## PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (78-74) vs ATLANTA BRAVES (85-68)

Friday, September 21, 2018 – 7:35p.m. EDT – SunTrust Park – Game 153 – Road 75

RHP Nick Pivetta (7-13, 4.67 ERA) vs RHP Julio Teheran (9-8, 3.97 ERA)

- **LAST NIGHT'S RECAP:** The Phillies fell to the Atlanta Braves, 8-3, at SunTrust Park in Atlanta ... Starter Vince Velasquez (ND) went 3.0 innings and allowed 3 runs on 5 hits with 1 walk and 3 strikeouts ... Philadelphia was able to score three runs without the aid of a home run and had the game tied at 3-3 through six frames ... Atlanta would go ahead in the 7<sup>th</sup> and eventually added four runs of insurance in the 8<sup>th</sup>.
- **SWING AND A MISS:** Philadelphia's pitching staff enters tonight's game with 1,377 strikeouts, eight shy of a franchise record 1,385 set in 2012 ... The Phillies, currently averaging 9.09 SO/9.0 IP, are on pace to obliterate their previous franchise record of 8.59, also set in 2012.
- **WHAT IF TOLD YOU...:** Last night, **Vince Velasquez** made his 29<sup>th</sup> start of the season ... Tomorrow, Jake Arrieta will join **Aaron Nola** and tonight's starter, **Nick Pivetta**, in the 30-start club for the Phillies in 2018 ... If Philadelphia has four starters reach the 30-start plateau this year, it would mark only the sixth time in franchise history that has occurred (others: 2008, 2003, 1987, 1982 & 1968) ... In 2008, Cole Hamels and Jamie Moyer each started 33 games and Kyle Kendrick and Brett Myers both started 30.
- **REMEMBER THE FIGHTINS:** The Phillies have won four of their last seven games (9/14-current), outscoring their opponents 39-31 (+8) in those seven contests ... Philadelphia is averaging 5.57 runs per game over this seven-game stretch with 10 home runs and 21 extra-base hits ... Philadelphia has won each of their last two series (2 of 3 vs MIA, 2 of 3 vs NYM) for the first time since July 20-25 (2 of 3 vs SD, 2 of 3 vs LAD).
- **SUNTRUST THE PROCESS:** Over the last four games against the Atlanta Braves, Philadelphia's starting pitchers have posted a 1.71 ERA (4 ER, 21.0 IP) with 26 strikeouts to 6 walks ... When scoring at least four runs against the Braves this season, the Phillies are 4-1 and have won each of the last four games in which they have done so (3/30-current).
- **NOTHING BUT RHYS-PECT:** Wednesday night, **Rhys Hoskins** connected on his 50<sup>th</sup> career home run in his 192<sup>nd</sup> major league game ... In doing so, Hoskins became the seventh-fastest player in the history of Major League Baseball to reach his 50<sup>th</sup> home run, trailing only Ryan Howard (182 G), Aaron Judge (174 G), Ryan Braun (171 G), Gary Sanchez (161 G), Mark McGwire (161 G) and Rudy York (153 G) ... Since he burst onto the scene August 10, 2017, **Hoskins'** 50 home runs rank T-4<sup>th</sup> in MLB with **CLE's Francisco Lindor**, trailing only **OAK's Khris Davis** (55 HR), **NY Yankees' Giancarlo Stanton** (56 HR) and **BOS' J.D. Martinez** (64 HR) for the major league lead in that stretch ... Lastly, Hoskins currently sports a .249/.357/500 slash line ... Over the last 10 years, only three Phillies have finished a season with a slash line of at least .250/.350/.500: Chase Utley in 2009, Jayson Werth in 2009 & 2010 and Ryan Howard in 2009 & 2010.
- **YOUTH GROUP:** The Phillies began the season with the youngest roster in MLB ... With just under two weeks remaining in the season, the Phillies have collected 926.1 innings from pitchers aged 26 or younger, the second-highest total of any team in the majors (most: PIT, 1046.2 IP) ... Of note, per FanGraphs, Philadelphia has totaled 16.3 WAR from hurlers 26 or younger this season which leads the majors (next: TB, 11.6) ... Further, every Phillies pitcher, not named Jake Arrieta, who has made a start this season has been 26 or younger ... Philadelphia's 123 games started by pitchers 26 or younger lead the majors (next: STL, 116 GS) ... Offensively, Philly's 3,709 plate appearances by players 26 or younger rank 2<sup>nd</sup> in the majors to only the Cubs (3,772) and their 123 home runs are most (next: TEX, 119 HR).
- **DOWN THE STRETCH THEY COME:** With 10 games left in the 2018 season, the Phillies enter play tonight 6.5 games back of the Atlanta Braves for first place in the National League East and 5.5 games back of the second wild card, trailing St. Louis ... Of Philadelphia's 10 remaining games, seven will be on the road (3 G at ATL & 4 G at COL) and three at CBP (3 G vs ATL) ... **Six of their final 10 games this season will come against the Braves.**
- **MR. NO DAYS OFF:** Starting with last night's game in Atlanta, the Phillies will play consecutive four-game series away from home for the first time since July 2010 (at CHI & at STL) ... The Phils are in the midst of 17 consecutive games without an off day to finish their season ... This marks the longest stretch this year for the club without an off day ... Per Elias, this is the first time the Phillies have finished a season with at least 17 straight games and no days off since the year 2000 when they also finished with 17 straight from September 15-October 1.
- **CLEAN BILL OF HEALTH:** Prior to Tuesday night's game, the Phillies reinstated **LHP Aaron Loup** off the 10-day DL ... The Phillies are currently the only team in Major League Baseball without a player on the DL ... As it stands now, this would be the first time since at least 1994, or as far as Phillies internal records go back, that Philadelphia finished a season without a single player on the disabled list.
- **PROGRESS IN THE PROCESS:** Thus far, through 152 games, the Phils are four games above .500 at 78-74 and in regards to the .500 mark, have improved by 34 games from this point last year when they were 30 games under .500 at 61-91 ... As for run differential, the Phillies have improved by 80 runs from this time last year when they carried a -92 mark through 152 games ... The Phils, who matched last year's win total of 66 on August 15, didn't notch their 66<sup>th</sup> win last year until the final day of the season, October 1 against the Mets, a difference of 47 days on the calendar.

**LAST START:** 9/16 vs MIA: L, 5.0 IP, 4 H, 3 R, 3 ER, BB, 8 SO, HR ... Pivetta vs Urena ... Cesar Hernandez led off the game with a home run and the Phillies rallied for 2 runs in the 9th before their comeback attempt fell short ... Enyel De Los Santos tossed 2.0 innings of scoreless relief.

**TONIGHT'S START:**

- **Striking: Averaging 10.56 SO/9.0 IP (173 SO, 149.0 IP), Pivetta is on pace to have the 2<sup>nd</sup>-highest SO/9.0 IP every by a Phillies qualifying pitcher (highest: Schilling, 11.29 in 1999) ...** He is 4<sup>th</sup> in the NL in SO/9.0 IP, and in SO rate (27.8), and is 8<sup>th</sup> in the league in strikeouts overall with 181 ... His 27.8 strikeout rate would be second to only Schilling's 31.6 % mark in 1997 among Phillies pitchers ... **No Phillie has finished top 4 in the NL in SO/9.0IP since 2011 (Cliff Lee, 4<sup>th</sup>, 9.21)** Has recorded at least 30 strikeouts in each full month of the season ... Became 1 of 3 Phillies starters since 1998 to reach 100 strikeouts before 85.0 IP in a season
- **Historic Pace:** Pivetta is within striking distance of joining teammate Aaron Nola with 200 strikeouts for the season, and both pitchers will finish the season before turning 26 ... **The only Phillies pitchers to finish a season with at least 200 strikeouts before age 26 are Nola this season, Brett Myers (208 in 2005), Grover Cleveland Alexander (227 in 1911), Kid Gleason (222 in 1890) and Charlie Ferguson (212 in 1886)** ... Gus Weyhing (202 in 1892) accomplished the feat in his age-25 season, however turned 26 on Sept. 29, before the season had ended ... Per Baseball Reference, only 10 teams have ever had two pitchers with 200+ strikeouts in their age-25 or younger season (meaning they were 25 or younger on June 30 of that year), with the last being the 1986 Angels (Kirk McCaskill & Mike Witt) and the 1986 Mets (Dwight Gooden and Sid Fernandez)
- **Brave New World:** Pivetta's 2.84 ERA (12 ER, 38.0 IP) is his lowest against any opponent against whom he has made at least 3 starts in his career ... Tonight marks his 5<sup>th</sup> start of the season against ATL, but his first since 5/21 ... In the first seven weeks of the season, he faced the Braves 4 times, and squared off against Mike Foltynewicz in each of them
- **vs NL East:** 9-10, 5.72 ERA (79 ER, 124.1 IP) in 27 games (26 starts)

**ROAD:**

- **2018:** 3-5, 5.14 ERA (36 ER, 63.0 IP) in 13 starts
- **Career:** 7-12, 5.93 ERA (87 ER, 132.0 IP) in 27 starts

**2018 SEASON:**

- Was the first Canadian-born Phillie to pitch in his home country since Phillie to do so since Paul Quantrill started for PHI in Montreal on 7/15/95
- Became the first Phillies starter to start at a neutral site (Bowman Field in Williamsport for Little League Classic) since Jack Sanford on 9/3/57 at BRO at Roosevelt Stadium in Jersey City
- Made his first ML relief appearance, 7/1 vs WSH (W, 1.0 IP)
- Struck out a career-high 13 batters on 6/18 vs STL
- Had a streak of 16 straight starts allowing 6 or fewer hits, 9/18/17-6/7/18, becoming 1 of 4 Phillies since 1908 to do so
- Allowed just 1 run in 19.0 IP (0.47 ERA) over 3 starts, 5/16-27, including a 14.0-inning scoreless streak
- Became 3<sup>rd</sup> PHI pitcher since 2010 with 7.0 + IP, 2 or fewer hits and 11+ strikeouts in a game on 5/16 at BAL (others: Halladay's perfect game, 5/29/10 at FLA and Hamels' no-hitter, 7/25/15 at CHI)
- Matched up against the Braves and RHP Mike Foltynewicz 4 times in PHI's first 46 games, first time two ML starters have squared off 4 times in first 46 team games since 1959 (PHI's Robin Roberts & MIL's Lew Burdette) - Elias
- Had a career-best 4-game win streak come to an end on 4/28 vs ATL ... It was also the end of a string of 9 team wins in 9 straight Pivetta starts since 9/12/17, the longest such streak since PHI won 9 straight Cole Hamels starts in 2012
- His string of 8 straight starts allowing 5 hits or fewer on 9/18/17-4/22/18 was the longest by a Phillies starter since 1994 (David West, 10)
- Did not allow a home run in 41.2 consecutive IP over parts of 8 starts, 9/18/17 vs LAD to 4/22/18 vs PIT
- Struck out 9 batters and did not walk any on 4/11 vs CIN, becoming the first Phillies starter to do so since Vince Velasquez, 4/14/16 vs SD
- Had a career-best 18.0-inning scoreless streak (since 9/18/17) come to an end in the 3rd inning of his season debut, 3/31 at ATL

**2017 SEASON:**

- Among ML rookies, was 1st in SO/9.0 IP (9.47, min. 125.0 IP), 3rd in SO (140), 4th in starts (26) and 7th in innings (133.0)
- Was tied for the 9th-most SO in a season ever by a Phillies rookie and had the highest SO/9.0 IP and SO rate (24.0%) of any Phillies rookie ever to make at least 25 starts

**CAREER:**

- Acquired by Philadelphia from WSH for RHP Jonathan Papelbon and cash, 7/28/15 ... Originally selected by WSH in the 4th round of the June 2013 draft ... Attended New Mexico Junior College
- Pitched for Canada in 2017 World Baseball Classic ... Was a member of the Canadian Junior National Team from 2009-12 ... Was the first Canadian-born starting pitcher to debut for the Phillies since 6/17/06
