The Mariners will play the Giants in the 2nd of 2 games at AT&T Park today, and will play a pair of games July 24-25 at Safeco Field...Seattle leads the all-time series 17-13, including winning 14 of the last 19 (since 6/10/00)...the Mariners are 5-6 all-time at AT&T Park.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue on their first road trip of the season, a 5,200-mile, 10-day, 8-game odyssey that includes trips to San Francisco (1-0), Minnesota (3 games) and Kansas City (3 games) before returning home to Seattle...opened the season at Safeco Field taking 2-of-3 game vs. the Cleveland Indians...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners are 3-1 on the season, going 2-1 during the day and 1-0 at night...10 of the Mariners first 18 games will be played at Safeco Field.

- **Young & Old** - Ichiro Suzuki was the oldest player on the Mariners Opening Day roster at 44 years, 158 days...Edwin Díaz was the youngest at 24 years, 7 days...(ages on March 29).
- **First Opening Day** - Marco Gonzales, Casey Lawrence, Mike Marjama and Daniel Vogelbach are on their first Opening Day rosters...this was the 17th Opening Day for Ichiro Suzuki and the 13th for Félix Hernández and Robinson Canó...Ichiro's 17 career appearances on an Opening Day roster are T2nd-most among active players (also: Albert Pujols), trailing Adrian Beltre (18)...Elias.
- **Service Time** - the Mariners have four players with at least 10 years of Major League service time, led by Ichiro Suzuki (17.000), Robinson Canó (12.153), Félix Hernández (12.060) and Nelson Cruz (10.082).
- **International Game** - the Mariners Opening Day roster is represented by 7 different countries or territories: Canada (James Paxton), Cuba (Guillermo Heredia), Dominican Republic (Robinson Canó, Nelson Cruz, Juan Nicasio and Jean Segura), Japan (Ichiro Suzuki), Puerto Rico (Edwin Díaz), United States (16 players) and Venezuela (Félix Hernández).
- **2017 in Review** - Completed the 2017 season 78-84 (.481), finishing in a tie for 3rd place in the American League West along with Texas (23.0 games behind division winner Houston)...finished 7.0 games back of the American League Wild Card...went 40-41 (.494) at home and 38-43 (.469) on the road.

HAPPY FÉLIX DAY...RHP Félix Hernández, who is making his first career starts at AT&T Park, is 3-0 with a 1.86 ERA (6 ER, 29.0 IP) in 4 career starts vs. the Giants (Mariners are 4-0 in his starts)...he has limited opponents to a .204 (23x113) average, while walking 7 and striking out 27...today's start at AT&T Park marks the 27th stadium in which Félix has appeared in his career...he has made starts in all 15 active American League ball parks and 7 of the 15 current National League ball parks, including Chase Field (ARI), Coors Field (COL), Dodger Stadium (LAD), Great American Ball Park (CIN), Petco Park (SD), PNC (PIT) and Wrigley Field (CHI)...Felix has also made starts at the Metrodome (MIN), Original Yankee Stadium (NYY), Shea Stadium (NYM) and Tokyo Dome (Japan).

LET'S GO STREAKING...Robinson Canó (.500/7x14, 5 R, 3 2B, 2 RBI, 2 BB), Dee Gordon (.412/7x17, 3 R, HR, RBI, BB, 2 SB) and Mitch Haniger (.462/6x13, 2B, 2 HR, 5 RBI, HBP, 2 BB) have each hit safely in each of the first 4 games this season.

HEATING UP...after going 0-for-4 in the first game of the season, Jean Segura has recorded 6 hits over his last 12 at-bats (.500) with 3 runs scored, 2 doubles, 2 RBI and 1 walk...overall this season he is batting .375 (6x16) with 3 runs scored, 2 doubles, 2 RBI and 1 walk.

FAST START...Mitch Haniger is 6-for-13 (.462) with 3 runs scored, 1 double, 2 home runs, 5 RBI 1 HBP and 2 walks in his first four games of the season...dating back to August 30, 2017, Haniger has hit safely in 25 of 33 games, including 15 multi-hit contests, batting .375 (51x136) with 22 runs scored, 11 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 22 RBI, 2 HBP, 5 walks and 2 stolen bases...during this stretch Mitch leads the Majors with a .375 average (min. 75 PA), ranking ahead of Jose Martinez-STL (.374/40x107)...teammate Dee Gordon ranks 4th during this same stretch (.365/54x148, 25 R, 3 2B, 2 HR, 9 RBI, 3 BB).

BRING ON THE NATIONAL LEAGUE...today is the 2nd game of 20 in Interleague match-ups for the Mariners this season...the Mariners are 204-181 all-time in Interleague play (96-94 on the road)...posted a .500 or better record vs. the National League in 14 of last 18 seasons (since 2000)...after this 2-game series vs. the Giants, the Mariners will not play another National League opponent until the Colorado Rockies visit Safeco Field, July 6-8.

NL SUCCESS...Seattle is 26-15 (.634) in its last 41 Interleague games since the start of the 2016...in that span, the .634 winning percentage is 6th-best in the Majors behind Boston (30-10/.750), Chicago-NL (27-13/.675), Texas (27-13/.675), Houston (26-14/.650) and Los Angeles-NL (26-14/.650).

INTERLEAGUE PITCHING...the Mariners boast the best ERA in Interleague history...Seattle's chuckers have compiled a 3.77 ERA in 385 games (1435 ER, 3426.0 IP) since the start of Interleague play in 1997...New York-AL is 2nd at 3.80, followed by Boston (3.88), Los Angeles-AL (3.89), Oakland (3.94) and Cleveland (3.99)...no other MLB team has an ERA under 4.00...the Mariners have 38 shutouts during Interleague play, which is the most by any team, ranking ahead of the Braves (29), Mets (29), the Yankees (29) and the Blue Jays (29).

BULLPEN BULLY...RHP Nick Vincent, who retired both Giants faced yesterday, has not allowed an earned run in 23 of his 24 career relief appearances vs. the Giants...overall he is 1-1 with a 0.78 ERA (2 ER, 23.0 IP) in 24 games...he has limited opponents to a .207 (17x82) average, while walking 3 and striking out 19.

AS YOU KNOW...starter Félix Hernández is 23-9 with a 2.92 ERA (96 ER, 296.0 IP) in 42 career Interleague starts, including going 11-2 with a 2.39 ERA (31 ER, 116.2 IP) in 17 Interleague road starts...AND AS YOU MIGHT KNOW...dating back to June 16, 2009, Félix is 10-0 with a 1.75 ERA (17 ER, 87.1 IP) in 12 IL road starts with his last road Interleague loss coming on June 15, 2007 at Houston...BUT, DID YOU KNOW...that Félix's current 10-game road Interleague winning streak is currently the longest active in the Majors and tied with Bartolo Colon (7/2/1998-6/7/2003) for longest in Interleague history?

ABOUT FÉLIX...

- 31-year-old right-hander is making his 377th career start and his 5th career start vs. San Francisco today.
Is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and career strikeouts...
Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013.
In 2010 won the AL Cy Young, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes...
ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...
At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history...

LAST OUTING...made his 11th career Opening Day start, his 10th consecutive, in a 2-1 win against Cleveland on March 29...he struck out 4 in 5.1 scoreless innings, allowing just 2 hits and 2 walks.

FOR OPENERS...improved to 7-2 with a 1.52 ERA (13 ER, 76.2 IP) with 78 strikeouts in 11 career Opening Day starts...marked Hernández's 6th career Opening Day start allowing 1 or fewer runs, tied for 2nd-most all-time (also: Juan Marichal and Tom Seaver)...

NATIONAL TREASURE...is 23-9 with a 2.92 ERA (96 ER, 296.0 IP) in 42 career Interleague starts (28 quality starts, 2 CG, 1 ShO)...he is one of 11 pitchers all-time to win at least 23 games in Interleague play...

NOW BATTING, FÉLIX HERNÁNDEZ...since his debut in 2005, Félix ranks T2nd among American League pitchers with 7 RBI in Interleague play (also: Ervin Santana)...only CC Sabathia has more RBI in Interleague play during this time with 9...

HISTORIC GRAND SLAM...Félix become the first pitcher to hit a grand slam home run in Interleague play when he went yard against Mets starter Johan Santana on June 23, 2008 at New York (2nd inning)...

HOT STARTER...in 64 career starts in March/April, Félix has recorded a 2.51 ERA (119 ER, 427.1 IP), the lowest among active pitchers and the 5th-lowest ERA in March/April in MLB history...

SPRING TRAINING RECAP...in 2 Cactus League starts, compiled a record of 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA (2 ER, 5.0 IP) with 5 strikeouts and 1 walk...Félix exited his first spring start after 1.1 innings on 2/26 at CHC after being hit by a line drive on right forearm (1.1,1,1,1,0,2)...

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 6-5 with a 4.36 ERA (42 ER, 86.2 IP) with 78 strikeouts and 26 walks in 16 starts...placed on the 10-day DL on April 26 with right shoulder inflammation...activated on June 23 after making three rehab starts (6/6, 6/11, 6/17 w/AAA Tacoma)...

IMPRESSIVE START...since 2005, has recorded 55 starts where he has thrown at least 6.0 innings and not allowed a run...that total ranks 2nd among starting pitchers behind only Clayton Kershaw (63)...

HE'S OUR LEADER...became the Mariners all-time career leader in strikeouts on April 23, 2016 at the Angels (previous: Randy Johnson, 2,162)...became the club's all-time career leader in wins on May 9, 2016 vs. the Rays (previous: Jamie Moyer, 145)...

CAREER...has spent entire pro career with Seattle...6-time All-Star (2009, 2011-15), 2-time ERA champ (2010, 2014), 2010 AL Cy Young Award winner...is 161-114 with a 3.19 ERA (890 ER, 2507.2 IP) in 376 career starts with 25 CG, 11 ShO, and 1 perfect game...
