## 2011 SEASON REVIEW [padres.com](http://padres.com)

**THE NEED FOR SPEED:** The Padres led the Majors with 170 stolen bases in 2011, the fifth-highest season total in club history and most since the 1999 Padres stole 174 bases... San Diego ranked second in the Majors with a 79.4 stolen base percentage (170 SB/44 CS), the second-highest season mark in club history behind the 2006 Padres' 79.9 stolen base percentage...the 170 stolen bases were the most by a National League team since the 2007 New York Mets stole 200 bases...the club featured six players with double digits in steals (Jason Bartlett 23, Chris Denorfia 11, Chase Headley 13, Orlando Hudson 19, Cameron Maybin 40 and Will Venable 26), the first time a Padres team had six-or-more players with 10-or-more steals since the 1987 team had a franchise-best seven...only other Padres team with six-or-more was the 1983 squad with six.

**ON THE HILL:** The Padres boasted the third-best team ERA in the Majors in 2011, with a 3.42 ERA (551 ER/1449.1 IP), and the seventh-best opponents batting average with a .245 (1324-for-5408) mark...the club's starters ranked sixth-best in the Majors and fourth-best in the National League, posting a 3.62 ERA (388 ER/965.2 IP) on the season...Padres relievers tanked third-best in the Majors with a 3.03 ERA (163 ER/483.2 IP), right behind the Atlanta Braves (3.02 ERA) and San Francisco Giants (3.02 ERA).

**HERE COMES THE SUN:** In day games in 2011 the Padres went 32-24 (.571), the third-best record in the National League and tied for seventh-best in the Majors...the club's 32 wins in day games were tied for second-most in the NL (also, Chicago) behind the Philadelphia Phillies' 33 wins...the Padres 3.14 ERA (174 ER/498.0 IP) in day games was the best mark in the Majors...the Padres also scored 227 runs in day games, good for sixth-most in the NL.

**THE DEBUT:** The Padres had 12 players make their Big League debuts in 2011, including RHPs Anthony Bass (6/13), Brad Brach (8/31), Erik Hamren (8/1) and Evan Scribner (4/26), LHP Josh Spence (6/24), C Luis Martinez (7/15), INFs James Darnell (8/9), Logan Forsythe (5/4) and Anthony Rizzo (6/9) and OFs Cedric Hunter (3/31), Blake Tekotte (5/25) and Andy Parrino (8/26)...per ELIAS, those were the most for a Padres team since the 2009 club had 15 players make their Major League debuts.

**HAPPY FLIGHTS:** The Padres went 16-12 (.571) in games in which they either flew to their next opponents city or back home immediately right after the game, including 8-4 (.667) in such games in the second half...had a stretch of winning six-straight such games from April to May after losing their first "getaway" game of the season on 4/3 at STL.

**TOO CLOSE FOR COMFORT:** A total of 91 of the Padres' 162 games (56.2%) in 2011 were decided by two runs-or-less with SD posting a 40-51 record in those games...played 51 one-run games (20-31) and 40 two-run games (20-20)...in 2010, the Padres had 80 of 162 games (49.4%) decided by two runs-or-less.

**PADRES MVP:** Cameron Maybin was named the Padres Most Valuable Player by the San Diego chapter of the Baseball Writers' Association of America (BBWAA) after setting career-highs in nearly every offensive category in his first year with San Diego, including games (137), runs (82), hits (136), doubles (24), triples (8), home runs (9), RBI (40) and stolen bases (40)...led the team in runs, triples, stolen bases and a career-high 37 multi-hit games...his 40 stolen bases ranked tied for fourth-most in the Majors and tied for second-most in the National League...became the 10th Padre in team history to steal 40 bases in a season...at one point, was successful on 21-straight stolen base attempts from 5/19-8/8, the longest streak by a Padre since Dave Roberts stole 25-straight in 2006.

**GOOD STAUFF:** Tim Stauffer set career-highs in nearly every category in 2011, including starts (31), wins (9), innings (185.2), strikeouts (128) and quality starts (20)...was the Padres Opening Day starter on 3/31 at STL, his first career Opening Day start...in the first half, went 5-6 with a 2.97 ERA (39 ER/118.0 IP), a .255 (112-for-439) opponents batting average and 90 strikeouts against 31 walks...in 15 starts at Petco Park, was 6-5 with a 2.57 ERA (27 ER/94.2 IP), a .245 (88-for-359) opponents average and 70 strikeouts against 19 walks...ranked tied with Mat Latos for the team-lead in quality starts in 2011.

**PRIDE OF MARIA STEIN:** Cory Luebke, in his rookie season, went 5-8 with a 3.31 ERA (37 ER/100.2 IP), a .218 (81-for-371) opponents average and 111 strikeouts against 29 walks in 17 starts after joining the rotation on 6/26...started the year in the bullpen, going 1-2 with a 3.23 ERA (14 ER/39.0 IP), a .183 (24-for-131) opponents batting average and 43 strikeouts against 15 walks in 29 relief outings...recorded a career-high 154 strikeouts overall on the year, the second-most ever by a Padres rookie...allowed a .209 (105-for-502) opponents average overall on the season, the fifth-best mark ever by a Padre with 100-or-more innings in a season...held left-handers to a .157 (22-for-140) opponents average overall on the year, leading the National League and ranking third-best in the Majors.

**BETTER LATOS THAN NEVER:** Mat Latos made a career-high tying 31 starts and worked a career-high 194.1 innings in 2011...finished the season by going 4-5 with a 2.75 ERA (31 ER/101.1 IP), a .204 (75-for-367) opponents batting average and 98 strikeouts against 26 walks over his final 15 starts from 7/8-9/26...his .204 opponents average from 7/8 through the end of the season ranked fourth-best among all National League pitchers over that span, while his 98 strikeouts ranked tied for seventh-most and 2.75 ERA 11th-best...started the year by going 5-9 with a 4.26 ERA (44 ER/93.0 IP), a .263 (93-for-354) opponents average and 87 strikeouts against 36 walks over his first 16 starts from 4/11-7/3...his .233 (168-for-721) opponents average overall on the season ranked ninth-best among qualifying National Leaguers.

**HOMETOWN HARANG:** Aaron Harang went 14-7 (.667) in 2011, leading the club in wins, while posting a career-best 3.64 ERA (69 ER/170.2 IP)...the San Diego native went 8-5 with a 3.05 ERA (37 ER/109.1 IP) in 17 starts at home in 2011, and 5-5 with a 3.11 ERA (28 ER/81.0 IP) in 13 starts against the National League West...was also 10-3 (.769) in starts following a Padres loss in 2011.

**MUY BUENO:** Jesus Guzman was selected from Triple-A Tucson on 6/16 and hit .312 (77-for-247) on the year for San Diego, ranking 13th-best in the National League from 6/16 through the end of the season (min. 250 PA)...set a Petco Park record by hitting .346 (37-for-107) over 35 games at home in 2011 (min. 100 PA)...the highest home batting average by a Padre since Tony Gwynn hit .378 (112-for-296) at home in 1997 (min. 100 PA)...over his first 29 games of the second half, hit .383 (36-for-94) with nine doubles, four homers and 27 RBI from 7/14-8/16...overall on the season, hit .431 (28-for-65) with runners in scoring position, the highest mark among all Major Leaguers with 50-or-more plate appearances with RISP.

**IN THE NICK OF TIME:** Nick Hundley set career-highs in 2011 in runs (34), hits (81), triples (5), home runs (9), batting average (.288), on-base percentage (.347) and slugging percentage (.477), making a career-high 73 starts behind the plate for the second-straight season...had two stints on the DL in 2011, undergoing arthroscopic surgery on his right elbow on 7/8 during his second stint...returned from the DL for the second and final time on 8/12 and hit .367 (47-for-128) with 11 doubles, four triples, six home runs, 14 RBI and 19 runs in 37 games to close out the season...his .367 average from 8/12 through the end of the season ranked fourth-best in the Majors in the second half and second-best in the National League.

**HEAD OF CLASS:** Chase Headley set a career-high in 2011 by hitting .289 (110-for-381) on the year...missed 39 games due to a fractured left pinkie finger from 8/6-9/19...at the time he was placed on the DL on 8/8 he was leading all Major League third basemen with a .292 batting average and ranked tied for third in both walks (51) and doubles (28)...had a career-best 16-game hitting streak from 5/21-6/6, batting .339 (20-for-59) over that streak...the hit streak was the longest by a Padre since Adrian Gonzalez in 2006 and the second-longest ever by a Padres third baseman behind an 18-game hit streak by Gary Sheffield in 1992...switch-hitter hit .352 (37-for-105) off left-handed pitching in 2011 and .330 (66-for-200) on the road.

**SAVED BY THE BELL:** Heath Bell was named the Padres Pitcher of the Year (Clyde McCullough Award) by the San Diego Chapter of the Baseball Writers' Association of America (BBWAA) after posting his third-straight season with 40-or-more saves...just the second Padre ever to have three 40-save seasons (Trevor Hoffman had nine)...set a Padres record with 26 saves in the first half of the season.

**DOWN ON THE FARM:** The Padres had four minor league affiliates make their respective league's postseason in 2011, with the Double-A San Antonio Missions, Single-A Lake Elsinore Storm, Single-A Fort Wayne TinCaps and Short-Season Eugene Emeralds...two of those four won their leagues championships with the Missions winning the Texas League and the Storm winning the California League...the Missions won their first Texas League title since 2007 and finished with a 100-47 (.680) overall record, including the playoffs...the Storm won their first California League title since being named co-champs in 2001 after the Finals were canceled that year in the wake of terrorist attacks...the title was Lake Elsinore's first outright championship since 1996...the Storm finished 77-74 (.510) overall on the year.

#### 2011 Summary

- Named the Padres Pitcher of the Year (Clyde McCullough Award) by the San Diego chapter of the Baseball Writers Association of America (BBWAA) after posting his third-straight season of 40-or-more saves...finished the season with 43 saves, second most in his career.
- Three straight years with 40-or-more saves, just the second Padre ever to have three 40-save seasons (Trevor Hoffman had nine for SD).
- His 43 saves in 2011 ranked tied for sixth most among all Major Leaguers and tied for fourth most in the National League.
- His 43 saves also ranked tied for fifth-most in a season in Padres history (also, Trevor Hoffman in 2000, 2001 and 2005).
- Named to his third-straight National League All-Star team in 2011.
- Had 26 saves in the first half, the most ever by a Padre at the All-Star Break, passing Trevor Hoffman who had 25 saves in the first half three times for SD (1998, 2005 and 2007).
- Since becoming a full-time closer in 2009, leads the Major Leagues with 132 saves and ranks fourth with a 90.4 save percentage (132-146)...has earned a save in 55.9 % of Padre wins since 2009 (132 saves/236 wins).
- Earned the 100th save of his career on 5/14 at COL.
- Converted 41-straight save opportunities from 5/29/10-5/3/11, tying Trevor Hoffman (8/24/97-7/25/98) for the longest such streak in club history...the streak was also tied with Rod Beck (8/19/93-4/29/95) for the fourth-longest saves streak of all-time.
- Posted a franchise-best 99-straight games and 102.0-straight innings without allowing a home run from 4/20/10-7/5/11...streak snapped on 7/14 vs. SF (Aubrey Huff), his first home run allowed since 4/19/10 vs. SF (Juan Uribe)...blown save on 7/14 also snapped a string of 19-straight save opportunities converted since 5/8.
- Allowed a home run to Mike Cameron on 8/21 vs. FLA, one of five blown saves in 2011...was his first home run allowed to a right-handed hitter since 4/19/10 vs. SF (Juan Uribe), snapping a streak of 215 consecutive at-bats against right-handed hitters without allowing a home run.
- Converted a save in four-straight days twice in 2011, three times total in his career...save in four-straight from 5/28-31/11, 6/27-30/11 and 8/10-13/10...four saves in four-straight days tied the second-most in four-or-more straight days in club history.
