OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-41) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (62-32)

WEDNESDAY, JULY 11, 2018 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 7:10 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 17-5 (.773) over their last 22 games dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span (Boston 16-6, .727)...are 51-41 (.554) overall, which is the third best record in the American League West, the fifth best record in the AL and tied for the ninth best record in the majors...the 10 games over .500 are one short of the season high of 11 (51-40 on July 9)...are 6-0-1 over the previous seven series and the seven series unbeaten streak is the longest by an A's team since a nine-series streak from May 17-June 13, 2013...are 10 games behind first place Houston and six games behind the second Wild Card team, Seattle...remain in sole possession of third place in the AL West for the 15th consecutive day...spent every day alone in fourth in the West from April 25 to June 24...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, 15 days in third, three days tied for third, 78 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's lead the majors with 66 runs in the eighth inning (Houston is second with 64), rank second with 48 runs in the ninth inning (Atlanta, 49), third with 167 runs in the seventh inning or later and tied for fourth with 11 runs in extra innings...have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in nine of their last 21 wins dating back to June 3 (eighth inning four times, ninth inning twice, 10th inning once, 11th inning twice)...are 35-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...are 42-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of four teams without a loss in those games (New York, Seattle, Texas)...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for the most in the majors (New York-NL, Seattle)...are tied for third in the American League with two wins when trailing after eight innings...are batting .266 (288-for-1081) in the seventh inning or later, which ranks second in the AL (Houston, .270), compared to .235 (490-for-2083) in innings 1-6, which is third lowest...have compiled a 3.36 ERA (105 er in 281.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL, compared to a 4.35 ERA (267 er in 552.0 ip) over the first six innings.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's erased a 4-0 deficit entering the ninth inning last night but went on to lose 6-5 in 11 innings...it was the A's second walk-off loss of the season, which is tied for the fewest in the majors...it was their 10th extra inning game of the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...are 6-4 (.600) in extra innings, which is the fourth best record in the AL...dropped to 26-14 (.650) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is third best in the AL, and 14-8 (.636) in one-run games, which is fifth in the AL...are now 13-6 (.684) in games decided in the last at bat, which is second best in the majors to Seattle (13-5, .722).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in each of the first five games of the road trip (nine home runs total) and now have 81 home runs on the road, which is 13 more than any other team (St. Louis, 68)...are on pace to hit 140 home runs on the road, which would break the Major League record of 138 set by San Francisco in 2001...have hit just 42 home runs at home and the A's 123 home runs are tied for third in the American League and rank fourth in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (137 in 1996, 131 in 2000, 125 in 2017).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (2-1), Houston (1-1) and San Francisco (three games)...it is the A's third and final 10-game road trip of the season and it will conclude a stretch where Oakland plays 20 of 25 games on the road...are 15-5 over the first 20 games of this stretch...have won seven of their last nine road games and are 19-8 (.704) away from home dating back to May 14...are 27-20 (.574) on the road compared to 24-21 (.533) at home...have the fifth best road record in the American League...are batting .263 (441-for-1676) with 256 runs scored in 47 games on the road compared to .226 with 168 runs in 45 games at home...rank second in the AL in batting average and runs per game (5.45) on the road to Houston (.276, 5.72)...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland (2-1) and San Diego (2-0) and have won six the last seven home games.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 13-26 (.333) against American League West competition compared to 38-15 (.717) against all other teams...have the second worst intradivision record in the majors (Baltimore 11-24, .314)...are batting .227 (296-for-1302) and are averaging 3.64 runs per game (142 runs in 39 games) against the AL West, .259 with an average of 5.32 runs per game against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 4.89 ERA (188 er in 346.1 ip) against the AL West, 3.40 against all other teams.

STARTING PITCHING: Chris Bassitt is scheduled to become the A's sixth different starting pitcher in the A's last six games tonight and Trevor Cahill is scheduled to make it seven in seven games tomorrow...also used seven different starters earlier this year from May 17-24...have 10 different pitchers with five or more starts, which is the most in the majors...have employed 12 different starting pitchers overall, which is tied with the Angels and Mets for second most in the majors (Rays, 13)...A's starting pitchers have combined for nine stints on the disabled list, including two each by Paul Blackburn and Trevor Cahill.

RANKINGS: The A's offense is tied for third in the American League in home runs (123), ranks fourth in extra base hits (307) and batting with runners in scoring position (.260) and fifth in runs (424) and slugging percentage (.424)...are tied for the second fewest sacrifice hits (3)...rank last in the majors in stolen bases (17), stolen base attempts (33) and stolen base percentage (51.5)...opponents have been caught stealing 21 times, which is tied with Toronto for the most in the AL, but they have 61 stolen bases, which is third most...have the fourth lowest stolen base percentage (70.1)...the pitching staff leads the AL in wild pitches (55), has the fourth fewest strikeouts (690), is tied for the fourth fewest walks (265) and ranks fifth in shutouts (7)...rank third in the AL in most errors (60) and unearned runs (34)...A's outfielders have eight assists, which is second fewest in the majors (Washington, 5).

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 5-3 (.625) in July, which is the fourth best record in the American League...went 13-12 in April, 15-14 in May and 17-10 in June...this is the eighth season in Oakland history in which the A's have posted a winning record in April, May and June (1971, 1972, 1975, 1990, 2003, 2013, 2014).

ALL-STARs: Jed Lowrie and Blake Treinen have been named to the American League All-Star team, the first All-Star selection for both players...Lowrie joins Phil Garner (1976) as the only second basemen in Athletics history to be named to the AL All-Star squad (includes Philadelphia and Kansas City)...Treinen is the first A's reliever named to the Midsummer Classic since Sean Doolittle in 2014...the A's have two All-Star representatives for the first time since 2015 (Gray and Vogt).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Cahill, Cotton, Gossett, Joyce, Mengden, Powell, Triggs)...Cotton and Powell are on the 60-day DL and Cahill and Mengden are on rehab assignments...have used the DL 21 times this year, which marks the fourth consecutive season the A's have used the DL 20 or more times (had 23 last year).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 2-9 against the Astros, which includes 2-3 in Houston and 0-6 in Oakland...with one more loss the A's will lose the season series for the fourth consecutive season...are 24-44 (.353) against the Astros over the last four years after winning each of their first four season series against Houston (31-13, .705)...have lost 28 of the last 37 games to the Astros...have dropped 16 of the last 20 in Oakland and 19 of the last 26 in Houston...are 55-57 all-time, including 29-28 in Oakland and 26-29 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis extended his hitting streak to a career-high and A's season-high 12 games last night...is 18-for-49 (.367) during the streak, which is tied for the longest active hitting streak in the American League (Merrifield, KC)...**Jed Lowrie** has matched his career high with 16 home runs (also 2012 with Houston)...leads the AL in RBI in the seventh inning or later (27), ranks second in game-winning RBI (12) and tied for fourth in RBI (62) and go-ahead RBI (17)...**Stephen Piscotty** has homered in four consecutive games, which matches the second longest streak by an Athletic over the last 12 years (5, Matt Olson, Sept. 15-19, 2017)...**Blake Treinen** lead Major League relievers in ERA (0.98) and ranks fourth among AL relievers in saves (23).

In **1991** Dave Stewart wins his 100th game as an Athletic in the A's 8-1 win over Baltimore...along with Catfish Hunter, Vida Blue and Barry Zito, he is one of four 100-game winners in Oakland history...in **2003** Tim Hudson tosses a three-hit shutout and strikes out nine in a 2-0 A's win over Baltimore...in **2017** Yonder Alonso is 2-for-2 with a stolen base for the American League in the All-Star Game at Miami.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (1-3, 3.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville June 27 for his fifth stint with the A's this year and is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (2 er in 10.2 ip) in two starts since his return...went 0-3 with a 3.86 ERA in three starts over his first four stints...did not pitch in his first two stints (April 20-25 and May 26)...made one start during his third stint (June 9) and two during his previous stay (June 14-22)...did not pitch for Nashville following his June 10 option.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .333 (13-for-39) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .176 (12-for-68) after that...opponents are hitting .174 (4-for-23) when leading off an inning...they are 7-for-57 (.123) with two strikes...the opponents four and five hitters are a combined 2-for-25 (.080).

RUN SUPPORT: Received no run support in his last start and has received two runs of support or fewer in all five of his starts this year (3 rs in 27.0 ip, 1.00 RSA)...has now received two runs of support or fewer in 24 of his 28 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 2.26 (40 rs in 159.0 ip).

NINE-GAME LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Picked up the win June 27 at Detroit for his first Major League victory since Aug. 4, 2015 against Baltimore...it snapped a career-high nine-game losing streak, which tied for third longest in Oakland history and was the longest since Bob Welch also lost nine straight from Sept. 5, 1993-May 11, 1994...compiled a 5.56 ERA and .290 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned 13 starts dating back to Aug. 21, 2015...is now 2-13 in 27 games (22 starts) in three seasons with Oakland.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss to Kansas City on June 9 in Oakland...it was his first Major League appearance since April 28, 2016 at Detroit as he had UCL reconstruction surgery on May 6, 2016...allowed a RBI single to Orlando in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...retired each of the final nine batters he faced...Duffy, McCarthy and Herrera combined to shut out the A's on four hits.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) June 15 in Oakland...allowed six runs in 4.0 innings but four were unearned...his own error in the first inning led directly to two unearned runs and a Pinder error led to three runs, one earned run, in the third...surrendered a solo home run to Kinsler in the fourth.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss in the second game of the double header June 22 at Chicago (AL)...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the bottom of the second on a Narvaez two-run single and a Tilson RBI single...Oakland scored once in the sixth to narrow the gap to 3-2 but he was charged with two runs in the bottom of the sixth...put runners on first and second with one out and was relieved by Coulombe who allowed both runners to score.

FOURTH START: He combined with Petit and Trevino on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Detroit June 27...tossed six innings and allowed two of the hits but walked a career-high tying five...retired the side in just one inning, the fourth.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win over San Diego July 3 in Oakland...blanked the Padres on four hits and three walks over the first four innings before allowing two runs in the fifth...Jankowski scored on a fielders choice and Myers had a RBI double...was relieved by Pagán with two outs in the fifth and the A's trailing 2-0 but Oakland scored five times in the sixth for the win.

BASSITT vs. HOUSTON: Is 0-0 with a 1.64 ERA (11.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, including one start, both in 2015 in Oakland...pitched in relief in his A's debut on April 25 in Oakland (4.1 ip, 2 h, 3 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 1 hr)...relieved Graveman with two outs in the fifth inning and pitched the final 4.1 innings, allowing two runs in the seventh inning and a solo home run to Springer in the ninth...then had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win on Aug. 9...struck out a career-high 10 batters in 6.2 innings...shut out the Astros on one hit and one walk over the first five innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-out RBI double to Correa in the sixth...left with the score tied at 1-1.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-3 with a 6.10 ERA in 10 games, including seven starts, with Triple-A Nashville...surrendered just two home runs in 38.1 innings...struck out 40, an average of 9.39 per nine innings...hit six batters, which was tied for fourth most in the Pacific Coast League at the time of his June 9 promotion to Oakland...allowed a .314 opponents batting average, including .270 (17-for-63) against left-handed hitters compared to .344 (32-for-93) against right-handers...has a .689 OPS against lefties, .904 against righties...held the opposition to a .208 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs...opponents hit .353 with a .436 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...was 2-0 with a 2.88 ERA in six games at home, 0-3 with a 12.15 ERA in four games on the road...went 1-0 with a 0.69 ERA in three relief appearances, 1-3 with an 8.88 ERA in seven starts...had two starts where he allowed seven runs (5.1 ip, 23.63 ERA)...had a 3.27 ERA (12 er in 33.0 ip) in his other eight appearances.

2018 NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season in the bullpen and was 1-0 with a 0.69 ERA in three appearances when he was recalled by Oakland April 20...tossed at least 4.0 innings in each appearances and did not allow a run over his first 9.0 innings...was optioned back to Nashville April 26 and started each of his final seven appearances...allowed a season-high seven runs on seven hits in 2.0 innings in his first start April 30 at Colorado Springs and took the loss...pitched 2.0 innings in his next start and 3.0 after that...then allowed a season-high tying seven runs on seven hits and three walks in 3.1 innings May 17 at Oklahoma City for the loss...picked up his first win as a starter May 22 against Colorado Springs when he allowed just one run in 5.0 innings...then had a no decision May 28 against Oklahoma City when he struck out a season-high eight batters in a season-high 6.0 innings.

2017 RECAP: Began the season on Oakland's disabled list as he continued his recovery from May 6, 2016 UCL reconstruction surgery and spent the entire season in the minors...went 0-1 with a 2.77 ERA in seven games, all starts, with Single-A Stockton and 4-2 with a 6.21 ERA in 17 games, two starts, with Triple-A Nashville...combined for a 5-3 record and a 5.33 ERA in 24 games, nine starts, overall...allowed a .260 opponents batting average, including .243 (26-for-107) against right-handed hitters compared to .282 (24-for-85) against left-handers...surrendered three home runs in 50.2 innings, an average of 0.53 per nine innings...all three of his home runs came with runners on base...yielded a .341 average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .167 with RISP and two outs...opponents hit .174 with a .269 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...was 1-2 with a 4.37 ERA in his nine starting assignments, 3-1 with a 6.11 ERA in 15 relief appearances...tossed at least two innings in 10 of his 15 relief outings...allowed 2-of-9 (22.2%) inherited runners to score...began his rehab assignment with Stockton April 29 and did not allow a run in two starts with the Ports (7.0 ip) before he was moved up to Nashville May 8...was 1-1 with a 4.79 ERA in five games overall when his rehab assignment was halted May 24...resumed pitching June 28 back at Stockton and had four scoreless outings (4.2 ip) before allowing four runs on six hits in 1.1 innings in a loss to Inland Empire July 12...was moved up to Nashville July 16 and pitched in relief...made three more rehab appearances before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville July 25...spent the remainder of the season pitching in relief, posting a 5.12 ERA in 11 appearances following his option...did not allow a run in five of his last seven outings (1.93 ERA).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER	
RHP Trevor Cahill (1-2, 2.77 ERA):	Will be reinstated from the 10-day disabled list tomorrow after a one-start rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville last Saturday against Iowa (ND, 4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...was placed on the DL June 14 retroactive to June 11 with a strained right achilles...it was his second stint on the DL this year...was also on the DL from May 6 to 15 with a right elbow impingement...is 1-0 with a 0.64 ERA in four starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 5.66 ERA in four starts on the road...has not lost at home since July 6, 2016 against Cincinnati and has not won on the road since Aug. 20 2016 at Colorado...had a no decision in his last Major League start on June 2, a 5-4 A's loss at Kansas City (4.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...is 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (13.1 ip, 16 h, 10 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 9 so, 3 hr) in three career appearances, including two starts, against Houston...the loss came in his only start this year, an 8-4 A's loss at Houston on April 29 (6.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 5 so).

- The A's bullpen had their 15.1 scoreless innings streak snapped on Tuesday night, it was the longest scoreless streak of the season...Have not allowed a run in five of their last seven games (6 er in 29.0 ip, 1.86 ERA).
- Has converted 27-of-34 (79.4%) save opportunities, which is the best save percentage in the majors...are tied for third in the American League in saves but are tied for fifth in fewest save chances.
- Has the fifth lowest ERA in the AL (3.55)...ranks first in winning percentage (22-8, .733), tied for first in wins (22) and third in innings (332.1).
- Has a 3.09 ERA (60 er in 174.2 ip) and .203 (129-for-636) opponents batting average over its last 47 games dating back to May 18...posted a 4.05 ERA and .273 opponents average over its first 43 contests.
- Has a 3.92 ERA (75 er in 172.0 ip) on road, 3.14 (56 er in 160.1 ip) at home.
- Had 11 saves in June, which tied for second in the American League and matched the Oakland record (1991 and 2006).
