WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost four of the last five games and 13 of the last 20 as they continue a six-game, seven-day homestand tonight with the opener vs. Kansas City.
- RHP James Shields is scheduled to start for the Sox, who are trying to avoid falling a season-high 32 games under .500.
- The Sox opened the homestand by losing two of three vs. Toronto, including a 7-4 defeat in Sunday's deciding game.
- Chicago owns the third-worst record in MLB ahead of Kansas City (32-73, .305) and Baltimore (32-74, .302).
- Following this series vs. the Royals, Chicago will take a brief three-game, weekend trip to Tampa Bay (8/3-5) before returning to Guaranteed Rate Field for a six-day, seven-game homestand vs. the Yankees (8/6-8) and Cleveland (8/10-12).
- The White Sox went 3-4 on their last trip from 7/20-26 at Seattle (1-2) and the Angels (2-2) and 3-2 on their last homestand vs. St. Louis (1-1) and the Royals (2-1) from 7/10-15.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- Chicago has won four of the last seven games, seven of the last 12 and eight of 14 at Guaranteed Rate Field ... the White Sox have scored 80 runs (5.7 R/G) during the 14-game span.
- The Sox have lost three of the last five games vs. Kansas City after starting the season series on a five-game winning streak.
- Chicago starters own a 7.63 ERA (37 ER/43.2 IP) with 14 homers allowed in the last eight games ... by contrast, the group surrendered just one earned run in the previous three contests.
- James Shields has allowed three earned runs or less in each of his last nine home starts, going 3-3 with a 2.58 ERA (17 ER/59.1 IP), .195 opponents average, 1.01 WHIP and eight quality starts.
- José Abreu is 11-32 (.344) with three home runs, seven RBI, and a 1.088 OPS in his last eight games (hit safely in seven).

DEADLINE DEAL

- Chicago has acquired LHP Hunter Schryver from Tampa Bay in exchange for international signing bonus pool money.
- Schryver is 1-3 with a 2.40 ERA (13 ER/48.2 IP), nine saves, 59 strikeouts, a 1.07 WHIP and .212 average in 31 appearances (one start) between Class A Bowling Green and Class A Charlotte.

ROSTER MOVES

- The White Sox today released RHP Chris Volstad ... he was designated for assignment on 7/27.

SUNDAY'S RECAP

- Toronto scored five runs in the ninth inning, including Brandon Drury's game-winning, two-run double off Jeanmar Gomez, as Toronto recorded a 7-4, comeback victory over Chicago.
- The White Sox led 3-2 entering the ninth but Teoscar Hernandez hit a game-tying solo homer off Jace Fry.
- The Sox scored a run in the fifth, sixth and seventh, including a RBI single by Matt Davidson and solo homer by Omar Narváez.
- Carlos Rodón received a ND despite allowing two runs on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts in 7.2 IP, marking his fourth straight QS ... Fry suffered his first blown save and second loss.
- Daniel Palka homered in the ninth, his 15th of 2018 ... Narváez fell a double shy of the cycle ... the Sox were 1-11 with RISP.

RODÓN ON A ROLL

- Carlos Rodón on Sunday made his fourth straight QS, tied for the longest streak on the club in 2018 ... he has allowed five hits or less in all four, and worked at least 7.1 IP in the last three.
- He has allowed two earned runs or less in seven of his nine outings in 2018 and is limiting opponents to a .193 mark (41-212).
- Rodón is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (6 ER/28.0 IP) and 20 strikeouts in four home starts this season (three quality starts).

35TH AND SHIELDS

- James Shields has allowed three earned runs or less in each of his last nine home starts, going 3-3 with a 2.58 ERA (17 ER/59.1 IP), 1.01 WHIP, 1.95 average and 47 strikeouts (eight QS).
- Has worked 7.0-plus IP five times, allowed three runs or less six times and surrendered five or fewer hits six times.
- Shields is receiving a 3.08 run support average (18 RS) during the eight-start span ... the White Sox have scored zero runs four times, one run once and five or more three times.

CEASE AND DESIST

- Class AA Birmingham RHP Dylan Cease last night extended his scoreless IP streak to 17.0 at Mississippi ... he received a ND despite allowing just five hits with seven strikeouts in 6.0 IP.
- Cease is 2-0 with a 2.34 ERA (9 ER/34.2 IP), 49 strikeouts and a .195 opp. average (24-123) in six starts with Birmingham.
- He has allowed one run or less in four of his five July outings, and is limiting righties to a .179 mark (12-67) with the Barons.

WHITE SOX VS. KANSAS CITY

- The White Sox lead the season series, 7-3, going 2-1 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 5-2 at Kauffman Stadium ... Chicago owns a 64-39 edge in runs scored this season.
- The Sox are hitting .295/.358/.540 with 21 home runs, and own a 3.20 ERA (32 ER/90.0 IP) and five quality starts.
- Chicago is 17-12 vs. Kansas City since 2017 after going 40-72 from 2011-16 (19-39 at home).
- The White Sox are 8-4 over the last 12 games at Guaranteed Rate Field but just 15-16 since 2015.
- The Sox lead the all-time series, 392-375 ... they are 216-171 at home (124-101 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and 176-204 on the road (165-182 at Kauffman Stadium).

ROYAL CONNECTIONS

- White Sox RHP James Shields (2013-14), bench coach Joe McEwing (2005) and third-base coach Nick Capra (1988) all previously played for Kansas City.

LOOKING FOR CENTRAL COMMAND

- The White Sox are 15-26 against the American League Central in 2018, going 7-13 at home and 8-13 on the road.
- Chicago is 4-9 over its last 13 games, 8-16 in the last 24 and 9-20 in the last 29 ... the club has scored three runs or less 16 times during the 29-game span ... the Sox are 4-6 in the last 10 and 6-10 in the last 16 contests at Guaranteed Rate Field.
- The Sox are 306-403 vs. the AL Central since 2009, posting a losing record every season except 2012 (37-35).

MAJOR MINOR MENTIONS

- Below is a breakdown of notable White Sox prospects:
 - ◆ Class AAA Charlotte OF Eloy Jiménez has hit safely in 16 of last 17 games, going 30-64 (.469) with eight doubles, five HRs and 14 RBI.
 - ◆ Jiménez is hitting .396/.443/.729 with eight doubles, eight home runs, 17 RBI and a 1.173 OPS in 26 games with the Knights this season.
 - ◆ Class A Winston-Salem OF Blake Rutherford is batting .333 (18-54) with two doubles and six RBI in his last 13 games ... he hit safely in 12 straight from 7/16-28, tied for ninth-longest in the Carolina League.
 - ◆ Rutherford ranks among the Carolina League leaders in hits (2nd, 108), RBI (2nd, 66), triples (3rd, 6) and average (4th, .306).
 - ◆ Class A Kannapolis INF Nick Madrigal has hit safely in nine of his 11 games with the Intimidators (.375, 15-40; 3 2B, 6 RBI, 2 SO).

PILING UP CROOKED NUMBERS

- Yoán Moncada has recorded 19 doubles, five triples, 13 home runs and 43 RBI in 97 games this season.
- He joins Javier Báez, Cody Bellinger, Andrew Benintendi, Corey Dickerson, Teoscar Hernández, Jurickson Profar, Trevor Story and Chris Taylor as the only MLB players to record 15+ 2B/5+ 3B/10+ HR/40+ RBI this season.

STOLEN BASE ... STOLEN BASE!

- Tim Anderson (21), Adam Engel (11), Leury García (11), Yoán Moncada (11) and Yolmer Sánchez (10) have all stolen 10 or more bases for the White Sox this season.
- The Sox are the only team in MLB this season with five players to record double-digits in stolen bases ... the last time five or more Chicago players recorded 10-plus stolen bases was 2005 (Dye, Harris, Iguchi, Ozuna, Podsednik, Rowand).
- Chicago ranks fourth in MLB with 76 steals in 2018.

"X" MARKS THE SPOT

- Xavier Cedeño has not allowed a run in 17 of his 19 games this season (11 of his outings have been hitless) ... opponents are hitting just .154 (8-52) in 2018 (righties are 3-24, .125).
- Cedeño has allowed just three of 13 (23.1 percent) inherited runners to score, and first batters faced are 2-17 (.118).

POWER AND SPEED

- Tim Anderson (14 HR/career-high 21 SB) is one of five players in MLB this season with 14-plus homers and 20-plus steals (also Mookie Betts, Starling Marte, José Ramírez and Mike Trout).
- Anderson is on pace for 22 homers and 32 steals in 2018 ... he is looking to become the third White Sox to record a 20+ HR/30+ SB season, joining Alex Rios (2010) and Tommie Agee (1966).

BARRELING BACKSTOPS

- Omar Narváez and Kevan Smith are hitting a combined .341 (66-189) with nine doubles, four home runs, 28 RBI and 21 multi-hit efforts in 54 games since 6/1 (hit safely in 43 contests).
- Narváez (1st, .391) and Smith (2nd, .309) lead all MLB catchers in average since 6/1 (minimum 95 plate appearances).
- Narváez owns 13 multi-hit efforts and has hit safely in 21 games since 6/1 ... Smith has hit safely in 22 of his 26 games in 2018 since being recalled from Class AAA Charlotte on 6/5.
- Narváez is 13-39 (.410) with two doubles, three home runs, nine RBI and a 1.183 OPS over his last 11 games.

SHIELDS AT A GLANCE

- Is scheduled to make his 24th appearance (23rd start), 14th start at Guaranteed Rate Field and third vs. Kansas City ... each of his last three wins, and three of his four overall this season, have come in Chicago.
- Needs four appearances for 400, 52.2 IP for 2,600.00 and 16 strikeouts for 2,200 in his career.
- Is tied for second in MLB with 12 losses in 2018 ... his 38 losses since 2016 are the most in the major leagues.
- Is 3-2 with a 2.30 ERA (8 ER/31.1 IP), .203 opponents average, 1.09 WHIP and just two home runs allowed over his last five home starts ... has allowed two earned runs or less in four of the five outings.
- Has worked at least 6.0 IP in 15 of his last 18 starts since 4/25 vs. Seattle ... is 3-10 with a 4.20 ERA (53 ER/113.2 IP), 1.21 WHIP, .229 opponents average and 3.09 RSA (39 RS) during the 18-start span.
- Ranks 65th all-time in major-league history with 2,184 strikeouts ... is 14 shy of tying Pete Alexander (2,167; 1911-30) for 64th place.
- Is 13-31 with a 5.45 ERA (223 ER/368.1 IP), 285 strikeouts, 76 home runs allowed and a 1.47 WHIP over 66 appearances (65 GS/30 QS) since being acquired by the White Sox from the Padres in a trade on 6/4/16.
- Ranks among the active MLB leaders since 2007 in starts (2nd, 373), IP (2nd, 2,423.2), pitches thrown (2nd, 38,165), quality starts (5th, 229), opponents GIDP (5th, 196), strikeouts (7th, 2,080) and wins (11th, 136).

LAST START

- Suffered his second consecutive loss on 7/25 at the Angels ... allowed six runs on seven hits, including three homers, with three walks and seven strikeouts in a season-low 4.0 IP.
- Allowed one run in the first inning, one in the second and was charged with four in the fifth ... surrendered home runs to Mike Trout (solo), Albert Pujols (solo) and Shohei Ohtani (two-run).
- Departed the game in the fifth with zero outs after throwing 88 pitches (50 strikes) ... Los Angeles-AL added five runs in the sixth off Chris Volstad en route to an 11-3 win.
- His three homers allowed matched a season high, and surrendered six-plus runs for the fifth time in 2018.

35TH AND SHIELDS

- His 75.1 IP (2nd) and 12 starts (T2nd) at home rank among the MLB leaders this season.
- Has allowed three earned runs or less in each of his last nine home starts going 3-3 with a 2.58 ERA (17 ER/59.1 IP), 1.01 WHIP, 1.95 average and 47 strikeouts (eight QS) ... worked 7.0-plus IP five times.
- Is 11-16 with a 4.64 ERA (115 ER/223.0 IP), 210 hits allowed (42 homers), 93 walks, 175 strikeouts, a .244 opp. average and 1.36 WHIP in 38 starts (22 quality) at Guaranteed Rate Field with the White Sox.
- Prior to joining the White Sox, was 4-1 with a 3.00 mark (24 ER/72.0 IP), 1.33 WHIP, 47 strikeouts and nine home runs allowed over 11 starts (nine quality starts) as a visitor at Guaranteed Rate Field.

LOW AND SLOW

- Opponents are hitting just .228 (92-404) since 5/1, tied for the 10th-lowest mark in the American League (Chris Sale's .172 mark is the lowest) ... his .173 opp. average in May was the fourth-lowest in the AL behind Seattle's James Paxton (.144) and Houston's Justin Verlander (.153) and Gerrit Cole (.164).
- Is limiting opponents to the following averages: .212 (49-231) at night, .206 (52-253) vs. left-handers, .194 (64-330) with nobody on base and .222 average (68-306) at Guaranteed Rate Field.

SUMMER NOT SO LOVIN

- Is 18-32 with a 4.63 ERA (228 ER/443.2 IP) and .274 opp. average in 71 career starts in July ... is 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA (18 ER/30.0 IP), six homers allowed and 31 strikeouts in five starts this month.
- His 4.63 ERA is the second-worst monthly mark of his career (4.80 in June), and his 18 wins are the fewest ... the 4.63 mark in July is the seventh-highest among active pitchers.
- Went 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA (25 ER/25.0 IP), 13 walks and eight home runs allowed over five starts in July 2017 ... opponents recorded a .640 slugging percentage and 1.035 OPS.

HELP WANTED

- Owns a 3.68 run support average as a starter in 2018, the 10th-lowest in the American League ... received two runs or less of support in 13 of his last 17 starts (one or less eight times) and three or less in 17 of the last 20 (2.80 RSA; 39 RS/125.1 IP) since 4/11 ... the club scored 17 runs in his first two outings.
- His 11-start stretch of three runs or less of support from 4/11-6/7 was his longest since 9/27/15-6/8/16 (13).
- His 3.22 RSA in 2016 was the lowest in baseball and the lowest of his career.
- Owns a 4.36 RSA (178 RS/367.2 IP) as a starter since joining the White Sox (65 starts), receiving the following run support marks: zero runs (16x), one (11x), two (12x), three (7x), four (4x), five (6x) and six-plus (9x) ... has received one run or less of support in 41.5 percent (27-65) of his outings with the Sox.

NOT DIGGING THE LONG BALL

- Has surrendered 18 home runs this season, including 14 in his last 11 starts ... allowed three homers in each outing on 6/2 vs. Milwaukee and 6/7 at Minnesota after going 14 consecutive appearances without allowing multiple homers from 9/20/17-5/27/18, the second-longest stretch of his career.
- Has allowed 85 homers since 2016 and 118 since 2015 ... his 118 homers allowed since 2015 are the most in MLB ahead of Kansas City's Ian Kennedy (116).
- Allowed 27 home runs last season, his fewest since 2014 (23) ... surrendered a major-league leading 40 home runs in 2016 after leading baseball with 33 in 2015 ... became the first pitcher to lead MLB in homers allowed in consecutive seasons since Tom Browning in 1988-89.
- Has allowed 1.66 homers per 9.0 IP since 2015 (638.0 IP), the fourth-highest mark in MLB.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- His start on 7/13 vs. Kansas City was his 20th of the season ... joined Cole Hamels and Justin Verlander as the only pitchers to make 20-plus starts every season since 2006 ... recorded at least 10 wins, 200.0 IP and 160 strikeouts every year from 2007-15 ... was an AL All-Star with Tampa Bay in 2011.
- Is 3-6 with a 5.46 ERA (36 ER/59.1 IP) and 45 strikeouts over 11 career postseason starts (four quality starts) ... pitched in the postseason with Tampa Bay (2008, 2010-11) and Kansas City (2014) ... made three World Series starts with the Rays (2008) and Royals (2014).

VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS

- Is making his 16th career start vs. the Royals and third this season ... is 9-2 with a 4.08 ERA (45 ER/99.1 IP), eight homers allowed, 25 walks, 80 strikeouts, a .249 opp. average and 1.20 WHIP lifetime.
- Has won both of his starts this season and is 4-0 with a 4.14 ERA (21 ER/45.2 IP), 38 strikeouts and a .243 opponents average over his last seven outings (five quality starts) since 8/9/11.
- Received two no decisions last season on 7/21 on the road (6 ER/4.1 IP) and 8/12 at home (3 ER/6.0 IP).
- Is 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA (8 ER/18.2 IP), .229 opp. average and 20 strikeouts in three starts in Chicago.
- Made 68 starts for Kansas City from 2013-14, and five in the 2014 postseason, including two in the World Series vs. San Francisco.
