TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 13, 1978: The Yankees defeat the White Sox, 4-2, in the Yankee Stadium opener on "Reggie!" Candy Bar Day. After Jackson slugs a three-run HR in the first inning, the field is showered with the chocolate and peanut treats, which were given out free to fans at the game.

April 13, 1921: Babe Ruth goes 5-for-5 with 2 doubles and 2 RBI as the Yankees defeat the Philadelphia A's, 11-1 on Opening Day at the Polo Grounds.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 14, 2004: One day after Mike Mussina earns his 200th career win, Kevin Brown claims his 200th victory in a 5-1 win over the Devil Rays. The two become the first pair of teammates all-time to reach the 200-win milestone in the same season.

April 14, 1955: Elston Howard becomes the first African American player in Yankees history, making his Major League debut in an 8-4 loss at Boston (1-for-1, 1RBI).

April 14, 1910: The Yankees and Red Sox play to a 4-4 tie in their season opener at Hilltop Park.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 1-2 on their six-game road trip, which continues in Detroit tonight after a three-game set in Boston from Tues.-Thurs....following this series, will return to the Bronx for a season-high-tying 10-game homestand, which will include visits from Miami (2G), Toronto (4G) and Minnesota (4G).

- ▶ Have dropped below .500 for the second time this season (were 5-6 at the close of play on 4/10).
- ▶ After playing their first 13G vs. the AL East, are playing outside the division for the first time tonight...will not visit another AL East city until a four-game series from 5/31-6/3 at Baltimore.
- ▶ Are 4-5 thus far on a stretch of 16-of-22G at home (4/3-26): 3-3 at home, 1-2 on the road.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the Red Sox, 6-3, on Thursday at Fenway Park...**Yankees batters** were held hitless through six innings and scoreless until the ninth inning...**RHP Sonny Gray** (3.0IP, 7H, 6ER, 2BB, 3K, 1HP, 3WP) recorded the loss in the shortest regular season outing by a Yankees starter since Jaime Garcia tossed just 2.1 innings on 9/24/17 at Toronto...was the second straight game in which a Yankees starter allowed 6ER (Tanaka on Wednesday)...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-3, 1R, 1BB) broke up the no-hitter with a double to lead off the seventh inning, pushing his hitting streak to 10 games...**C Gary Sánchez** (1-for-4) hit a bases-clearing double to put the Yankees on the board in the ninth...has 4XBH in his last two games on the heels of a 1-for-33 stretch...**LF Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-3, 1R, 1SB, 1HP) reached base safely multiple times for the third straight game and was the Yankees' only base runner through the first six innings (HBP in the fourth)...**RHPs Domingo Germán** (3.0IP, 1H, 3K), **Tommy Kahnle** (1.0IP, 1BB, 2K) and **Adam Warren** (1.0IP, 1K) combined to throw 5.0 scoreless innings of relief.

CATCHING UP: **C Gary Sánchez** is 4-for-9 with 3R, 2 doubles, 2HR and 7RBI over the last two games...was just 2-for-36 (.056) with 2R, 1 double, 1HR and 3RBI in his 9G this season prior to his recent two-game stretch.

- ▶ Marks the fourth time in his career he has tallied at least 7RBI over a two-game stretch and the first such time since 8/22-23/17 at Detroit (also 7RBI).
- ▶ Is batting .400 (10-for-25) with 8R, 2 doubles, 4HR, 10RBI and a 1.389 OPS in six career games against Detroit...has multi-hit games in four of six contests...in his only prior career series at Detroit (8/22-24/17), went 7-for-15 (.467) with 5R, 4HR, 9RBI and a 1.767 OPS in 3G.
- ▶ Hit 2HR in Wednesday's win at Boston, marking the 55th and 56th homers of his career...is the fourth player in Major League history to hit at least 56HR through 188 games, joining Rudy York (57), Aaron Judge (57) and Mark McGwire (56)...is tied for the fourth-most HRs in a player's first 200 games (see chart in upper right).
- ▶ Wednesday's 2HR game was his eighth career multi-home run game, marking the most multi-HR games in a player's first 200 career games in Major League history (Sánchez has played in 188 career games through Thursday)...tied for second on the all-time list with seven such multi-HR games are Ryan Braun, Zeke Bonura, Joe DiMaggio, Aaron Judge and Mark McGwire...the Yankees have scored at least 9R in each of his last six 2HR games.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: Four different Yankees have hit 2HR in a game this season: **C Gary Sánchez** on Wed. at Boston; **SS Didi Gregorius** on 4/3 vs. Tampa Bay; **1B Tyler Austin** on 3/31 at Toronto; **OF Giancarlo Stanton** on 3/29 at Toronto (all 2HR games).

- ▶ Sánchez's 2HR game on Wed. occurred in the Yankees' 12th game of 2018, marking the earliest into a year the Yankees have ever had four individual multi-HR games...the previous mark was set in 2012, when Nick Swisher joined Curtis Granderson, Eric Chavez and Mark Teixeira in the multi-HR game club in the Yankees' 20th game.
- ▶ Is tied for the fourth-fastest mark to four multi-HR games by an AL club, behind the 2014 White Sox (10th game), the 2006 Tigers (10th game) and 1973 Red Sox (11th game).

ALL RISE: **RF Aaron Judge** extended his hitting streak to 10G on Thurs. at Boston, going 1-for-3 with 1R, 1 double and 1BB... is the second-longest hitting streak of his career (14G from 9/17/17-3/29/18)...is the longest hitting streak by a Yankee in 2018 and tied for the third-longest active streak in the Majors this season...is batting .405/.542/.703 (15-for-37) with 10BB and 11K during the streak.

- ▶ Hit his 59th career HR on Tuesday (in his 193rd career game), which **tied the all-time MLB record for HRs through 200 career games**, set by Mark McGwire and Rudy York (see chart)...McGwire is the fastest ever to 60HR, reaching the mark in 202 games.
- ▶ Is batting .343 (24-for-70) with 7HR in his last 21 road games (since 8/22/17) after hitting just .218 (58-for-266) with 14HR in his first 75 career road contests.
- ▶ Is tied for the AL lead with 11BB (also Boston's Andrew Benintendi)...leads the AL with 29 times on base.
- ▶ Has scored at least 1R in five straight games and in eight of his last nine contests...is tied for fifth in the AL with 12R.
- ▶ Has RBI in six of his last 9G (8RBI)...his five-game RBI streak from 4/3-7 is tied with the Angels' Mike Trout (4/8-12) and Pittsburgh's Corey Dickerson (4/5-10) for the longest in the Majors this season.

THEY'RE ON IT: **Yankees batters** have reached base safely 172 times this season (110H, 57BB, 5HP), the third-highest total in the Majors (Los Angeles-AL-200 and Washington-175)...despite tying a season low with 4H on Thursday at Boston, have 53H over their last five games.

DROPPING IN: **Yankees pitchers** have allowed a .312 batting average on balls in play, the third-highest average in the Majors this season (Texas-.340, L.A.-NL-.315)...**their .282 BABIP mark in 2017 was the lowest in the Majors.**

- ▶ **Lead MLB with 146K this season** and are second with a 10.86 K/9.0IP ratio (Houston-10.97).

SS Didi Gregorius has reached base safely in 11-of-13 games played this season, batting .333/.455/.738.

- ▶ **Leads MLB in slugging pct and OPS (1.193)**...is tied for the MLB lead with 10 extra-base hits...is tied with Boston's Hanley Ramirez for the AL lead with 12RBI.
- ▶ His 1.0 WAR is second among MLB batters to Oakland's Matt Chapman (1.1) – FanGraphs.
- ▶ Has 14 hits in 2018, including 10 for extra-bases (4 singles, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR)...in 2017, did not pick up his 10th (and 11th) extra-base hits until his 32nd game of the season on 6/3/17.
- ▶ Is tied for third in the AL with 10BB in 55PA in 2018 (18.2%)...drew walks in just 4.4% of his PAs over his first three years with the Yankees...did not draw his 10th walk last season until his 62nd game of the year (7/8/17).

GRAND-IOSE: **OF Giancarlo Stanton** is currently at 999 career games played...with his next game, will become the fourth player from the 2007 First-Year Player Draft to reach the 1,000-game milestone, joining OF Jason Heyward, C Matt Wieters and 1B Freddie Freeman.

- ▶ Has 270HR in 999 career games...marks the fourth-most HRs through a player's first 1,000 career G, behind Ryan Howard (279), Ralph Kiner (277) and Harmon Killebrew (272).
- ▶ Has 10RBI, the most through 13 team games by a first-year Yankee since Nick Swisher in 2009 (11RBI).

CHART TOPPERS: For the 21st consecutive season, *Forbes Magazine* ranked the New York Yankees as the most valuable franchise in baseball.

YANKEES at DETROIT TIGERS

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees and Tigers will meet seven times in 2018: a three-game series in Detroit this weekend and a four-game set at Yankee Stadium from 8/30-9/2... are 3-5 in the last eight meetings but are 18-12 in 30 games since 4/7/13... Yankees pitchers have allowed more than 4R just four times in their last 27 games vs. Detroit... **IN 2017:** Went 3-3 against Detroit, going 1-2 at home and 2-1 at Comerica Park... scored 30R in the three wins and a total of 9R in the three losses... **IN SEASON SERIES:** Are 16-4-6 in the last 26 season series between the clubs (since 1992)... have not lost a season series to Detroit since going 3-4 in 2011... **AT YANKEE STADIUM:** The Yankees have lost 2-of-3 at home to Detroit in each of the last two seasons (2016-17) after winning each of their first seven consecutive series over the Tigers at the current Yankee Stadium... are still 19-10 (.655) at the current Yankee Stadium, their third-best mark vs. any AL opponent here... since the start of 2001, are 39-18 at home vs. Detroit, winning 14-of-18 series (1-2 in 2017, 1-2 in '16, 0-3 in '08, 1-2 in '04)... **AT COMERICA PARK:** Have visited Detroit in April in four of the last six seasons (2013, '15-16, '18)... are 7-2 in their last nine games at Comerica Park and are 35-35 all-time there... have won three straight season series in Detroit for the first time since 1992-98... **IN THE POSTSEASON:** Are 0-3 all-time in postseason series against the Tigers (2012 ALCS, 0-4; 2011 ALDS, 2-3; 2006 ALDS, 1-3)... Detroit is one of three franchises to defeat the Yankees in three postseason series, joining the Dodgers (three wins in 11 postseason series) and Cardinals (three wins in five postseason series).
