NATIONALS NEWS

THAT'S CALLED A WINNING STREAK

The Washington Nationals won their third straight game on Thursday night, topping the Cincinnati Reds, 10-4, in the opening game of this four-game weekend set...**Max Scherzer** (6.0 IP, 4 H, 2 ER, 2 BB, 10 SO) earned his 15th win of the season, while **Trea Turner** (2-for-4, HR, 4 RBI, BB, 2 R, 2 SB), **Bryce Harper** (2-for-3, HR, 2 RBI, 2 BB, 2 R) and **Juan Soto** (3 BB, RBI, R) led the offense.

- The Nationals have won six of their last eight games...Over the eight-game stretch dating to July 25, Washington has outscored its opponents 67-25...Nationals starting pitchers have worked to a 1.88 ERA (11 ER/52.2 IP) and a .188 opp. AVG over this stretch of games.

SPEAKING OF STREAKS

The Washington Nationals have won eight straight games over the Cincinnati Reds dating to July 14, 2017... During this eight-game streak, the Nationals have scored at least 10 runs four times and have outscored the Reds, 66-28, along the way.

SECOND HALF STATUS CHECK

Since returning from the All-Star break, the Nationals rank among National League clubs in slugging percentage (1st, .494), on-base percentage (1st, .370), OPS (1st, .864), runs scored (1st, 83), stolen bases (1st, 14) and batting average (2nd, .281).

THE OPPOSITE OF A DERBY SLUMP

Bryce Harper is hitting .359 (14-for-39) with four doubles, three home runs, 13 RBI, nine walks, three stolen bases and 12 runs scored in 12 games since returning from the All-Star break...He has a .480 on-base percentage, a .692 slugging percentage and 1.172 OPS over this stretch.

- Even before the All-Star break, Harper began to heat up in the form of extra-base hits...Since June 19, he is tied for fourth in the National League with 12 doubles and his 19 extra-base hits are tied for eighth.
- Harper clubbed his 26th home run of the season on Thursday night...With 26, he is tied for second in the National League in home runs...His 87 walks pace the National League.

TREA TAKES BASES

Trea Turner has recorded at least two stolen bases in three consecutive games...His current streak is tied for second in Major League history (with many players) and trails only HOU **Jose Altuve** (4 G, 6/26-29/2014) and CLE **Ray Chapman** (4 G, 9/24-28/1917) for the longest streak in MLB history.

- Turner leads Major League Baseball with 30 stolen bases, while his 119 hits are tied for ninth in the National League.
- Over his last seven games, Turner is hitting .412 (14-for-34) with two doubles, one triple, two home runs, seven RBI, one HBP, two walks, eight stolen bases and 12 runs scored.

ROOKIE OF THE MONTH...AGAIN

For the second consecutive month, **Juan Soto** was named National League Rookie of the Month...He led National League rookies in batting average (.299), on-base percentage (.398), slugging percentage (.526), OPS (.924), hits (29), RBI (15) and walks (16).

- Soto leads all MLB rookies (min. 265 PA), in batting average (.306), on-base percentage (.419), slugging percentage (.554), and OPS (.973).
- Even though he was called up on May 20, he ranks among National League rookies this season in home runs (2nd, 13), walks (T2nd, 43), runs (3rd, 44), RBI (5th, 37), hits (6th, 68) and doubles (T5th, 14).
- Since May 15 (the first game in his game log, due to the suspended game vs. NYY), Soto ranks among all National League hitters in on-base percentage (3rd, .419), runs scored (6th, 44), slugging percentage (8th, .554), walks (7th, 43), home runs (T9th, 13) and batting average (12th, .306).
- Among all National League hitters (min. 265 PA) in 2018, he ranks in OPS (2nd, .973), on-base percentage (2nd, .419), slugging percentage (7th, .554) and batting average (9th, .306).

TONY IS ON A TEAR

Anthony Rendon has hit safely in 32 of his last 37 games dating back to June 15...Over the stretch he is hitting .325 with a .370 OBP and a .616 SLG...He is tied for fifth in the National League with 23 extra-base hits (12 2B, 3B, 10 HR) and his .616 SLG is good for sixth over this stretch.

- Rendon ranks in the NL in doubles (T8th, 26) and SLG (11th, .518) this season.

MURPH IS MASHING

In 19 games dating to July 8, **Daniel Murphy** is 24-for-59 (.407) with a .471 on-base percentage (24 H, 8 BB) and a .627 slugging percentage (4 2B, 3 HR)...He has struck out just six times in 68 plate appearances over this stretch.

- Murphy has hit safely in 11 of his last 13 games, going 16-for-42 (.381) with two doubles, three homers, 13 RBI, four walks and seven runs scored.

NATIONALS HISTORY

August 3 (8-4 on this date)

2005 – **Brad Wilkerson** hit the first grand slam in the history of the Nationals (2005-present), an eighth-inning shot off **Duaner Sanchez**, in a 7-0 win vs. Los Angeles.

IN THE COMMUNITY

August 4: Harris Teeter Food Drive

The Nationals will collect non-perishable food items for the annual Harris Teeter Food Drive outside Center Field Gate on August 4 and 5. Fans who donate at least four items will receive two tickets to a Nationals home game (while supplies last). All items collected benefit the Capital Area Food Bank. Donation collections will begin three hours before first pitch.

OPPONENT

CINCINNATI REDS

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** spent the 1992 season with the Cincinnati Reds, hitting .254 with 20 doubles, five triples, three homers, 31 RBI and 47 runs scored in 135 games...Reds interim manager **Jim Riggleman** managed the Nationals from 2009-11.

THE SERIES

The Nationals and Reds will face off seven times in 2018 (3 in CIN, 4 in D.C.)...Since June 5, 2016, Washington has won 14 of the last 16 games against the Reds, outscoring them 134-67 over this stretch.

DAVE MARTINEZ

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon's** bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

#47 - GIO GONZALEZ - LHP

Electric left-hander is in his seventh season with Washington. In seven years with the Nationals, is 85-61 with a 3.52 ERA in 207 starts...Ranks second on Washington's all-time (2005-pres.) wins list with 85...Is Washington's most prolific left-handed pitcher, leading Nationals southpaws in nearly every pitching category...Leads Nationals (2005-pres.) lefties in wins (85), innings pitched (1,222.0), and strikeouts (1,192), among other categories...Has made 30-or-more starts seven of the last eight seasons.

AGAINST THE REDS: Faces the Cincinnati Reds for the second time this season...Tossed 6.0 innings of five-hit, one run ball on April 1 at CIN...Has allowed one earned run in 14.1 IP spanning his last two starts (0.63 ERA) against the Redlegs...Is 2-0 with a 2.14 ERA (5 ER/21.0 IP) in three career starts against the Reds at Nationals Park.

LAST START: Was strong in 7.0 innings on July 28 at Miami...Allowed one earned run on three hits...Did not factor into the decision as the Nationals fell to the Marlins, 2-1.

2018 NOTES

- Ranks seventh among National League left-handed pitchers with a 3.78 ERA.
- Is tied for sixth in the National League, second among lefties, having allowed 0.79 home runs per 9.0 IP (10 home runs in 114.1 IP).
- Also ranks among National League lefties in strikeouts per 9.0 IP (6th, 8.11), opp. SLG (5th, .384), opp. OPS (7th, .720), opp. AVG (10th, .252) and opp. OBP (10th, .335).
- Has held opposing batters to a .170 average with RISP (16-for-94), seventh-best in MLB and fourth-best mark in the National League.
- Opposing left-handed batters are hitting .198 against him, the fourth-best mark among National League left-handers.
- Has allowed two earned runs or fewer in 14 of his 21 starts...His 14 such starts are tied for eighth among National League starting pitchers.
- Has not yet hit a batter in 2018...ATL **Sean Newcomb** is the only other qualified starter not to have hit a batter in 2018.
- He pitched to a 1.81 ERA (9 ER/44.2 IP) in seven starts from April 29 through June 2, going 4-0 along the way...He recorded 43 strikeouts and a .200 opp. AVG.
- Was strong in 6.0 innings of work on July 11 at Pittsburgh...Allowed two earned runs on six hits with four strikeouts and one walk...Both runs came via third inning home run by **Starling Marte**...Was saddled with the loss as the Nationals were blanked by the Pirates, 2-0.
- Struck out a season-high nine batters in 7.0 innings pitched in Washington's 5-3 win over Atlanta on June 2.
- Tossed a season-high 7.2 innings on May 28 at Baltimore...Did not allow a run while allowing six hits and striking out three.
- Allowed two earned runs on six hits in 5.0 innings of work on May 15 vs. New York...Struck out five batters...Allowed his first home run since April 12 vs. Colorado...The game was eventually suspended due to rain.
- Earned his 11th career win at Citi Field vs. NYM on April 17...Allowed two earned runs on eight hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 5.1 IP.
- Allowed two earned runs on five hits with three walks and seven strikeouts in 5.0 innings on April 12 vs. COL.
- Opened the season with 6.0 strong innings as Washington completed the sweep of Cincinnati, 6-5...Allowed one earned run on five hits with one walk and seven strikeouts.

CAREER NOTES

- His 85 wins are sixth among left-handed pitchers since 2012...Ranks fourth among MLB left-handers in that span with a .237 opp. AVG.
- His 21 wins in 2012 are tied with **Clayton Kershaw** (21 in 2014) for the most in a single season by a lefty since 2012.
- Since 2012, is 75-6 with a 2.96 ERA in 103 starts when receiving more than two runs of offensive support...Is 86-1 with a 2.81 ERA in 109 starts when getting four or more runs of offensive support in his career.
- Since 2014, has allowed just six home runs in 694 AB vs. LHB, the fewest among left-handed starting pitchers (min. 600 AB vs. LHB).
