TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Diamondbacks open a four-game set tonight with the fourth meeting between the clubs this season...The Diamondbacks won two-of-three games at SunTrust Park earlier this season, winning a 2-1 and 3-0 game to open the series, before the Braves took a 5-1 decision in the final game before the All-Star break.

A The Braves have not won a series in Arizona since taking three-of-four in 2012...They are 6-10 overall since 2013 here, including 0-4-1 in series play.

A RHP Aníbal Sánchez allowed one run over 6.0 innings in a no-decision in his lone appearance against the Diamondbacks this season...The righty is 4-1 with a 4.14 ERA (25 ER/54.1 IP) in nine career appearances, eight starts, against Arizona... He has not lost to them since 2010 while with Florida, going 3-0 in six games, five starts, against Arizona since that defeat.

A RHP Zack Greinke beat the Braves, 3-0, on July 14 of this season after tossing 7.2 innings and striking out seven...The righty is 4-0 with a 1.85 ERA (10 ER/48.2 IP) over his last seven starts against Atlanta, dating to 2013.

THE WEST: The Braves open a seven-game trip tonight that has the team playing four in Arizona and then three in San Francisco...After that series with the Giants, the team will return for 10 games at SunTrust Park to close out their home schedule.

A Over the last six years, dating to the start of the 2013, the Braves are 29-64 (.312) on the road against the National League West.

A They are 4-5 on the road and 9-18 overall against the West this season...They have lost seven of the last eight.

SKID: The Braves suffered through their third multi-game series sweep of the season yesterday, losing 9-8 to Boston in the finale of the clubs' three-game set... All three sweeps have happened at SunTrust Park: The Giants took three, May 4-6, while Colorado won four, August 16-August 19.

A The Braves have lost six of eight, dating to August 29 vs. Tampa Bay.

A They have committed an error in seven of the eight games, and nine overall that have led to 10 unearned runs.

ON THE ROAD: The Braves start their penultimate road trip today, and are 39-29 (.574) away from SunTrust Park this season...That is the best record in the National League and tied for the fourth-best mark in the majors...Only Houston (47-21, .691), Boston (49-26, .653) and Oakland (41-28, .594) are better... New York is also 39-29.

LEADOFF HOME RUNS: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. drove Héctor Velazquez's second pitch of the game out to left-center field yesterday for his franchise record-setting eighth leadoff home run of the season...Acuña's eight are the most in a single-season by a Braves player and break a tie with Marquis Grissom, who first set the mark in 1996.

A Yesterday was Acuña Jr.'s 44th game leading off; Grissom set the record over 157 games in 1996.

A Acuña Jr. is now one shy of the rookie record for a season...Arizona's Chris Young hit nine in 2007.

A The overall single-season major league record is 13 by the Yankees' Alfonso Soriano in 2003.

A Acuña Jr. is now tied with St. Louis' Matt Carpenter for the major league lead this season.

A Acuña Jr.'s eight leadoff home runs are the eighth most in franchise history...Felipe Alou holds the record with 17 career leadoff home runs over six years with the team, 1964-1969.

NO. 24: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. passed Mickey Mantle and moved into a tie for the seventh most home runs in a single season prior to turning 21 yesterday after hitting his 24th home run...Acuña Jr. is now tied with Boston's Tony Conigliaro, who hit 24 as a 19-year-old in 1964... He also leads all major league rookies this season with his 24 homers; the Yankees' Miguel Andujar has 23.

A With another home run this season, Acuña Jr. will tie Eddie Mathews and Orlando Cepeda for fifth place...Al Kaline sits in fourth place with 27 in 1955, while Conigliaro had 32 in 1965...Frank Robinson hit 34 in 1956, while Mel Ott holds the record with 42 in 1929.

STRONG STARTS: Braves starters have not allowed more than one earned run in 11 straight road starts, the longest such stretch by a major league team since 1916... The Brooklyn Robins also went 11 consecutive road games from July 19-August 22.

A The Braves streak began on August 7 at Washington and overall, the rotation is 6-2 with a 0.77 ERA (5 ER/58.1 IP) on the road during the streak...They have allowed 31 total hits.

A The Robins' starting pitchers, led by RHP Jeff Pfeffer who won 25 games that season, tossed 90.1 innings during their streak, compiling a 0.70 ERA (7 ER) with eight complete games.

ROSTER MOVE: The Braves today recalled LHP Max Fried from Triple-A Gwinnett...The club's active roster is now at 34 players.

A Fried is 1-4 with a 3.14 ERA (10 ER/28.2 IP) in 10 games, five starts, at the MLB level this season.

A The team also announced that OF Dustin Peterson has been claimed off waivers by the Detroit Tigers.

- Hit his 20th home run, 8/14 vs. MIA...Is looking for his third consecutive season of .300, 30 doubles and 20 home runs...In franchise history, only two other Braves, Hank Aaron (nine such seasons) and Chipper Jones (seven), have three such seasons.
- Compiled three double-digit hitting streaks this season...Nick Markakis also has three such streaks...They are the first Braves players with three such streaks since Martin Prado also had three in 2011.
- Selected to his third career All-Star Game, and made his first start, going 0-for-2.

- Became the first Braves player in franchise history (since 1876) to collect at least 35 doubles in four straight seasons...Only Chipper Jones (five) and Hank Aaron (five) have more 35-double seasons over their entire Braves career than Markakis.
- Ranks fifth among active players with 470 two-base hits...Became one of 12 players in franchise history to reach 25 doubles prior to the All-Star break.
- Is 6-for-11 (.545) with 14 RBI with the bases loaded this season...Hit his first grand slam and first since 2011, 6/30 at STL...He went 1,073 games in between slams.
- Was selected to his first career All-Star Game, and made the start in right field...Went 0-for-1 with a walk...Received 3,556,469 fan votes to pace all N.L. outfielders.
