **SEASON SERIES:** Have won four of the last six season series (2012-17)...have lost just four of 17 season series between the clubs since 2000, going 11-4-3 over the span...**AT YANKEE STADIUM:** Are 3-2 at Yankee Stadium this year...went 6-4 against the Red Sox at Yankee Stadium in 2017...matched their highest home win total vs. Boston since going 7-2 in 2009...are 13-6 in the Bronx since 7/17/16...are 47-43 vs. the Red Sox at the current Yankee Stadium, their most losses to any team at the Stadium.

**TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS SEVERINO (12-2, 2.10 ERA)**

**RHP Luis Severino** will make his 18th start of the season in tonight's series finale vs. Boston...the 24-year-old will start on regular four days' rest...**his 12 wins lead the Majors**...his 2.10 ERA leads the AL (third in the Majors)...is sixth in the AL and ninth in the Majors with 132K...earned his 12th win of the season with 7.0 scoreless innings on Tues. at Philadelphia (6H, 0BB, 9K)...the Yankees are 15-2 in his starts, the most *team wins* started by any pitcher in 2018...marks his third straight season beginning the year in the starting rotation...finished third in 2017 AL Cy Young Award voting after posting a 14-6 record and 2.98 ERA (193.1IP, 64ER) in 31 starts...made his first career AL All-Star Team in 2017...was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 12/26/11.

**LAST START:** Earned his Major League-leading 12th win on Tuesday at Philadelphia, throwing 7.0 scoreless innings (6H, 0BB, 9K)...registered 13 pitches at 99.0 mph-or-faster in the sixth inning or later, the most such pitches by a starter this season...held Philadelphia batters hitless with runners in scoring position (0-for-3, 2K)...was his 23rd straight road start with at least 6K (since 4/7/17), the fourth-longest streak in Major League history...registered his 24th start of allowing 1R-or-fewer since the start of 2017, the most in the Majors...improved to 6-1 with a 0.94 ERA (57.2IP, 6ER) in nine 10 Interleague games (eight starts)...with the win, has now registered a win against 16 teams in the Majors...has won five of his last six starts and seven of his last nine...became the first Yankees pitcher since 1994 (Jimmy Key) to record at least 12 wins in the team's first 77G.

**WELCOME TO MY HOUSE:** Is 7-0 with a 1.83 ERA (59.0IP, 39H, 12ER, 14BB, 69K, 4HR) in nine starts at Yankee Stadium this season...his 1.83 ERA is the third-lowest home ERA in the AL (seventh-lowest in the Majors).
