CINCINNATI REDS (47-58) vs. PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (58-46)

Sunday, July 29, 2018 – 1:10 EDT – Great American Ball Park – Game 105 – Road 53

RHP Zach Eflin (7-2, 3.41) vs RHP Luis Castillo (5-8, 5.30)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies fell to the Cincinnati Reds, 6-2 ... Starter Vince Velasquez (ND) went 5.0 innings and allowed 2 runs on 6 hits with 5 walks and 4 strikeouts ... Asdrubal Cabrera made his Phillies debut in a start at shortstop and Rhys Hoskins slugged another home run, his 21st of the season.
- TAKE A BOW, BIG MAN:** Today, **Jim Thome** will take his rightful place in Cooperstown as he is enshrined in the Baseball Hall of Fame ... A veteran of 22 major league seasons, Thome, a Phillies Wall-of-Famer, slashed .276/.402/.554 in his career with 612 home runs, 1,699 RBI and 1,747 walks ... He played parts of four seasons for the Phillies (2003-05; 2012) and is credited with ushering in a new era of Phillies baseball after signing as free agent before the 2003 season.
- NEW YORK STOCK EXCHANGE:** Just before Friday night's game in Cincinnati, the Phillies announced they had acquired infielder **Asdrubal Cabrera** from the New York Mets in exchange for right-hander Franklyn Kilome ... A switch-hitter and two-time All-Star (2011-12), Cabrera, 32, has appeared in 99 games between the Phillies and Mets this season, slashing .274/.326/.483 in 411 plate appearances with 42 extra-base hits (23 2B, 1 3B, 18 HR) ... Cabrera ranks second among all major league second basemen this season in home runs and extra-base hits, trailing only Atlanta's Ozzie Albies in both categories ... A veteran of 12 major league seasons, Cabrera has appeared in 1,048 games at shortstop, 332 games at second base and 46 games at third base ... In 24 career games at Citizens Bank Park, Cabrera is slashing .387/.418/.634 in 98 plate appearances.
- REMEMBER THE FIGHTINS:** The Phillies have won 17 of 27 games (6/27-current, .630 win %) and have posted a 26-16 record since June 10 (.619 win %) ... At 58-46 with a .558 winning percentage this season, the Phils currently sport a 2.5 game lead over the Atlanta Braves (54-47, .535) in National League East and their 2.5 game lead in the division is tops among all NL divisions.
- PROGRESS IN THE PROCESS:** Thus far, through 104 games, The Phils are 12 games above .500 at 58-46 and have scored 464 runs and allowed 438 (+26) ... Last season, through 104 games, they were 26 games under .500 at 39-65 and had scored 422 and allowed 500 (-78) ... The Phillies didn't notch their 58th win last season until September 16 ... This season, in nine games (8.7 % of their games played thus far) in which they have allowed 10 or more runs, the Phillies have been outscored 111-30 (-81) ... **However, in their 95 other games this year (91.3% of their season), Philadelphia has a +107 run differential, outscoring the opposition 434-327.**
- BELIEVE IT:** On May 29 at Dodger Stadium, facing LA closer Kenley Jansen, **Rhys Hoskins** fouled a ball off his face resulting in a fractured jaw ... Hoskins returned on June 9 and in 197 plate appearances since being activated off the DL, he is slashing .292/.376/.614 with 32 runs, 10 2B, 15 HR, 42 RBI and 22 walks ... **The only other player in the majors with as many walks and home runs as Hoskins since June 9, when he came off the DL, is STL's Matt Carpenter (18 HR, 29 BB).**
- EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Phillies have collected at least one extra-base hit in 100 consecutive games (since 4/4), which is the longest extra-base hit streak in the majors this season (next: DET, 67 G, 4/10-6/22) ... This current streak is the third-longest in franchise history and is the longest extra-base hit streak since 4/20-8/11/00 when they did so in 101 straight games.
- SERIESLY:** Over their last 13 series (6/12-current), the Phillies are 10-2-1 ... Philadelphia's only two series losses in that span have come against the Yankees at Citizens Bank Park (1-2, 6/25-27) and the Marlins in Miami (1-2, 7/13-15) ... Philadelphia's 10 series wins in that span have come against the Rockies, Brewers, Cardinals, Nationals (2x), Orioles (2x), Pirates, Padres and Dodgers.
- CHANGE UP:** The Phillies return to Cincinnati for the first time since the opening series of the 2017 season last April, and my how things have changed ... Philadelphia's last game in The Queen City prior to this series was on April 6, 2017 and of the 13 players who appeared in that game for the Phils, only six remain today: Cesar Hernandez, Odubel Herrera, Maikel Franco, Andrew Knapp, Adam Morgan and Edubray Ramos ... Gone are Daniel Nava (started in LF, batting 2nd), Michael Saunders (started in RF, batting 5th), Brock Stassi (started at 1B, batting 7th), Freddy Galvis (started at SS, batting 8th), Clay Buchholz (starting P, batting 9th), Andres Blanco (pinch hitter) and Tommy Joseph (pinch hitter).
- IT'S HITTING SEASON:** The Phillies have slugged 58 home runs in their last 39 games (6/14-current) which is tops among all National League clubs and ranks 2nd in the majors, trailing only the Yankees (59 HR).
- GRAND CENTRAL:** Philadelphia is 18-11 against the NL Central this season, starting the year with an eight-game winning streak against teams from the division ... They are 23-13 against the division dating back to 7/16/17 at MIL.
- FLAGS FLY FOREVER:** When the Phillies return home to Citizens Bank Park following their six-game road trip, they will honor the 2008 World Series Champions as part of Toyota Phillies Alumni Weekend, August 3-5 ... Festivities take place during the Phillies-Marlins series and feature 2008 World Champion photo opportunities, special first pitches and pregame tributes throughout the weekend ... Highlights include the retirement of Shane Victorino (Aug. 3), the induction ceremony of Roy Halladay and Pat Gillick into the Toyota Phillies Wall of Fame (Aug. 4), 2008 Phillies World Series Champions Luncheon (Aug. 4), a celebration of the 10th Anniversary of the 2008 World Series Champions (Aug. 5) and a 2008 World Champions' Home Run Derby at The Yard (Aug 4-5).

LAST START: 7/23 vs LAD: ND, 2.2 IP, 5 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 3 BB, 1 SO, 3 HR ... Eflin vs Stripling ... Los Angeles jumped to a 4-1 lead after four, and the Phillies took the lead in the fifth with a four-run inning ... The bullpen was unable to preserve the lead as the Dodgers won 7-6 ... Eight homers were hit in the game, four by the Phillies (Franco-2, Hoskins, Herrera).

TODAY'S START:

- **#Winning:** His 6 straight wins (in starts with a decision) are a career high, and he joins teammate Aaron Nola (5/30-7/9) as the only Phillies since 2013 (Cliff Lee, 8) to win at least 6 straight decisions ... Prior to receiving a no-decision in his last start, Eflin had earned a win in 6 straight starts ... **Since 2000, only Eflin, Cliff Lee (7/30-9/5/11) and Roy Halladay (6, 7/23-8/20/10) had done that as a Phillie**
- **Crazy 8: Eflin is 6-0 with a 2.78 ERA (14 ER, 45.1 IP), 1.06 WHIP, 9 BB, 39 SO in his last 8 starts since 6/5 ...** He has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 6 of those 8 starts
- **RISPy Business:** Has faced 64 batters with RISP this season, and has allowed a hit to only 9 of them (.180 AVG) ... Batters are 5-32 (.156) with RISP in his last 9 starts
- **Striking Difference:** He is averaging 8.58 SO/9.0 IP (68 SO, 71.1 IP) this season, almost double his average of 4.65 SO/9.0 IP (66 SO, 127.2 IP) from 2016-17 ... Prior to this season had never struck out more than 6 in a start (both times with 6 were CG), and this season has struck out 6 or more in 6 of his 12 starts
- **Mulligan:** His last start was tied for the shortest of his career (2.2 IP), with the other being his first career start on 6/14/16 at TOR ... Walked 3 batters in that his last start (3 in previous 4 starts combined) and allowed 3 HR (2 in previous 7 starts combined)
- **vs NL Central:** 4-1, 3.25 ERA (16 ER, 44.1 IP) in 7 starts

ROAD:

- **2018:** 3-1, 3.62 ERA (15 ER, 37.1 IP) in 7 starts
- **Career:** 6-6, 5.15 ERA (63 ER, 110.0 IP) in 20 starts

2018 SEASON:

- Was on the 10-day DL, 7/15 (retro to 7/12) to 7/22 with a right middle finger blister
- Had a 32.2-inning homerless streak in parts of 7 starts, 5/30-7/3
- Went 5-0 with a 1.76 ERA (6 ER, 30.2 IP), 6 BB, 0 HR, 28 SO and held opponents to a .218 AVG in 5 June starts ... Was T-1st in the majors in wins in June and HR/9.0 IP, and in the NL ranked 3rd in ERA, 4th in SO/BB (4.97) and 8th in WHIP (0.98)
- He was the first Phillie to win 5 games in a month since May 2012 (Hamels) and the first Phillie to have at least 30.0 IP in a month and 0 HR allowed since April 2012 (Halladay)
- Clubbed his first major league home run on 5/25 vs TOR
- Struck out a career-high 9 batters on 5/7 vs SF ... Needed only 3.2 innings to surpass his previous high of 6 (which he did twice, both in complete games)
- Took a perfect game through 5.0 innings in his 2018 debut, 5/1 at MIA
- Began the season with Lehigh Valley (AAA) before being recalled on 4/30 by PHI (1.69 ERA in 3 starts with LHV)

2017 SEASON:

- Began the season on the 10-day DL recovering from offseason surgery on both knees
- Had a career-best 29.0-inning streak without issuing a walk, 4/18-5/10; longest by a Phillie since 2013-14 (Cliff Lee, 31.0 IP)
- Had 3 straight starts with at least 7.0 IP and no walks, 4/18-5/4
- Was on the 7-day DL, 6/3-7/8 (right elbow strain)
- Placed on the 10-day DL on 8/22 (retro to 8/19) with a right shoulder strain, causing him to miss the remainder of the season
- Posted a 2.81 ERA (10 ER, 32.0 IP) in his first 5 starts of the season and a 9.46 ERA (34 R, 32.1 IP) in his final 6
