**TODAY'S GAME:** Is **Game 1** of a 3-game series vs **Zach Wengrove's Cubs** and **Game 1** of a 10-day, 9-game road trip heading into the **All-Star break** that includes upcoming series at Cle's **Progressive Field** (3g) and at StL's **Busch Stadium** (off day, 3g)...the Redlegs are coming off a **4-3 homestand** vs the first-place **Brewers** (2-2) and American League Central Division's **White Sox** (2-1)...Cin will open up the championship season's second half on **Fri, 7/20** with a 10-game homestand vs the division rival **Pirates** (3g) and **Cardinals** (3g), followed by the **Phillies** (4g).

**TRANSACTIONS:** The Reds have selected from Class AAA Louisville the contract of **IF Dilson Herrera** (#15)...he fills the roster spot vacated by **LHP Cody Reed**, who yesterday was optioned to Louisville...on **Wednesday**, the Reds recalled from Louisville **Reed** and **RHP Tanner Rainey** (#44), optioned to Louisville **IF/OF Brandon Dixon** and acquired from the Dodgers minor league **RHP James Marinar** and **RHP Aneurys Zabala** in exchange for **RHP Dylan Floro**, minor league **RHP Zach Neal** and international signing bonus pool space...**Marinar** reported to Rookie Billings and **Zabala** to Class A Dayton.

**SERIES NOTES:** Following a **6-3 Reds home season series win** at **Great American Ball Park** completed on **6/24**, tonight the Reds and Cubs are playing the first of their **3 series** and **10 games** at **Wrigley Field**...the Cubs have won **11** of the **last 15 series** overall...the Cubs won **14** of the **last 19 games** played at **Wrigley Field**, including **10** of the **last 13 games** here...**Billy Hamilton** has **33 stolen bases** vs the Cubs, the most by a Reds player vs Chi in the live ball era (**Barry Larkin**, 32)...over the **previous 3 seasons** (2015-2017), the Cubs' **.702 winning percentage** vs the Reds (40-17) was the best by any team against any division opponent...**Reds vs Cubs** information is on media guide **Page 320**.

**APRIL 19:** The Reds are **35-34** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

**STREAKING:** The Reds' active **5-series unbeaten streak** (2-0 vs Det, 4-0 vs Chc, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Cws) is their longest since a **6-series winning streak** from **7/15-8/4, 2016** (2-1 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Atl, 2-1 vs Ari, 2-1 at SF, 2-1 at SD, 2-1 vs StL)...in **fifth place** since the **fourth day of the season**, the Reds have pulled to within **2.5 games** of the fourth-place **Pirates**...from **6/21-7/1** the Redlegs played 3 consecutive series vs **first-place teams** and went **4-0 vs Cubs**, **2-1 at Atl** and **2-2 vs Mil**.

**ALL-STAR INFIELD:** The Reds' infield collectively leads the Major Leagues in **hits** (397), **batting average** (.290) and **on-base percentage** (.368)...**1B Joey Votto** leads the National League in on-base percentage and hitting vs RHP...**2B Scooter Gennett** leads the league in overall hitting and hitting on the road...**3B Eugenio Suárez** is tied for the NL lead in RBI and leads the Major Leagues in fewest at bats per RBI...he also ranks second in the NL in slugging percentage and seventh in batting average...**SS José Peraza** ranks second in the league in most plate apps per strikeout.

**DOT...DOT...DOT:** The deadline for signing **2018 draft picks** is **5:00 p.m. ET today**...in Sat's 12-3 win vs the **Brewers** **Reds** pitchers recorded **18 strikeouts**, a new franchise record for a 9-inning game...the **Reds trailed** in **8** of their **last 11 victories**...over an **8-day span** from **6/23-6/30**, **Reds** pitchers produced **4 HR** (**Michael Lorenzen** 3, **Anthony DeSclafani** 1), **2 grand slams** (**Lorenzen**, **DeSclafani**), **2 pinch-hit HR** (**Lorenzen** 2) and a **pinch-hit grand slam** (**Lorenzen**).

**REHABBING:** **RHP Homer Bailey** is 4 apps into a **rehabilitation assignment** at **Louisville** (4gs, 1-2, 6.35, 22.2ip, 29h, 16er, 2bb, 14k, 4hr, 1hbp)...he has been disabled since **6/2** with **right knee inflammation**...made his most recent start **Tue vs Indianapolis** and earned the 3-2 win (6.2ip, 7h, 1er, 0bb, 8k, 103 pitches, 69 strikes).

**RUTHIAN:** In his last 6 plate apps **RHP Michael Lorenzen** singled, homered (pinch hit), walked, homered, homered (pinch-hit grand slam) and struck out...he became the first Major League pitcher to homer in **3 consecutive** at bats since **Col's Mike Hampton** in **2001**...his **3 HR** are the most by a Reds batter whose primary position is pitcher since **Micah Owings** had **3 homers** in 2009...in his career as a pinch hitter **Lorenzen** is 4-for-12 with 3 HR (4/6/17 off Pit's **Adam Morgan**, 6/24/18 off Chi's **Mike Montgomery**, grand slam on 6/30/18 off Mil's **Jacob Barnes**), including 3-for-5 this season (2hr, 5rbi)...5 times **Lorenzen** has come off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active Major League pitchers combine for just 2 such games...on 6/7 vs **Col Lorenzen** pinch hit and produced a 116.5-mile-per-hour single off **Tyler Anderson**, the hardest-hit ball in the Statcast era by any **Reds batter** or by any **Major League pitcher**...info courtesy **Elias** and **Stats**.

**SLAMMING:** The Reds lead the Major Leagues with **9 grand slams**, tying the **2002 franchise single-season record** and including a streak of **6 slams** over a **17-game span** from **6/13-7/1**...the **1996 Expos**, **1997 Braves** and **2006 Mets** are the only other teams in **Major League history** to produce at least **6 grand slams** over a **17-day span**...the **9 grand slams** tie the **2010 Yankees** for most ever prior to the **All-Star break**...the National League record for grand slams in a season is **12** (1997 **Braves**, 2000 **Cardinals**), while the Major League record is **14** (2000 **Athletics**, 2006 **Indians**)...the Reds hit 5 in **June**, a new club record for **grand slams** in a **calendar month**...the Reds' **9 grand slams** were hit by **Adam Duvall** (2), **Scooter Gennett**, **Eugenio Suárez**, **Joey Votto**, **Jesse Winker**, pitcher **Anthony DeSclafani**, **Michael Lorenzen** (pinch-hit) and **José Peraza**...on **6/23 vs Chi** (off **Brian Duensing**), **DeSclafani** became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a **grand slam** (**Bob Purkey** 1959, **Al Hollingsworth** 1936, **Ice Box Chamberlain** 1892).

# Today's Pitcher - #30 Tyler Mahle, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Tyler Mahle's** last name rhymes with **RALLY**...at just **23 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...this afternoon is making his 18th start of the season and 22nd appearance and start of his **career**...will be the third start of the season and of his career vs the **Cubs** and his first appearance at **Wrigley Field**...didn't allow more than **3 earned runs** in any of his **6 starts in June (3-0, 2.18)**...hasn't lost since **5/20**...in **7 starts** since then is **3-0, 2.84** (38ip, 12er)...is the **first winning streak** of his career and ties **Luis Castillo's (5/8-5/24)**, **Anthony DeSclafani's (6/10-6/23)** **Matt Harvey's** (current) for the longest winning streak by a Reds pitcher this season...leads National League rookies in **wins, starts, innings pitched** and **strikeouts** while ranking sixth in **ERA**...is tied for the Major League lead in strikeouts among all pitchers **age 23 and younger** (Col's **German Márquez**)...his career-high **12 strikeouts** in Sat's **12-3 win vs Mil** were the most by a Reds pitcher since rookie **LHP Amir Garrett** had **12 strikeouts** on **4/19/17 vs Bal** and the most by a Reds righthander since rookie **Raisel Iglesias** had **13 strikeouts** on **8/23/15 vs Ari**...leads the staff with **6 quality starts**.

# Tomorrow's Pitcher - #32 Matt Harvey, RHP

## RED HOTS

## 16 TUCKER BARNHART, c

- The switch-hitter ranks third in the National League in hitting vs LHP (.373, 19-51, 4 2b, 1 3b, 0hr, 8rbi, .475obp, .490slg).
- In his last 3 apps is 0-for-10 (2bb) following a season-high 8-game hitting streak (9-31, .290, 1 2b, 1hr, 5rbi)...over 4 apps is hitless in his last 12 at bats, 1 shy of his season high (0-13, 5/14-5/19).
- In his last 44 apps beginning 5/6 is hitting .276, raising his season BA from .224 (48-174, 7 2b, 1 3b, 3hr, 19rbi).

## 23 ADAM DUVAL, lf

Last 22 Reds Games: .250 (17-68), 3hr, 20rbi

- In his last 16 apps beginning 6/19 is hitting .275, raising his season BA from .186 (14-51, 3 2b, 2hr, 15rbi, .362obp).
- Beginning with the 2016 season is 1 of only 3 Major Leaguers to produce at least 81 doubles, 77 HR and 255 RBI (Nolan Arenado, Paul Goldschmidt).
- Is on pace for 48 extra-base hits...is trying to join Hall of Famer Frank Robinson as the only players in Reds history to produce at least 70 XBH in 3 straight seasons.
- Has made 8 apps this season and 41 apps in his career at 1B...has made 26 career starts at 1B, including 4 this year (4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF, 6/12 at KC, 6/13 at KC).
- In 2016 was a National League All-Star and in each of the 2016 and 2017 seasons was a finalist for the Rawlings Gold Glove Award.

## 4 SCOOTER GENNETT, 2b

Last 22 Reds Games: .300 (24-80), 2hr, 12rbi

- Leads the National League in hitting (.331) and hitting on the road (.354)...no Reds batter has led the NL in batting average since Pete Rose hit .338 in 1973...the list of Reds batters who led the National League in hitting is on media guide page 397.
- Is trying to become the first second baseman to lead the Reds in hits, runs and home runs since Cooperstown Hall of Famer Bid McPhee did it in 1886.
- In his last 162 apps beginning 6/27/17 is hitting .311 with 31 doubles, 1 3b, 30 HR and 114 RBI (.514slg, .357obp, .871ops).
- Has a 4-game hitting streak (7-17, .412, 1 2b, 1hr, 4rbi).
- Hit .298 in April (2hr, 14rbi), .398 in May (8hr, 24rbi) and .309 in June (3hr, 16rbi)...hit safely in 21 of his 25 apps in June, including a pair of 10-game hitting streaks.
- In May (.398, 8hr, 24rbi) became the first Reds player to win the National League Player of the Month Award since Jay Bruce in May 2011...twice in a 3-week span that month won the NL Player of the Week Award (5/7-5/13, 5/21-5/27), the first Reds player to win the weekly award twice in a season since Bruce in 2012 and the first Reds player to win it twice in the same month since Dave Parker in May 1985.
- Since RBI became an official statistic in 1920, is the only Reds second baseman ever to record at least 8 HR and 24 RBI in a calendar month...has done it twice (8hr, 24rbi in May 2018 & 9hr, 24rbi in June 2017).
- Was born in Cincinnati and lived in nearby Lebanon until he was 9 years old, when his family moved to Sarasota.

## 6 BILLY HAMILTON, cf

Last 22 Reds Games: .275 (19-69), 6sb, 17r

- In 17 apps beginning 6/17 is hitting .315 (17-54, 1 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, 5sb, 13r, .367obp), raising his season BA from .187.
- Has made 9 starts batting leadoff, 1 start batting eighth (4/2 vs Chi) and 62 starts batting ninth...his 62 starts batting ninth are the most by any player in the Major Leagues at that spot in the order...has made 51 straight starts batting ninth since he last led off on 4/26 vs Atl...overall beginning 4/27 is hitting .230 (43-187, .303obp).
- Since his debut on 9/3/13 leads all Major League players in steals with 258, sixth on the Reds' all-time list since 1898...Reds Hall of Famer Eric Davis is fifth at 270.
- On 5/26 at Coors Field was timed at 10.39 seconds from home plate to third base, the quickest triple since Statcast started tracking in 2015.

## 15 DILSON HERRERA

Daytona & Louisville: 71g, .297, 13 2b, 9hr, 35rbi

- Was promoted from Class AAA Louisville today to fill the roster spot vacated by LHP Cody Reed, who yesterday was optioned to Louisville.
- When he plays will make his Reds debut and his first Major League appearance since 10/3/15 for NYM vs Wsh.
- Recorded his last Major League hits on 9/27/15 for NYM at Cin (3-4, 1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).
- In 9 apps and 4 starts for the Reds during spring training hit .263 (1 3b, 2rbi)...on 3/13 cleared waivers and was outrighted off the roster.
- Began the season at Class A Daytona (21g, .298, 3 2b, 2hr, 8rbi)...on 5/3 was promoted to Louisville (50g, .297, 10 2b, 7hr, 27rbi)...at both stops combined to make 54 apps at 2B and 11 apps at 3B.

## 9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss

Last 22 Reds Games: .296 (24-81), 3hr, 12rbi, 5sb

- Accent mark on the "e" in José.
- Ranks second in the National League in most plate apps per strikeout (9.5, Nick Markakis 9.6)...twice this season made at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout, from 4/15-4/25 (43pa) and from 5/22-6/2 (40pa).
- Hit safely in 8 of his last 9 apps (13-36, .361, 1 2b, 3 3b, 3hr, 8rbi, 1sb).
- In his last 32 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting .328 (41-125, 5 2b, 3 3b, 3hr, 17rbi, 6sb, .387obp), raising BA from .243 and including a 12-game hitting streak (5/26-6/9) that fell 1 shy of his career high.
- On 6/27 at Atl and 6/28 vs Mil homered in consecutive games for the first time in his career, and in Sun's 8-2 win vs Mil produced his first career grand slam (off Aaron Wilkerson)...was the ninth grand slam by a Reds batter this season, tying the 2002 club record.
- In the batting order hit first (19gs), second (33gs), seventh (21gs) and eighth (8gs).
- From 5/26-6/24 reached base safely in 23 consecutive apps (.330ba, .392obp)...was the longest on-base streak of his career, the longest by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the third-longest active streak in the Major Leagues.

## 43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of

Last 22 Reds Games: .246 (17-69), 3hr, 9rbi

- In his last 28 apps beginning 5/30 is hitting .324, raising his season BA from .237 (35-108, 10 2b, 6hr, 15rbi, .583slg, .393obp).
- The lefthanded batter is hitting .353 vs LHP but doesn't have enough plate apps to qualify among the leaders (24-68, 3 2b, 2hr, 4rbi, .405obp).
- Hit .320 through April (3hr, 11rbi), .200 in May (3hr, 9rbi) and .330 in June (4hr, 11rbi, .560slg, .392obp).
- Has made 24 career starts batting leadoff, including 19 times this year (26-82, .317)...in his 24 career starts batting leadoff hit .317 (33-104), including .320 (32-100) in his 23 starts batting leadoff for the Reds...his career on-base percentage while batting first is .374.
- Has made a team-high 43 starts in RF, 14 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.

## 7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

Last 22 Reds Games: .329 (27-82), 5hr, 16rbi

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb is tied for the National League lead in RBI...no Reds batter has led the NL in RBI since Dave Parker drove in 125 runs in 1985...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- Leads the Major Leagues in fewest at bats per RBI (4.2) while among National League leaders ranks second in slugging percentage and seventh in batting average.
- In his last 162 apps beginning 6/16/17 is hitting .274 with 27 doubles, 2 triples, 33 HR and 109 RBI (.502slg, .379obp, .881ops).
- Has an 8-game hitting streak (11-32, .344, 3 2b, 1hr, 5rbi)...his 13-game hitting streak from 6/8-6/23 was the longest by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the longest active streak in the Major Leagues.
- In his last 39 apps beginning 5/22 is hitting .333, raising his season BA from .274 (50-150, 6 2b, 1 3b, 10hr, 31rbi, .587slg, .423obp, 1.010ops).
- The Reds are 34-36 when he plays and 4-13 when he does not play.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

## 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

Last 22 Reds Games: .243 (18-74, .429obp), 2hr, 16rbi

- Leads the National League in on-base percentage while ranking second in walks and BA vs RHP (.330)...is trying to lead the NL in walks for the sixth time, in OBP for the seventh time and in both categories in the same season for the fifth time.
- Reached base safely in 74 of his 86 apps...his season-high 20-game on-base streak was snapped on 6/13 at KC (0-4).
- Through his third plate appearance on 6/6 was hitting .311 (68-219), his highest batting average since he was 3-for-9 (.333) in the third game of the season.
- On 4/17 at Mil reached 1,000 walks in 1,446 apps, the fourth-fewest games to 1,000 walks in National League history...Pete Rose (1,210) is the only other player in Reds history with at least 1,000 walks...Miguel Cabrera and Albert Pujols are the only other active players in the Major Leagues with at least 1,600 hits and 1,000 walks.
- In the Reds' 87 games has made 86 apps and 84 starts...missed his 3 starts on 4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF and 5/24 vs Pit...missed his only full game on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...prior to that 4/12 day off, had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...during his 202-games started streak played 1,733.1 of the Reds' 1,782.1 innings in the field (97%)...was the longest games started streak by a Reds player since Pete Rose started 370 consecutive games from 1973-1976.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.

## 33 JESSE WINKER, of

Last 22 Reds Games: .305 (18-59), 3hr, 17rbi

- Among the National League leaders ranks sixth in on-base percentage, ninth in hitting with RISP (.345) and T5th in pinch hits (7)...leads NL rookies in walks while ranking second in hits, on-base percentage and multi-hit games (17).
- Produced 2 hits in each of his last 2 apps (4-6, 2 2b, 2rbi).
- In his last 15 apps beginning 6/20 is hitting .421 (16-38, 2 2b, 3hr, 16rbi, 12bb, .711slg, .560obp, 1.271ops).
- Hit .305 through April (0hr, 9rbi, .414obp), .174 in May (1hr, 3rbi) and .308 in June (5hr, 20rbi, .432obp)...among National League leaders in June ranked third in on-base percentage, T9th in RBI and 20th in hitting.
- Has made 37 starts in RF, 24 starts in LF and 1 start at DH...leads the team with 35 starts batting leadoff...on 4/12 vs StL, with Votto off, made his only career start batting third in the order.
- Made his first Opening Day roster...was 1 of 5 rookies on the Opening Day roster (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Phillip Ervin).
- Was the Reds' Opening Day starter in LF...batted leadoff.
