Spring Training Game Notes

Kansas City Royals (7-6-1) @ Arizona Diamondbacks (8-7)
Saturday, March 10, 2018

BROOMED ON FRIDAY--The first split-squad action of the spring didn't go particularly well for the Royals, as they dropped a 7-2 decision to the D'Backs in Surprise and 6-4 affair to the Dodgers in Glendale...in the home game, Ian Kennedy had a solid second outing with 3.0 innings of 3-hit ball with a walk and two K's...Eric Stout was solved for three runs in his inning of work to absorb the loss...Kansas City's eight hits on the day were spread over eight different hitters, with Paulo Orlando providing his first homer of the spring, while Ryan O'Hearn and Jack Lopez each doubled...as for the trip to Glendale, the en fuego Whit Merrifield opened the game with a home run to stake KC to an immediate lead, but the Dodgers tied the game with a tally in the third...KC regained the lead in the fifth, but again LA tied it in the bottom of the frame and then a pair in both the sixth and seventh put it out of reach...Merrifield went 2-for-3 on the day, the only Royal in either game to get more than one hit...Scott Barlow, facing his former organization, went 2.0 innings and allowed just one hit with two K's.

EXTRA-BASE WHIT--Whit Merrifield had his typical two-hit game yesterday in Glendale, highlighted by a game-opening home run giving him eight extra-base hits out of his 13 overall hits this spring...his 1.120 slugging pct is third among all big league hitters during exhibition play, with three doubles, three triples and two homers.

SPRING FORWARD (EXCEPT HERE)--Don't forget that the majority of the country will be moving their clocks ahead tonight by one hour as Daylight Savings time commences at 2:00 a.m...that rule does not pertain here in Arizona, where today the Royals are just a one-hour time difference from back home, but tomorrow and beyond it will be a two-hour difference.

NEAR THE TOP IN TEAM BATTING--Yes, it's only spring training, but clubs would much rather see progress offensively during camp than the alternative...with a total of 14 hits over the two games yesterday, the Royals dropped to second among all big league clubs with a .298 team average this spring.

VS. D'BACKS--Today is the second of three meetings with the Diamondbacks, as the Royals fell to Arizona yesterday by a 7-2 count in split-squad action in Surprise...the D'Backs will also host Kansas City on Saturday, March 24 for the final get together of '18.

DENNY BACK FOR #50--The one common thread between the start of the Royals' franchise in 1969 and the start of 2018 is the voice of Denny Matthews...the 2007 Ford Frick Award winner will be at the mic for his 50th season this year, the same anniversary the organization is celebrating, with only the Dodgers' Vin Scully (67 years) and Jaime Jarrin (59 years) having longer stretches in the baseball broadcast booth.

ROYALS "FRIENDED" BY FACEBOOK--Major League Baseball and Facebook yesterday announced a joint agreement that the global audience of Facebook will exclusively televise 25 games this season...the Royals are among the early selections with the Wednesday, April 18 game in Toronto now a Facebook telecast, thus it will be scratched from the FSKC schedule.

TUBE TIME--The Royals will have plenty of television exposure starting today as this contest with the Diamondbacks will be shown on FSKC...also on the slate is tomorrow's tilt in Surprise vs. the Tribe and then the second game of Monday's split-squad with Texas, an 8:05 start (Kansas City time).

50TH SEASON OF ROYALS BASEBALL--The 2018 campaign is the Golden Anniversary season of the Royals who began play in 1969 in Ft. Myers, FL...this 33-game exhibition slate will feature 32 games here in Arizona and then will be capped with a stop in Omaha against KC's AAA affiliate for all 50 seasons of the franchise's existence...KC has 10 games remaining in Surprise, nine of which will be as the home club...the 2018 spring slate also has three more split squads, two of which are day/night doubleheaders, with the first coming on Monday vs. San Diego at noon and the Rangers at 6:00 p.m...the 2018 exhibition slate is a strange one in that the Royals will not play the Los Angeles Angels or the Colorado Rockies...there are a pair of off days in the spring slate on March 5 and 19...the 2018 regular season starts on Thursday, March 29 in Kauffman Stadium against the White Sox in the first of a 3-game series.

SURPRISE STADIUM RATED NUMERO UNO--At USA TODAY's request, ReviewTrackers conducted a study of more than 36,000 online reviews of the 23 spring training ballparks and analyzed 130,000 key words used in the reviews...the study provided a look at how baseball fans feel about the ballparks used for exhibition games...to create a score for each spring training stadium, ReviewTrackers examined how fans felt about four aspects of their visits: the facility; family friendliness; food; and the fan experience...to no surprise (pun intended), the Surprise Stadium, spring home of the Royals and Rangers, generated the highest overall score of the 10 Cactus League venues, finishing first in family friendliness...the park also topped all 23 spring parks (Arizona and Florida combined) in the facility and fan-experience categories.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN--With the addition of Ricky Nolasco to the non-roster invites, the Royals have 67 players in camp, though pitcher Jesse Hahn has been placed on the 60-day D.L...the breakdown includes 33 pitchers (10 non-roster), 7 catchers (5 non-roster), 16 infielders (8 non-roster) and 11 outfielders (5 non-roster)...among the 32 active pitchers in camp, 7 are left-handed...of the 28 non-roster players in camp with Kansas City, 10 have previous Major League experience, including eight who had time in "The Show" in 2017...of the 37 roster players in camp, nine have yet to accrue any big league service time.

COMING OFF SUB .500 CAMPAIGN--The Royals had their first sub-.500 season since 2012 with last year's 80-82 ledger, finishing in third place in the A.L. Central, 22 games behind the division winning Indians...Kansas City has gone 431-379 in its last five seasons, tying the New York Yankees for the third best record in the American League in that span, trailing Cleveland (454-354) and Boston (432-378).

SPRING WORK--After yesterday's split-squad losses to both the D'Backs and Dodgers, the Royals have an all-time exhibition record of 688-631 with 41 ties for a .522 winning pct...the 2018 exhibition season is the 16th here in the Valley of the Sun where the club has posted a 257-207 mark with 19 ties for a .554 mark...the Royals spent their first 34 seasons training in Florida, beginning with Fort Myers (1969-87), followed by a 15-year stint in Baseball City (1988-2002).

WORKING TOWARD THE START OF A NEW YEAR--The 2018 campaign will see the earliest start for the Royals, with the lid-lifter scheduled for Thursday, March 29 against the Chicago White Sox...that 3:15 contest will be the first of a 3-game series, that will see a "weather" off day on Friday, March 30, then resumption with games on Saturday (6:15 p.m.) and Sunday (1:15 p.m.)...KC will then depart on its first road swing of the year with a 6-game journey through Detroit (3) and Cleveland (3)...the first two trips of the campaign will include 3-game stops in the Motor City to battle the Tigers, then the Royals will not travel to Detroit again until the final trip of the year in late September...Kansas City will take on the National League Central in Interleague action, playing home & home 2-game sets with Milwaukee and Cincinnati, a home & home 3-game series with St. Louis and then a 3-game series in Kauffman Stadium against the Chicago Cubs (August 6-8) and 3-game road trip to Pittsburgh (September 17-19).

AT THE HELM--The winningest manager in franchise history, Ned Yost begins his eighth full season with the club, taking the reins on May 13, 2010...he has a 629-632 regular season record at the helm for the Royals, surpassing Whitey Herzog's previous team mark of 410 wins (1975-79)...Yost is the 16th full-time manager in franchise history and enters this year sixth among active managers in games (2,220) and wins (1,086)...his postseason winning pct. of .710 (22-9) is tops among all managers in history who have worked at least 20 playoff games...this is his second stint as a big league manager after nearly six full campaigns at the helm for the Milwaukee Brewers (2003-2008)...he compiled a 457-502 record with the Brew Crew including a 166-146 mark in his last two seasons...Yost, a catcher during his playing days, began his coaching career in the Atlanta organization, including 12 straight seasons on Bobby Cox's big league staff (1991-2002).

THE WEEK AHEAD--The Royals will start a 5-game in 4-day homestand tomorrow with the Cleveland Indians visiting Surprise for a 1:05 start...Kansas City will play a split-doubleheader on Monday with a 12:05 game against San Diego and then a 6:05 affair against Texas, both at Surprise Stadium...KC will remain at home for a 1:05 game against Oakland on Tuesday and same start for the Chicago Cubs on Wednesday.

ON THE AIRWAVES--Today's game against Arizona was added to the 610 Sports schedule immediately after Kansas State was eliminated from the Big 12 tournament last night...the Royals will also be on 610 Sports tomorrow vs. Cleveland and on Monday night at home against the Rangers...Monday's day game vs. San Diego will be a webcast...Denny Matthews, Ryan Lefebvre, Steve Physioc and Steve Stewart are providing the call on 610 Sports and the Royals Radio Network, while Stewart also anchors the webcasts.

TODAY'S KANSAS CITY PITCHERS

#39 JASON HAMMEL, 35, will make his second start of the spring today...retired all six batters he faced in his spring debut on Sunday in Goodyear vs. Cincinnati...set career highs with 32 starts and 180.1 innings in 2017 and was one of five pitchers age 34 or older who made at least 32 starts, joining: Justin Verlander, Ervin Santana, Ricky Nolasco and Jason Vargas...the Royals scored just 86 runs in his 180.1 innings, a 4.29 average, second lowest in the American League among the 23 qualified pitchers...issued 23 walks through his first 51.0 innings over 10 starts (4.06 BB/9), before issuing just 25 walks in his last 129.1 innings over 22 starts (1.74 BB/9), the third-lowest walk rate in the Majors from June 1 through the end of the season...walked two or fewer in each of his last 15 starts, the longest streak by a Royals right hander within one season since Zack Greinke (also 15) in 2004.

#40 KELVIN HERRERA, 28, will make his fourth appearance this spring...has recorded three scoreless innings, most recently on Wednesday vs. Milwaukee in Surprise...converted 26 of 28 save opportunities (92.9%) between April 13 and Aug. 16, the best percentage in the American League during that stretch...allowed nine runs (seven earned) over his first six appearances in September (4.2 IP)...allowed seven HR in his first 24.1 innings (2.59 HR/9), but just two in his last 35.0 innings (0.51 HR/9)...an AL All-Star in consecutive seasons, 2015-16.

#49 HEATH FILLMYER, 23, is scheduled to make his fourth appearance of the spring today...last pitched on Tuesday vs. San Diego and allowed two runs on four hits and a walk in 2.0 innings...acquired from Oakland on Jan. 29 with RHP Jesse Hahn in exchange for 1B/OF Brandon Moss and LHP Ryan Buchter...spent all of 2017 in Midland (AA), where he tied for the Texas League lead in starts (29), tied for second in wins (11) and ranked fifth in ERA (3.49)...went 5-0 during a six-start stretch from July 25-Aug. 23, posting a 2.33 ERA (10 ER in 38.2 IP)...attended Mercer County Community College (N.J.), where he was an infielder as a freshman, before going 9-0 with a 0.68 ERA (5 ER in 66.0 IP) as a sophomore.

#56 BRAD KELLER, 22, scheduled to make his fourth appearance today...he's recorded three scoreless outings (3.1 IP) to date, most recently pitching 1.1 innings on Tuesday vs. San Diego in Surprise...in his first camp with the Royals after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati after they selected him from Arizona in the Rule 5 Draft...spent all of 2017 with Jackson (AA) in the Diamondbacks' organization, going 10-9 with a 4.68 ERA in 26 starts...entered 2017 rated as the No. 7 prospect in Arizona's system, according to *Baseball America*...originally selected by Arizona in the eighth round of the 2013 First-Year Player Draft.
