NEW YORK YANKEES NOTES

- The Yankees earned their second “walk-off” win of the season...their first came in their previous home game, when Gary Sánchez hit a three-run HR in the ninth on 4/26 vs. Minnesota...extended their winning streak to four games...have taken the lead in their last at-bat in three of their last 4G.
- Are 13-1 in their last 14 games since 4/21**, their best 14-game stretch since going 13-1 from 6/3-18/12...are 8-3 in series openers in 2018 (5-1 at home).
- Extended their home winning streak to seven games (since 4/21), matching their longest streak since 2011...last won eight in a row at home from 8/21-9/4/10...have outscored opponents, 54-19, during the streak.
- At 22-10, have their best 32-game start since 2004 (23-9).
- Are 6-0 vs. the AL Central this season and 13-2 outside the AL East.
- Yankees batters** hit 3HR, their most since hitting 4HR both on 4/23 and 4/24 vs. Minnesota...have homered in 11 straight games at Yankee Stadium (since 4/16; 24HR total)...is the longest home HR streak in the Majors this season.
- 3B Miguel Andújar** (2-for-5, 2R, 1RBI) recorded his first career “walk-off” hit with a two-out RBI single in the ninth...at 23 years, 63 days, is the second-youngest Yankee to record a “walk-off” hit since 2010, following Clint Frazier (22 years, 305 days) on 7/8/17 vs. Milwaukee.
 - Was his second straight multi-hit game...is the sixth Yankee since 1908 with at least 12 multi-hit efforts in his first 30 career games.
- 2B Gleyber Torres** (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI) hit his first career Major League home run, a three-run shot in the fourth...is the second Yankee since 1999 to hit a three-run HR for his first career homer (also Colin Curtis on 7/21/10 vs. Los Angeles-AL); also, Hideki Matsui hit a grand slam for his first homer on 4/8/03 vs. Minnesota.
 - At 21 years, 142 days, is the youngest Yankee to homer since John Ellis (20 years, 269 days) hit an inside-the-park HR on 5/17/69 vs. California...the last Yankee as young as Torres to homer *over the fence* was Bobby Murcer (19 years, 117 days) on 9/14/65 at Washington-AL...is the youngest Yankee born outside the U.S. to hit a home run (passing Jesús Montero, 21 years, 281 days on 9/5/11 vs. Baltimore)...is the youngest second baseman to homer for the Yankees (passing Jerry Priddy, 21 years, 178 days on 5/6/41 vs. Detroit)...is the third-youngest player in the Majors to homer this season (Atlanta’s 20-year-old Ronald Acuña Jr. and a younger 21-year-old Ozzie Albies)...the last AL player younger than Torres to homer was Boston’s Rafael Devers (20 years, 335 days) on 9/24/17 at Cincinnati.
- Along with Cleveland’s Bradley Zimmer, marked the first game in which both teams’ starting No. 9 hitters hit a three-run HR (or grand slam) since Texas’ Bill Haselman and Oakland’s Carlos Peña turned the trick on 4/4/02 in Oakland.
- RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB) hit a solo HR in the fourth, his eighth HR of the season...seven of his 8HR have come at home...also drew a go-ahead bases-loaded walk with two outs in the eighth.
 - Marked his 64th homer in his 214th career game, becoming the fastest player in Baseball history to reach 64HR in terms of games played (previous: Rudy York, 215th game).
 - Has reached base safely in 31 consecutive home games (since 9/3/17), the second-longest on-base streak at the current Yankee Stadium (Mark Teixeira, 33G, 6/3-8/6/10)...is hitting .346/.493/.860 (37-for-107) with 34R, 7 doubles, 16HR, 39RBI and 33BB at Yankee Stadium during the streak.
- C Gary Sánchez** (1-for-4, 1BB) hit a solo HR in the fifth...was estimated by Statcast to have a projected distance of 461 feet, the longest by a Yankee this season (prev. Stanton, 458 feet on 4/4 vs. Tampa Bay).
 - Was the 62nd homer of his career in his 206th career game...is tied with Mark McGwire for the second-most HRs through 206 career games in Baseball history behind Aaron Judge (63).
- 1B Neil Walker** (2-for-3, 1R, 2BB) reached safely four times...is 3-for-5 with 3BB and 1HP in his last 2G...his seven times on base are three more than he had in his previous 16 games (4-for-41 with OBB).
- LHP CC Sabathia** (6.0IP, 3H, 0R, 0BB, 7K) started and tossed 6.0 shutout innings but took a no-decision...was his first scoreless start this season and his longest scoreless start since 7/16/17-G1 at Boston (6.0IP)...in four starts since his 4/19 return from the D.L., is 2-0 with a 0.39 ERA (23.1IP, 14H, R/1ER, 3BB, 16K)...has allowed 0ER in three of his last four starts...lowered his 2018 ERA to 1.39 (32.1IP, 5ER) and will qualify for the AL leaderboard.

- **RHP David Robertson** (1.0IP, 2H, 1ER, 1HR) made his 448th appearance with the Yankees, breaking a tie with Andy Pettitte (447) for fifth place on the club's all-time list for games pitched.
- **LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP, 1H, 1ER, 3K, 2WP) had his streak of 14 consecutive save conversions snapped...also snapped his 8.0IP scoreless streak.
- **Yankees pitchers** have not allowed a run before the seventh inning in any of their four games this month...
- The Yankees drew 46,869, their second sellout of the season.

CLEVELAND INDIANS NOTES

- The Indians dropped the first game of their five-game road trip...marked their third "walk-off" loss this season...have alternated wins and losses for their past seven games (since 4/21)...are 6-7 on the road this season...are 10-13 outside the AL Central this season (4-4 vs. the AL East, 5-8 vs. the AL West, 1-1 vs. the NL Central).
 - Are 9-4 in their last 13 regular season games at Yankee Stadium but 13-19 in 32 regular season games at the venue.
- **Cleveland batters** have scored at least 6R in each of their last six games (55R total).
 - Scored 5R in the eighth inning...marks the fourth time this season they scored 5R-or-more in an inning, with all of those innings coming in the last three days (7R in the fourth and 9R in the fifth on 5/3 vs. Toronto; 5R in the second on 5/2 vs. Texas).
- **RHP Josh Tomlin** (7.0IP, 8H, 5R/4ER, 2BB, 4K, 3HR, 1HP) started and did not record a decision...is winless in five starts...has allowed multiple home runs in four of his five starts and at least 3HR in three of those starts...his 7.0IP marked a season high.
 - Is 3-3 with a 5.69 ERA (49.0IP, 31ER) in nine career games (eight starts) vs. the Yankees...is 1-3 with a 7.71 ERA (28.0IP, 24ER) in six games (five starts) at Yankee Stadium.
- **CF Bradley Zimmer** (1-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI) hit a three-run homer in the eighth inning...has 6RBI in his last three games.
- **3B José Ramírez** (3-for-4, 1R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI) hit a two-run, game-tying home run in the eighth inning...marked his third career game-tying or go-ahead home run in the eighth inning or later (also a ninth-inning, game-tying home run on 8/19/16 vs. Toronto and an eighth-inning, go-ahead home run on 8/21/16 vs. Toronto).
 - Has homered in consecutive game for the eighth time in his career and for the second time this year (4/21-22).
 - Is batting .378 (34-for-90) with 18R, 8 doubles, 8HR and 17RBI in his last 22 games (since 4/9) after hitting .061 (2-for-33) with 2R, 1HR and 4RBI in his first nine games of the season.
 - Eight of his last 12 hits have gone for extra bases (6 doubles, 2HR).
 - Has recorded 3H in back-to-back games...has recorded multiple hits five of his last six games.
- **SS Francisco Lindor** (2-for-5, 1 double) extended his hitting streak to seven games...is batting .444 (16-for-36) with 9R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 8RBI and 2BB in that span...has recorded six consecutive multi-hit games, the longest such streak of his career (previous: 5G from 5/16-20/16)...marks the longest streak by a Cleveland batter since José Ramírez recorded nine consecutive games with multiple hits from 6/14-21/17.
- **1B Yonder Alonso** (1-for-4) was ejected in the eighth inning by home plate umpire Tim Timmons.
