HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ Arizona is 6-2 in its last 8 games vs. San Diego.
- ♦ 13 of the D-backs last 15 games have been decided by 3 runs or fewer: 1 run - 8 times; 2 runs - 3 times; 3 runs - twice.
- ♦ **Robbie Ray** is 4-0 with a 3.57 ERA (16 ER in 40.1 IP) and 58 strikeouts in his last 7 starts vs. San Diego.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is hitting .391 (36-for-92) with 8 doubles, 7 home runs, 18 RBI and a 1.163 OPS in his last 24 games.
- ♦ **David Peralta** is batting .507 (37-for-73)/.526 OBP/.849 SLG with 8 doubles, 5 homers and 14 RBI in his last 18 home games.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs lost vs. Padres, 6-2.
- ♦ **Zack Godley** (14-8) allowed 4 runs and struck out 7 in 5.0 innings, his 10th consecutive game with 6+ strikeouts.
- ♦ **Eduardo Escobar** went 1-for-2 with 1 double, 2 runs scored and 2 walks...**Paul Goldschmidt** had a RBI double.

ROSTER MOVES

- ♦ Prior to tonight's game, the D-backs recalled INF **Ildemaro Vargas** from Triple-A Reno and RHP **Matt Andriese** from Single-A Adv. Visalia.
- ♦ In addition, Arizona placed RHP **Zack Godley** on the Paternity Leave List.
- ♦ The D-backs' 40-man roster remains at 40.

WELCOME IAN McDONALD!

- ♦ The D-backs would like to welcome **Ian McDonald**, head of communications for Baseball New Zealand, to Chase Field.
- ♦ McDonald earned the Winston Churchill fellowship, which has permitted him to travel overseas and learn about the way other countries operate in the baseball industry...he previously spent time in the Major League Baseball offices in New York prior to joining the D-backs' Content & Communications department for September.
- ♦ New Zealand was recently awarded a franchise in the Australian Baseball League for this winter.

GOLDY NAMED D-BACKS ROBERTO CLEMENTE AWARD NOMINEE

- ♦ Major League Baseball announced this morning that **Paul Goldschmidt** was named the D-backs' nominee for the 2018 Roberto Clemente Award...this marks Goldschmidt's fifth consecutive nomination.
- ♦ The award is the annual recognition of a player from each MLB Club who best represents the game of Baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field.
- ♦ Fans are encouraged to vote at mlb.com/clemente21...the winner of the fan vote will count as 1 vote among the panel.

THIS DATE IN D-BACKS HISTORY: 2017 EDITION

- ♦ Last year, **J.D. Martinez** became the 18th player in Major League history and the first in D-backs history to hit 4 home runs in a game @ Dodgers...additional notes:
 - Was the first player in the modern era to hit a HR in the seventh, eighth and ninth innings of the same game [source: ELIAS].
 - Was the first time in Major League history a player had more homers (4) than the opponent had hits (3) [source: ESPN Stats & Info].
 - Became the third player to hit 4 homers against 4 different pitchers in a single game and the first since Joe Adcock in 1954.

DOWN THE STRETCH WE GO

- ♦ The D-backs have 24 games remaining (14 home/10 away) and their opponents' combined .523 winning pct. is higher than the Rockies (.520) and Dodgers (.493) [source: ESPN.com].
 - 15 games vs. NL foes: 7 vs. Rockies (4 on road/3 @ home), 4 vs. Padres (3 on road/1 @ home), 3 vs. Dodgers (@ home).
 - 17 games vs. first place teams: 7 vs. Rockies (4 on road/3 @ home), 4 vs. Braves (@ home), 3 vs. Astros (on road), 3 vs. Cubs (@ home).

PITCHING IN

- ♦ The D-backs' 3.53 ERA (488 ER in 1,244.0 IP) ranks third in the Majors...only the Astros (3.10) and Dodgers (3.41) are better.
- ♦ Arizona's 3.53 ERA is also currently the lowest single-season mark in club history:
 - **LOWEST SINGLE-SEASON ERA BY D-BACKS: 3.53 - 2018;** 3.66 - 2017; 3.77 - 1999; 3.80 - 2011; 3.84 - 2003.

RAY AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Fourth season with the D-backs (2015-present) after spending parts of 5 with the Nationals (2010-13) and Tigers' (2014) organizations.
- ◆ 2017 NL All-Star Team @ Marlins Park (DNP).
- ◆ Acquired from Tigers with INF Domingo Leyba for INF Didi Gregorius on Dec. 5, 2014.

HERE'S THE STORY

- ◆ Is looking for his first win @ Chase Field since his 2018 debut on March 30 vs. Rockies.
- ◆ Has allowed 3 runs or fewer in 5 straight starts, going 1-0 with a 3.24 ERA (9 ER in 25.0 IP).
- ◆ Has not won back-to-back starts since a 5-game stretch from Aug. 24-Sept. 15, 2017.

LAST TIME OUT

- ◆ Snapped a streak of a club-record 7 straight no decisions on Aug. 30 @ Dodgers (1 ER in 5.1 IP)...was his first win since June 27 @ Marlins.

VS. PADRES

- ◆ Has gone 0-0 with a 7.27 ERA (7 ER in 8.2 IP) in 2 starts vs. Padres in 2018 and 4-4 with a 4.40 ERA (30 ER in 61.1 IP) in 11 career starts.
- ◆ Is 4-0 with a 3.57 ERA (16 ER in 40.1 IP) and 58 strikeouts in his last 7 starts vs. San Diego.
- ◆ In 6 starts @ Chase Field, is 2-3 with a 5.34 ERA (19 ER in 32.0 IP).

AT HOME VS. NL WEST

- ◆ Has gone 8-2 in his last 16 home starts vs. NL West (D-backs are 11-5).

LEFTY ON LEFTY

- ◆ His .157 average vs. lefties is best in the NL and third among Major League starters (min. 5 GS, 60 BF) behind Blake Snell/TB (.142) and Francisco Liriano/DET (.146) and ahead of Carlos Rodon/CWS (.157).

WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION

- ◆ Has a .177 opponent average (14-for-79) with runners in scoring position and a .125 average with RISP/2 outs.

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ Won a gold medal with USA Baseball's 18U National Championship Team that participated in the 2009 Pan-American Championships in Venezuela...was teammates with Cory Hahn, D-backs Coordination, Professional Scouting.
- ◆ Committed to pitch at the University of Arkansas before signing with the Nationals.
- ◆ Wears a protective cap insert on the left side of his head after being struck by a 108-mph line drive on July 28, 2017 @ Cardinals...was on the disabled list from July 29-Aug. 24.

STRIKEOUT STATS

- ◆ His 11.87 strikeouts per 9.0 innings ratio is second among NL starters (min. 5 GS, 25.0 IP) behind Max Scherzer/WSH (12.08).
- ◆ Among active pitchers since 2016, Ray ranks second in the Majors with 11.71 strikeouts per 9.0 innings, trailing only Scherzer (11.74).

WHIFF ON THE SLIDE PIECE

- ◆ Opponents have whiffed on 42.31 percent of sliders swung at, the seventh-highest pct. in the NL [min. 200 pitches] behind Patrick Corbin/ARI (54.98), Max Scherzer/WSH (47.08), Jack Flaherty/STL (47.04), Noah Syndergaard/NYM (47.01), Kenta Maeda/LAD (45.45) and Julio Teheran/ATL (45.31).

WILL SOMEONE MAKE A DECISION?

- ◆ Did not factor in the decision in 7 consecutive starts from July 20-Aug. 25, the longest streak in franchise history by a starter, passing the previous record of 6 held by Armando Reynoso from June 22-July 21, 1999.

KEEPING IT "100"

- ◆ Made his 100th career appearance on July 2 vs. Cardinals and is third all-time among left-handed pitchers with 632 strikeouts in his first 100 career games [source: Elias Sports Bureau] behind Herb Score/CLE (679) and Frank Tanana/CAL (638) and ahead of Scott Kazmir/TB (628).

SD Series: -

- ◆ Struck out at least 1 batter in 35 of his 36 appearances this season.
- ◆ Acquired on July 25 from the Rays for C Michael Perez and RHP Brian Shaffer.
- ◆ Has thrown 2.0+ innings 20 times, tied for the third most by a Major League reliever (2 others), trailing Ryan Yarbrough (21) and Jesse Chavez (21).

#31 • BRAD BOXBERGER • R/R
SD Series: -

- ◆ **NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS):** 3rd in SV (31), 5th in SO/9.0 IP (12.74), 9th in SV PCT. (83.8).
- ◆ Is the eighth D-back to record 30 saves (fourth different pitcher in last 5 years).
- ◆ Is 31-for-37 in save chances with a .205 opp. average (26-for-127) and 50 strikeouts.
- ◆ Right-handed hitters are batting .118 (6-for-51) over his last 28 games since June 6.
- ◆ First batters faced are hitting .114 (5-for-44), fourth in the NL.

- ◆ Holding righties to a .135 (5-for-37) average, including 1 hit in their last 9 at-bats.

- ◆ **NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS):** T-1st in HLD (31), T-3rd in G (66).
- ◆ His 66 appearances are a career high (previous high was 63 in 2017).
- ◆ Needs 4 holds to tie Brandon Lyon's club record (35 in 2007).
- ◆ Lefties are hitting .115 (7-for-61) over his last 37 games since May 23.
